I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of April 3, 2025

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the April 3, 2025, minutes. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A24-122) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$255,871, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,203,400 TO THE CITY OF HODGENVILLE, LARUE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Hodgenville's request for a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$255,871 for the WWTP Upgrade and Modifications project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on April 11, 2024. This will bring their total KIA loan amount up to \$1,203,400. The increase request is due to bids coming in higher than the amount originally budgeted. No additional work is being funded.

Funding from a previous planning and design loan was used to evaluate wastewater flows, existing facilities, permit compliance, make recommendations, and provide probable costs based on the findings. Recommendations were broken into two phases that will re-rate and modify the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) and replace aging equipment. This loan will finance Phase 1, which will increase the average daily flow capacity from 0.78 MGD to 1.0 MGD and complete necessary modifications. These modifications that will be made at the WWTP include additional aeration to the existing oxidation ditch, adding a sludge press, and phosphorus removal equipment. The project will maximize the available treatment capacity of the existing infrastructure and yield high quality discharge to the receiving stream, resulting in improved water quality.

The City currently serves 1,604 residential customers and 228 commercial customers.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$255,871 for a total loan amount up to \$1,203,400 to the City of Hodgenville with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain the KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review

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indicates that revenues will need to increase approximately \$140,000 by FY2027 to meet the loan requirement. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion was approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-029S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,807,520 TO THE GRANT COUNTY SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holley Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Grant County Sanitary Sewer District's (GCSSD) request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$8,807,520 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade project. The project includes the construction of a 450,000 gallon per day Sequencing Batch Reactor (SBR) for biological treatment. There are currently four package treatment basins. One will be converted into a pre and post equalization basin to help handle peak flow to the SBR and the disinfection system. This will receive flows from the entire system area following screening. Another existing package treatment basin will be converted to a 60,000-gallon aerobic digester. while the other two will be demolished. Other project components include a solids dewatering system, a new screening system, and the rehabilitation of a Pump Station on KY 191. The overall project will provide additional capacity to help with treatment quality and is necessary to bring the GCSSD in compliance with their outstanding Agreed Order.

The GCSSD currently serves 1,524 residential customers, 131 commercial customers, and 5 industrial customers. e

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund A loan to the Grant County Sanitation District for a total loan amount up to \$8,807,520 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The GCSSD will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that revenues will need to increase approximately \$160,000, or 17%, by FY2028 to meet the loan requirement. Mr. Boba Amato seconded the motion, and the motion was approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,100,000 TO THE CITY OF MOUNT STERLING, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Mount Sterling's request for a \$5,100,000 Fund B loan for the Greenbrier Dam Rehabilitation Project Phase II. Greenbriar Dam impounds a reservoir used for raw water supply by the city. Mount Sterling also supplies potable water to six public drinking water systems, serving a population of nearly 40,000 people in the city and surrounding region. This project will implement Interim Risk Reduction Measures (IRRM) to address significant structural issues at Greenbrier Dam, including two active slope failures and erosion of the spillway. If left unaddressed, further degradation of the dam may impact raw water supply and endanger areas downstream. Key actions include replacing failed slopes with stone materials, reinforcing spillway walls, lowering the gravel walking path by two feet, modifying the sheet pile wall, and using grouted riprap to mitigate erosion. The IRRM project aims to reduce immediate risks while planning for a permanent resolution to ensure the continued safety and reliability of Mount Sterling's water supply.

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The City currently serves 4,970 residential customers, 694 commercial, industrial and institutional customers and 6 wholesale customers.

Mr. Ron Parritt abstained from the vote. Deputy Secretary Geri Grigsby made the motion to approve the Fund B loan to the City of Mount Sterling for an amount up to \$5,100,00 with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion carried.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-005E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,567,076 TO THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Morganfield's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,567,076 for the Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Contactor Tank project. The project will include adding a GAC treatment facility to the existing Water Treatment Plant. This facility will be a standalone add on facility that will house steel vessel contact tanks holding GAC material for reducing Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) concentration in drinking water. GAC material specifications will be determined from pilot testing of the water supply to meet USEPA regulations. This project will include additional work including existing piping modifications at the Water Treatment Plant, foundation development, and relocation of existing chemical feed systems in the treatment process. The City is being proactive with the removal of PFAS and other emerging chemicals from the community's treated drinking water.

The City currently serves 1,900 residential customers and 332 commercial and industrial customers. They provide whole service to the Union County Water District and Uniontown Water and Sewer Department.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-005S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,432,924 TO THE CITY OF MORGANFIELD, UNION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Morganfield's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,432,924 for the Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Contactor Tank project. The project will include adding a GAC treatment facility to the existing Water Treatment Plant. This facility will be a standalone add on facility that will house steel vessel contact tanks holding GAC material for reducing Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) concentration in drinking water. GAC material specifications will be determined from pilot testing of the water supply to meet USEPA regulations. This project will include additional work including existing piping modifications at the Water Treatment Plant, foundation development, and relocation of existing chemical feed systems in the treatment process. The City is being proactive with the removal of PFAS and other emerging chemicals from the community's treated drinking water.

The City currently serves 1,900 residential customers and 332 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service to the Union County Water District and Uniontown Water and Sewer Department.

Commissioner Sawyers asked the group if they preferred to vote on both the Morganfield projects as two separate projects and roll them into one vote

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Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to roll both projects into one vote. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve both Morganfield projects, F25-005E and F25-005S. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

6. 7. DISCUSSION AND SUGGESTIONS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY RELATING TO SCORING OF AND FUNDING PROPOSALS RELATING TO KYWWATERS APPLICATIONS

Scoring Rubric Recommended Changes Summary

At its September 5, 2024, meeting, the KIA Board approved a weighted scoring rubric ranging from 6 to 20 points for each of the statutorily mandated scoring criteria. The maximum available points equal 125. After evaluating the program's performance and making suggestions for improvement, the Legislative Review Commission created House Bill 741 to amend KRS 224A.320. The changes in House Bill 741 offer an improved analytical approach, by eliminating scoring metrics that were found to be ineffective for purposes of determining the financial condition of program applicants.

Increased weighting is recommended for MHI and Water Loss Correction. These metrics are the key factors for improved economic health for service providers. Decreased weighting is recommended for financial ratios, as they represent three separate categories, the total of these three categories should be viewed as a combined single Ratio Category Score.

House Bill 741, Summary

Summary of Original Version:

Amend KRS 224A.320 to require that eligible funding recipients for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (WWATERS) Program meet three or more of the eligibility criteria instead of one; require that a funding application for a capital construction project include cost and timeline estimates prepared and signed by a licensed professional engineer; allow the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority board to evaluate and score funding applications for proposed

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projects in phases; remove the funding evaluation criteria categories of current accounts payable turnover ratio and current days' sales in accounts receivable ratio; remove the requirement from the evaluation criteria that the applicant's receipt of a notice of violation of drinking water or other water quality standards occur in the past year; add to the funding evaluation criteria that the funding applicant previously received funding through the program for a prior phase of the proposed project.

Summary:

Retain original provisions; require that approved eligible funding recipients adopt best management practices as established and administered by the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority board; add to the funding eligibility criteria that the funding applicant can demonstrate that the amount of stormwater inflow and groundwater infiltration entering the funding applicant's system seriously impairs its effectiveness; EMERGENCY. House Bill 741 received third reading and passed 95-0 on 3/11/25 and was then taken to the Senate. The Bill subsequently received two readings in the Senate, but was not read a third time and no vote was taken.

Proposed Changes for KY WWATERS for Fiscal Year 2026 Scoring Adjustments for 2026

House Bill 741 proposed by the General Assembly with respect to suggestions for program improvement by KIA staff, sought to eliminate certain scoring metrics. These metrics were the Accounts Receivable Ratio, the Accounts Payable Turnover Ratio, along with changes to restrictions to the Notice of Violation metric, among others.

After reviewing applications for the 2025 Fiscal Year, these changes were evaluated for achieving the goal of funding Economically Restrained Systems. Based on the overall program, the recommendation of both the Legislative Review Commission and KIS staff recommends that the suggested changes to the weighted scoring rubric will better serve the review and analysis process for Fiscal Year 2026.

Mr. Bob Amato made the motion to approve the KIA staff recommendations for updating the scoring adjustments moving forward for 2026. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

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II. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Director Williams thanked everyone for attending the meeting. She introduced Mr. Bobby Aldridge as KIA's newest staff member. Mr. Aldridge is very familiar with KIA, having served as a Board proxy for the Cabinet for Economic Development before retiring a few years ago. He most recently worked for the Office of Broadband Development. He will be joining Julie Bickers and Debbie Landrum on the Regional Compliance team.

She noted that EPA Region IV was in the office the week of April 14th to perform their annual review of our Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds. They met with both KIA and DOW staff during their visit. They reviewed files and did transactional testing on the funds that we send to the borrowers. They found there were no inappropriate payments. We provided all their requested information. We have not received the final report back but expect it to be favorable. As mentioned in our annual Blue & Co. audit, EPA determined KIA had adequate internal controls and this is consistent with EPA's determination. EPA staff members were very impressed with the WRIS and portal systems and the amount of information that was readily available.

The week following the EPA review, several KIA staff attended the Council on Infrastructure Financing Authorities (CIFA) conference in Washington, DC. This group consists of other state members that do the same things that we do at KIA. Staff had the opportunity to hear from Jess Kramer, who is the appointee for the assistant administrator for EPA. We also heard from Andrew Sawyer and Jennifer McClain who work for Jess. They discussed possible changes that could trickle down to the SRF programs. There is so much unknown now that they weren't in position to discuss specifics. They will be creating a one-pager and will be releasing the information when it becomes available. They mentioned getting back to the basics with the program requirements and moving toward anything specifically required in the law without any additional policies or guidance. Director Williams hopes that it will simplify the process for the borrowers.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$20,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Regional Water Resource Agency for the Locust Force Main Replacement/Rehabilitation project. Such

amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 20.4%, not to exceed \$4,074,344, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$15,925,656 shall be repaid.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 79,747 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$58,819. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 23 percent from \$26.55 million in 2022 to \$32.62 million in 2024, outpacing operating expenses which increased 13 percent over the same period. Revenue growth was primarily driven by the addition of a Facilities/Compliance Plan (FCP) fee in July of 2023 to finance upgrades to the agency's two wastewater treatment plans. Operating expenses – less depreciation and other non-cash items – increased six percent in both 2023 and 2024 due to increases in employee wages/benefits and maintenance costs. While operating expenses have increased in the aggregate, the percentage of operating expenses to total revenues decreased from 63.2 percent in 2022 to 61.4 and 58 percent in 2023 and 2024, respectively. The agency's existing debt consists primarily of revenue bonds totaling \$82.7 million and 14 KIA loans totaling \$23.78 million. All KIA loans have been fully drawn with ongoing principal and interest payments. The debt service coverage ratio was 2.3, 1.7, and 3.0 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 6.5, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.4, 19.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 45.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash/equity in external investment pool.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer service revenues will increase 8 percent in FY 2025, 5 percent in FYs 2026 and 2027, and 3 percent in 2028 due to scheduled rate increases.
- 2) Sewer service revenues in FY 2029 will remain unchanged from the prior year due to there being no rate adjustments currently scheduled for FY 2029.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 4) The debt service coverage ratio is 2.3 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments commence.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The current replacement reserve account of \$2,500,000 is adequate to cover reserves for all KIA loans. No additional reserves will be required as a result of this loan.

The City of Bardstown is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$3,200,000 for their Gunning Sewer Pump Station and Force Main Upgrade project. The existing pump station is obsolete and has been operating on a rental bypass system since the existing pumps failed after the flooding and ice in February 2025. This project will upgrade the existing 200 GPM station to 600 GPM and replace 4" force main with 3,970 LF of 8" sewer force main. Nine new manholes will also be installed as well as 1,030 LF of 12" gravity sewer to direct the wastewater to the new Gunning Sewer Lift Station. The new station will be located downstream at a new site to allow for continued service during construction. The upgraded sewer liftstation will include hook-ups for a portable bypass pump and an electrical generator. This project will handle future development at The Nelson County Fairgrounds, which is not currently served by public sewer.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Bardstown is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$3,200,000 for their Gunning Sewer Pump Station and Force Main Upgrade project. The existing pump station is obsolete and has been operating on a rental bypass system since the existing pumps failed after the flooding and ice in February 2025. This project will upgrade the existing 200 GPM station to 600 GPM and replace 4" force main with 3,970 LF of 8" sewer force main. Nine new manholes will also be installed as well as 1,030 LF of 12" gravity sewer to direct the wastewater to the new Gunning Sewer Lift Station. The new station will be located downstream at a new site to allow for continued service during construction. The upgraded sewer lift station will include hook-ups for a portable by-pass pump and an electrical generator. This project will handle future development at The Nelson County Fairgrounds, which is not currently served by public sewer.

The city currently serves 7,420 residential customers, 1,285 commercial customers and 46 industrial customers.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 18,522 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$52,344. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer revenues increased 23.6% from \$5.97 million in 2022 to \$7.37 million in 2024 due to rate increases and capital capacity charges for the Town Creek Treatment facility improvements. Operating expenses increased 35.5% from \$2.56 million to \$3.46 million during the same period primarily due to salaries and related benefits, chemicals, and vehicle leases. The debt coverage ratio was 11.5, 5.9, and 7.5 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.5, 28.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 3.3% in FY25 due to approved rate increases with annual CPI increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 4.5 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$160,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$8,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-013) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$226,000 TO THE CITY OF EVARTS, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Evarts, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$226,000 of project expense, to the City of Evarts for the Lift Station Renovation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$12,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of June, 2025.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023 and unaudited financial statement ended June 30, 2024. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer revenues increased 2.52% from \$157,606 in FY2022 to \$161,571 in FY2024. Operating expenses increased 15.42% from \$159,885 to \$184,533 during the same period primarily due to increases in repairs and maintenance. The city does not currently have any sewer debt.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.8, 0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 22.5% in FY2025 and 8.2% in FY2026 with approved rate increases. A 2% annual increase in FY2027 and FY2028 has been approved as well.
- 2) Operating expenses will decrease 5.2% in FY2026 when the project is completed and then increase 2% annually due to inflation and general expenses increases.

3) Debt service coverage is 2.9 in 2027 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$12,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-018L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$182,255 TO THE CITY OF JAMESTOWN, RUSSELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Jamestown, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$182,255 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Jamestown for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 100%, not to exceed \$182,255, will be deducted from the approved loan amount.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of June, 2025.

VII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 27.9% from \$3.16 million in 2022 to \$4.04 million in 2024 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 5.0% from \$2.72 million to \$2.86 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 0.7, and 2.4 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.9, 42.0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 5.3 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

No repayment is required for this funding. There is also no service fee or replacement reserve required.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of June 5, 2025.
