I. PROCEEDINGS

Vice Chair Russell Rose called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of June 5, 2025

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the June 5, 2025, minutes. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A25-023S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,916,881 TO THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Shepherdsville's request for a \$6,916,881 Fund A loan for the second phase of the Blue Lick Road Drainage & Sanitary Sewer Improvement project. The first phase of this project has been completed and included the rehabilitation of two pump stations and elimination of a third pump station through the installation of gravity sewer. Phase Two, which is the portion being presented for consideration, will include the construction of a stormwater trunk line along a portion of Bullitt Lick Middle School Road, which will create an outlet for trapped runoff that is inundating the sewer system and nearby homes. Construction of the trunk line, along with work completed in Phase One, will help to reduce water runoff and infiltration and inflow into the sewer system. Based on the successful completion of Phases One and Two, a third phase is planned to install additional gravity sewer and convey flow directly from the Blue Lick Road area to the influent pump station at the sewer treatment plant. This will allow Shepherdsville to eliminate three pump stations in the area. The completion of each phase will improve drainage infrastructure, reduce infiltration and inflow, and operations and maintenance costs associated with the pump stations.

The city currently serves 4,776 residential customers and 466 commercial, industrial and institutional customers.

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A25-023S, for an amount up to \$6,916,881 to the City of Shepherdsville with the standard conditions. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND

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LOAN (F25-024) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$967,785 TO THE CITY OF AUBURN, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Auburn's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$967,785 for the Lead Service Line and Water Main Remediation project. A separate Fund F loan in the amount of \$482,215 from the Lead Service Line Replacement program will supplement this request in order the fully fund the project. The project consists of the replacement of approximately 5,000 linear feet of old 2" galvanized and 6" cast iron pipelines with PVC. Construction will be on West Main Street and Lincoln Avenue in an area that serves over 80 customers. The existing lines are over 50 years old, and their excessive leaks have led to extreme water loss. Lead goosenecks and joints will be replaced along with the lines and new meter sets will be installed. The project will also fix flow volume and water pressure issues in the area.

The City currently serves 738 residential customers and 82 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F25-024, to the City of Auburn for an amount up to \$967,788 with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-024L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$482,215 TO THE CITY OF AUBURN, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Auburn's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$482,215 for the Lead Service Line and Water Main Remediation project. A separate Fund F loan in the amount of \$967,785 from the Base program will supplement this request to fully fund the project. The project consists of the replacement of approximately 5,000 linear feet of old 2" galvanized and 6" cast iron pipelines with PVC. Construction will be on West Main Street and Lincoln Avenue in an area that serves over 80 customers. The existing lines are over 50 years old, and their excessive leaks have led to extreme water loss. Lead goosenecks and joints will be replaced along with the lines and new meter sets will be installed. The project will also fix flow volume and water pressure issues in the area.

Secretary Goodman made the motion to approve the four 2025-2026 KIA loan program interest rates as presented. Deputy Secretary Grigsby seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

9. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING INTEREST RATES FOR THE WWATERS PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2025, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2026

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The interest rate for all Kentucky WWATERS loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.25% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.25% and 0.50% based on the income parameters defined in the 2026 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the KYWWATERS interest rates as presented. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

Vice Chair Rose noted there were some guests from the City of Providence that would like to address the board. Webster County Judge Steve Henry, Representative Jim Gooch and Mr. Blake Edge, Green River Area Development District attended in-person and Mayor Tom Glover and other staff were on the phone.

Judge Henry took the floor and discussed recent issues the City had been experiencing. On July 1st, a boil-water advisory was issued and still remains in effect. Their system lost pressure on July 1st. Tanks could not be refilled until July 4th. There were service issues, with parts of the town having no water service for 4 days. Emergency Management provided bottled water. Four leaks were discovered and repaired with additional breaks the following day. The sole raw-water source at City Lake is five feet below normal summer pool. They fear a single large water main break, or an August drought could collapse the system, and they plan to submit an application for Emergency KYWWATERS funding. An outage would not only affect the City of Providence, but they supply water to two other communities as well. Mr. Blake Edge said they were in the process of completing the application and working with KIA to get the emergency application completed and submitted. Representative Gooch said he had been the former Mayor or Providence, and he would appreciate any efforts KIA could make to assist. Vice Chair Rose said that KIA would be happy to schedule a special meeting when the completed application has been submitted and reviewed.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for attending the meeting. She mentioned that the KIA financial team is working with the Blue & Co. auditors' staff on this year's audit.

The Intended Use Plan (IUP) is out for public comment for the EPA State Revolving Fund programs. This comment period ends on July 16th.

Staff is working on updates for the conference room. All the table tops need to be redone and will be sent out for repair. KIA has been told this project could take six to eight weeks to complete, which will affect the next couple of months' board meetings. Staff is inquiring about an alternate space in the building, and we will keep everyone informed as plans are finalized. If not, we may ask the board's permission to meet via ZOOM. We are also working on audio visual upgrades, with larger monitors and a better sound system.

Staff is composing a letter to our Cleaner Water Program and EKSAFE grantees as well as 2022 federally funded line-item recipients that were funded with ARPA funds reminding them that their spenddown must be completed no later than December 31, 2026. If anyone has the opportunity to spend time with any recipients, please remind them of this important deadline.

The KYWWATERS application submission deadline is open until August 29th. Our hope is to bring the projects scored to the board at the November 6th meeting. The final report should

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be completed by November 26th in order to submit it to the Legislature's Appropriations and Revenue Committee by the December 1st deadline.

KIA staff will be participating in some speaking engagements in the next few weeks. Some staff will be attending the EPA Region IV's All States Meeting in Chattanooga at the end of the month and at the Governor's Local Issues Conference in mid-August at the Galt House in Louisville. We invite you all to attend; online registration is open now. There is also the Kentucky Rural Water Association Conference that Director Williams will be attending to talk about the Water Resource Information System (WRIS) and KIA funding opportunities. KIA staff will be meeting with Area Development Districts' GIS and water coordinators on July 30th. We have reinstated the quarterly meeting and will discuss upgrades and updates on the WRIS.

Director Williams introduced Cynaman Jones as a new temporary staff member that will be assisting Mr. Rick Harris with the KYWWATERS application process. She will be happy to assist anyone should the need arise.

Vice Chair Rose mentioned that KIA staff had attended the KIPDA Water Management Council meeting recently and their participation was greatly appreciated.

 A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W26-001E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$880,000 TO THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, WEBSTER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

The Emergency Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance Fund was established to provide funding for troubled or economically restrained systems. The funding is dedicated to capital and non-capital expenses relating to restoring or avoiding imminent interruption of utility service provided by a public water or wastewater system after a declaration of emergency has been declared.

The County of Webster and the City of Providence have declared a state of emergency due to a system-wide loss of water pressure. The City of Providence water system has suffered an emergency resulting in a catastrophic loss of pressure to the entire system. An initial main break depressurized the entire system; once that leak was repaired and pressures began to rise, latent weaknesses in the aging distribution lines triggered additional failures, leaving every customer without service. Because the system was installed decades ago without adequate sectional valves, staff cannot isolate individual zones to make repairs while keeping the rest of the system pressurized.

The project will include 450 feet of interconnect PVC that will tie Webster County Water District to the City of Providence. This interconnect will provide an immediate auxiliary supply capable of stabilizing system pressure, enabling boil-water advisories to be lifted faster and allowing targeted repairs without full-system shutdowns. Rehabilitating the Herrin Water Storage Tank will supply sufficient pressure and volume to meet peak demand and fire-flow requirements. Lastly, seven separate valves and flow meters will be placed in the Providence system to allow sectional shutdowns and repairs, while also identifying leak zones.

The city currently serves 3,353 residents, consisting of 1,683 households.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the KYWWATERS Emergency funding, W26-001E, for an amount up to \$880,000 to the City of Providence with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 3,953 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$39,474. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022, through December 31, 2024. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 20 percent from \$1.66 million in 2022 to just over \$2 million in 2024. The primary drivers of revenue growth were a PSC-approved general rate adjustment in October 2023 and a purchased water adjustment in April 2024. Additionally, a monthly Water Loss Reduction surcharge was introduced in October 2023 to fund improvements and equipment intended to address the District's ongoing water loss issues. Operating expenses – less depreciation and other non-cash items - increased 32 percent from 2022 to 2024, outpacing revenue growth. However, this figure is somewhat misleading as operating expenses decreased by 4 percent in 2023 and then increased by 37 percent in 2024. The nearly 40 percent increase in operating expenses in 2024 was largely due to non-recurring costs. Additionally, Purchased Water costs increased nearly 21 percent from \$483 thousand in 2023 to nearly \$585 in 2024 due to the City of Burkesville – the District's primary water wholesaler – increasing its rates. The agency's existing debt consists of loans payable to the Kentucky Rural Water Finance Corporation totaling \$1.3 million, various bond issues payable to the U.S. Department of Agriculture totaling \$2.4 million, and notes payable to a local financial institution totaling \$130 thousand. The District has one loan with KIA (F15-001) which is fully drawn with ongoing principal and interest payments and a balance of \$548,420 as of CYE 2024. The debt service coverage ratio was 0.6, 1.3, and 0.4 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.7, 24.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water Revenues will increase 3.7 percent in 2025 due to PSC-approved rate increases that took effect in April 2024 and April 2025.
- 2) Water revenues will increase \$280,000 annually starting in 2026 to maintain the required 1.1 debt service coverage ratio.
- 3) Revenues obtained via the Water Loss Reduction Surcharge are not included in the 2025 2029 revenue projections due to the restricted nature of the funds. Per the District, surcharge revenues can only be used for improvements and equipment directly addressing the District's water loss and are not available for debt service of any kind.
- 4) Purchased Water costs will increase 10.5 percent in 2025 and 2026 and 4 percent in 2027 due to scheduled rate increases from the District's primary wholesale water provider. However, the overall volume purchased is projected to decrease 2.5 percent annually starting in 2026 due to ongoing and planned projects funded by the Water Loss Reduction Surcharge.
- 5) Operating Expenses will *decrease* by approximately 14 percent in 2025 due to the removal of non-recurring expenses that occurred in CY 2024.
- 6) Operating Expenses will increase 2 percent annually starting in 2026 due to inflation.
- 7) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

The Cumberland County Water District is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$1,110,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$56,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$38,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$760,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2019-2023, the Utility's service area population is 20,030 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$74,179. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$62,417. The loan will qualify for a 2.75% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022 through December 31, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 17.5% from \$4.57 million in 2022 to \$5.37 million in 2024 primarily due to a rate increase. Operating expenses increased 3.9% from \$2.30 million to \$2.66 million during the same period due to increases in salaries and wages. The debt coverage ratio was 1.0, 1.9, and 3.3 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.3, 56.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase \$850,000 annually starting in 2029 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 3% annually due to inflation and costs associated with added production from the new WTP.
- 3) Purchased water costs will increase 2% annually through 2027. When project construction is completed in 2028 purchased water costs will decrease \$400,000 annually.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2029 when the first full year of principal and interest repayment begins.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The BPWD is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$15,208,119 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$760,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$38,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-003L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$600,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Northern Kentucky Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

There are an estimated 24 customers in this area with lead service lines to be replaced along with approximately 950 feet of water main. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 20.2% from \$61.14 million in 2022 to \$73.50 million in 2024 due mostly to two separate rate increases. Operating expenses increased 17.4% from \$33.68 million to \$39.54 million during the same period due to salary increases and higher costs for chemicals and contractual services. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.8, and 1.9 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, and 16.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 1% in 2025 due to a rate increase that went into effect in February 2024.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses.

3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The NKWD is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$600,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$200,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$10,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$14,017,000 TO THE CITY OF LEWISPORT, HANCOCK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Lewisport, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$14,017,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lewisport for the Hancock County Regional Water Treatment Plant project. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness, not to exceed \$3,726,270, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$10,290,730 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$35,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$700,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of August, 2025.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, 32.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 7.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$4,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for the Taylor Mill Treatment Plant Powdered Activated Carbon

System project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$200,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of August, 2025.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2019-2023, the Utility's service area population is 252,858 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$79,887. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$62,417. The loan will qualify for a 2.75% interest rate.

VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022 through December 31, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 20.2% from \$61.14 million in 2022 to \$73.50 million in 2024 due mostly to two separate rate increases. Operating expenses increased 17.4% from \$33.68 million to \$39.54 million during the same period due to salary increases and higher costs for chemicals and contractual services. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.8, and 1.9 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, and 16.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 1% in 2025 due to a rate increase that went into effect in February 2024.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The NKWD is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$4,000,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$200,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$10,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 7th day of August, 2025.
