### I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Dennis Keene called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

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### A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of March 2, 2023

Ms. Geri Grigsby moved to approve the minutes of the March 2, 2023, regular board meeting. Mr. Matt Wingate seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### B. KIA LOAN PROGRAMS (Informational)

**1.** Director Sandy Williams gave a KIA Loan Program Summary discussing each of the Loan Programs administered by KIA staff.

Ms. Linda Bridwell thanked Director Williams for her presentation and said the information was very in-depth and helpful, especially with the new funding through the EPA.

She noted she wasn't aware of the impact Congressionally Directed Spending could have on future allotments and what happens when the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding ends. Director Williams noted it is a concern and is being discussed at the national level. Many of the drinking water lobbying groups are notifying their national representatives that this could be a big problem. She noted if anyone was having a conversation with the federal level representatives and had concerns, they may want to mention it.

Mr. Russell Neal noted that DOW staff had a meeting with EPA regarding the new DWSRF allotment formula which reduced Kentucky's funding, specifically for lead service replacement. There will possibly be a chance in the near future to submit data to EPA that could increase the allotment. He stated that many systems did not know if there were lead service lines in place and to what extent currently.

### C. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING APPROVAL FOR THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS – DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT FOR THE EAST KENTUCKY STATE AID FUNDING FOR EMERGENCIES (EKSAFE) FUND

Director Williams noted that this funding was authorized by the General Assembly in HB1 of the 2022 Special Session that is being administered the Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management. The funding is to benefit the families that were affected by the severe flooding that occurred in July 2022 in eastern Kentucky. KIA's role will be to administer the funding of the water and sewer projects associated with the new higher ground subdivision. This new community will provide safe housing for displaced residents that will be out of the flood plain.

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Ms. Bridwell asked if KIA would apply to the Division of Military Affairs and then the utilities will make an application to KIA and if there was a base amount for the ask. Ms. Williams stated that KIA staff has been working the Kentucky River Area Development District (KRADD) to apply for the amount of money for one project in particular. This project would be getting the water and sewer components in place for the Olive Branch Subdivision initially. Then as more projects present themselves KIA could request additional funding as needed.

Ms. Bridwell made the motion to approve the filing of an application with the Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management for the East Kentucky State Aid Funding for Emergencies (EKSAFE) Fund. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A23-018S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,660,000 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON, MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Russell Neal, DOW and Mr. John Brady, KIA discussed the City of Lebanon's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$7,660,000 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and Sewer System Improvements project. A recent Condition Assessment Study of the WWTP identified several critical components that need to be addressed with either replacement or an upgrade. Existing aerators will be replaced with higher efficiency motors to reduce energy costs. The existing mechanical bar screen will be replaced, and a second redundant screen will be installed. Other work at the WWTP includes the installation of an influent flowmeter and technology upgrades. The project will also involve the installation of a new oxidation ditch, clarifier, and digester for increasing capacity from 3 MGD to 3.75 MGD. This will allow the City to provide continued treatment at the existing site in a more efficient and cost-effective manner.

Two problematic lift stations will be eliminated and replaced with gravity sewer line that will connect to an existing interceptor sewer. This will reduce the overflow issues and eliminate the power and maintenance costs of each station. The City currently serves 1,944 residential customers and 542 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Carey Johnston abstained from voting, noting as the Director of the Division Water he is their regulatory representative. Mr. Bob Amato made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A23-018S, to the City of Lebanon in the amount of \$7,660,000 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that service revenues will need to increase approximately \$150,000, or 10%, by FY2026 to meet the loan requirement. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B23-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,000,000 TO THE MAYFIELD ELECTRIC AND WATER SYSTEMS, GRAVES COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the Mayfield Electric and Water Systems, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$8,000,000 of project expense, to the Mayfield Electric and Water Systems for the Pilgrim's Pride Substation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$20,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$400,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this  $4^{th}$  day of May, 2023.

### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

Projected 2026

The Mayfield Electric and Water Systems is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$8,000,000 for the Pilgrim's Pride Substation project. The Pilgrim's Pride facility was located in one of many areas severely damaged by the tornado that struck the city of Mayfield in December 2021. A new state-of-the-art hatchery is being constructed that will be twice the size of the original plant. The current substation in the Industrial Drive area will not provide the necessary capacity to supply the businesses that will exist in the near future. A 69-13 kV electric utility substation will be constructed along with approximately 0.5 miles of 69kV transmission line. 13 kV distribution lines will be added to serve the new load and to integrate the substation into the distribution system.

### KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING LOAN FUND (FUND B) MAYFIELD ELECTRIC AND WATER SYSTEMS, GRAVES COUNTY PROJECT REVIEW

### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Mayfield Electric and Water Systems (MEWS) is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$8,000,000 for the Pilgrim's Pride Substation project. The Pilgrim's Pride facility was located in one of many areas severely damaged by the tornado that struck the city of Mayfield in December 2021. A new state-of-the-art hatchery is being constructed that will be twice the size of the original plant. The current substation in the Industrial Drive area will not provide the necessary capacity to supply the businesses that will exist in the future. A 69-13 kV electric utility substation will be constructed along with approximately 0.5 miles of 69kV transmission line. 13 kV distribution lines will be added to serve the new load and to integrate the substation into the distribution system.

The MEWS currently serves over 4,000 residential customers and approximately 730 commercial and industrial customers. They purchase power from the Tennessee Valley Authority.

### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 10,647 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$37,345. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

### VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2019 through June 30, 2021. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Total electric revenues decreased 6.2% from \$16.54 million in 2019 to \$15.51 million in 2021 primarily due to weather conditions. Total expenses decreased 9.8% from \$15.55 million to \$14.03 million during the same period as a result of less power being purchased. The debt coverage ratio was 1.5, 2.3, and 1.4 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.1, 43.7 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 2.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Electric revenues will increase \$60,000 starting in 2025 due to the development of the Pilgrim's Pride facility.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2025 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-004S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,280,000 TO THE CITY OF HARRODSBURG, MERCER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Harrodsburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$4,280,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Harrodsburg for the Water Main and Water Hydrant Replacements project. Such amounts

are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of \$3,079,601 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,200,399 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,700 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$214,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2023.

### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 8,684 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$42,821. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020 through June 30, 2022. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 2.1% from \$5.83 million in 2020 to \$5.95 million in 2022. Operating expenses increased 3.2% from \$3.14 million to \$3.24 million during the same period due to higher costs for materials and supplies. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.0, and 1.2 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.3, 37.9 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 11.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues will both increase 6.9% in 2023 due to existing rate increases and 6.5% in 2024 due to proposed rate increases.
- 2) Water and sewer revenues will both increase 2% in 2025, 2026, and 2027 due to the City's annual CPI rate adjustment for both services.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2025 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$214,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$10,700 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Northern Kentucky Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$4,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for the Water Main Replacement- Newport and Ovation project.

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of \$1,598,681 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,401,319 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$200,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2023.

### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2016-2020, the Utility's service area population was 252,560 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$66,417. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$52,238. The project will qualify for a 2.25% interest rate.

### VIII. 2022 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of \$1,598,681 will be deducted from the approved loan amount.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2019 through December 31, 2021. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Total revenues increased 4.4% from \$57.57 million in 2019 to \$60.08 million in 2021 due to an increase in water consumption. Operating expenses increased 4.3% from \$28.74 million to \$29.97 million during the same period due to salary increases and higher contractual services costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.0, and 17.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash. Days sales in accounts receivable are 95.3 as the District does the majority of its billing on a quarterly basis.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 7.2% in 2023 and 6.6% in 2024 due to previously approved rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The District is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$4,000,000 loan and the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$200,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$10,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 4th day of May, 2023.
