#### I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

#### A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of March 6, 2025

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the February 6, 2025, minutes. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-008) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$841,383 TO THE EAST CLARK COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, CLARK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the East Clark County Water District's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$841,383. This loan will be used in conjunction with a previously awarded Cleaner Water Program grant to fund the Mt Sterling Rd and KY 89 Water Line Upgrade project. This project will replace some of the oldest water lines in the District's system. The existing water lines experience frequent leaks and breaks causing service disruptions as well as potential health hazards.

The project will replace approximately 3,200 linear feet (LF) of 6-inch water line along Mt. Sterling Road (US 60), approximately 7,200 LF of 6-inch water line along KY 89, and approximately 750 LF of 3-inch water line along Hilltop Drive with new Class 250 SDR 17 PVC. Creek crossings will be installed by directional drill method using DR 11 HDPE water line. The project will also include either new meter settings and service line from the new water mains or reconnection to the existing meter settings. Other proposed project components include valves, flush hydrants, and road bores with steel cover pipe.

Secretary asked East Clark County officials about their water loss percentages. They noted that they had been 18%, but down to 11% currently.

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Ms. Linda Bridwell and Ms. Shelley Porter abstained from the voting. Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Fund B loan for an amount up to \$841,383 to the East Clark County Water District with the standard conditions. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion was approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C25-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,129,061 TO THE OLDHAM COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the Oldham County Water District's request for a Fund C loan in the amount of \$6,129,061 for the US 42 West Improvements from KY-393 to KY-1694 project. This project includes the installation of approximately 22,300 linear feet of 12-inch water line along US 42 from KY-393 to KY-1694. This project will increase water pressure and flow to an underserved portion of the District's customer base. The new water line will also provide a looped connection to multiple points in this part of the District's distribution system, strengthening the existing infrastructure and maintaining water supply in the event of a break.

This project is one phase of a larger project intended to provide redundancy and improve the water pressure and flow in this part of the county. A second phase of the project, which includes the installation of water line from KY-1694 to South Buckeye Lane, will be funded with previously awarded Cleaner Water Program Grants.

Oldham County Water District serves 8,576 residential customers and 682 commercial and industrial customers. The District also sells water to the LaGrange Utilities Commission.

Mr. Russ Rose recused himself from the conversation, as well as voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from the vote. Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund C loan to the Oldham County Water District for a total loan amount up to \$6,129,061 with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded the motion, and the motion was approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F22-030) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$619,180, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,304,263 TO THE CANNONSBURG WATER DISTRICT, BOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Sandy Rankin, on behalf of John Brady, KIA, discussed the Cannonsburg Water District's request for a Fund F loan increase in the amount of \$619,180 for the Shoppes Road Water Line Replacement Phase 2 project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on July 7, 2022. This will bring their total KIA loan amount up to \$2,304,263. The increase request is due to bids coming in higher than the amount originally budgeted. No additional work is being funded.

The project is a continuation of the Water District's water loss reduction efforts established in Phase 1. Approximately 17,000 total linear feet (LF) of problematic asbestos cement water line will be replaced. This consists of 2,000 LF of 12" line and 15,000 LF of 6" line. A 1,000 gallon per minute booster pump station (BPS) will also be replaced. Approximately 180 service line connections will be installed due to aging service line material. The project

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will improve water service in the area and help reduce O&M costs associated with daily operations.

The Water District currently serves 3,359 residential customers and 253 commercial and other customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Deputy Secretary Geri Grigsby made the motion to approve the Fund F loan increase to the Cannonsburg Water District for \$619,180 for a total loan amount up to \$\$2,304,263 with the standard conditions. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Secretary Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams Thanked everyone for their flexibility in changing the in-person meeting to virtual, due to the adverse weather conditions. KIA wanted to keep everyone safe and felt it was in everyone's best interest to move to Zoom. *I'm thankful to see our board members and guests remotely today. Thanks to Mr. Gary Larimore and Mr. Scott Young from Kentucky Rural Water for participating in today's meeting.* 

She noted that the KIA State Revolving Fund staff will be attending the Council for Infrastructure Financing Authorities Conference in Washington DC the week of April 21st. Staff will have the opportunity to meet with EPA HQ, EPA Region 4, and peers from 50 states that do the same type of water and sewer infrastructure financing we do.

She thanked Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and her staff for timely providing the SRF ranked project lists to KIA for inclusion in the SRF Intended Use Plans (IUP). This is an important first step in the SRF funding cycle.

She mentioned that House Joint Resolution 30 has been passed into law. The bill was delivered to the Secretary of State on March 28th. The final version of the bill is available on LRC's website legislature.ky.gov. This joint resolution provides Kentucky WWATERS funding for 34 unique projects with \$65,673,500 of funding allotted from state fiscal year 2025 and \$21,609,500 of funding allotted from state fiscal year 2026. Staff is finalizing the financing agreements to have the agreements out to the designated recipients as quickly as possible.

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No final legislative action was taken on HB 741, making changes to the KY WWATERS requirements, so the requirements for the program will be the same as last year. Staff is reviewing the scoring weights and rubric. We anticipate having slight program revisions for review prior to the May meeting when we would be requesting your approval of program changes. The new application acceptance period will come after the May board meeting.

Ms. Linda Bridwell asked to have the floor for a moment. She wanted to update the Board about a PSC investigation into the Livingston Water District. The KIA Board approved funding to Wood Creek Water District through the KYWWATERS Emergency program to pay some debt owed to Wood Creek, which resulted in Livingston's customers losing their water service. Livingston has not paid their past due amount and has not made monthly payments as we stipulated. Wood Creek has notified Livingston that their water service will once again be disconnected if the full amount has not been paid by April 7<sup>th</sup>.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A24-122) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$255,871, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,203,400 TO THE CITY OF HODGENVILLE, LARUE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A24-122) to the City of Hodgenville on April 11, 2024, in the amount of \$947,529 and the City of Hodgenville has requested to increase loan A24-122 by \$255,871, for a total loan amount up to \$1,203,400; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Hodgenville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and

Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$1,203,400 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Hodgenville for the WWTP Upgrade and Modifications Phase 1 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 20.5%, not to exceed \$246,511, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$956,889 shall be repaid

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$60,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2025.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The City of Hodgenville is requesting a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$255,871 for the WWTP Upgrade and Modifications project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on April 11, 2024. This will bring their total KIA loan amount up to \$1,203,400. The increase request is due to bids coming in higher than the amount originally budgeted. No additional work is being funded. Funding from a previous planning and design loan was used to evaluate wastewater flows, existing facilities, permit compliance, make recommendations, and provide probable costs based on the findings. Recommendations were broken out into two phases that will re-rate and modify the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and replace aging equipment. This loan will finance Phase 1, which will increase the average daily flow capacity from 0.78 MGD to 1.0 MGD and complete necessary modifications. These modifications that will be made at the WWTP include additional aeration to the existing oxidation ditch, adding a sludge press, and phosphorus removal equipment. The project will maximize the available treatment capacity of the existing infrastructure and yield high quality discharge to the receiving stream, resulting in improved water quality.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Hodgenville is requesting a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$255,871 for the WWTP Upgrade and Modifications project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on April 11, 2024. This will bring their total KIA loan amount up to \$1,203,400. The increase request is due to bids coming in higher than the amount originally budgeted. No additional work is being funded.

Funding from a previous planning and design loan was used to evaluate wastewater flows, existing facilities, permit compliance, make recommendations, and provide probable costs based on the findings. Recommendations were broken out into two phases that will re-rate and modify the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and replace aging equipment. This loan will finance Phase 1, which will increase the average daily flow capacity from 0.78 MGD to 1.0 MGD and complete necessary modifications. These modifications that will be made at the WWTP include additional aeration to the existing oxidation ditch, adding a sludge press, and phosphorus removal equipment. The project will maximize the available treatment capacity of the existing infrastructure and yield high quality discharge to the receiving stream, resulting in improved water quality.

The City currently serves 1,604 residential customers and 228 commercial customers.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 3,598 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$53,868. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$55,454. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

#### VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 20.5% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$246,511, will be credited to the loan balance.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2023. Unaudited financials were reviewed for the year ending June 30, 2024. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues increased 4.9% from \$1.96 million in 2022 to \$2.05 million in 2024 due to sewer rate increases. Operating expenses increased 19.3% from \$1.27 million to \$1.52 million during the same period due to repairs and maintenance and higher personnel costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.2, 1.2, and 1.0 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.0, and 3.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 5% in 2025 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Total revenues will increase \$140,000 annually starting in 2027 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$60,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$3,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-029S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,807,520 TO THE GRANT COUNTY SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Grant County Sanitary Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$8,807,520 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Grant County Sanitary Sewer District for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade project. Such

amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 41.8%, not to exceed \$3,677,615, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$5,129,905 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$22,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$440,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2025.

## **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 9.5% in 2024 due to a rate increase previously approved by the Public Service Commission (PSC).
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase \$160,000 annually starting in 2028 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

The GCSSD is regulated by the PSC and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$8,807,520 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$440,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$22,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,100,000 TO THE CITY OF MOUNT STERLING, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Mount Sterling, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$5,100,000 of project expense, to the City of Mount Sterling for the MSWS Greenbriar Dam Rehabilitation Phase II project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 15 years at an annual interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$17,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$255,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2025.

## VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2024. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Total water revenues increased 19.9% from \$5.87 million in 2022 to \$7.04 million in 2024 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 9.3% from \$4.69 million to \$5.13 million during the same period primarily due to monitoring and water treatment expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 5.4, and 6.3 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.5, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.7, 51.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 21.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

## **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 11.7% in FY25 due to approved rate increases.
- 2) Wholesale water revenues will increase 4.1% in FY25 due to approved rate increases. Wholesale water is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) who approved this rate increase on 9/1/24.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually de to inflation and general expense increases.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2027 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$255,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$17,000 yearly) each December 1 for 15 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

## VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 4,701 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$58,047. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183.

## VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 100% of the assistance amount will be credited to the loan balance.

## IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

## HISTORY

Total revenues increased 24.8% from \$3.16 million in 2022 to \$3.94 million in 2024 due to annual rate increases for both water and sewer services. Operating expenses increased 13.5% from \$2.71 million to \$3.07 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 1.6, and 2.6 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, and 5.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

## **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Retail water revenues will increase 5% in each projected year due to an annual adjustment outlined in the City's rate ordinance.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 5% in each projected year due to an annual adjustment outlined in the City's rate ordinance.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$222,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$11,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-005S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,432,924 TO THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Morganfield, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$4,432,924 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Morganfield for the GAC Contactor Tank project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment

by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 65.7%, not to exceed \$2,912,563 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,520,361 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$11,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$222,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of May, 2025.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Morganfield is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,432,924 for the Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Contactor Tank project. The project will include adding a GAC treatment facility to the existing Water Treatment Plant. This facility will be a standalone add on facility that will house steel vessel contact tanks holding GAC material for reducing Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) concentration in drinking water. GAC material specifications will be determined from pilot testing of the water supply to meet USEPA regulations. This project will include additional work including existing piping modifications at the Water Treatment Plant, foundation development, and relocation of existing chemical feed systems in the treatment process. The City is being proactive with the removal of PFAS and other emerging chemicals from the community's treated drinking water.

The City currently serves 1,900 residential customers and 332 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service to the Union County Water District and Uniontown Water and Sewer Department.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 4,701 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$58,047. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

#### VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 65.7% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$2,912,563, will be credited to the loan balance.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues increased 24.8% from \$3.16 million in 2022 to \$3.94 million in 2024 due to annual rate increases for both water and sewer services. Operating expenses increased 13.5% from \$2.71 million to \$3.07 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 1.6, and 2.6 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, and 5.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Retail water revenues will increase 5% in each projected year due to an annual adjustment outlined in the City's rate ordinance.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 5% in each projected year due to an annual adjustment outlined in the City's rate ordinance.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$222,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$11,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of May 1, 2025.

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### Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Kentucky WWATERS Program Scoring Changes

#### **Scoring Rubric Recommended Changes Summary**

At its September 5, 2024, meeting, the KIA Board approved a weighted scoring rubric ranging from 6 to 20 points for each of the statutorily mandated scoring criteria. The maximum available points equal 125. After evaluating the program's performance and making suggestions for improvement, the Legislative Review Commission created House Bill 741 to amend KRS 224A.320. The changes in House Bill 741 offer an improved analytical approach, by eliminating scoring metrics that were found to be ineffective for purposes of determining the financial condition of program applicants.

Increased weighting is recommended for MHI and Water Loss Correction. These metrics are the key factors for improved economic health for service providers. Decreased weighting is recommended for financial ratios, as they represent three separate categories, the total of these three categories should be viewed as a combined single Ratio Category Score.

#### House Bill 741, Summary

#### **Summary of Original Version:**

Amend KRS 224A.320 to require that eligible funding recipients for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (WWATERS) Program meet three or more of the eligibility criteria instead of one; require that a funding application for a capital construction project include cost and timeline estimates prepared and signed by a licensed professional engineer; allow the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority board to evaluate and score funding applications for proposed projects in phases; remove the funding evaluation criteria categories of current accounts payable turnover ratio and current days' sales in accounts receivable ratio; remove the requirement from the evaluation criteria that the applicant's receipt of a notice of violation of drinking water or other water quality standards occur in the past year; add to the funding evaluation criteria that the funding applicant previously received funding through the program for a prior phase of the proposed project.

#### **Summary:**

Retain original provisions; require that approved eligible funding recipients adopt best management practices as established and administered by the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority board; add to the funding eligibility criteria that the funding applicant can demonstrate that the amount of stormwater inflow and groundwater infiltration entering the funding applicant's system seriously impairs its effectiveness; EMERGENCY.

House Bill 741 received third reading and passed 95-0 on 3/11/25 and was then taken to the Senate. The Bill subsequently received two readings in the Senate, but was not read a third time and no vote was taken.

#### Proposed Changes for KY WWATERS for Fiscal Year 2026

#### **Scoring Adjustments for 2026**

House Bill 741, proposed by the General Assembly with respect to suggestions for program improvement by KIA staff, sought to eliminate certain scoring metrics. These metrics were the Accounts Receivable Ratio, the Accounts Payable Turnover Ratio, along with changes to restrictions to the Notice of Violation metric, among others.

After reviewing applications for the 2025 Fiscal Year, these changes were evaluated for achieving the goal of funding Economically Restrained Systems. Based on the overall program, the recommendations of both the Legislative Review Commission and KIA, staff recommends that the suggested changes to the weighted scoring rubric will better serve the review and analysis process for Fiscal Year 2026.
