#### I. PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

KIA Executive Director Sandy Williams reminded everyone there are new requirements for Board members participating via teleconference. Every Board member must be on camera at all times to be considered a participant. Also mentioned, should there be any disruption in video proceedings; the meeting must stop until video is restored.

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the April 7 2022, regular board meeting. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F22-028) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,370,713 TO THE CITY OF CYNTHIANA, HARRISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Cynthiana's request for a Fund F loan, F22-028, for an amount up to \$3,370,713 for the Industrial Park Water Tank and Water Treatment Plant Upgrade project. This project consists of a new 750,000 gallon elevated water storage tank and booster pump station located at the EDA Industrial Park. It also includes the replacement of failed valves, the installation of UV disinfection units on the filter effluent, and various electrical upgrades.

The City currently serves over 2,400 residential customers and over 300 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service to the Harrison County Water Association.

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the Fund F Loan, (F22-028), for an amount up to \$3,370,713 to the City of Cynthiana with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS

- 5, Fund B will get an additional \$25 million
- 6. 2006 line item grant reauthorized and reallocated to Greenup Rt.1 Line Upgrade \$177,000

#### **HB 315**

Creates the Office of Broadband administratively attached to KIA, creates a rural infrastructure improvement fund to support the replacement of utility poles for broadband

#### **HB 758**

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Amends the definition of governmental agency to include water associations and will allow KIA to enter into financial agreements with water associations.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-003) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$45,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE F/B/O HOPKINSVILLE WATER ENVIRONMENT AUTHORITY, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A Loan (A19-003) to the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority on July 9, 2019 in the amount of \$9,000,000, which included a previously approved Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A Planning and Design Loan (A16-005) in the amount of \$1,500,000 approved on March 3, 2016; and the Authority approved the first increase in the amount of \$5,000,000 on January 7, 2021; and the Authority approved the second increase in the amount of \$16,000,000 on September 23, 2021 to bring the loan to a total of \$30,000,000; and the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority has requested a third increase to loan A19-003 in the amount of \$15,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure

Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$45,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Expand Hammond-Wood WWTP & Interceptor Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$44,000,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$112,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$2,250,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The City of Hopkinsville, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), is requesting a final Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$15,000,000 for the multi-phased Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. The previous 3 funding cycles have funded \$30,000,000 and this year's increase will bring the total Kentucky Infrastucture Authority project funding amount to \$45,000,000. The City is self funding an additional \$3.3 million.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Hopkinsville, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), is requesting a Fund A19-003 loan increase in the amount of \$15,000,000 for the last phase of the multi-year funding for the Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. Prior KIA loan funding cycles for this project total \$30,000,000. This final increase will bring the total KIA loan project amount to \$45,000,000.

HWEA is proposing renovation and expansion of the Hammond-Wood WWTP, located on the North Fork of the Little River, south of Hopkinsville. Renovation will occur by replacing the existing river siphon with a new influent interceptor river crossing, new influent pump station, new head works (screening and grit removal), new anaerobic phosphorus release tank, renovation of two existing oxidation ditches and two existing clarifiers, modification of the existing activated sludge pump station, modifications to return and waste activated sludge pumping station, post aeration steps and new outfall, new operations building, new electrical building and standby power, controls and Instrumentation, demolition of existing structures, construction of two sludge holding tanks, aeration, and dewatering equipment, and renovation of the existing ultraviolet disinfection process.

Expansion of the plant to 9 MGD with a hydraulic capacity of 27 MGD will occur with the construction of a new oxidation ditch and site development, addition of a third clarifier, excavation, grading, and site piping, new sludge-holding tank, new belt filter presses with additional pump, conveyor system, and a new blower building, controls, and instrumentation. Improvements to the 36" and 48" influent interceptor transporting wastewater to the plant will occur as determined through inspection.

The total project cost is \$48,300,000 and the budget and funding breakdowns are

shown below.

Hammond-Wood WWTP currently serves over 12,000 customers in Christian County including the cities of Hopkinsville and Pembroke. In addition, Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority also provides sewer service to the cities of Crofton and Oak Grove and drinking water to the cities of Hopkinsville, Pembroke and Crofton.

Based on Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 34,674 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$35,846. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, are removed from 2019 to 2021 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Combined revenues for sewer and water increased 9.7% from \$17.8 million in 2019 to \$18.6 million in 2021. Sewer revenues increased around 20.3% from \$8.7 million in 2019 to \$10.5 million in 2021 whereas water revenues have decreased 3.0% from \$9.1 million in 2019 to \$8.8 million in 2021. Sewer revenue growth is attributed to rate increases during the observed period for ongoing capital projects. The water revenues decreased marginally due to various pandemic changes. Combined expenses increased 26.3% from \$9.7 million to \$12.3 million from 2019 to 2021.

The 2021 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 1.6, 25.2 days' sales in accounts receivable, and 5.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- Sewer revenues will increase according to the approved rate increases by the utility (FY 2022, 2023 and 2024 projected 9% and flat for 2025 and 2026).
   Water revenues will remain flat for growth and volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 3) All debt service and replacement reserves for pending KIA loans A11-08, A16-005, F13-020, and F16-001 have been included in this analysis.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$2,250,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$112,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A22-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$722,040 TO THE CITY OF FRENCHBURG, MENIFEE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Frenchburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$722,040 including permanent financing for planning & design loan A21-043 in the amount of \$258,340 and \$463,700 for construction, and capitalized interest during the construction period, to the

City of Frenchburg for the Wastewater Collection System Rehab project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$361,020 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$361,020 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$36,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of June, 2022.

Total water and sewer revenues increased 3.3% from \$1.33 million in 2019 to \$1.37 million in 2021. Operating expenses increased 7.3% from \$1.25 million to \$1.34 million during the same period due to an increase in personnel and professional services costs. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 1.4, and 0.3 in 2019, 2020, and 2021.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.7, 47.7 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 2.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 2.7% in 2022 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Water revenues will increase 2.1% in 2022 due to an existing rate increase.
- 3) Per resolution passed by the City on February 2, 2022, sewer and water rates will both increase 5% in 2024 and 2025 to generate additional revenues necessary to maintain KIA's 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2025 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$36,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$1,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 2nd day of June, 2022.
