PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. Commissioner Keene welcomed Judge Mark Edward McKenzie, from Johnson County, the newly appointed KACo representative. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Meg Link, KIA Secretary was asked to call the Roll.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of January 7. 2021

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the January 7, 2021, regular board meeting. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-009) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,857,216 TO THE CITY OF GEORGETOWN, SCOTT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Georgetown's request for a Fund A Loan increase, (A19-009) in the amount of \$7,857,216 for a total loan amount of \$21,400,000. The City received seven (7) bid submissions on the project on 10/29/2020. The low bid amount is above the current KIA-SRF project budget. Additionally, the 319(h) Non-Point Source grant amount going toward construction was reduced to cover 319(h) administration fees. The additional funding is necessary for the project to move forward.

The original project, named the Georgetown/Scott County South Sewer Extension project, remains unchanged. The purpose of this project is to eliminate the untreated sanitary discharges from two package treatment plants and remove major point sources of pollution to the Cane Run Creek and Cane Run Watershed thus improving the public health of the region. It will provide adequate sanitary sewer service to approximately 500 mobile home units (around 320 are currently occupied) within the Ponderosa and Spindletop mobile home parks (MHPs) by replacing all leaking collector sewers within the two MHPs and extending a gravity interceptor (approximately 17,000 LF) to a new pump station where the flows will be conveyed into Georgetown Municipal Water and Sewer Service (GMWSS) collection system.

Once the two MHPs are fully connected to the new gravity collection system and pump station, the two existing package treatment plants, Ponderosa and Spindletop, will be recommissioned and demolished. The mobile home park collection systems will also undergo rehab and

replacement of approximately 17,000 LF of collector sewers and various manholes as determined necessary. The gravity interceptor route will also provide sanitary sewer service for an area previously unserved. Both of the mobile home parks will be served by master meters billed to the owners of the parks with associated treatment and project costs being passed on to residents as part of their lot rent.

Georgetown Municipal Water and Sewer Service currently serves approximately 13,588 residential, commercial, and industrial customers in the City of Georgetown and Scott County.

Mayor Stapleton asked what the largest area of cost increases had been. Deputy Director Williams asked Mr. Becker from DOW if he had any additional information. He said he did not have specifics at the moment, but would be happy to get back with Mayor Stapleton with the requested information.

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the Fund A loan increase (A19-009), for an amount up to \$7, 857,216 for a total loan of \$21,400,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-050) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,000,000 TO THE CITY OF RICHMOND, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Richmond's request for a Fund A loan (A19-050) increase up to \$3,000,000 for a total loan amount of \$13,142,000 for the Silver Creek Outfall Sewer Phase 1 project. This increase request is due to bids coming in higher than originally expected. The purpose of this project is to eliminate known overflows and provide additional capacity in the collection system for future growth. In 2009, soon after the construction of the Otter Creek Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP), two existing WWTP's (Dreaming Creek and Tates Creek) were taken off-line with flows directed to this new large WWTP. The other large WWTP (Silver Creek), was built in the summer of 1999 to treat waste generated on the south side of Richmond, primarily the area along Duncannon Road and the new industrial park. This project will eliminate this Kentucky Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (KPDES) permit and convey flows through the existing conveyance system to the Otter Creek WWTP.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked if there was a trend that the Board needed to be aware of in the coming months. Was Prevailing Wage causing issues? Mr. David Schrader with Bell Engineering noted that with the Richmond project, they received numerous bids, but only two did road boring, which reduced the competitiveness of the bids. Mr. Lovan noted with many of the projects the Board has been reviewing staff should drill down and determine what the trends are that are causing the need for loan increases.

Mr. Bob Amato moved to approve the Fund A Loan increase, (A19-050) for an amount up to \$3,000,000 for a total loan of \$13,142,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND

LOAN (A20-030) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,017,000 TO THE CITY OF JACKSON, BREATHITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, discussed the City of Jackson's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,017,000 for the Jackson Sewer Rehabilitation project. The City of Jackson's initial sanitary sewer collection system was installed prior to 1950, with extensions to various areas of the city in the 1970's. The existing sewer system experiences high flows during and after rainfall events. The high flows impair the performance of the wastewater treatment plant resulting in frequent KPDE permit violations. The City knows of problem areas where there are pipe failures that need to be addressed immediately. This project will address both the planning needs for future projects as well as construction of the immediate needs of the collection system. There are two different phases that will be addressed at the same time.

The immediate areas that need to be addressed, as funds are available, include but are not limited to:

A. A 12-inch gravity sewer and manholes that are collapsing along East Main Street B. An 8-inch gravity line along Quicksand Road that is collapsing into the North Fork of the Kentucky River due to the riverbank failing. This will need to be relocated as needed or relaid and strengthened with bank erosion protection.

While the design for the above phase is on-going, a study of the sewer system will also be on-going. This will include:

- A. Development of a working map that includes flow line elevations of the sewer lines
- B. Manhole inspections
- C. Flow studies at key points to determine where the most concentrated I/I is located
- D. A report that quantifies the I/I problem and outlines future projects to address the I/I results.

Currently the City of Jackson serves 3,083 residential and over 297 commercial customers.

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the Fund A loan (A20-030), in an amount up to \$1,017,000 to the City of Jackson with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-020) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$300,000 TO THE FARMDALE SANITATION DISTRICT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA discussed the Farmdale Sanitation District request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$300,000 for the Farmdale Sanitation District-Rehabilitation Project. This project will involve the rehabilitation of the existing sanitary sewer collection systems in order to reduce the I&I in the Farmdale, Coolbrook, Edgewood, Farmgate, Evergreen, Huntington Woods, and Meadowbrook subdivisions. It will include point repairs, manhole rehab, sewer line rehab, sewer line replacement and repairing lateral connections. The Quail Run Pump Station will also be eliminated as part of this project with

the construction of approximately 1300 linear feet of 8" gravity sewer. This will eliminate SSOs. The Farmdale Sanitation District serves approximately 1,076 customers.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan, A21-020, in an amount up to \$300,000 to the Farmdale Sanitation District with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-041) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,800,000 TO THE CITY OF WHITESBURG, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Whitesburg's request for a Fund A Loan, A21-041, for an amount up to \$1,800,00 for the Sewer Lift Station Rehab Project. This project will rehabilitate the system's 18 lift stations. They are aging and in need of new pumps, new control panels, rails and mounting hardware, valves, and the interior coating of wet wells needs treated to prevent hydrogen sulfide. The pumps will remain the same size.

The City provides sewer services to approximately 615 residential customers, 140 commercial customers, and 11 industrial customers.

Mr. Bob Amato asked the age of the lift stations. Mr. Paul Nesbitt, Nesbitt Engineering noted they were various ages, were between 20 and 30 years old and were requiring costly maintenance.

Ms. Geri Grigsby moved to approve the Fund A Loan, A21-041, in an amount up to \$1,800,000 to the City of Whitesburg with the standard conditions. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F17-005) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$268,293 TO THE CITY OF STANFORD, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Stanford's request for a Fund F loan increase, F17-005, to supplement the Water System Upgrades project initially approved on March 2, 2017, which will bring the total loan amount up to \$2,958,293. The increase is due to unforeseen obstacles encountered during construction and an unexpected highway relocation. The unforeseen obstacles during construction include issues that resulted in a necessary increase in quantities beyond the bid scope. There were streets approved to receive new waterlines as part of the original project scope, and were bid with the project. However, this work had to be subsequently removed due to an unforeseen highway relocation project advanced by KYTC in the middle of construction. A change order was submitted.

The initial project description and scope is to help improve water pressure and replace aging and tuberculated cast iron waterlines that have been in service since the 1950's. A major

portion of this project will be replacing a cross country 8" cast iron waterline which provides water directly to the City from the water treatment plant. This waterline needs to be replaced very soon due to its necessity and the fact that it is aging and has experienced many breaks. The remainder of the project will be various system wide replacements and connections of dead-end waterlines to create loops throughout the system.

The city of Stanford currently serves 3,179 residential and 241 industrial and commercial customers.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F loan, F17-005, for an amount up to \$268,293 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The comprehensive rate study currently under review shall be completed by December 31, 2021 and rates shall be adjusted to provide a 1.1 debt coverage ratio on all outstanding debt within 3 months of completion of the rate study. If rates are not adjusted within the allowable timeline, \$268,293 shall be immediately due and payable in full on June 1, 2022. Mr. Paul Miller seconded and the motion was approved unanimously.

7. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. *Mr.* Russ Rose seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Deputy Executive Director Sandy Williams thanked everyone for their participation. She welcomed Judge McKenzie and mentioned that she planned to hold a New Board Member Orientation and anyone interested in participating should let her know for inclusion in the distribution of materials.

KIA has just completed the audit for this year and has begun preparing the plan for the next audit process to make things more efficient.

The Capital Plan is being worked on. The State Revolving Fund programs have several federal requirements and staff is preparing an outline to ensure all reporting is submitted in a timely manner.

The Call for Projects ended December 4th, the Division of Water has notified KIA that their information will be completed by the established deadline. They plan to have a ranked list of projects to us in early March as scheduled. Staff looks forward to beginning work on the Intended Use Plan (IUP) for the next funding cycle.

Every four years, the EPA requires a Drinking Water Needs Survey be completed by the Utilities. It was originally scheduled for 2020, but was delayed due to COVID-19. The Division of Water has notified staff that 70 Drinking Water systems will be included. Although it is the responsibility of the Utilities to complete the survey and return it to EPA, the states are expected to ensure completion. So the Division of Water will be working closely with the Utilities on this project. Luckily, a large majority of the information comes out of our WRIS system and is readily available. This Needs Survey is very important since funding to the states is based on the information gathered. There is a little over \$1.1 billion that goes toward the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF). She noted that KIA received about 1.6% of that last year. If the state did nothing, KIA would be guaranteed 1% of the funding, the extra 0.6% we received accounted for \$7 million. Even a small percentage increase can account for significant additional funding. Ms. Williams asked Mr. Becker if he had any additional comments pertaining to the Needs Survey. Mr. Becker reiterated that 70 Utilities were on the list and that none of them had currently been contacted. An email blast will be sent out to system contacts as soon as they receive the information from EPA. If anyone has any questions, please contact Mr. Becker. All the information will be completed and submitted back to EPA in October.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked if a PowerPoint presentation was prepared for the New Board Member Orientation, it might be helpful if it was distributed to all Board members as a review. Director Williams said she would be more than happy to send everyone a copy.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$12,350,000 TO THE CITY OF MOUNT STERLING, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Mount Sterling, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$12,350,000 of project expense including permanent financing for planning & design loan A20-007 in the amount of \$525,000 and \$11,825,000 for construction, and capitalized interest for the construction

period, to the City of Mount Sterling for the Wastewater Capacity Upgrade Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$30,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$618,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 11,965 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$40,976. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

Financial information was obtained from the Mount Sterling City's audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020 for the business type-activities of Mount Sterling City and Water and Sewer Commission. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total operating revenues have increased 5.4% from 5.64M in 2018 to 5.94M in 2020 while total operating expenses have increased 9.1% from 3.40M in 2018 to 3.72M in 2020. The debt coverage ratio was above 2.4 for 2018 and above 3.5 for 2019 and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet for the year of 2020 reflects a current ratio of 5.6, debt to equity ratio of 0.3, 47.7 days of sales in accounts receivable and 26 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Future revenue projections are expected to remain flat.
- 2) Expenses are projected to rise 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) The existing debt obligations will be paid off by FY2025.

4) Debt service coverage will be 1.6 in FY2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$618,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$30,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

The City of Providence is requesting a planning and design Fund A loan in the amount of \$700,000 for the Providence Sanitary Sewer Upgrades project.

The City of Providence has received Notices of Violation from the KY Division of Enforcement concerning the current state of the Providence Wastewater Treatment System and is currently under an Agreed Order. This project will document and prioritize needed repairs and cleaning in the collection system: approximately 42,000 LF of sewer line, 120 manholes and 6 pump stations in order to prevent overflows and reduce excessive inflows & infiltration in the worst identified areas. Also, this project includes planning and designing the WWTP improvements.

The sewer project will be associated with a project of replacing waterlines that are running directly parallel on the sewer lines. The total cost of the two projects will be \$7,230,000.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 2,861 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$26,849. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 2.50% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total operating revenues have increased 5.8% from 4.75 M in 2017 to 5.03 M in 2019 while total operating expenses have decreased 5.6% from 4.19 M in 2017 to 3.96 M in 2019. There was a significant decrease in the water treatment and collection expenses due to several leak repairs in the water and sewer distribution systems.

The balance sheet for the year of 2019 reflects a current ratio of 1.8, debt to equity ratio of 1.1, 42.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Future revenue projections are expected to remain flat.
- 2) Expenses are projected to rise 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) The existing debt obligations will be paid off by FY2023.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 4.8 in FY2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,270,000 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT (MSD), JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$8,270,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and

Jefferson County MSD for the Rosa Terrace, Sanders, Wathen, and Sonne Pump Station Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of March, 2021.

The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sanitation District (MSD) is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$8,270,000 for the Rosa Terrace, Sanders, Wathen and Sonne Pump Station project. This project will eliminate the Rosa Terrace and Sonne Avenue pump stations and replace the Wathen Lane and Sanders Lane pump stations. These are some of the most problematic pump stations in Jefferson County and all four are in low to moderate income areas. All of the pump stations are in the Dixie Highway area of Louisville adjacent to or just outside this significant commercial corridor.

The Rosa Terrace pump station will be eliminated with nearly 1,500 linear feet of eightinch gravity sewer. Construction will occur in a residential/commercial area and will involve a railroad crossing. Some of the proposed sewer will be relatively deep which may require some more specialized construction techniques such as stacked trenchboxes or shoring, larger excavation equipment, and/or trench-less installation methods (jack-and-bore, micro-tunneling, etc.). Overall, the average depth of the sewer is approximately 17-feet.

Over 2,700 linear feet of eight-inch gravity sewer will be used to eliminate the Sonne Avenue Pump Station. In addition to having to cross a state road (Dixie Highway - 31W), portions of the sewer will be somewhat deep and in a residential area. Fortunately, there are numerous detour options and the impact to residents will be relatively minor.

To eliminate the Wathen Lane pump station rehabilitation project consists of a full replacement of the existing pump station. The existing pump station will be replaced with a new, modern station and will utilize the existing 6" force main. As part of the layout of the proposed station, a dedicated entrance drive and concrete maintenance pad will be constructed to provide MSD staff with a safe and secure area to service the pump station in the future.

The Sanders Lane pump station rehabilitation project consists of the replacement of approximately 450 linear feet of existing 4" force main from the existing pump station. The new force main will follow the same general alignment of the existing. In addition

to the force main replacement, there will be additional site improvements to the area immediately adjacent to the existing pump station. A dedicated entrance drive and concrete maintenance pad will be constructed to provide MSD staff with a safe and secure area to service the pump station in the future. This new concrete pad will also house a new emergency backup generator and the upgraded electrical components.

Currently MSD serves over 220,000 residential and over 21,000 commercial and industrial customers.

The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 14.3% from \$279 million in 2018 to \$319 million in 2020. The \$319 million includes \$6.9 million in wastewater revenues that are related to the OCEA acquisition. MSD's board can approve rate increases up to 7% without needed approval from Louisville Metro Council which they have done in 2018 and 2019 audited years and 5% in 2020 driving the annual increases in revenue. Wastewater service charges totaled \$237.8 million in 2020 while storm water service charges totaled \$75 million. Operating expenses increased 17.6% during the same time period from \$93.8 million to \$110.3 million. Expense increases were attributed mostly to increased operations and maintenance expenses in connection with the OCEA as well as various weather events (flooding) that occurred during the audited period observed. The debt coverage ratio for 2018-2020 was 1.62, 1.63, and 1.71 respectively (includes only net operating income).

The 1993 Sewer and Drainage System Revenue Bond Resolution requires MSD to provide available revenues sufficient to pay 110% of each year's aggregate net debt service on revenue bonds and 100% of operating expenses. Each year MSD's audit contains a Comparative Schedule of Debt Service Coverage which includes net operating income as well as other sources of revenue including investment income and current period payments of property owner assessments. When factoring in those additional revenue streams, MSD's debt coverage ratio from 2018-2020 was 1.6, 1.6, and 1.7 respectively. Moody's Investors Service affirmed an Aa3 rating for MSD on September 14, 2020 for outstanding senior revenue bonds with a stable outlook. S&P Rating Service affirmed an AA long term rating and stable outlook on September 11, 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 3.6, 31.1 days sales in accounts receivable, and 10.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Revenues will increase 6.9% each forecasted year due to rate increases

anticipated from MSD's Board.

- 2) Expenses will increase 4% for inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses for pending projects.
- 3) The forecast includes debt service for both approved KIA loans for MSD including A19-015 and A19-028 (total of \$25,870,000).
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 and above during the projected FY 2021-2025.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-031) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000 TO THE CITY OF FRANKFORT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Frankfort, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$1,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Frankfort for the Miami Trails Sanitary Sewer Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$76,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of March 2021.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$76,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$3,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$124,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$6,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

XI. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

KIA staff recommends approval of the loan with the standard conditions and the following special conditions:

- The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,491,916 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than <u>2025</u>.
- 2) By March 31, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the McKinney Water District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$202,000, which equates approximately to rates increased by 22% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 5,114 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$31,624. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The increase will qualify for a 20-year loan term at 0.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$348,250 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues were basically flat from \$2.43 million in 2018 to \$2.44 in 2020 while operating expenses decreased 5.7% from \$2.50 million to \$2.35 million during the same period primarily due to the accounts payable and interest payable portions due to an ongoing expansion project. The debt coverage ratio was (0.7), (0.1), and 1.1 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.5, a debt to equity ratio of 1.9, 42.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1 month of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will continue to increase annually due to the 2% increase for water and 2% increase for sewer approved by the City.
- 2) Sewer rates are estimated to increase an additional 11% in 2022 to cover debt service for permanent financing for a sewer project currently under construction. The city has a \$3.65 million ongoing sewer project financed with a BAN through the Kentucky Rural Water Association Finance Corporation. Permanent financing is anticipated to be in place around June 2021 through U.S. Rural Development.
- 3) Expenses are projected to continue to increase 2% due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$34,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$1,700 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 4th day of March, 2021.
