I. <u>PROCEEDINGS</u>

Chairman Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of December 5, 2024

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the minutes of the December 5, 2024, regularly scheduled meeting. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-018) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$28,550,000, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$48,275,000 TO THE CITY OF FRANKFORT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Frankfort's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$28,550,000 for Phase III of their East Frankfort Interceptor (EFI) Wet Weather Facility project. This project received approval for \$19,725,000 from the KIA Board on June 3, 2021. This brings their total KIA loan amount up to \$48,275,000.

This will be a major project in Frankfort Sewer Department's Long Term Control Plan. The proposed project includes new installation of approximately 11,000 LF of 42-inch diameter gravity sewer around the east side of the FSD service area, a 3 MG wet weather storage facility, approximately 30 manholes, two sets of triple barrel siphons (one set under the Kentucky River and one set under Cove Spring Park). KY River siphons are approximately 1,400 LF each barrel and Cove Spring siphons are approximately 3,000 LF each barrel, control gates, flow control/metering, and SCADA integration. This project will also allow the Farmdale Sanitation District to move forward in the elimination of multiple package wastewater treatment plants and opens capacity in the southern sewers of FSD's service area.

The City of Frankfort serves approximately 12,177 residential customers and 2,196 commercial and industrial customers.

Secretary Goodman asked if there had been any pushback from residents on the rate changes. Frankfort officials said there had not been.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Fund A loan increase to the City of Frankfort for an amount of \$228,550,000 for a total loan amount up to \$48,275,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was unanimously passed.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-020S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$933,456 TO THE CITY OF STURGIS, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Sturgis' request for a Fund A loan, A24-020S for an amount up to \$933,245 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Upgrade project. The City is currently under an Agreed Order (AO) with the Energy and Environment Cabinet and this project is necessary to satisfy the requirements of the AO. The projects include the following components:

- Auger screen on the wastewater influent lines
- Replacement of lagoon liners
- Mechanical bar screens in force main to oxidation ditch and lagoon
- · Switch gear for automatic switch over of auxiliary power
- Telemetry at all lift stations for monitoring of all 11 stations from the WWTP
 - New lab equipment for testing and monitoring
- 4 auto control valves on the influent lines
- 4 air releases on the force mains to the WWTP

These improvements at the WWTP are needed to keep the City in compliance with its KPDES permit.

Secretary Goodman asked local officials about the amount of past due accounts and if there had been pushback to getting the outstanding monies paid. Local representatives said no, that if the bills are not paid, customer services are shut down until the bill is current.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A24—20S for an amount up to \$933,456 to the City of Sturgis with the standard conditions. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-016S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,387,000 TO THE CITY OF SCOTTSVILLE, ALLEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Scottsville's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$6,387,000 for the Inflow & Infiltration (I&I) Phase 1 project. The project will rehabilitate and replace portions of the City's sewer collection system to reduce wet weather induced flows into the system to eliminate sanitary sewer overflows (SSO's). The City entered into an Agreed Order (AO) with the Kentucky Division of Water for Notices of Violation of SSO's caused by excess I&I into the collection system upstream of the Baptist Hollow Pump Station (PS). This project is necessary to achieve full compliance with the AO.

Approximately 20,000 linear feet of gravity sewer line will be either repaired or replaced based on SSES field investigations. Additionally, the project will include upgrading and expanding the Baptist Hollow PS. Minor rehabilitation will also be completed on other PS's throughout the system. This will provide greater capacity, and the new pumps will have premium efficient motors and VFD's. The overall

project of reducing I& into the collection system will save energy usage and costs at the PS and treatment plant.

The City currently serves 2,533 residential customers and 433 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A25-016S, for an amount up to \$6,387,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,280,000 TO THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Morganfield's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,280,000 for the planning and design portion of their Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Upgrade project. The City's WWTP was commissioned in the 1940's and was designed for 3.5 million gallons of capacity. The facility was originally constructed for Camp Breckinridge, a World War II infantry division and prisoner-of-war camp that served a population of nearly 40,000 people. The plant now serves a significantly smaller population and will not need the same capacity. The WWTP needs a full rehabilitation and most of the existing equipment needs replacement to allow the system to stay in compliance with its KPDES permit. There is currently an Agreed Order with the Kentucky Division of Water, which outlines several improvements that must be made. The planning and design funding will help the City figure out how to most efficiently meet these requirements.

The City currently serves 1,817 residential customers and 105 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A25-022, for an amount up to \$1,280,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-006) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE WESTERN PULASKI COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Western Pulaski County Water District's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$4,000,000 for Phase 2 of the Faubush/Nancy Area Water Transmission project. This is a continuation of a project to extend and replace existing water lines from the new Lees Ford Pump Station along Highway 80 through Nancy, then along Highway 196 to Faubush. The project will consist of the installation of approximately 21,500 linear feet (LF) of 12" PVC water transmission main. The new 12" line will replace approximately 17,000 LF of the existing 8" line and 4,500 LF of the existing 6" line that runs parallel with each other along Highway 80 and onto Highway 196. The purpose of the project is to meet the demands and growth in the western portion of the system near Lake Cumberland. The existing lines are undersized to carry a flow of 1,200 gallons per minute, which the new Lees Ford Pump Station is rated.

The Water District currently serves 9,685 residential customers and 63 commercial customers.

Mr. Ron Parritt abstained from voting. Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B25-005 for an amount up to \$4,000,000 to the Western Pulaski County Water District with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The Water District will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that revenues will need to increase approximately \$225,000, or 5%, by FY2027 to meet the loan requirement. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-016S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,522,000 TO THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD, WASHINGTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Springfield's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,522,000 for their Water Main Assessment, Replacement Planning & Design - WTP & Priority Area 3 project. This project includes an assessment of the aging system and the design and construction components of replacing the aging facilities in Priority Area 3. Improvements at the WTP include the replacement of the in-line turbidity units and controls and the installation of granular activated carbon contract to reduce emerging contaminants.

The Springfield Water & Sewer Commission currently serves 4,792 residential customers and 292 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Geri Grigsby made the motion to approve the fund F loan, F25-016S, for an amount up to \$4,522,000 to the City of Springfield with the standard conditions. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W25-004E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,487,450 TO THE CITY OF EDDYVILLE, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Rick Harris, KIA, discussed the Emergency Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance Fund which was established to provide funding for troubled or economically restrained systems. The funding is dedicated to capital and non-capital expenses relating to restoring or avoiding imminent interruption of utility service provided by a public water or wastewater system after a declaration of emergency has been declared.

The Governor and the City of Eddyville have declared a state of emergency due to harsh weather conditions, which in part contributed to the malfunction. On Monday, January 6, 2025, the City of Eddyville Sewer Treatment Plant had a catastrophic failure to the Sequencing Batch Reactor Tank. The initial release from the tank was estimated at approximately 400,000 gallons of partially treated sewage; it was estimated that approximately 800,000 gallons were lost before the partially treated sewage in the tank could be pumped out into a temporary tank. A structural assessment was conducted on January 7, 2025; a comprehensive investigation to determine the cause of the failure will likely require a substantial investment of hundreds of thousands of dollars and up to a year. Damage consisting of buckled wall plates of the tank's outer shell was observed in multiple places. Buckling defects are localized areas where the tank wall deforms inwards due to excessive force.

The project will address the immediate response and temporary treatment needs associated with the Eddyville Wastewater Treatment Plant Sequencing Batch

Reactor Tank. This project includes costs for overtime, equipment, fuel and supplies, and temporary treatment processes. Blue Tank & Pump Rental brought in an emergency tank to resolve the immediate emergency. This project includes the operation of that temporary treatment solution for a period of 24 months, until a permanent treatment system can be constructed, as well as disinfection, pumps, and blowers. The project also includes dredging of the sludge lagoons to provide necessary pretreatment and capacity during temporary treatment, environmental fines and response fees, and engineering and administrative costs. These components will provide the City with a means to continue treating raw wastewater and to protect the environment around the property and receiving water bodies.

The city currently serves 683 residential and 246 commercial/industrial customers.

Several officials from Eddyville were in attendance to discuss the dire situation and provided some photographs of the damage.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Emergency KYWWATERS grant, W25-004E for an amount up to \$5,487,450 to the City of Eddyville. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the grant was unanimously approved.

8. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. *Ms.* Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for coming. She mentioned KIA submitted suggestions to the General Assembly members about the KYWWATERS funding to improve the program.

 KIA Board to Make Funding Decisions – The KY WWATERS eligibility criteria and scoring criteria are legislatively prescribed and the board has a strong track record of successfully administering programs with "funding lists" under both the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (since 1988) and the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (since 1997). With KIA administering both the regular program and the emergency program, there would be no lag in knowing how much funding is available. There could be emergency projects approved by the Board after the December 1st report is submitted to LRC, reducing the amount of funding available to be allocated.

- Define the process once the General Assembly has received the report from KIA – KIA is unable to answer questions beyond a response of, "The General Assembly will select the projects to receive funding."
- 3. Expand timeframe for violations, agreed orders (AO), and consent decrees (CD) In the case of CDs and AOs, some may be greater than a year old and compliance with such orders may have included phases for construction activities lasting greater than a year. Economically restrained communities may not have been able to comply with violations until funding was made available to do so. If the CD/AO or violation is not closed out by the Energy and Environment Cabinet, and the project works towards compliance with the CD/AO or violation, then it should count in the criteria.
- 4. Scoring Criteria Revisions Consider redefining the criteria for scoring.
 - a. Accounts Payable Turnover Ratio delete this requirement. This was not a key indicator.
 - b. Accounts Receivable Ratio delete this requirement. This was not a key indicator.
 - c. Timeline for Notice of Violation or Agreed Order Delete requirement for NOV or AO entered into within a year. Many of these solutions to compliance may take decades.
- Further limit eligibility of Eligible Applicant Consider redefining the eligibility for KY WWATERS to an applicant that meets more than 1 of the eligibility criteria. Recommend requiring applicants to meet at least 3 of the qualifiers to submit an application. This metric revision will focus on those systems most economically restrained.

She noted the federal government spending pause that happened recently. KIA's receipt of federal funding through the EPA for Funds A and F was briefly paused, but that is no longer the case. There is a federal funding system that KIA's accounting team uses to draw down funds from the loans and grants that have been awarded. The A and F loans are federally funded. Access to the federal funding was not available for a brief period and was then restored. Director Williams mentioned that the loans that KIA had awarded with principal forgiveness are the biggest concern. The principal forgiveness is 100% federal funding. Secretary Goodman noted that that would be catastrophic should that happen. Commissioner Sawyers noted that funding at DLG was also paused, but with the temporary restraining order that was put in place the funding was reinstated.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$74,006,047 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A23-007) to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on December 7, 2023 in the amount of \$27,783,547, and a loan increase on July 11, 2024 in the amount of \$26,222,500. The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District has requested to increase loan A23-007 by \$20,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$74,006,047 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 2.45%, not to exceed \$1,812,951, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$72,193,096 shall be repaid

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of March, 2025.

This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of life-threatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 427,764 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$36,514. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$55,454. The loan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for \$15,082,000 of Green Project Reserve funding. The majority of the green project components fall under the environmentally innovative category.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of \$1,812,951 will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 16.7% from \$365.4 million in 2022 to \$426.3 million in 2024 primarily due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 15.9% from \$118.9 to \$137.9 million during the same period due to higher service and administration costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.8, 1.9, and 2.0 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.8, 37.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 6% annually in projected years due to current and anticipated rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses for pending projects.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains debt reserve accounts on its senior obligations equal to at least 10% of the face amount of all bonds issued outstanding, 100% of the maximum aggregate net debt service in the current year or any future fiscal year, or 125% of the average aggregate net debt service in the current or any future fiscal year.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A23-007E) to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on August 3, 2023 in the amount of \$1,118,600, and an increase on May 9, 2024 in the amount of \$2,544,580. The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District has requested to increase Ioan A23-007E by \$2,544,580; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$6,207,760 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 100%, not to exceed \$6,207,760, will be deducted from the approved loan amount.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of March, 2025.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 427,764 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$36,514. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$55,454.

VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for \$15,082,000 of Green Project Reserve funding. The majority of the green project components fall under the environmentally innovative category.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and

Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 16.7% from \$365.4 million in 2022 to \$426.3 million in 2024 primarily due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 15.9% from \$118.9 to \$137.9 million during the same period due to higher service and administration costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.8, 1.9, and 2.0 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.8, 37.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 6% annually in projected years due to current and anticipated rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses for pending projects.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains debt reserve accounts on its senior obligations equal to at least 10% of the face amount of all bonds issued outstanding, 100% of the maximum aggregate net debt service in the current year or any future fiscal year, or 125% of the average aggregate net debt service in the current or any future fiscal year.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$300,000 of project expense, to the City of Burnside for the Burnside Water Storage Tank project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized. Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$750 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$15,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

The City of Burnside is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$300,000 for the Burnside Water Storage Tank project. This loan will supplement previously awarded Cleaner Water Program grants to fully fund the project after bids came in over budget. The project will add a second water storage tank to the distribution system providing the City with greater capacity and the ability to take one tank out of service in the event of an emergency of for inspection or maintenance. The project consists of the construction of approximately 130 linear feet of 8-inch PVC water line and a 200,000-gallon steel ground storage tank. Additionally, the 300-foot access road to the tank will be re-graveled.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Burnside is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$300,000 for the Burnside Water Storage Tank project. This loan will supplement previously awarded Cleaner Water Program grants to fully fund the project after bids came in over budget. The project will add a second water storage tank to the distribution system providing the City with greater capacity and the ability to take one tank out of service in the event of an emergency or for inspection or maintenance. The project consists of the construction of approximately 130 linear feet of 8-inch PVC water line and a 200,000-gallon steel ground storage tank. Additionally, the 300-foot access road to the tank will be re-graveled.

The City of Burnside serves 568 residential customers and 35 commercial and industrial customers. The City produces approximately 85 percent of its water and purchases the remaining 15 percent from the Southeastern Water Association.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 1,314 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$44,443. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The Ioan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021, through June 30, 2022. Financial information for the year ended June 30, 2023, was obtained from an unaudited financial statement and verified with profit and loss statements. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Modest increases in water and sewer revenues were outpaced by rising operating expenses due to plant repairs and inflation in 2021 and 2022, resulting in debt service coverage ratios of 0.2 and 0.7, respectively. The City passed an ordinance in the

summer of 2022 stating that water and sewer rates will be increased annually based according to the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index. A ten percent increase in combined water and sewer revenues coupled with steadied operating expenses resulting in a debt service coverage ratio of 1.1 in 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.7, 28.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- Water and sewer revenue projections for the first eight months of FY 2025 were calculated based on the City's July 2024 rate changes. The City subsequently discovered a calculation error in the rate changes and adjusted the rates in February of 2025. Revenue projections for the final four months of FY 2025 reflect the adjusted water and sewer rates.
- Water and sewer revenues will increase annually according to the Consumer Price Index, which is assumed to be 3 percent for fiscal years 2026 through 2029.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 4) Purchased water/treatment/related costs will increase 1 percent annually due to an increase in Southeaster Water Association's wholesale rate and general expense increases.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$15,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$750 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-008S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Hopkinsville, Kentucky, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$8,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Hopkinsville, Kentucky for the HWEA Phase V-E – Hopkinsville DWTP – GAC Membrane

Filtration project operated and controlled by the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority on behalf of and for the benefit of the City. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness not to exceed \$5,256,237 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,743,763 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$20,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$400,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of March, 2025.

The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water and sewer revenues increased 8.4% from \$20.67 million in 2022 to \$22.4 million in 2024 due to an increase in sewer rates. Operating expenses increased 15.2% from \$12.98 million to \$14.96 million during the same period primarily due to increases in chemicals and repairs and maintenance. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.3, and 1.3 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.9, 29.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Wholesale water rates/revenues will increase in FY26 and FY27 per Municipal Order 42-2024 pending PSC approval; all other revenues will remain the same.
- 2) Expenses for water and sewer will increase 2% each year due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2030 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$400,000 total) of the final amount borrowed, prior to principal forgiveness, to be funded annually (\$20,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W25-005E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$501,755 TO THE CITY OF ELKHORN, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, House Bill 563 (the "Bill") of the 2024 General Assembly amended the Act to create the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (WWATERS) Program (the "Fund") in order to fund capital and non-capital expenses of public water or wastewater systems that meet the eligibility requirements set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans and grants to public water or wastewater systems for the purpose of providing funds for capital and non-capital expenses, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such public water or wastewater systems governing the provisions in respect of which such loans and grants are to be made, the amounts thereof and, if applicable, the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

<u>Section 3.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes an Emergency Kentucky WWATERS Fund grant in the amount of \$501,755, to the City of Eddyville. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this grant is authorized. <u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority on this 6th day of March, 2025.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of March, 2025.
