I. PROCEEDINGS

Vice Chair Russ Rose called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

One vote was taken for both sets of Minutes.

Judge Mark McKenzie moved to approve both sets of the minutes of the June 6, 2024, regularly scheduled meeting as well as the July 1, 2024, special called board meeting. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$54,006,047 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$26,222,500 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) and Capacity Improvements project. This project is receiving funding over multiple cycles. They received approval for \$27,783,547 from the KIA Board on December 7, 2023. This brings their total KIA loan amount up to \$54,006,047. This project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include six new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

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The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of lifethreatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

MSD currently serves 236,020 residential customers, 21,919 commercial customers, and 394 industrial customers.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman asked if it would be possible for MSD to provide the Board with the total number of projects with consent decrees and the total funding spent thus far at a future KIA Board meeting. Mr. Wes Sydnor said MSD would be happy to prepare the requested information.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the amendment to Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's loan increase for an amount up to \$26,222,500 for a total loan amount of \$54,006,047 with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-014S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$13,600,000 TO THE CITY OF PRINCETON F/B/O PRINCETON WATER AND WASTEWATER COMMISSION, CALDWELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Princeton, for the benefit of the Princeton Water & Wastewater Commission's, request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$13,600,000 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Improvements project. The WWTP is aging and requires numerous upgrades to continue operating at its current capacity. The project consists of the following components:

- Addition of a flow diversions structure
- New equalization basin pump station to address I&I issues
- Replacement of grit removal and influent screens
- Modifications to existing oxidation ditches to improve treatment
- · Repairs to existing clarifiers
- · Additional aeration to existing sludge holding basins
- Replacement of emergency generator and belt filter press
- New SCADA system
- Miscellaneous electrical and mechanical improvements

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The City currently serves 2,403 residential customers, 450 commercial customers and 9 industrial customers.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund A Loan, A24-014S, for an amount up to \$13,600,000 to the City of Princeton F/B/O Princeton Water and Wastewater Commission with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F23-006S) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,577,650 TO THE ADAIR COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, ADAIR COUNTY, ENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Adair County Water District's request for a Fund F loan increase for an amount up to \$1,200,000 for the Phase 23 Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and System Improvements project. The original loan of \$4,377,650 was approved by the KIA Board on February 2, 2023. This will bring the total KIA loan amount to \$5,577,650. The request for additional funds is due to bids coming in higher than expected. No additional work is being funded with the loan increase.

The project consists of installing plate settlers at the WTP to increase treatment capacity of the existing basins, improve effluent quality, and reduce associated operational costs. The disinfection system at the WTP will be converted from chlorine gas to sodium hypochlorite. Five of the Water District's seven water tanks are experiencing corrosion and will be rehabilitated. A water main extension will also be installed to provide a connection to an unserved area.

The Water District currently serves 7,774 residential customers and 670 commercial and industrial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the F loan increase for an amount up to \$1,200,000 to the Adair County Water District with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion was passed.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-134L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$32,134,730 TO THE LOUISVILLE WATER COMPANY, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed The Louisville Water Company's (LWC) request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$32,134,730 for their Private Lead Service Line Replacement project. The project consists of the identification and complete replacement of all lead service lines for approximately 32,000 households in some of the most economically disadvantaged areas of Louisville Metro. There will be a comprehensive plan for outreach in these areas

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and the replacement of the lines will come at no cost to the customer. A process is in place to identify the material of the private side portion of the service line which will include point entry inspection or potholing. The LWC has invested significant resources identifying areas most likely to include lead service lines on their property, the majority of which were built prior to 1950. They manage a robust GIS system that includes detailed records of infrastructure, census tract data, mapping of the entire service area, and construction dates of homes. The project will accomplish one of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law's top priorities of replacing all lead service lines in disadvantaged areas around the nation.

The LWC currently serves 258,633 residential customers and 43,802 commercial, industrial, and other customers. They provide wholesale service to 9 different systems in the state.

Mayor Bruce Fraley asked about the ability to use public funds on private property. KIA staff noted that was a great question and stated that the Lead Service Line program allows funding for use on private property.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F23-134L, in an amount up to \$32,134,730 to the Louisville Water Company with the standard conditions. Mr. Andy Luttner seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-064E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,501,690 TO THE LOGAN/TODD REGIONAL WATER COMMISSION, TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed The Logan/Todd Regional Water Commission's (LTRWC) request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$6,501,690 for the LTRWC Additional Sedimentation Train/General Plant Expansion project. The Commission will expand the plant capacity from 13 to 15 MGD by adding membrane filtration and granular activated carbon to address emerging contaminants, primarily PFOS and PFOA. This expansion includes the addition of a third sedimentation train along with upgrades to plant components.

The LTRWC currently serves 13 wholesale customers which includes Logan, Todd and Christian counties in Kentucky and Springfield, Tennessee.

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F24-064E for an amount up to \$6,501,690 to the Logan-Todd Regional Water Commission with the standard conditions. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-066L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,320,394 TO THE CITY OF DANVILLE, BOYLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

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Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed the City of Danville's request for a Fund F loan in an amount up to \$2,320,394 for the Danville Lead & Copper Replacements project. This project would replace any known lead/copper service lines and connections, thereby reducing the potential for lead contamination in the water distribution system. This replacement would be performed upon the completion of the lead service line inventory project. This project will include only the line and component replacements needed for eliminating lead service lines moving the system into compliance with the Lead & Copper rule.

The City currently serves 11,142 residential customers and 38 commercial/industrial and 6 wholesale customers.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F24-066L, for an amount up to \$2,320,394 to the City of Danville with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

7. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

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8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING INTEREST RATES FOR THE WWATERS PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025

Director Williams discussed the interest rates that staff recommends for approval for the new Kentucky WWaters Program. She reminded the group that this program was established in the 2024 General Assembly in HB563. KIA is to use the same criteria to set rates as is used for SRF Funds A and F, and the rate must be at least 0.5% lower and not less than zero

Last month the Board approved the interest rates for Funds A and F at Standard 2.25% and Non-Standard 1.25% and .50% respectively, based on income parameters in the 2025 Cleaner Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan (IUP).

The interest rate for all Kentucky WWaters loans for the period July 1,2024 through June 30, 2025, shall be as follows: One standard interest rate shall be 1.75% and two non-standard rates shall be 0.75% and 0.00% based on the income parameters defined in the IUP.

Staff recommends approval of the Kentucky WWaters interest rates as presented

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the interest rates as presented. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for their participation in today's meeting. She said that Chair Matt Sawyers sent his regrets for not being in attendance, due to a scheduling conflict, and many thanks to Mr. Rose for stepping in to Chair the meeting.

She noted that she was pleased to introduce Mr. Russell Neal joining KIA as a Staff Assistant. He previously worked for the Division of Water, and we are very happy to have him. There is another staff member starting next Tuesday, July 16th. There are two active postings that we will be working on very soon and three additional IT postings will be posted next.

The Kentucky WWaters applications are being finalized and will be distributed next week via email. The application deadline is August 31st. The Board will be responsible for approving the score and the rank of each project and recommending a funding scenario for submission to the General Assembly by - December 1st. The General Assembly will make the final funding decision.

She updated everyone on the 2025 Intended Use Plan for both the Clean Water and Drinking Water SRF programs. The Public Comment period ends on Friday, July 12th. KIA has a little over \$100 million in the Clean Water and \$75 million in the Drinking Water funds, so staff will be working on all that funding as soon as the IUP is finalized.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,372,500 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON, MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Lebanon, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$6,372,500 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lebanon for the Wastewater System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 26%, not to exceed \$1,657,882, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$4,714,618 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$15,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$318,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of September, 2024.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 6,484 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$37,636. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for \$2,315,000 in Green Project Reserve funding. The majority of the green components qualify under the energy efficiency category.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 26% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,657,882, will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 28.4% from \$1.46 million in 2021 to \$1.87 million in 2023 due to increased usage from Diageo Distillery, a new industrial customer. Operating expenses increased 38.6% from \$1.20 million to \$1.67 million during the same period primarily due to costs associated with system repairs. The debt coverage ratio was 2.1, 9.4, and 13.0 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, 75.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 10% in 2025 due to an existing rate increase.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase \$250,000 annually starting in 2026 due to the development of Pernod Ricard Distillery.
- 3) Sewer revenues will increase \$230,000 annually starting in 2027 to maintain the 1.1 debt coverage ratio requirement.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase 3% annually due to inflation and costs associated with added volume from industrial customers.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$318,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$15,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-023) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,366,000 TO THE PADUCAH MCCRACKEN COUNTY JOINT SEWER AGENCY, MCCRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Paducah McCracken County Joint Sewer Agency, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$15,366,000 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Paducah McCracken County Joint Sewer Agency for the Long-Term Control Plan Project 3 Phase 2 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 26%, not to exceed \$3,997,649, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$11,368,351 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of September, 2024.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Paducah McCracken County Joint Sewer Agency (Paducah JSA) is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$15,366,000 for the Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) Project 3 Phase 2 project. The project is associated with the Outfall 003 located adjacent to the Paducah Wastewater Treatment Plant and will be constructed next to the recently completed 15 MG combined sewer wet weather tank and diversion structure and pump station. This portion of the project will complete installation of the remaining pumps not installed in phase 1 and construct the 56 inch force main to a fine screening facility with two 45 MGD fine screens and related appurtenances. In addition, this phase will also construct a 72 inch gravity line, with capability to serve a future disinfection facility (Project #5 of the LTCP) that will extend through the City of Paducah floodwall, and join with the existing Outfall 003 discharge location outside of the floodwall. The construction of this discharge line will also augment the existing floodwall pumping capacity for this area of the City by approximately 20%, as well as reducing contamination going into the river. All new pumps are energy efficient and ran by VFDs. Combined with Project #5 (disinfection), Outfall 003 will have the capacity to screen and disinfect over 77 MGD of combined sewer overflow. This project is required by the approved LTCP for the Paducah JSA and is necessary to achieve compliance with the Consent Decree 07-CI-1252 related to combined sewers.

This portion of the project will complete installation of the remaining pumps not installed in phase 1 and construct the 56 inch force main to a fine screening facility with two 45 MGD fine screens and related appurtenances. In addition, this phase will also construct a 72-inch gravity line, with capability to serve a future disinfection facility (Project #5 of the LTCP) that will extend through the City of Paducah floodwall, and join with the existing Outfall 003 discharge location outside of the floodwall. The construction of this discharge line will also augment the existing floodwall pumping capacity for this area of the City by approximately 20%, as well as reducing contamination going into the river. All new pumps are energy efficient and ran by VFDs. Combined with Project #5 (disinfection), Outfall 003 will have the capacity to screen and disinfect over 77 MGD of combined sewer overflow. This project is required by the approved LTCP for the Paducah JSA and is necessary to achieve compliance with the Consent Decree 07-CI-1252 related to combined sewers.

The Paducah JSA currently serves 19,417 customers.

The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Sewer revenues increased 9.1 from \$9.60 million in 2021 to \$10.47 million in 2023 due to rate adjustments. Operating expenses increased 12.1% from \$4.51 million to \$5.06 million during the same period due to higher costs of chemicals and system repairs. The debt coverage ratio was 2.5, 4.0, and 2.5 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 6.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, 20.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 8.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 3% in 2024 and 3.3% in 2025 due to existing rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The Agency currently has designated reserves of \$3,000,000. The reserves are specifically for high dollar capital equipment purchases, for emergencies, or for rate stabilization in the event of a loss of a substantial revenue stream. No additional reserves will be required.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDEMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B22-004) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL \$555,000 FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT OF UP TO \$5,055,000 TO THE WESTERN PULASKI COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously entered into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the Western Pulaski County Water District in the amount of \$4,500,000 and the Western Pulaski County Water District has requested to increase the loan B22-004 by \$555,000 for a total loan amount of up to \$5,055,000.

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$5,055,000 of project expense, to the Western Pulaski County Water District for the Bourbon Water Storage Tank Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.0%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$12,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$252,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of September, 2024.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 15.3% from \$3.54 million in 2021 to \$4.08 in 2023 while operating expenses increased 16.9% from \$2.66 million to \$3.11 million during the same period primarily due to increased transmission and distribution maintenance expenses as well as salary and pension costs. Consolidated cash flow before debt service averaged \$0.99 million in the 3 audited years. The debt coverage ratio was 1.5, 1.4, and 1.4 in 2021, 2022, and 2023 respectively.

The Western Pulaski County Water district is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$5,055,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$252,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$12,600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 5th day of September, 2024.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY RELATING TO SCORING OF AND FUNDING PROPOSALS RELATING TO KYWWATERS APPLICATIONS

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, House Bill 563 of the 2024 General Assembly amended the Act to create the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (KYWWATERS) Program in order to fund capital and non-capital expenses of public water or wastewater systems that meet the eligibility requirements set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority anticipates processing and scoring KYWWATERS applications and reporting funding recommendations to the Kentucky General Assembly's Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue (the "Joint Committee"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby determines that all KYWWATERS applications will be scored based on the scoring rubric set forth on Exhibit A hereto. (NOTE: Scoring rubric to be discussed and determined by the Authority in the meeting)

Section 3. The Authority hereby determines that, in order to make the proposals regarding structure and terms of funding of the KYWWATERS applications to the Joint Committee as required by KRS 224A.320 (7)(g)1., the Authority shall propose the first funding scenario on the list attached hereto as Exhibit B that results in applicant maintaining a debt service coverage ratio of ______ (or a grant if such DSCR is not possible even with a full grant). (NOTE: Loan repayment term, amount of principal forgiveness to be offered in third funding scenario, target DCSR and any other applicable funding scenario terms to be discussed and determined by the Authority in the meeting)

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of September, 2024.
