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### I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Dennis Keene called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

### A. <u>BUSINESS</u> (Board Action Required)

### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of December 1, 2022

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the December 1, 2022, regular board meeting. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### **B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS**

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B23-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$635,000 TO THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD F/B/O SPRINGFIELD WATER AND SEWER COMMISSION, WASHINGTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The City of Springfield, on behalf of the Springfield Water and Sewer Commission (SWSC) requested a Fund B loan in the amount of \$635,000 for the Water Interconnect Project. The project will install approximately 22,000 linear feet of 12" water main along KY Highway 150 to Perryville, connecting the City of Danville's water system to the SWSC's water system. The new connection will provide an additional source of finished water for 4 of the 6 Springfield hydraulic pressure zones in the eastern portion of the county. The project will also provide the capacity for future economic and commercial growth in the area.

The SWSC currently serves approximately 4,600 residential customers and over 300 commercial and industrial customers.

Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B23-002, to the City of Springfield in the amount of \$635,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-006S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,377,650 TO THE ADAIR COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, ADAIR COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Adair County Water District (ACWD) requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,377,650 for the Phase 23 Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and Improvements project. Plate settlers will be installed at the WTP to increase treatment capacity of

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the existing basins, improve effluent quality, and reduce associated operational costs. The disinfection system at the WTP will be converted from chlorine gas to sodium hypochlorite. Five of the ACWD's seven water tanks are experiencing corrosion and will be rehabilitated. A water main extension will also be installed to provide a connection to an unserved area.

The ACWD currently serves approximately 7,775 residential and 675 commercial and industrial customers. They purchase water from both the Campbellsville Water and Sewer System and Jamestown Utilities and provide wholesale service to Edmonton Water Works.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mayor Les Stapleton made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F23-06S, to the Adair County Water District in the amount of \$4,377,650 with the standard conditions. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

3. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Sandy Williams presented the Executive Director's Report. Director Williams welcomed everyone back to our first in-person meeting since March 2020. She noted there were two new members recently appointed by the Governor: Shaun Youravich representing the Kentucky Section of the American Water Works Association and Ms. Shelley Porter, representing the For-Profit Water Companies. Ms. Kristina Slattery is back from maternity leave and serving as proxy for Secretary Jeff Noel at the Economic Development Cabinet.

Ms. Williams stated KIA had weathered the storm of the last two years, staying busy and keeping funds moving. Round One of the Cleaner Water Program had 406 grants committed. Round Two had 407 grants committed. Fifty-six grants from the Cleaner Water Program Round Two have been approved and are awaiting commitments. Sixteen-line-item grants from last year's state budget have

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also been processed. KIA also assisted with the first 46 broadband grants that have been awarded. That is 885 grants, 931, if you include broadband and there are six counties that have outstanding water and sewer projects to submit.

A big thanks goes to all the KIA staff. Bryan Bunch has programmed from scratch an online, digital tracking, accounting, and grant management system for all the new funding.

The grants administrators and our regional compliance team members, Kelly Cunnagin, Don Schierer, Carmen Ignat, Julie Bickers and Debbie Landrum have worked diligently to process the Cleaner Water Program Grants and keep the SRF Loan program moving forward.

KIA has applied for and created processes for five new EPA grants under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, (BIL), that will provide additional funding for new loan programs under our Federally Assisted State Revolving Loan programs. These loans are administered jointly with the Division of Water (DOW).

This year the total number of CWSRF projects submitted during the call for projects increased by about 25% and the total number of DWSRF projects submitted increased approximately 100%.

The Board will be seeing some new types of projects addressing lead service line inventory and replacement and emerging contaminants both on the clean water and drinking water sides to eliminate PFAS and other non-regulated contaminants.

KIA will have an additional \$25 million added to our Fund B loan program. This funding was provided to KIA during the last budget session and will be available starting July 1, 2023. The Board can expect to see a non-water or sewer project coming in the next couple of months. We have one application for an electric loan for economic development in western Kentucky.

In total, this represents \$500 million for utilities in the form of grants and \$315 million available for low interest loans for a grand total of \$815 million over the past two years that KIA staff members have been administering.

Milward Dedman, KIA's Deputy Executive Director stepped up and spearheaded the second round of grants and other special projects. He did a great job.

The accounting staff, deserves a special thanks as well. Jim Carpenter, KIA Treasurer and accounting staff members, James Nelson and Denise Pitts have received clean audits the last two years with no findings, which means they are handling KIA funds correctly and within all the guidelines under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles.

Loan analyst, John Brady has done an incredible job keeping up with all the loans and new programs. He has also pitched in and assisted with the new grants. We hope to have a new analyst onboard very soon to help John.

With all the new funding, our GIS specialist, Tom Schubert has been busy with changes to the WRIS and updating the new project profiles as well as mapping

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data. Tom has worked closely with all the ADDs. Tom and Bryan keep the KIA staff up and running not only on one workstation, but two, one for the office and one for home without us missing a beat.

Board Secretary, Meg Link keeps our Board meetings running smoothly whether online or now in-person. She is happy to help any of you, at any time.

Director Williams thanked everyone for letting her brag on the KIA staff and concluded her report.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A23-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, BRECKINRIDGE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Hardinsburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$1,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Hardinsburg for the Wastewater Treatment Plant and Collection System Improvements

project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of \$306,792 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$693,208 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$50,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this  $2^{nd}$  day of March, 2023.

This project will include several improvements at the WWTP. New sludge pumps and actuator valves will replace the current ones which have reached the end of their useful life. The City routinely experiences excessive maintenance costs associated with the pumps and valves. The new ones will allow the operations to become automated which will improve the overall effectiveness of the treatment process. Other improvements at the WWTP will include concrete and pipe rehab and electrical upgrades. The collection system component of the project will consist of replacement of approximately 4,000 linear feet of main transmission line located between Mercer Trailer Park and the FFA Camp. This will correct inflow and infiltration of stormwater into the sanitary sewer system.

The City currently serves 959 residential customers and 188 commercial and industrial customers.

### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 2,215 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$47,616. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

### VIII. 2021 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for Green Project Reserve funding for \$80,000.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of \$306,792 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2019 through June 30, 2021. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses.

### **HISTORY**

Total sewer revenues increased 12.6% from \$481,844 in 2019 to \$542,679 in 2021 due to previous rate adjustments. Operating expenses increased only 0.7% from \$352,907 to \$355,219 during the same period due mostly to a decrease in costs associated with maintenance and supplies. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 0.6, and 1.1 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.7, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.9, 32.9 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 28.8% in 2022, 14.2% in 2023, and 5% in 2024 due to existing rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.8 in 2025 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$50,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$2,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B23-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,445,000 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Bardstown, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$4,445,000 of project expense, to the City of Bardstown for the East Bardstown Water Storage Tank project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$11,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$222,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, 2023.

### HISTORY

Total water revenues increased 39.9% from \$5.03 million in 2020 to \$7.04 million in 2022 due to rate adjustments. Operating expenses decreased 0.7% from \$4.55 million to \$4.52 million during the same period due to a significant decrease in personal service expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 1.1, 2.1, and 5.2 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, 26.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,400,000 of project expense, to the Garrard County Water Association for the GCWA Water System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$70,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, 2023.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 13,064 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$54,818. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 2.25% interest rate.

#### VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2019 through December 31, 2021. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Total water revenues decreased 1.7% from \$2.31 million in 2019 to \$2.27 million in 2021. Operating expenses increased 3.1% from \$747,848 to \$770,717 during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 2.4, 0.6, and 0.4 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 9.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.0, 21.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 10.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Water revenues will increase 2.1% in 2022 and 6.5% in 2023 due to existing rate increases.

- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 3.7 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

The GCWA is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$1,400,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$70,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$3,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Principal forgiveness of 100% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$2,001,013 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2019 through December 31, 2021. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Total water revenues increased 35.1% from \$1.54 million in 2019 to \$2.08 million in 2021 due to rate adjustments. Operating expenses increased 1.5% from \$1.57 million to \$1.59 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 0.0, 0.1, and 1.6 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.2, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.3, 52.1 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 2.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 26.1% in 2022 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.

The District is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,001,013 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$100,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$5,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-009S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,850,060 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON F/B/O LEBANON WATER WORKS COMPANY, MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS,** the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$3,850,060 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company for the 2022 WTP and Water System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness in an amount not to exceed \$2,770,245 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,079,815 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$9,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$192,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, 2023.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 6,412 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$30,382. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Total water revenues increased 25.9% from \$3.38 million in 2020 to \$4.25 million in 2022 due to rate adjustments. Operating expenses increased 3.8% from \$2.26 million to \$2.34 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 2.1, and 2.4 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.6, 44.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 3.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Retail water revenues will increase 4.5% in 2023 due to an existing rate increase and 2%in future years due to an annual CPI rate adjustment.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2025 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$192,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$9,600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-119L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100,000 TO THE CITY OF SCOTTSVILLE, ALLEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Scottsville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$100,000 of project expense to the City of Scottsville for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted

by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 100% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$100,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March, 2023.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020 through June 30, 2022. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues increased 6.1% from \$2.44 million in 2020 to \$2.59 million in 2022 due to rate adjustments for both water and sewer services. Operating expenses increased 7.2% from \$2.09 million to \$2.24 million during the same period due mostly to costs associated with repairs and maintenance. The debt coverage ratio was 4.5, 2.3, and 1.9 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 3.5, 42.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues will each increase 2% in future years due to the City's annual CPI rate adjustment for both services.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 2nd day of March, 2023.
