I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

He also thanked all the Board members for their commitment to the KIA Board and the tremendous work they do and appreciates their willingness to continue to serve.

A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the July 10, 2025, minutes. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the July 24, 2025, minutes. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-014) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,110,000 TO THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the Cumberland County Water District's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$1,110,000 to fund the Joe Scott Ridge Booster Pump Station Replacement project. The project will replace a non-operational pump station and enable the District to meet the water demands of existing and future customers in the southern portion of its distribution system. The District supplies water to the project area via wholesale purchases from the City of Burkesville and the City of Albany. In recent years, there have been multiple instances where the needed supply from the City of Albany was unavailable. The proposed project will allow the District to supply the project area solely with the City of Burkesville, which has ample capacity. Accordingly, the project will significantly improve the overall reliability for the District's system, while also helping to alleviate the ongoing capacity issues for the City of Albany.

The project consists of the construction of a new 250 gallon-per-minute (GPM) booster pump station and the installation of approximately 1,350 linear feet (LF) of 8-inch water transmission main and 1,750 LF of 3" water main and appurtenances along Kentucky HWY 61. The existing, non-operational pump station will be demolished and removed.

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The District serves 2,806 residential, 85 commercial, and 5 industrial customers. As noted, the District currently purchases water from the City of Burkesville, the City of Albany, and, minimally, the Columbia/Adair Utilities District.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B25-014, for an amount up to \$1,110,000 to the Cumberland County Water District with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The Cumberland County Water District will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt service coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that service revenues will need to increase approximately \$280,000, or 15 percent, by CY 2026 to meet the loan requirement. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,208,119 TO THE BULLOCK PEN WATER DISTRICT, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Bullock Pen Water District's (BPWD) request fie a Fund F loan in the amount of \$15,208,119 for the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Replacement project. The project will include architectural design, geotechnical investigation, surveying, environmental, funding administration, bidding services, construction administration, and construction costs for a 2.0 million gallons per day (mgd) WTP. The proposed WTP will replace a 1.1 mgd conventional mixed media WTP constructed in 1961 and expanded in 1985. Even though the existing WTP is rated at 1.1 mgd, the BPWD only produces an average of 0.40 mgd due to its condition and age and BPWD's water quality standards. In addition to replacing the WTP, the water intake, raw water and high service pumps will be replaced using VFD's for energy conservation.

The proposed WTP would be constructed near the existing WTP taking advantage of the existing transmission/distribution piping infrastructure. A feasibility study was completed to determine the type of WTP to construct, the location, and an economic study to show cost and potential savings by producing water instead of buying additional water from area providers. Other components of the project include improvements and expansion of the distribution system. This consists of a waterline extension to provide service to a currently unserved area with the possibility of looping the line in the future for service resiliency, replacement of an existing AC waterline that has a history of breaks, construction of a new water storage tank, and several mixing systems for existing tanks.

The BPWD currently serves 7,154 residential customers, 542 commercial customers, and 5 industrial customers.

After discussion among the Board members, there were several questions and concerns regarding this project. The members were concerned about moving the project forward without Bullock Pen Water District sharing their completed feasibility study and documentation from the Public Service Commission and the Division of Water certifications. They have been asked to come back to a future KIA Board meeting with the requested documentation.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to defer this project until Bullock Pen Water District can provide the Board with additional information, including their feasibility study, and certifications from the Public Service Commission and the Division of Water. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-009S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Northern Kentucky Water District's (NKWD) request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,000,000 for the Taylor Mill Treatment Plant Powdered Activated Carbon (PAC) System project. The proposed project involves the construction of a PAC storage and feed system to replace the temporary feed system as well as the original non-functioning feed system. It will also allow for the replacement of the ultraviolet light disinfection system which is at the end of its useful life. The project will aid in the removal of organic compounds including those in stormwater runoff such as pesticides, taste and odor causing compounds, river spills, and emerging contaminants such as PFAS. In 2021 testing conducted by the Energy and Environment Cabinet detected the presence of two PFAS compounds in the Licking River, which is the water source for the Taylor Mill Treatment Plant. The NKWD conducted similar testing in 2023 and found the presence of PFAS above detectable levels.

The NKWD currently serves 79,473 residential customers and 7,632 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service for six different systems.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from the vote. Mr. Andy Luttner made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F25-009S, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for an amount up to \$4,000,000 with the standard conditions. Secretary Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Sawyers noted the next two projects pertain to requests from the City of Lewisport. Staff recommends one presentation for both projects and rolling them into one vote following the presentation.

Deputy Secretary Geri Grigsby made the motion to roll the two Lewisport projects into one vote. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$14,017,000 TO THE CITY OF LEWISPORT, HANCOCK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Lewisport's request for a \$14,017,000 Fund F loan to construct a new 0.50 MGD Regional Water Treatment Plant and 40,000 LF of transmission main. This new Hancock County Regional Water Treatment Plant will replace 2 existing plants that are nearing the end of their useful life and require substantial rehabilitation and upgrades to remain functional. The regional facility will serve the City of Lewisport, the City of Hawesville and will also serve as an emergency water source for the East Daviess County Water Association, ensuring long term quality water for the citizens of Hancock County.

The City of Lewisport currently serves 1,112 residential customers and 98 commercial and industrial customers.

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5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-002E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,850,614 TO THE CITY OF LEWISPORT, HANCOCK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Lewisport's request for a \$3,850,614 Fund F loan to construct a new 0.50 MGD Regional Water Treatment Plant and 40,000 LF of transmission main. This new Hancock County Regional Water Treatment Plant will replace 2 existing plants that are nearing the end of their useful life and require substantial rehabilitation and upgrades to remain functional. The regional facility will serve the City of Lewisport, the City of Hawesville and will also serve as an emergency water source for the East Daviess County Water Association, ensuring long term quality water for the citizens of Hancock County.

The City of Lewisport currently serves 1,112 residential customers and 98 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve both Lewisport Fund F loans, F25-002 for an amount up to \$14,017,000 and F25-002E for an amount up to \$3,850,614 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City of Lewisport will pass a resolution to increase water revenues to meet the minimum 1.1 Debt Coverage Ratio for this loan. KIA staff estimates that to be approximately 50%, or \$300,000, in addition to revenues from Hawesville of \$769,000 annually. Secretary Goodman seconded, and the motion was unanimously passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-009S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

She reminded everyone that next week is the Governor's Local Issues Conference at the Galt House in Louisville. She hopes everyone will plan to attend. KIA staff will host an information table throughout the three-day event and will also do two presentations.

She noted that the KYWWATERS applications submission window is open until August 29th. Staff have informed borrowers that if applications are submitted by August 22nd, KIA staff will review submissions for thoroughness and will allow additional information to be submitted or corrected up until the Friday, August 29th deadline. Any applications received after the 29th will not be allowed to make any changes.

The KIA SRF team has sent out loan invitation letters for the upcoming SRF program. There were 11 Cleaner Water invites and 15 Drinking Water invites.

KIA staff continues to remind the ADDs and the recipients of the Cleaner Water grants that the spend down deadline is December 31, 2026. All funding needs to be spent by that time, or the monies will be forfeited.

She mentioned that the Bluegrass Area Development District will be presenting KIA Regional Compliance Coordinator Debbie Landrum a Community Planning Champion Award in the fall. Congratulations to Debbie.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to acknowledge Debbie Landrum at the next meeting in her absence today. Secretary Goodman seconded and the motion carried.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-037S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,772,000 TO THE CITY OF MONTICELLO, WAYNE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Monticello, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$8,772,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Monticello for the Sanitary Sewer Improvements – Phase I and Carter Road project. Such amounts

are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 41.8%, not to exceed \$3,662,784, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$5,109,216 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$21,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$438,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of September, 2025.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The City of Monticello is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$8,772,000 to fund the Sanitary Sewer Improvements-Phase 1 and Carter Road project. The project will provide public sanitary service for approximately 85 new customers and improved service to approximately 17 existing customers in the project area, which includes Westwood Estates, North Main Street, Green Acres, as well as customers in the area of Carter Road. The project will consist of the installation of 2,543 linear feet (LF) of 10" gravity sewer line, 19,375 LF of 8" gravity sewer line, 2,081 LF of 6" service laterals, 2,739 LF of 1.5" sewage force main, 875 Lf of 6" sewage force main, over 100 manholes, four grinder pumping stations and a 280 gallon-per-minute (GPM) wastewater pumping station. The line installation will consist of the replacement of existing lines for existing customers and the installation of new lines for new customers with no sewer currently. Existing septic systems will be eliminated for 85 customers being provided access to public sanitary service. In addition to providing public sanitary service to approximately 85 new customers, the project will eliminate sources of inflow and infiltration and help reduce public health issues to approximately 17 existing customers. Finally, the project will lay the foundation for future sewer extension and help foster growth and development to the region.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 6,137 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$42,840. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

VIII. 2024 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 41.8% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$3,662,784, will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2023. Financial information for the year ended June 30, 2024, was obtained from an unaudited financial statement. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

The combined operating revenues of the sewer and water systems increased 13.5 percent from \$4.99 million in 2022 to \$5.66 million in 2024. The increase in revenues over the period was largely due to an increase in metered and wholesale water rates that took effect in November 2023 resulting in a 14 percent increase in water revenues in fiscal year (FY) 2024. Sewer revenues were steady in 2022 and 2023 before decreasing by 5 percent, or nearly \$45,000, in 2024. Combined operating expenses for the sewer and water systems kept pace with revenues, increasing nearly 14 percent from FY 2022 through FY 2024; however, the increased costs over the period can mostly be attributed to increased employee wages and repair costs incurred in 2023. Operating expenses increased by just 1 percent in 2024. The City's utility debt consists of revenues bonds with a total balance of approximately \$15.45 million and three equipment loans totaling less than \$300,000. The City has one loan with KIA (F22-005) in the amount of \$2,340,250 that has yet to be drawn upon as of August 2025. The City anticipates that draws will begin on this loan in January of 2026. The debt service coverage ratio was 1.4, 0.9, and 1.6 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The City raised its water and sewer rates by 19.8 percent and 59.5 percent, respectively, effectively July 2024 (the start of FY 2025). This is the first sewer rate increase since 2016. The July 2024 rate adjustment did not include a wholesale water rate increase.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.9, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.0, 13.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.3 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 59.5 percent in FY 2025 due to the July 2024 rate increase.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase an additional 4 percent in FY 2028 following the completion of this project and the addition of approximately 85 new customers.
- 3) Water revenues will increase 25 percent in FY 2025 due to the combined impact of the November 2023 and July 2024 rate increases.
- 4) Water revenues will remain unchanged for FYs 2026-2029 due to there being no rate adjustments scheduled.
- 5) Operating expenses will increase 15.5 percent in FY 2025 due to the addition of rental expenses paid by the Utility Commission to the City for the use of Cityowned property and for inflation-related cost increases.
- 6) Operating expenses will increase 2 percent annually in FYs 2026-2029 due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 7) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in FY 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$438,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$21,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-015) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,700,000 TO THE BRONSTON WATER ASSOCIATION, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the Bronston Water Association, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,700,000 of project expense, to the Bronston Water Association for the Bronston 2025 Water System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$4,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$86,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4^{th} day of September, 2025.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 3,146 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$46,552. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022, through December 31, 2023. Financial information for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained from the Association's annual report filed with the Public Service Commission and verified with profit and loss statements. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 11.2 percent from \$978 thousand in 2022 to nearly \$1.1 million in 2024. The primary drivers of growth over the period were an October 2022 general rate adjustment and a purchased water adjustment that took effect in November of 2023. Expenses – meaning purchased water costs plus operating expenses less depreciation and other non-cash items – increased 31.5 percent from \$641 thousand in 2022 to \$843 thousand in 2024, outpacing revenue growth. The increased expenses are due, primarily, to inflation-related material and supply cost increases coupled with a 25 percent increase in wholesale water purchase rates that became effective November 2023.

The Association's existing debt consists of revenue bonds with a total balance of \$3.75 million as calendar-year end 2024. Additionally, the entity has a construction loan (B22-005) with KIA with \$1.93 million of the total available loan amount of \$3.37 million drawn as of August 2025. The debt service coverage ratio was 1.8, 1.1, and 1.5 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 11.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.0, 25.9 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase \$255,000 annually starting in CY 2026 to maintain the required 1.1 debt service coverage ratio.
- 2) Purchased water costs will remain stable at the level reflected in 2024; however, the volume of water purchased is projected to decrease by 2.5 percent in both CYs 2026 and 2027 due to expected improvements in the water system after the completion of the 2022 and 2025 Bronston Water System Improvements projects.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2 percent annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments on the proposed loan begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

The ENTITY is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$1,700,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$86,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$4,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 4th day of September, 2025.
