## I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Dennis Keene called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

### A. **BUSINESS (Board Action Required)**

### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of March 7, 2024

*Mr.* Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the March 7, 2024, regular board meeting. *Mr.* Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried.

### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-122) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$947,529 TO THE CITY OF HODGENVILLE, LARUE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Hodgenville's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$947,529 for the WWTP Upgrade and Modifications project. Funding from a previous planning and design loan was used to evaluate wastewater flows, existing facilities, permit compliance, make recommendations, and provide probable costs based on the findings. Recommendations were broken out into two phases that will re-rate and modify the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and replace aging equipment. This loan will finance Phase 1, which will increase the average daily flow capacity from 0.78

MGD to 1.0 MGD and complete necessary modifications. These modifications that will be made at the WWTP include additional aeration to the existing oxidation ditch, adding a sludge press, and phosphorus removal equipment. The project will maximize the available treatment capacity of the existing infrastructure and yield high quality discharge to the receiving stream, resulting in improved water quality.

The City currently serves 1,604 residential customers and 228 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A24-0122, for an amount up to \$947,529 to the City of Hodgenville with the standard conditions. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion passed.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-006) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,692,500 TO THE LARUE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT #1, LARUE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed The LaRue County Water District #1's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$1,692,500 for the planning and design phase of the New Treatment Plant project. The district proposes to construct a new 4.0 MGD water treatment plant, raw water intake and new pumping facility. LCWD currently purchases from 8 different wholesale suppliers to resale to its customers. Divergent treatment processes among the suppliers causes difficulties in managing adequate distribution and movement with the system. A new water treatment facility will help insure a more reliable and standard supply of finished water allowing the LCWD to better meet water quality standards and enhance supply based upon usage and need as opposed to availability.

The LCWD currently serves approximately 3,505 residential and 68 commercial and industrial customers. They purchase water from 8 different wholesale suppliers.

*Mr.* Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F24-006, to the Larue County Water District #1's for an amount up to \$1,692,500 with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion carried.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-013S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,277,500 TO THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD FBO SPRINGFIELD WATER & SEWER COMMISSION, WASHINGTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of

\$4,277,500 for the Water Main Assessment, Replacement Planning & Design - WTP & Priority Area 2 project. This project includes an assessment of the aging system, design, and construction components of replacing aging facilities in Priority Area 2 as well as replacing any lead service lines that are identified, including the private side of the meter. Upgrades to the WTP include installation of covers over the settling basins to reduce debris from entering and algae growth. The project also includes the rehabilitation of one of the two clearwell tanks.

The Commission currently serves 4,685 residential customers and 297 commercial and industrial customers.

# *Mr.* Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F24-013S to the City of Springfield, F/B/O the Springfield Water and Sewer Commission for an amount up to \$4,277,500 with the standard conditions. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion passed.

Commissioner Keene noted that the following seven projects are all Lead Service Line projects and staff would like to present them all together as was done at the March Board meeting. He asked for a motion to present all the remaining projects together and roll them into one vote.

# Ms. Geri Grigsby made the motion to accept the staff's recommendation to take projects number 4 through 11 under consideration with one vote. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion passed.

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, told everyone that the following projects are all Lead Service Line projects. These projects are like the eight Lead Service Lines presented at the March meeting. They all have a similar scope and methodology. The EPA is requiring lead service line inventory to be completed by October 15, 2024, and all the following projects are trying to comply by that deadline. Mr. Brady noted that the following projects all will receive 100% principal forgiveness and qualify as disadvantaged communities.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-014L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$220,000 TO THE GRAYSON COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, GRAYSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Grayson County Water District (GCWD) requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$220,000 for the Lead Inventory and Replacement project. This project will enable the GCWD to comply with the revised EPA Lead and Copper Rule. The GCWD will begin the inventory of public and private service lines and connections in the distribution system to determine which, if any, are composed of lead piping. They will then gather data within areas of its distribution system that were constructed prior to 1987. It will establish a data management system and GIS inventory as required by the revised EPA rule. The inventory is being collected and stored using ARCGIS Online and is formatted to meet all the requirements set by DOW. All data is being collected by several different processes that include a

customer survey, local PVA records, as built records, installation dates, and visual inspections.

The GCWD currently serves 7,656 residential customers and 421 commercial and industrial customers.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-019L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100,000 TO THE ROWAN WATER ASSOCIATION, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Rowan Water Association requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$100,000 for the Lead and Copper Line and Components Assessment project. This project is necessary to conduct a Lead Service Line inventory of all the public and private service lines in their water distribution system, as required by the revised EPA Lead and Copper Rule, to identify which lines, if any, are made of lead piping. Work will include procurement of professional services to aid in review and summary of historic records, existing data, and visual inspections on existing service lines as well as active/invasive investigations of existing service lines. Investigative actions may include acquiring customer provided data by means of education campaigns, surveys, mailings, and advertisement. Water quality sampling may also be needed. For data management and format of submission they will be utilizing an Excel Inventory and Silver Smith GIS Data Software to review, update, and log the verification and location of Lead Service Lines and components. The Water Association will specify the method of verification of each service line and its location. The Water Association will also identify the length of the line and any components that may also need to be replaced, such as goosenecks, within their Excel Document.

Rowan Water currently serves 7,319 residential customers and 131 commercial and industrial customers.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-027L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$214,000 TO THE CITY OF DANVILLE, BOYLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The City of Danville requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$214,000 for the LCCR Inventory and Assessment project. The City of Danville's Municipal Utilities Department has begun initial data review of its current water customer base as it relates to prevalence of lead service lines with early attention given to disadvantaged communities in the city and county. It is anticipated, based upon system age and early data, over 500 services may be affected. The City is formalizing its approach to conform with KY DOW and EPA guidelines in its inventory and assessment plan. The initial steps include reviewing mapping, PVA records, and conducting plumbing code research.

The City currently serves 11,142 residential customers and 38 commercial and industrial customers.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-033L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100,000 TO THE BATH COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, BATH COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Bath County Water District (BCWD) requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$100,000 for the Lead and Copper Line and Components Assessment project. This project is to conduct a Lead Service Line inventory of all the public and private service lines in their water distribution system, as required by the revised EPA Lead and Copper Rule, to identify which lines, if any, are made of lead piping. Work shall include procurement of professional services to aid in review and summary of historic records, existing data, and visual inspections on existing service lines as well as active/invasive investigations of existing service lines. Investigative actions may include acquiring customer provided data by means of education campaigns, surveys, mailings, and advertisement. Water quality sampling may also be needed. Gateway Area Development District has created, in cooperation with Kentucky Rural Water Association, an ArcGIS Dashboard that will be utilized by the BCWD and professional services they may procure, to review, update, and log the verification and location of Lead Service Lines and components. Parties can specify the method of verification of each service line and its location. Parties can also identify the length of the line and any components that may also need to be replaced, such as goosenecks, within the created Dashboard.

The BCWD currently serves 4,377 residential customers and 117 commercial and industrial customers.

8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-041L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$450,000 TO THE CITY OF GRAYSON F/B/O GRAYSON UTILITIES COMMISSION, CARTER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The City of Grayson, on behalf of the Grayson Utilities Commission (GUC), requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$450,000 for the Lead Service Line Inventory/Survey project. This project consists of a comprehensive inventory of each service connection within the system to determine the service line material on both sides of the meter. GUC began the inventory process by conducting outreach and education to engage customers to complete a service line survey. While this is a low-cost method the commission did not have the workforce available to complete the full system inventory themselves. GUC sees this as an opportunity to create a value-added project that meets compliance, improves system capacity, and builds resilience. GUC proposes to contract for the development of an ESRI based GIS/AM framework that builds upon the existing Commission datasets with a GIS schema necessary to support lead service line

inventory requirements. A map for both office and field staff will be created that will allow for individual and batch editing of the data. Additional contract personnel will be hired and trained to collect service line data through customer engagement surveys, historical records, visual inspection, or excavation to update the service line layer. Field verified data will be captured with sub-foot GPS technology. Upon completion, the service line inventory data can be exported to a spreadsheet or shared with DOW through ArcGIS Online to meet compliance requirements.

The GUC currently serves 2,883 residential customers and 1,487 commercial and industrial customers.

9. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-042L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$275,000 TO THE WESTERN PULASKI COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Western Pulaski County Water District requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$275,000 for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. This project includes a comprehensive inventory of each service connection within the system to determine the service line material on both sides of the meter. The District will utilize ArcGIS Online asset management tools and dashboards to assist with inventory development, record-keeping, and required documentation submissions to regulatory agencies. District personnel and contract labor will be utilized to complete the inventory via the following methods: previous materials evaluation, installation date after lead ban use, installation records, distribution inspection records, historical repair record, field verification during routine work, field verification by visual inspection at meter box, and field verification by excavation.

The District currently serves 9,333 residential customers and 141 commercial and industrial customers.

10. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-055L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,000,000 TO THE CITY OF OWENSBORO, DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The City of Owensboro, on behalf of the Owensboro Municipal Utilities (OMU), requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. This project includes a comprehensive inventory of each service connection to determine the service line material on both the utility and private side of the meter. OMU will develop a public facing online map (hosted either internally or using ArcGIS Online) reporting material status of the system's lead service lines. Continuous inventory efforts include previous materials evaluation, installation date after lead ban use, installation records, distribution inspection records, service line diameter greater than 2", historical repair record, and field verification during routine work, by visual inspection at meter pit, and by excavation. A great deal of the initial inventory (review of internal records) has been conducted. However,

there are approximately 4,400 locations intended for hydro-excavation (pothole) inspection at this time (unknown/suspected lead locations). The primary work left to complete is to identify those 4,400 remaining locations that are unknown but suspected lead locations. Upon completion of the inventory, OMU will develop a final scope of work and list of projects and procedures pertaining to lead service line replacements.

OMU currently serves 22,724 residential customers and 3,283 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service to Daviess County Water District and East Daviess County Water Association.

#### 11. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-065L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$227,500 TO THE CITY OF MAYSVILLE, MASON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The City of Maysville requested a Fund F loan in the amount of \$227,500 for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. The purpose of this project is to conduct an inventory of all the public and private service lines in the City's water distribution system, as required by the revised EPA Lead and Copper Rule. The City will use several different verification methods including, but not limited to, customer surveys, data, and records reviews at the PVA, employee knowledge with field verification, and possibly mechanical/vacuum excavation. The City will use ArcGIS for the method of data management and the final inventory product submitted to KDOW would be a shapefile with all service locations.

The City currently serves 4,547 residential customers and 651 commercial and industrial customers.

*Ms.* Shelley Porter made the motion to approve all the projects, numbers 4 through 11 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion passed.

# *Ms.* Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion passed.

#### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for their participation in today's meeting. She updated the group on the Grant programs. The Cleaner Water Program Grants program to date has 896 committed grants from CWP Round 1 and Round 2, only 13 Commitment Letters have not been returned to accept the grant funding. If the Commitment Letters are not returned by April 15th or reallocated to a new project, the funding will be swept and reallocated.

The next milestone is getting the grant agreements signed. Our goal is to have all grant agreements fully executed by June 30, 2024. Right now, we have 602 fully executed agreements and still need 294. The final milestone is to have all funds spent by December 31, 2026. Currently 121 projects have drawn all grant funds. There are 10 EKSAFE Grants, 19 Line-Item Budget Grants from the current biennial budget, for a total of 925 grants.

Regarding SRF loans, KIA has received the federal allotment amounts for all SRF Base Program Capitalization Grants and all BIL SRF Capitalization Grants except Lead Service Line Replacement allotment. KIA staff has also received the project rankings from the Division of Water. As soon as KIA receives the final allotment amount from EPA, KIA will be ready to put the finishing touches on the Intended Use Plans for the upcoming funding cycle.

For the state fiscal year 2025, 146 pre-applications were received for CWSRF funding (which represents an 11% increase), and 202 pre-applications were submitted for DWSRF funding (representing a 25% decrease). Over the last 10 years, the total number of pre-applications has increased 335% from (80 total projects to 348)

The Legislative update includes several bills that will impact KIA:

<u>HB 1</u> - Appropriates funding from the Budget Reserve Trust Fund Account. Certain line items in the bill received Gubernatorial veto, however, there were no changes to the KIA portion of the funding or projects. There are 40-line-item grants to be administered by KIA for water and wastewater projects totaling \$183,932,500. There is a \$75 million allocation in each year of the biennium, a total of \$150 million, for the Kentucky WWATERS and the Emergency Kentucky WWATERS programs.

<u>HB 6</u> - Appropriates funding from the Executive Branch. Certain line items in the bill received Gubernatorial veto, however, there were no changes to the KIA portion of the funding. Funding was included for the required state match for our SRF loan programs. There was \$30 million included in the second year of the biennium for the issuance of leverage bonds for each SRF loan program. An additional \$25 million was included in the second year for Fund B loans.

<u>HB 563</u> – Creates two new loan programs within KIA. Certain line items in the bill received Gubernatorial veto, removing the General Assembly's selection of the projects to be funded. Kentucky WWATERS and the Emergency Kentucky WWATERS programs are for troubled or economically restrained systems.

The first milestone is to provide an update of project information by December 1, 2024, to LRC. Between now and December, KIA staff will need to create an application, an application process, a project scoring rubric, and loan terms. Project funding may be for both capital and non-capital expenditures and may be provided as loans, zero-interest loans, loans with principal forgiveness, or grants. Quarterly reporting requirements are due on or before October 1, 2025, and each quarter thereafter, KIA must submit a report on the status of all funding awarded through the KY WWATERS programs. Interest rates are established in the same manner as the SRF programs and must be 0.5% less than the SRF rates. Funding through the emergency KY WATERS program may only be provided to restore or avoid imminent interruption of utility service provided by a public water or wastewater system after a statewide state of emergency has been declared or a local state of emergency has been declared for the jurisdiction where the public water or wastewater system is located.

<u>SB 229</u> – Among other things, amends KRS 224A.030 and replaces the KIA board member represented by the Kentucky Municipal Utilities Association with a member representing municipal utilities to be designated by the Kentucky League of Cities. This bill was signed by the Governor on March 29. According to the Secretary of State's website the Municipal Electric Power Association of Kentucky, Inc. d/b/a Kentucky Municipal Utilities Association, was dissolved October 31, 2023.

Several staff members attended the Council of Infrastructure Financing Authorities - 2024 CIFA Summit on Water Infrastructure in Washington DC and the State/EPA SRF Workshop.

EPA Region 4 Atlanta will be performing their annual review of our SRF programs the week, April 16-18.

EPA HQ, Office of the Inspector General will be conducting an audit of our Clean Water SRF program for state fiscal years 2022 and 2023. They will be on sight April 23 and 24.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007E) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,544,580 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A23-007E) to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on August 3, 2023, in the amount of \$1,118,600 and the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District has requested to increase Ioan A23-007E by \$2,544,580; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$3,663,180 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 100%, not to exceed \$3,663,180, will be deducted from the approved loan amount.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 9<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2024.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$2,544,580 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) and Capacity Improvements project. This project is receiving Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Emerging Contaminants (EC) funding over multiple cycles. MSD previously received EC funding approval for \$1,118,600 from the KIA Board on August 3, 2023. This brings their total KIA EC loan amount up to \$3,663,180.

The project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include six new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of life-threatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

MSD currently serves 236,020 residential customers, 21,919 commercial customers, and 394 industrial customers.

# VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 427,764 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$64,724. The project area population was 46,411 with an MHI of \$36,514. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$55,454.

# VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for Green Project Reserve funding for \$15,082,000. The majority of the green project components fall under the environmentally innovative category.
- Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 100% of the assistance amount will be credited to the loan balance.

## IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Total revenues increased 19% from 329.4 million in 2021 to \$392 million in 2023 due to annual increases in service charges and revenues from a new customer base following MSD's acquisition of the Bullitt County Sanitation system. Operating expenses increased 13.6% from \$109.7 million to \$124.6 million during the same period due to higher service and administration costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.8, and 1.9 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 3.1, 27 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 6.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 6.9% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Revenues will increase 6.1% beginning in 2025 due to rate increases anticipated from MSD's Board.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses for pending projects.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.0 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains debt reserve accounts on its senior obligations equal to at least 10% of the face amount of all bonds issued outstanding, 100% of the maximum aggregate net debt service in the current year or any future fiscal year, or 125% of the average aggregate net debt service in the current or any future fiscal year.

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#### A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B24-007) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,938,800 TO THE CITY OF SOMERSET, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Somerset, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$4,938,800 of project expense, to the City of Somerset for the Pitman Creek WWTP Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$12,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$246,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 9<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2024.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 13,357 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$32,363. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

#### VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total sewer revenues increased 20.1% from \$2.84 million in 2021 to \$3.41 million in 2023 due to increases in service charges. Operating expenses increased 13.4% from \$2.31 million to \$2.62 million during the same period primarily due to employee related expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 0.4, and 1.0 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.5, 64.7 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 9% in 2024 and 15.1% in 2025 due to existing rate increases.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase \$600,000 annually in 2027 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$246,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$12,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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#### A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 9th day of May, 2024.
