I. PROCEEDINGS

Vice Chair Bob Amato called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

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A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of November 2, 2023

It was noted that the next meeting date was listed incorrectly, it should be December 7, 2023.

Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve the November 2, 2023, minutes with the noted correction made. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

Mr. Amato addressed the group stating that the organization he represents disbanded as of the end of September. He said he has been told he remains on the. Board until the Governor removes him.

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Amato opened the floor up for nominations for KIA Chair.

Mr. Russ Rose nominated Commissioner Dennis Keene to serve again. There were no other nominations, so the nominations were closed.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve Commissioner Keene as Chair. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Amato opened the floor up for nominations for the KIA Vice Chair position.

Judge Mark McKenzie nominated Mr. Russell Rose for Vice Chair. There were no other nominations, so the nominations were closed.

Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve Mr. Russ Rose as Vice Chair. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously.

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3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF 1ST VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Amato opened the floor up for nominations for First Vice Chair. Mr. Russ Rose nominated Judge Mark McKenzie. There were no additional nominations, so nominations were closed.

Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve Judge McKenzie as First Vice Chair. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A23-007) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$27,783,547 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's request for a Fund A loan for an amount up the \$27,783,547 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) Capacity project. This project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and emerging contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of life-threatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

MSD currently serves 224,374 residential customers, 21,483 commercial customers and 391 industrial customers.

A question from the floor was asking if this was a replacement project. Ms. Nicole Refalo with MSD said that yes it was a replacement project.

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Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve the Fund A Loan for an amount up to \$27,783, 547 to the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD with the standard conditions. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A KENTUCKY WATER MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE FUND LOAN FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,323,623.15 TO THE MARTIN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, MARTIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady discussed the first Water Management Assistance Fund project. This funding was appropriated during the 2022 General Assembly to assist financially challenged water systems.

The Martin County Water District (MCWD) is requesting a Water Management Assistance Fund loan in the amount of \$1,323,623.15 to consolidate outstanding debt owed by the MCWD. Funding will be utilized to restructure KIA Loan B293-02 in the amount of \$219,313.49 and a Kentucky Rural Water Finance Corporation Flexible Term Finance Program note in the amount of \$1,104,309.66. This loan will assist MCWD by reducing current payments and providing it with more operating capital for necessary repairs.

The MCWD currently serves 3,043 residential customers and 281 commercial customers.

Mr. Craig Miller, representing Martin County briefly spoke and thanked the Board for consideration of this financial assistance. He said the MCWD has been through a very difficult time for years and they are now moving forward and making progress in getting the utility back on track. This assistance would be a tremendous help to continue their progress forward.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman said that she wholeheartedly supports this financial assistance to the Martin County Water District. She noted that in the past she would not have been able to do so but has seen the progress the District has made in recent months and thinks they are moving in the right direction.

Mr. Ron Parritt and Mr. Russ Rose abstained from the vote. Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Martin County Water District's Fund B Loan, B323-001, for an amount up to \$1,323,623 with the standard conditions, along with these additional recommendations: KIA will provide 50% principal forgiveness on the outstanding loan balance as of July 1, 2027 if two goals are met: 1. Martin County Water District has not had a loan default on this loan through June 30, 2027, and; 2. Martin County Water District has remained in compliance with its agreements with the Public Service Commission through June 30, 2027. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded and the motion for approval was passed.

Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

7. CONSIDERATION OF MEETING DATES FOR KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2024

Director Williams discussed the KIA staff suggested dates for the 2024 regularly scheduled monthly Board meetings. The recommendation was to continue with the first Thursday of each month, with three exceptions, April, May, and July moved to the second Tuesday due to KIA staff scheduling conflicts and the Fourth of July holiday falling on the first Thursday.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the suggested dates as presented. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Williams thanked everyone for their participation. She told everyone to enjoy the holiday refreshments after the meeting.

She noted that today's meeting would serve as the Annual meeting to select our Officers of the KIA Board, as stipulated in the KIA By-Laws.

She discussed the dissolution of the Kentucky Municipal Utilities Association, of which Mr. Amato serves as their representative. Director Williams has been in contact with the Governor's Office and the staff at Boards and Commissions, which process the appointments. KIA is awaiting word from them on how to proceed.

She noted that KIA staff were working with the Division of Water and the Area Development Districts on upgrading and modernizing the WRIS software system. They need to be done prior to 2026 when our versions of the software will no longer

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be supported. KIA will not allow the WRIS to go into disarray and will work to ensure there is a smooth transition.

The KIA accounting team has been working diligently with the auditors from Blue & Company. As everyone remembers, Mr. Allen Norvel with Blue & Company met with the Board members at the November KIA meeting to discuss the 2023 audit. We received a 'clean' audit with no findings. The team has also submitted the 2024 Budget request to the Office of the State Budget Director. This request does contain funding for all the SRF federal programs that we anticipate applying for in the next two years. Additionally, the request includes the funding for the required state matching funds required through the federal grants. Also included, as announced by the Governor in October, it contains \$500 million in grant funding for water and sewer projects. KIA staff has also submitted information on the six-year capital plan to the Capital Planning and Advisory Board. That is a precursor to the budget process and includes all items previously mentioned. The accounting staff has submitted all applications required to the EPA to receive our federal money and initiated reimbursements to the infrastructure borrowers and grants along with processing reimbursements for the Office of Broadband Development. KIA provides back-office support to the OBD.

The KIA Grants staff are administering 918 grants over five different programs, which involves five different sets of rules. The ARPA funded KIA administered projects that have not entered into an Assistance Agreement with the Authority will be contacted within the coming weeks. The ARPA funds need to be fully committed by December 31, 2024. We do not want anyone to lose their funding. Our Grants staff has also been posting reallocations and 10% increases for the Cleaner Water Grants Program. As a reminder to all our members, if you have or know a utility who has a Cleaner Water Grant and their bids have come in over budget that utility can very easily request a 10% increase in funding to their existing grant. There is a form on the KIA website, KIA.KY.GOV. Staff are happy to review requests and the required Bid Tabs stating your bids came in over budget and additional funding is needed.

The KIA loan staff have been working with the Division of Water to talk with the ADDs and let them know that the Call for Projects for the next SRF loan cycle ends on Friday, December 15th. All the loan applications for the last funding cycle have been sent out and the majority of those have come back in and have accepted their invitation. John Brady and Sandy Sanders will be working with the utilities.

Judge Mark McKenzie asked if there could be a drop-down box included in the WRIS for HB9 funding. Director Williams said that she would make a note on that and see that it is included. Judge McKenzie asked about the proposed \$500 million the Governor announced and would that funding be under the previous funding requirements. Director Williams stated that that would be decided by the Governor and the legislators, which would be determined during the budget process. KIA would not be involved in establishing those requirements.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A23-014) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,626,195 TO THE CITY OF DANVILLE, BOYLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Danville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$5,626,195 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Danville for the Clark's Run Trunk Line Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of \$490,867 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$5,135,328 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of .50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$14,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$282,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of February, 2024.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The City of Danville is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$5,626,195 for the Clark's Run Trunk Line Improvements Project - Phase II. The proposed project includes construction of approximately 9,200 LF of 24 and 27" trunk line sewers. Lines will begin at Woods Drive lagoon, extending along Clark's Run with parallel 24 and 27" sewers for approximately 6,600 LF of the Norfolk Southern Railroad (NSRR). Beginning at NSRR, existing 12" truck line will be replaced with a 24" line for approximately 2,400 LF. The project will include replacing the existing Woods Drive storage lagoon. This will provide needed capacity to the area allowing for better utilization of the wet weather storage lagoon.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 20,839 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$44,142. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer and water revenues increased 9.7% from \$9.58 million in 2020 to \$10.51 million in 2022 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 5.5% from \$9.16 million to \$9.67 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.0, 0.9, and 0.9 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.7, 20.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 9.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$345,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 2) Water revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$330,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 3) Expenses for both sewer and water will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$282,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$14,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C24-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000 TO THE BARKLEY LAKE WATER DISTRICT, TRIGG COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Governmental Agencies Program (Fund C) with the Barkley Lake Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Governmental Agencies Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Governmental Agencies Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Governmental Agencies Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$500,000 of project expense, to the Barkley Lake Water District for the AMR Water Meter Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 2 years at an annual interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of February, 2024.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F22-028) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,971,313 TO THE CITY OF CYNTHIANA, HARRISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 6,518 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$38,873. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$50,589. The project will qualify for a 0.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020 through June 30, 2022. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 3.9% from \$3.49 million in 2020 to \$3.62 million in 2022. Operating expenses decreased 4.9% from \$2.58 million to \$2.45 million during the same period due mostly to significant decreases in maintenance and repair costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.5, 1.8, and 1.7 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.0, 51.0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 2.3 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 7.3% in both 2023 and 2024 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 5.5% in both 2023 and 2024 due to an existing rate increase.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$298,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$14,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 24,951 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$47,002. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020, through June 30, 2022. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer and water revenues increased 9.7% from \$9.58 million in 2020 to \$10.51 million in 2022 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 5.5% from \$9.16 million to \$9.67 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.0, 0.9, and 0.9 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.7, 20.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 9.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$345,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 2) Water revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$330,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 3) Expenses for both sewer and water will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$62,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$3,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-001S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,071,745 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON F/B/O LEBANON WATER WORKS COMPANY, MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$15,071,745 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company for the Lebanon Water Works 2023 Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. Principal forgiveness of 52.3%, not to exceed \$7,882,523 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$7,189,222 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$37,700 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$754,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of February, 2024.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 6,412 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$32,733. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020 through June 30, 2022. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water revenues increased 25.9% from \$3.38 million in 2020 to \$4.25 million in 2022 due to rate adjustments. Operating expenses increased 3.8% from \$2.26 million to \$2.34 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 2.1, and 2.4 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.6, 44.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 3.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Retail water revenues will increase 4.5% in 2023 and 1.4% in 2024 due to existing rate increases. They will increase 2% in future years due to an annual CPI rate adjustment.
- 2) Water revenues will increase an additional \$150,000 starting in 2024 due to the development of Pernod Ricard Distillery.
- 3) Revenues will increase an additional \$100,000 starting in 2024 due to an operations contract with the City of Springfield.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.5 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$754,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$37,700 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-038L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,050,077 TO THE FRANKFORT PLANT BOARD, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Frankfort Plant Board, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,050,077 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Frankfort Plant Board for the FPB – Logan/E. 3rd Street – Water Main and LCSL Replacement project.

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of \$603,684 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$446,393 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$52,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of February, 2024.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in Exhibit A plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 1st day of February, 2024.
