I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

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A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of November 7, 2024

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2024, regularly scheduled meeting. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Rose opened the floor up for nominations for KIA Chair.

Mayor Bruce Fraley nominated Commissioner Matt Sawyers to serve again and made the motion to approve Commissioner Sawyers as Chair. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Commissioner Sawyers opened the floor up for nominations for the KIA Vice Chair position.

Judge Mark McKenzie nominated Mr. Russell Rose for Vice Chair and made the motion to approve Mr. Rose for Vice Chair. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was approved unanimously.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF 1ST VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Russ Rose nominated Judge Mark McKenzie and made the motion to approve Judge McKenzie as First Vice Chair. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-019) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$977,500 TO THE CITY OF EDMONTON, METCALFE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delany, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA discussed the City of Edmonton's request for a \$977,500 Fund A loan for their WWTP Wet Weather Retention Improvements project. This project will construct a 1.0 MG Wet Weather Retention Basin at the existing WWTP and will convert an existing unused basin for use as a retention basin to capture and hold excess flows during significant rainfall events. This will include an automated influent flow diversion structure and basin effluent lift station, adding SCADA capabilities and making other miscellaneous minor repairs and access/safety improvements. The proposed improvements will eliminate historical and frequent Sanitary Sewer Overflow events at the WWTP.

The City currently serves 530 residential customers, 116 commercial customers, 4 industrial/institutional customers and 54 other customers.

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Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund A loan for an amount up to \$977,500 to the City of Edmonton with the standard conditions and Ms. Shelley Porter seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$250,000 TO THE CITY OF MIDWAY, WOODFORD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Midway's request for a Fund B loan for an amount up to \$250,000 for the I-64 Waterline Extension project. This project will construct an 8" PVC line to connect the City's 500,000-gallon elevated water tower to the town of Midway. Currently the line connecting the tower is owned by Kentucky American Water (KAW). The new 8" line will run from the City's existing infrastructure along Leestown Road and Coach Station Road to existing infrastructure on McKinney Ave. The new line will be a total of approximately 1300 linear feet (LF) and will include a 400 LF bore under I-64 and a 100 LF bore under Leestown Road. There will be a 6" spur to serve the Green Gables Development which is currently served by the KAW line and in operation in the City's system. This portion of the project will be 750 LF of 6" line from I-64 to Green Gables Drive where there is existing infrastructure. This project aims to provide consistent service for the City's existing customers and is necessary because they will no longer be purchasing water from KAW.

The City currently serves 699 residential customers and 53 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Shelley Porter abstained from voting. Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund B loan request to the City of Midway for an amount up to \$250,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-008L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,000,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Northern Kentucky Water District's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$5,000,000 for the Newport Water Main and Full Lead Service Line Replacement project. The Project involves water main replacement of older unlined cast iron water mains with lead joints that have a high rate of failure. Approximately 15,300 feet of water main plus switchover services (from 6" to 12" on 16th Street) will be replaced and another 1,700 feet of water main will be abandoned. The project will impact approximately 578 households, 520 of which are expected to have service lines made of lead. The cost to replace lead service lines as part of a water main replacement has been reported to be 40% lower than stand-alone replacement. Trenchless installation methods will be used for service line replacement. Open cutting a trench for line replacement will only be allowed if trenchless methods are unsuccessful. The project will reduce water main breaks and water loss, along with accomplishing one of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's top priorities of replacing all lead service lines around the nation.

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Northern Kentucky Water District's request for a Fund F loan for an amount up to \$3,305,825 for the Newport Water Main and Full Lead Service Line Replacement project. The Project involves water main replacement of older unlined cast iron water mains with lead joints that have a high rate of failure. Approximately 15,300 feet of water main plus switchover services (from 6" to 12" on 16th Street) will be replaced and another 1,700 feet of water main will be abandoned. 8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-006) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,923,968 TO THE CITY OF CORBIN, WHITLEY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the request from the City of Corbin for the Corbin Water Treatment Plant Sodium Hypochlorite Disinfection Facility project. This project is for the design and construction of a new disinfection facility for the water treatment plant including a new bulk storage building with 8,000 gallons of bulk storage, day tanks, chemical feed pumps, process piping and typical facility appurtenances. One SCADA feature type will be added. This will allow the utility to better comply with the Stage 2 provisions of Disinfectant and Disinfection By-Products Rule of the Safe Water Drinking Act. Additionally, to address PFAS, Corbin will develop and implement a sampling plan to more accurately reflect levels of PFAS in their source water.

Corbin Utilities Commission currently serves 5,716 residential customers, 1,023 commercial customers, 25 industrial/institutional customers and 4 wholesale customers. e City of Corbin's request for a Fund F loan for an amount up to \$2,923,968.

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Ms. Geri Grigsby made the motion to approve the Fund F loan for an amount up to \$2,923,968 to the City of Corbin with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

9. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-017L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$400,000 TO THE LAUREL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT #2, LAUREL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Laurel County Water District's request for a Fund F loan for an amount of \$400,000 for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. The Water District completed a thorough review of records on file and updated results on their inventory map on ArcGIC. Field staff conducted a visual inspection of meters constructed prior to 1998 and both the public and private side of the service lines were documented. In cases where both sides could not be identified, a statistical method will be used, and excavating could be done as necessary. The Water District will follow a 15-step plan instituted for their statistical method.

Following a meticulous assessment, 0 out of 361 randomly selected service lines throughout the system were found to contain lead. There is 95% confidence that fewer than 1% of the unverified service lines contain lead.

The Water District currently serves 5,935 residential customers and 444 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Ron Parritt abstained from the vote. Mr. Andy Luttner made the motion to approve the Fund F loan to the Laurel County Water District #2 for an amount up to \$400,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was approved.

10. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

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11. KENTUCKY WATER AND WASTEWATER ASSISTANCE FOR TROUBLED OR ECONOMICALLY RESTRAINED SYSTEMS (KYWWATERS) PROGRAM – NEW/AMENDEDED PROJECTS FOR CONISIDERATION AND UPDATED PROGRAM SCORING AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Director Williams, Mr. Rick Harris and Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, addressed the Director Williams noted that letters had been sent out to all the KYWWATERS applicants notifying them of their score and the funding recommendation that the Board approved at the November meeting. There was some follow-up from a few of the applicants. She turned the discussion over to Mr. Harris and Mr. Skinner. Mr. Harris noted that there were two projects that had been submitted and were not put in the initial report at the November meeting. There were three additional projects, the City of Evart, the City of Stanford and Parksville Water District asking why they had not made the final list. All three had at least one document that had not been submitted per our records, but after further investigations they had indeed submitted the documentation but had been rejected due to an influx of emails, 800-1,000 in one day, 80% of them came within a 3-hour window at the end of the day and the in box was full. They had evidence that that had sent or attempted to send the documentation, we felt it necessary to include them in the revised information provided today. Mr. Skinner noted that those five projects were highlighted on page 111. He noted that originally there were 165 applications, now there are 167. Originally, there were 150 eligible projects, now there are 154 projects and 13 remain ineligible. Director Williams noted that the amended list with the additional applicants was submitted to LRC, with the notation that those five projects had not been approved by the KIA Board at the time of submission and would be addressed at the KIA December Board meeting. Director Williams stated that if for some reason the Board chooses not to approve these additional projects, KIA will notify LRC of that as well and to disregard the additions.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the updated KYWWATERS Recommendations and Scoring as submitted. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

12. CONSIDERATION OF THE 2025 KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING SCHEDULE

Director Williams noted the suggested dates for the 2025 Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Board meetings. She asked for input on the suggested dates for January and July, to continue with the first Thursday of those months or move to the second Thursday, due to holidays being involved. The consensus was to move both January and July to the second Thursday of the month.

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve the schedule as presented, with the January 9th and July 10th meeting dates. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for coming and wished them all the very best holiday season.

She updated everyone on the status of the lengthy discussion at the November Board meeting pertaining to the City of Livingston, Kentucky American Water and the Wood Creek Water District's disconnection of services to the City. On November 26th, she, Deputy Director Milward Deadman and Mr. Rick Harris traveled to the Rockcastle County Courthouse. There were representatives from the Public Service Commission, the Division of Water, the City of Livingston, Wood Creek Water District, Kentucky American Water, Representative Josh Bray, the Rockcastle Judge Executive Howell Holbrook and the County Attorney were in attendance. There was another robust discussion on how to proceed moving forward with the City's water issues. The City did agree to take to their Council a recommendation to work with

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either Kentucky American or Wood Creek Water District to purchase the water system. The Council did meet earlier in the week, and they did pass a resolution to dissolve, pending an agreement from either Kentucky American Water or Wood Creek Water District to purchase the City of Livingston's water system. She noted that's a great step forward. She mentioned that the conditional approval by the KIA Board in November for the Emergency KYWWATERS funding to Wood Creek Water District is moving forward, all the conditions have been met. The Commitment Letter has been sent out and was returned to KIA on Monday. The Assistance Agreement was sent out yesterday for their representatives to sign. Assistant General Counsel Natalie Lile noted that they do not have to do the exhibits that are normally required, and we hope to receive that very soon. Director Williams mentioned that all the deliberations that occurred at the last KIA meeting had paid off and things are moving in the right direction.

Director Williams mentioned a handout that was provided on the KYWWATERS that was submitted to the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue which included each of the Executive Summaries, the scores for each project and the funding recommendations. She noted that the information is available in two different locations on the KIA website, under the Board materials, as well as under the dropdown for the KYWWATERS program. It is also available on the LRC website on the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue page as well. She thanked the Board for their consideration and support through the process. Commissioner Sawyers asked if there had been any feedback from LRC. Director Williams stated that she had had a request to add information including the County and the Area Development District in columns as well.

She updated everyone on the Cleaner Water Grant Program. There were two rounds of appropriations of \$250 million each to counties based on population. The funding came through ARPA funds with federal deadlines. The first deadline states that all funding must be obligated by December 31, 2024. There are a very few left that are in process to meet the deadline. She commended KIA staff for their diligence in contacting all the ones that have not completed the process. It's been a team effort by Julie Bickers, Debbie Landrum, Kelly Cunnagin, Don Schreier and Milward Dedman. This would not have been possible without them. There were over 900 projects that have been or are being worked on. Commissioner Sawyers noted that this has been a top priority for Governor Beshear since the beginning of 2023. He asks at every meeting that they have with the local officials and the infrastructure calls where things stand. Mr. Youravich noted that he has worked closely with staff to get his projects completed and they have done a wonderful job.

Finally, she noted that the audit draft that was approved at the November meeting has been submitted to the Controller's Office for inclusion in the Annual Consolidated Financial Report of the State and the Infrastructure Authority is a distinct component in an independent audit separate from the Auditor of Public Accounts or other agencies. We are still waiting to receive the final copy of the audit, but there shouldn't be any changes. Mr. Jim Carpenter, KIA treasurer mentioned he has reached out to Blue & Company earlier in the week and was told we should expect the final copy before the Christmas holiday. Director Williams noted that the final copy will be submitted to the Securities and Exchange Commission to comply with SEC continuing disclosure requirements for our outstanding bonds. We will meet all the required deadlines.

Secretary Goodman asked if she could have the floor for a moment. She noted that Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, who regularly attended and presented the DOW projects to the KIA Board has been promoted within the agency and she thanked Ms. Hollie Delaney for stepping in and taking over the reins in presenting the projects to the KIA Board now and is doing an excellent job!

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$2,414,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$120,700 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 1,877 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$40,247. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 41.8% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$389,768, will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from limited unaudited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024.

HISTORY

Sewer revenues increased 195% from \$199,119 in 2022 to \$587,594 in 2024 due to a significant rate increase and the collection of past due payments. Also, customers were not being billed the correct user fees for several years which was corrected in 2024. Operating expenses increased 94% from \$215,201 to \$417,483 during the same period. The large increase was due mostly to payments on past due bills and maintenance expenses.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will remain flat in projected years.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 17.7% in 2025 due to increased costs for salaries and benefits. Expenses will increase 3% per year beginning in 2026 due to inflation and system maintenance.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.3 in 2028 when the first full year of principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$46,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$2,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

X. <u>DEBT OBLIGATIONS</u>

The City's sewer system currently has no outstanding debt.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-016S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,387,000 TO THE CITY OF SCOTTSVILLE, ALLEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Scottsville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$6,387,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Scottsville for the Inflow & Infiltration Phase I project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by

further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 45%, not to exceed \$2,876,993, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$3,510,007 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$16,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$320,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of February, 2025.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the

operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 40.6% from \$2.59 million in 2022 to \$3.64 million in 2024 due to rate increases for both water and sewer. Operating expenses increased 11.3% from \$2.75 million to \$3.06 million during the same period due to higher salaries and increased costs for sludge disposal. The debt coverage ratio was -0.6, -0.1, and 0.7 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.5, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.8, 42.0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues will both increase 7.8% in 2025 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Water and sewer revenues will both increase 2% annually starting in 2026 due to the City's annual cost of living adjustment.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$320,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$16,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,280,000 TO THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Morganfield, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$1,280,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Morganfield for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade project. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 41.8%, not to exceed \$534,469, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$745,531 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 5 years at an interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of February, 2025.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 4,907 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$58,056. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 2.25% interest rate, the standard rate of all planning and design loans.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 11.7% from \$3.09 million in 2021 to \$3.46 million in 2023 due to rate adjustments for both water and sewer services. Operating expenses increased 11.6% during the same period due to salaries and increased costs for chemicals. The debt coverage ratio was 2.5, 1.4, and 1.6 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.7, 44.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 5.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues and retail water revenues will increase 5% in projected years due to the annual rate adjustment set out in the City's rate ordinance.
- 2) Wholesale water revenues will increase 26.4% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase previously passed by the Public Service Commission.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.5 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$4,000,000 of project expense, to the Western Pulaski County Water District for the Faubush/Nancy Area Water Transmission Main Phase II project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$200,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of February, 2025.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 17,482 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$55,246. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2021 through December 31, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water revenues increased 15.3% from \$3.54 million in 2021 to \$4.08 million in 2023 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 16.9% from \$3.17 million to \$3.71 million during the same period primarily due to employee salaries and benefits. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.1, and 1.2 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.8, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.6, 40.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 8.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 12% in 2024 and 5.2% in 2025 due to existing rate increases previously approved by the Public Service Commission (PSC).
- 2) Water revenues will increase \$225,000 annually starting in 2027 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 3% annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2028 when the first full year of principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

The Water District is regulated by the PSC and will need to apply, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$4,000,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$200,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$10,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water and sewer revenues increased 17.6% from \$4.02 million in 2022 to \$4.72 million in 2024 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 51.3% from \$2.61 million to \$3.96 million during the same period largely due to repairs and maintenance issues. The debt coverage ratio was 0.1, 1.3, and 0.9 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.2, 64.0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 3.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 2% each year due to recent rate increases.
- 2) Water revenues will increase 6% each year through 2029 due to recent rate increases.
- 3) Expenses for water and sewer will decrease in 2025 from 2024 due to one-time repairs then increase 3% each year due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$226,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$11,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W25-004E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,487,450 TO THE CITY OF EDDYVILLE, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, House Bill 563 (the "Bill") of the 2024 General Assembly amended the Act to create the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (WWATERS) Program (the "Fund") in order to fund capital and non-capital expenses of public water or wastewater systems that meet the eligibility requirements set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans and grants to public water or wastewater systems for the purpose of providing funds for capital and non-capital expenses, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such public water or wastewater systems governing the provisions in respect of which such loans and grants are to be made, the amounts thereof and, if applicable, the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for financing from the Kentucky WWATERS Program with the City of Eddyville; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby determines that the City of Eddyville (a) provides public drinking water or wastewater services to ratepayers in the Commonwealth; (b) meets one or more of the eligibility criteria set forth in the Bill; and (c) has expenses relating solely to restoring or avoiding imminent interruption of water services after a state of emergency was declared on January 5, 2025.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes an Emergency Kentucky WWATERS Fund grant in the amount of \$5,487,450, to the City of Eddyville. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this grant is authorized.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

On Monday, January 6, 2025 the City of Eddyville Sewer Treatment Plant had a catastrophic failure to the Sequencing Batch Reactor Tank. The initial release from the tank was estimated at approximately 400,000 gallons of partially treated sewage; it was estimated that approximately 800,000 gallons were lost before the partially treated sewage in the tank could be pumped out into a temporary tank. In addition to a statewide Emergency Declaration due to weather, local declarations of emergency were issued by both the City and the County. A structural assessment was conducted on January 7, 2025; a comprehensive investigation to determine the cause of the failure will likely require a substantial investment of hundreds of thousands of dollars and up to a year. Damage consisting of buckled wall plates of the tank's outer shell was observed in multiple places. Buckling defects are localized areas where the tank wall deforms inwards due to excessive force.

The project will address the immediate response and temporary treatment needs associated with the Eddyville Wastewater Treatment Plant Sequencing Batch Reactor Tank catastrophic failure. This project includes costs to the City of Eddyville and Lyon County Fiscal Court for overtime, equipment, fuel and supplies for cleanup and temporary treatment processes. Blue Tank & Pump Rental brought in an emergency tank the night of the disaster to resolve the immediate emergency; the next day a temporary treatment solution was brought in and set up in order to start treating raw sewage again before the sludge lagoons overflowed. This project includes the operation of that temporary treatment solution for a period of 24 months, until a permanent treatment system can be constructed, as well as needed electrical and site upgrades, disinfection, and pumps/blowers in order for the system to operate properly. The project also includes dredging of the sludge lagoons to provide necessary pretreatment and capacity during temporary treatment, environmental fines and response fees, and engineering and administrative costs. These components will provide the City a means to continue treating raw wastewater and to protect the environment around the property and receiving water bodies.

It was determined by the structural engineer that the amount of work required to reuse the tank while keeping parts of it that are 22 years old is not economically viable. The installation of a new tank or system with redundancy is advised. The permanent solution will be addressed in Phase II of this project.

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of February, 2025.
