PROCEEDINGS

Mr. Bruce Scott, First Vice-Chair, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He asked Ms. Suzanne Molley, DLG Staff Attorney, to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of February 7, 2019

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the minutes of the February 7, 2019, regular board meeting. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

Mr. Scott noted that the Lincoln County Sanitation Project would be presented first in order for the two Morehead projects to be presented together.

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A PLANNING AND DESIGN LOAN (A19-048) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$388,400 TO THE LINCOLN COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Lincoln County Sanitation District's request for a Fund A Planning and Design loan in the amount of \$388,400 for the US 127 Corridor Sanitary Sewer Phase 2 project. This project will fund the planning and design of a project that will bring sanitary sewer to approximately 355 homes and 8 commercial customers that are currently on private septic systems nearing the end of their useful life. The area has seen rapid residential growth over the recent past and is currently underserved. This second phase will complete service to virtually all subdivisions on the east and west side of US 127 from the Norfolk Southern Railroad North to KY Hwy 1194.

The District has received national recognition from US EPA for their accomplishments with Phase 1 of this project including an Honorable Mention for the 2018 PISCES award. The first phase brought service to over 600 households and commercial customers in Lincoln County. The District is still in process of bringing all of those customers online and should have that completed somewhere near the end of 2019 per their estimated timeline. Connection delays have been experienced due to a shortage of plumbers able to perform the work and poor weather conditions, but the District will continue to push forward.

The District was established on May 10, 2011 by the Lincoln County Fiscal Court. It is governed by five directors who are appointed by the County Judge Executive and approved by the fiscal court. Connection to the public wastewater system is mandatory within four months of the date that a property owner is notified that service is available.

Ms. Melinda Hill moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-048) for an amount up to \$388,400 with the standard conditions. Mr. Robert Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-032) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,650,000 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Morehead Plant Utility Board's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$3,650,000 for the US 60 West and KY 801 SSO Correction project. This project will improve the sanitary sewer collection system in order to address capacity issues and sanitary system overflows (SSO). MUPB began recording SSO events circa 1998. In 2000, MUPB was released from their Agreed Order with the Kentucky Division of Water. Since 1998, MUPB has recorded 396 SSO events throughout their collection system; 245 of the recorded 396 SSO events, approximately 62%, have occurred in the proposed capital improvement project area. Currently, the majority of the SSO events occur at the lift station wet wells in the proposed project area. However, the manholes found in lower elevation areas, such as Salt Lick, often overflow when the pump stations become backed up. Increasing the line capacity will alleviate the bottleneck and allow the lift stations to pump at their designed capacity, thus reducing SSO events. Approximately 65,500 linear feet of line will be rehabilitated as well as 5 lift stations and related appurtenances. Two of the lift stations will be equipped with SCADA and three will be equipped with VFD devices to increase energy efficiency.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board currently serves 5,581 sewer customers, 3,453 water customers, and also provides natural gas to customers in Rowan County.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,554,200 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Morehead Utility Plant Board's request for the first increment of a Multi-Phased Fund F loan in the amount of \$5,257,000 for the Regional Water Treatment Plant Construction project. Prior KIA Loan F18-004 (\$1,297,200) which funded the planning and design of this project will be rolled into this increment of the loan for a total of \$6,554,200. KIA plans to fund this major project in annual increments from the 2019 funding cycle through 2023. Each year the Utility will undergo a financial analysis and reapply to KIA for authorization of supplemental funding. Project progress and finances will be reviewed with each supplemental application.

Phase One will be completed in the first year (2019) and will include a new raw water intake and raw water transmission line. Phase Two will begin in the second year and be completed in the fourth year (2020-2022); the second phase will include the construction of the new water treatment plant. The final phase of the project will begin in the fourth year and be completed in the fifth year (2023) and will include the construction of a new ground storage tank and a finished water line.

The new raw water intake will replace the existing intake structure located approximately three miles below the Cave Run Lake Dam on the Licking River. It will be a fixed structure on Cave Run Lake and will include variable intake depths. The new Cave Run Lake raw water intake structure will include a new 1,000 kW standby diesel generator. The intake structure will feature security fencing to encompass the site. Approximately 6,500 LF of 24" DI pipe will be installed to connect the intake structure to the water treatment plant. The relocation of the intake is expected to significantly improve raw water quality with a much better turbidity.

The new 12 million gallons per day (MGD) regional water treatment plant (WTP) will replace the existing 8 MGD WTP. The proposed 12 MGD regional WTP will feature new and improved technologies that have been introduced to the treatment process since the last major expansion of the existing plant in 2002. The plant will employ pretreatment flocculation using flash mix and a flocculation basin, a membrane pressure filtration system, and a granular activated carbon (GAC) adsorption system for treatment. The new WTP will include all new treatment and administration facilities on a site near the existing WTP, upgraded SCADA/telemetry for the WTP and distribution system sites along with an increased clearwell capacity of 1,800,000 gallons (currently 1,237,000 gallons). Three 1 MG earthen lagoons will be constructed (for a total capacity of 3 MG) for residual sludge containment of the water generated from membrane backwashes, flux maintenance, enhanced flux maintenance, and clean-in-place operations. The site will be secured through the construction of security fencing to surround the facility.

Approximately 4,500 LF of finished waterline will be extended to a new one million gallon ground storage tank. The existing US 60 tank will be decommissioned (621,000 gallons) and the new tank will serve as its replacement. The project will increase the net storage volume of the utility by 379,000 gallons once the increased clearwell capacity is obtained and the US 60 tank is decommissioned. Given the demand for potable water in the area, no issues are anticipated with respect to mixing or turnover for the new tank. To reduce the risk of disinfection by-product (DBP) formation, this issue will be taken into consideration during the design phase and site identification of the storage tank.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board currently serves 5,581 sewer customers, 3,453 water customers, and also provides natural gas to customers in Rowan County. In addition, they sell approximately 434 MG of water to the Bath County Water District and approximately 620 MG to Rowan Water, Inc. annually. Both of these systems will contribute to debt

service for this project through wholesale rate increases which will be passed on to customers of those systems. Both Bath County Water District and Rowan Water are PSC regulated.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-048) for an amount up to \$388,400 and Fund F (F19-002) in an amount up to \$6,554,200 with the standard conditions. Ms. Melinda Hill seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Ms. Gwen Pinson moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil addressed the group. Per previous discussion about coordinating an Infrastructure Funding Agency Workgroup, with Linda Bridwell's arrival, KIA staff is moving forward with a meeting on Tuesday, March 12th at 2:30. Attendees will include individuals representing Rural Development, DLG and KIA initially. The first meeting will be to strategize and determine what other agencies should be involved, including the Division of Water and the Public Service Commission, that are facing infrastructure issues and how to get projects moving forward. The Corp of Engineers has already contacted Director McNeil and asked to be included.

Jeff Abshire is working on the Capital Plan for 2020-2026. It is due to the Capital Plan Advisory Board by April 15th, a draft is due to Director McNeil for review by March 27th. This will be an Agenda item for the April 4th Board meeting.

Director McNeil received an email on the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund relating to the America's Water infrastructure Act of 2018 that was passed last October. EPA has sent a draft document asking for comments back by March 18th. Anyone interested in receiving a copy for review, please let Director McNeil know. Some major issues include: the states must provide principal forgiveness from 6% up to 35%, that is a change from 0% to 30% to disadvantaged communities, repayments currently have to begin repayment after one year and that has been changed to 18 months, it isn't a requirement to wait 18

months, but it is now an option, Director McNeil wants to investigate further. It now allows all loans a 30 year term, with disadvantaged communities having a 40 year repayment option. This is not applicable to the Clean Water program.

EPA is doing a needs survey in 2019, that is mandated by statute. More information will be coming in the spring. Next month, Director McNeil will be attending the CIFA Conference and is Co-Chair of the SRF State/EPA Workgroup and the survey will be a topic of discussion. The Drinking Utilities will be required to report on lead service lines for the next 20 years and that includes up to the residential foundation. The SRF does allow the state to pay for construction on private property up to the foundation for lead service line replacement. Linda has begun researching this with other states and will investigate any liabilities that may be involved. KIA staff will meet with Division of Water staff to further discuss how this would be implemented. In regards to the set asides, it now allows for funds to be used for source water protection areas. Division of Water will need to review.

A Congressional report is due October 23 where Congress has required the Government Accountability Office to prepare a report on the federal crosscutters on the Drinking Water SRF. There is a particular interest on Davis Bacon. Currently Davis Bacon is now required for the State Revolving Fund, but not for Rural Development.

There is a section regarding asset management. It encourages the states to pursue asset management in their capacity development strategies. EPA is to update their materials by October 2023. Asset management software is an eligible expenditure for the Drinking Water SRF programs, if it is part of a loan or if the Division of Water determines that it is a priority for set aside funds.

There is also a section on a consolidation incentive relating to the Energy and Environment Cabinet primacy enforcement strategies. If EEC has determined that a utility has to look into consolidation in order to comply with an Agreed Order, it is eligible for funding. These are some highlights. A full copy is available, interested parties should contact Director McNeil and one can be provided.

Dirk Bedarff, KIA's legal counsel at Dinsmore passed away unexpectedly last week. His interim replacement will be Roger Peterman. Dirk had worked with KIA for many years and had extensive historical information pertaining to KIA.

The offices of KIA and DLG will be moving across town. No date has been determined as of yet, logistics are being worked out. At a future meeting, the By-Laws will need to be updated to change KIA's location. Director McNeil also noted that with the remaining loans that need to be presented, the May and June Board meetings will require longer meetings to discuss the remaining projects.

Director McNeil, asked Bruce Scott to discuss the status of the Concurrent Resolutions in the House and the Senate. Mr. Scott noted there had been five or six Resolutions filed approximately at the same time relating to water and sewer infrastructure, including the EEC filing a bill, HJR71, which was killed and then taken over Concurrent HB56 and SB81 and modified them with Committee subs. Both Bills passed out of their respective Chambers and are now in the opposite Chambers for consideration. The State and Local

Government Committees have now rested for over a week. EEC has asked if the HB56 could be considered this coming Monday and have been told yes, but still am uncertain of the fate of at this time. There is a 21 member Task Force that is very interested in getting infrastructure moving forward.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR ASSUMPTION OF THE CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A98-04) BY THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assumption Agreement for the A98-04 loan under the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Federally Assisted Clean Water State Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water State Revolving Fund Ioan commitment for assumption of the A98-04 Fund A Ioan to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District. The Ioan shall be subject to existing amortization schedules. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assumption agreement for this Ioan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable in 2.5 years at an annual interest rate of 3.8% subject to determination of the tax status of the project. These terms are subject to adjustment upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of April, 2019.

KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY WASTEWATER REVOLVING LOAN FUND (FUND A) LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT LOAN ASSUMPTION

I. DESCRIPTION

Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District ("MSD") plans to assume a Fund A wastewater loan (A98-04) from the City of Crestwood in Oldham County as part of MSD's acquisition of the Crestwood wastewater system and all of its assets. The original loan to Crestwood included a sewer collection system for the residents of Crestwood and Park Lake which transported waste to MSD's Hite Creek Plant. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on April 28th, 1998. MSD entered into an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Crestwood on September 3, 1996. Since then MSD has provided operational and maintenance services to Crestwood for wastewater collection and treatment, responded to customer calls, provided billing services, and managed regulatory programs such as the Consent Decree. Kentucky Revised Statutes changed in 2018 allowing for an acquisition of the Crestwood system by MSD. This acquisition is attractive to both parties in order to continue a high level of service while maintaining a competitive billing rate for existing Crestwood customers. For MSD, the acquisition gives MSD the opportunity to provide wastewater services to potential development in the area and achieve greater economies of scale.

When the transfer of assets is complete, Crestwood customers will transition to the normal MSD rate structure above resulting in savings for the customer as the existing debt service surcharge for Crestwood customers will be eliminated.

IV. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for Louisville MSD for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018 from the combined wastewater and stormwater funds. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 14.7% from \$243 million in 2016 to \$279 million in 2018. MSD's board can approve rate increases up to 7% without needed approval from Louisville Metro Council which they have done each audited year observed (2016-18) driving the annual increases in revenue. Wastewater service charges totaled \$210.6 million in 2018 while stormwater service charges totaled \$63.8 million. Operating expenses increased 7.6% during the same time period from \$87 million to \$94 million.

Expense increases were attributed mostly to increased labor expense as well as various weather events (flooding) that occurred during the audited period observed. The debt coverage ratio for 2016-2018 was 1.5, 1.5, and 1.6 respectively (includes only net operating income).

The 1993 Sewer and Drainage System Revenue Bond Resolution requires MSD to provide available revenues sufficient to pay 110% of each year's aggregate net debt service on revenue bonds and 100% of operating expenses. Each year MSD's audit contains a Comparative Schedule of Debt Service Coverage which includes net operating income as well as other sources of revenue including investment income and current period payments of property owner assessments. When factoring in those additional revenue streams, MSD's debt coverage ratio from 2016-2018 was 1.9, 1.8, and 1.9 respectively. Moody's Investors Service affirmed an Aa3 rating for MSD on June 27, 2018 for outstanding senior revenue bonds with a stable outlook. S&P Global affirmed an AA rating and stable outlook on April 24, 2018.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.1, a debt to equity ratio of 3.7, 34.4 days sales in accounts receivable, and 6.4 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 6.9% each forecasted year due to rate increases anticipated from MSD's Board.
- 2) Expenses will increase 4% for inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses for pending projects.
- 3) The forecast includes debt service for both recently approved KIA loans A19-015 and A19-028 (total of \$25,870,000).
- 4) MSD will make the June 1, 2019 debt service payment for the existing KIA loan.
- 5) MSD will pay off an existing loan with PNC bank held by Crestwood upon execution of the acquisition. Payoff is currently estimated at \$750,000 and has been included in the forecast.
- 6) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2019 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$152 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,944,345 TO THE OLDHAM COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORITY, OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Oldham County Environmental Authority, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$2,944,345 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Oldham County Environmental Authority for the Lift Station Rehab, Renovation, and Replacement Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$7,400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$148,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of April, 2019.

Every customer is billed a flat fee in addition to the usage rate to help pay for the Utility's debt service. The CapEx fee was last adjusted in August, 2017 from \$24.76 to \$28.66 and expects to go up again in 2019 with additional debt.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. Storm water reporting was consolidated into the 2016 and 2017 audits but removed in 2018 after takeover by the Oldham County Storm Water Management District.

HISTORY

Overall revenues decreased 1.9% from \$6.67 million in 2016 to \$6.54 million in 2018 after the removal of storm water operations in spite of a 7% sewer rate increase in 2018. Expenses decreased 12% from \$4.49 million in 2016 to \$3.95 million in 2018 mainly because of the storm water removal. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 0.8, and 1.2 respectively for the years 2016 through 2018.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.0, debt to equity ratio of 2.3, 68.0 days sales in accounts receivable, and 7.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues reflect all previously approved rate increases and a 1% annual increase for population growth.
- 2) Revenues will go up 9% in 2020 after OCEA meets the special condition assigned to this loan.
- 3) OCEA is currently under a pending negotiation for a takeover by the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District. If both parties reach an agreement to proceed with the takeover, the debt service for this and other existing KIA loans shall be transferred to MSD as part of the assumption.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2022 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$148,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$7,400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-050) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$10,142,000 TO THE CITY OF RICHMOND, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Richmond, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$10,142,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Richmond for the Silver Creek Outfall Sewer Phase 1 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of approximately 6.5% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$660,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$9,482,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$25,400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$508,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of April, 2019.

The project will address capacity issues within the Silver Creek sewer shed and three sanitary sewer overflows (SSO's) within the TC-15 sub-basin of the Silver Creek sewer shed as well as provide additional capacity for future growth. This will be accomplished by constructing a new 1,500 gpm pump station at Silver Creek WWTP and pumping flows through 14,500 lf of 16 – inch PVC force main to 3,500 lf of 30 – inch and 11,500 lf of 24 – inch gravity sewer. This new gravity sewer will collect flows from 2,550 lf of 12 – inch and 1,500 lf of 15 – inch gravity sewers within the TC-15 sewer basin and discharge flows to the Wilgreen pump station. A new parallel 12 – inch force main will increase capacity at the pump station to handle the new flows from Taylor Fork.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Richmond is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$10,142,000 for the Silver Creek Outfall Sewer Phase 1 project. The purpose of this project is to eliminate known overflows and provide additional capacity in the collection system for future growth. In 2009, soon after the construction of the Otter Creek Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP), two existing WWTP's (Dreaming Creek and Tates Creek) were taken off-line with flows directed to this new large WWTP. The other large WWTP (Silver Creek), was built in the summer of 1999 to treat waste generated on the south side of Richmond, primarily the area along Duncannon Road and the new industrial park. This project will eliminate this Kentucky Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (KPDES) permit and convey flows through the existing conveyance system to the Otter Creek WWTP.

Division A - Silver Creek WWTP to Existing Pavilion Force Main

The existing Silver Creek WWTP will be used as an equalization basin to store wet weather flows. A new 1,500 gallon per minute (gpm) pump station will be built at the Silver Creek WWTP site along with 14,500 linear feet (lf) of 16 - inch force main that will discharge into an existing 14 – inch force main for approximately 10,500 lf to a point of discharge at the existing Pavilion pump station. The Pavilion pump station will be de-commissioned and all flows will be diverted to the new Taylor Fork gravity Sewer (Division B).

Division B – Taylor Fork Gravity Sewer

Flows from the Silver Creek and Pavilion pump stations will be diverted to approximately 3,500 lf of 30 inch, 11,500 lf of 24 inch gravity sewer and approximately 49 manholes along Taylor Fork. This line will discharge into the existing Wilgreen pump station on the west side of Interstate 75.

Division C – TC-15 Collector Sewers

The TC15 drainage basin of the Richmond Utilities Sanitary Sewer Collection System is subject to frequent wet weather induced overflows at three primary locations: TC15-M4-11, TC15-M8-18, and TC15-M10-3. This division of the project will replace

approximately 1,500 lf of 15 inch and 2,550 lf of 12 inch gravity sewer along with 25 manhole replacements.

Division D – Wilgreen Parallel Force Main

The existing Wilgreen pump station is capable of pumping a peak flow of approximately 2,500 gpm through the existing 12 inch force main. This project will extend a second 12 inch force main parallel to the existing force main for approximately 4,900 lf. The new force main will add approximately 1,100 gpm of peak capacity to the Wilgreen pump station for a total peak flow of 3,600 gpm.

Richmond Water, Gas, and Sewerage Works provides sanitary sewer service to almost 12,000 residential, commercial, and industrial customers in Madison County.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for Richmond Water, Gas, and Sewerage Works the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The balance sheet and income statement include water, sewer, and gas operations. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expense totals. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues for water, sewer, and gas increased 5% from \$19.2 million in 2016 to \$20.1 million in 2018 while total operating expenses increased 11% from \$9.8 million to \$10.9 million during the same time period. Sewer revenues increased 1% from \$6.9

million to \$7.1 million from 2016-2018 and sewer expenses increased 9% from \$3.5 million to \$3.8 million. Water revenues increased 3% from \$6.9 million to \$7.1 million and water expenses increased 22% from \$3.8 million to \$4.6 million during the same time period. Operating expense increases in the respective funds are primarily attributed to changes in pension and benefit reporting requirements. Gas revenues and expenses moved in tandem with both increasing 22% from 2016-2018 as gas is mostly a pass- through service to customers of the Utility.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a 2.0 current ratio, a 0.9 debt to equity ratio, 56.2 days sales in accounts receivable and 11.2 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. The debt coverage ratio from 2016-2018 was 2.4, 1.2, and 1.8, respectively.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues will increase approximately 2% annually for both growth and inflation adjustments via the City's CPI clause.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2022 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$508,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$25,400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The City's Enterprise Funds account for Gas, Water, and Sewer operations. The Gas portion has been extracted from the Enterprise Funds and therefore is not part of this analysis. The non-cash impact of GASB 68 - Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 - Other Postemployment Benefit has been removed from the operating expenses.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues declined 3.8% from \$762,943 in 2016 to \$733,524 in 2018 due to population loss while operating expenses decreased less than 1% from \$638,450 to \$632,909 during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 114.1 in 2016 due to the absence of existing debt and declined to 1.2 in 2016, and 0.9 in 2018 after debt service began.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.6, debt to equity ratio of 0.5, 28.8 days sales in accounts receivable, and 4.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Total water and sewer revenues will go up 8% through rate increase in 2020 as required by the Special Condition.
- From 2021 on, an estimated 2% increase will be mandatorily applied to both water and sewer rates each year based on the Cost of Living Adjustment, subject to annual KIA administrative compliance monitoring.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% for general inflation.
- 4) The City is seeking funding assistance from RD for the WWTP Improvement (Phase II) & Sanitary Sewer Rehab project. The potential increase of debt obligation is not included in the projections due to the application's pending status. If the debt service increases after RD funding is committed, RD will set new rates to ensure that the City can afford the additional debt.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2021 after the special condition is met.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$20,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$1,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Danville is requesting a Drinking Water SRF loan in the amount of \$4,918,257 for the Danville – Perryville Standpipe Replacement and Water Main project. The project will replace the 100,000 gallon standpipe on the east side of Perryville with a 750,000 gallon elevated tank, and construct an 800 GPM pump station that will be located on Perryville Road near Locklin Lane. The current standpipe is outdated, undersized, and does not have adequate turnover. The new elevated tank will be fed by approximately 17,500 LF of new 12-inch water main that will start at Coldwell Road and will parallel Perryville Road West to the new tank site. It will provide additional storage capacity to meet both current and future demands.

Approximately 35% (470 million gallons) of water produced by the utility is sold to wholesale customers including four PSC regulated entities (Garrard County Water Association, Lake Village Water Association, Parksville Water District, and North Mercer Water District) and three municipals (City of Hustonville, City of Springfield, and City of Stanford).

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 23,575 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$38,499. The median household income for the Commonwealth was \$44,811. The project will qualify for a 2.00% interest rate with its median household income below 100% but above 80% of the state MHI.

- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The Utilities Fund accounts for the activities of the water and sewer services provided to residents of the City and surrounding areas. The City also has a storm water fund which is reported separately and therefore is not part of this analysis. The non-cash impact of GASB 68 -Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 - Other Postemployment Benefit has been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues went up 16.5% from \$7.98 million in 2016 to \$9.30 million in 2018 as a result of a 56% sewer rate increase effective July 24, 2017. Operating expenses increased 17.2% from \$5.92 million to \$6.94 million during the same period due to operation and personnel costs associated with the new water treatment plant. The debt coverage ratio was 2.2, 2.5, and 1.1 for 2016, 2017, and 2018 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.8, debt to equity ratio of 1.8, 32.3 days sales in accounts receivable, and 7.3 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase approximately 1.3% each year for cost of living adjustment (COLA) while wholesale remains flat.
- 2) Sewer revenues will reflect a full year increase of 56% from the July 24, 2017 rates and a 2% COLA adjustment.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$246,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$12,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 4th day of April, 2019.

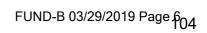
