Chair Sandra Dunahoo called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order.

Ms. Dunahoo asked DLG Staff Attorney Bill Pauley to confirm the press notification and the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the filing of an application for the 2017 Capitalization Grant for the Drinking Water Revolving Fund. Mr. Robert Amato seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

6. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING APPROVAL FOR THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2017 CAPITALIZATION GRANT FOR THE WASTEWATER REVOLVING FUND

Mr. David Voegele moved to approve the filing of an application for the 2017 Capitalization Grant for the Wastewater Revolving Fund. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C18-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,800,000 TO THE CITY OF BOWLING GREEN f/b/o BOWLING GREEN MUNICIPAL UTILITIES, WARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the City of Bowling Green f/b/o Bowling Green Municipal Utilities' request for a Fund C loan in the amount of \$3,800,000 for the Water Treatment Plant Expansion project. In order to meet anticipated growth and redundancy needs in the City and County, it is necessary to upgrade the aging water treatment plant. This loan will fund all engineering costs for the project which has anticipated construction costs around \$42 million and financed by bonds. The future plant design will maintain the conventional treatment process and include the addition of a filter building with ten filters, two flash mix units, four flocculation and sedimentation basins, and expansion of an existing raw water pump station. The project will be offered for bids with a base bid addition of 7.5 MGD with an additive alternate of 7.5 MGD. The renovation will potentially add 7.5-15 MGD of capacity to the current plant capacity of 30 MGD (37.5-45 MGD total).

The driving force behind the expansion is mainly to address population growth in the County. Because BGMU is the majority water provider for Warren County Water District (WCWD), they must increase capacity to continue meeting their needs. As a result of this, WCWD will actually carry approximately 85% of the debt related to this project. BGMU provides WCWD with around 8.5 MG of water on a daily basis.

BGMU services approximately 22,000 residential and commercial retail customers. They also sell water to Warren County Water District who provides service to approximately 25,000 additional customers.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund "C" Loan, (C18-001) up to the amount of \$3,800,000 to the City of Bowling Green f/b/o Bowling Green Municipal Utilities with the standard conditions. Mr. Robert Amato seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR ASSUMPTION OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A04-06) BY THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG f/b/o PRESTONSBURG CITY'S UTILITY COMMISSION, FLOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR ASSUMPTION OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A11-16) BY THE CITY OF PRESTONSBURG f/b/o PRESTONSBURG CITY'S UTILITY COMMISSION, FLOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, discussed the City of Prestonsburg for the benefit of the Prestonsburg City's Utility Commission (PCUC) plans to assume two wastewater loans from Southern Water and Sewer District (the "District") in conjunction with an asset acquisition and realignment of customer territories and responsibilities between the two organizations. PCUC will acquire all wastewater assets and selected drinking water assets and customer rights in exchange for cash, the assumption of debt and previous financial assistance provided by the PCUC. The Kentucky Public Service Commission ("PSC") approved the transaction on May 2, 2017.

The decision to realign the assets and customers is necessitated by two primary items. First, the District has been issued numerous Notices of Violation (NOV) from the Division of Enforcement for violations of Kentucky water quality laws in connection with its operation of the wastewater system. To mitigate or eliminate potential civil penalties that could result from the violations, the District entered into an operating agreement with PCUC to manage and operate the wastewater system since July 1, 2016. Second, the water system facilities proposed to be

transferred are in remote sections of the District system and can more easily be serviced by PCUC.

The initial financial impact of the transfers to PCUC will improve their net cash flow by about \$100,000 annually which will be needed to support ongoing capital improvements for the acquired system components. PCUC has estimated a need of \$1.5 million of which a major portion will be water tank rehabs, tank additions, and meter replacements throughout the acquired areas. Both the improvements and the acquisition are being funded with a 2017 bond issue. Additional cash flow will result from the meter replacements and the addition of customers from an in process District wastewater service extension that is expected to be completed by the end of December 2017. The aggregate cash flow improvements will offset the debt service.

Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the assumption of Fund "A" Loans, (A04-06 and A11-16) to the City of Prestonsburg f/b/o Prestonsburg City's Utility Commission. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

9. AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO UCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

Mr. Robert Amato moved to approve the resolution. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil addressed the group. She mentioned that she and Ashley Adams had recently traveled to Atlanta for the EPA Region IV meeting. It was a valuable trip having the opportunity to network with other states' staff. With the addition of new KIA financial staff, Sheryl Parsons, EPA Region IV SRF Coordinator, will come back to Kentucky in September for training. There will be an Intended Use Plan public meeting held on Friday, July 7th. This will be the first year KIA will present two H20 awards at the upcoming Governor's Local Issues Conference in Louisville, August 23-25. Eligible nominees for the Award must have a clean or drinking water project funded by KIA which comply with the federal Clean Water Act and/or Safe Drinking Act and the project must be completed with full operational status no later than June 30, 2017. Nomination deadline is July 28th. Linda Bridwell has agreed to serve on

the selection committee and if others are interested, please let Director McNeil know as soon as possible. Finally, while reviewing application status, staff recommends that the regularly scheduled August KIA Board meeting be cancelled. There will not be enough for the Board to review and those can be combined with the applications ready for the September meeting.

Chair Dunahoo asked Board members if they had any questions or concerns about postponing the August Board meeting. There were none so she asked for a motion.

Mr. Ron Lovan made the motion to cancel the regularly scheduled August Board meeting. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A16-036) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$597,939 TO THE CITY OF ELKHORN CITY, PIKE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A16-036) to the City of Elkhorn City on September 3, 2015, in the amount of \$560,000 and the City of Elkhorn City has requested to increase loan A16-036 by \$37,939; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Elkhorn City, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such

statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$597,939 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Elkhorn City for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness not to exceed \$140,000 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$457,939 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$15,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of September, 2017.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

This request is for a \$37,939 increase to a previously approved loan in the amount of \$560,000 originally approved on September 3, 2015. The need for the loan increase is due to changes in project design and limited site space/access that lead to the construction budget estimate being higher than expected.

The City of Elkhorn City is requesting an increase of \$37,939 to an existing Fund A loan. The original loan was approved on September, 3 2015 in the amount of \$560,000 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Project. The City is requesting the increase due to increased construction estimates caused by changes made to the project design addressing limited space and access to the project site.

The purpose of the original project was to replace the City's 150,000 gallon per day plant with a 385,000 gallon per day Sequencing Batch Reactor plant. The loan increase will continue the purpose of the original loan.

The City serves approximately 353 residential customers and 51 commercial customers.

The City of Elkhorn City made the decision to lower water rates over a three year period as a result of wholesale rate decreases by Mountain Water District. Mountain Water District (MWD) rate decreases were determined by PSC. They also mirrored sewer rate increases done by MWD less 20% for Inside City customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2011-2015, the City's service area population was 1,073 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$25,041. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$43,740. The MHI for the City is 57.2% of the Commonwealth's MHI. This project qualifies for a .75% interest rate based on the MHI.

- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization in the amount of \$140,000. The additional subsidization is unchanged from the original loan.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2014 through 2016. The water and sewer utilities are components of the City. These components are identified separately in the audited financial statements.

HISTORY

Revenues decreased 1.9% from 2014 to 2015 and increased 4.4% from 2015 to 2016. The revenue increase from 2015 to 2016 is the result of changes in water and sewer rates implemented by the City in December 2015. In November 2016, the City decreased water rates by approximately 5.1% and increased sewer rates approximately 35.5%. Rate movement in the City and County was modeled after the rate movement of Mountain Water District, the City's wholesale water provider. PSC directed Mountain Water District to lower water rates over three years starting in 2015 and increase sewer rates over the same period of time. Operating expenses decreased 1.9% from 2014 to 2015 and increased 8.6% from 2015 to 2016.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.8 and 29.3 days sales in accounts receivable. The debt coverage ratios for 2014, 2015, and 2016 were 1.6, 0.7, and 0.4, respectively.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues reflect a rate reduction spanning from 2017 to 2019. Sewer revenues reflect increases during the same time period. Please refer to the rate tables in section VI (B) for more information.
- 2) Expenses will increase according to inflation; estimated to be 2%.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2020 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$1,500. This amount must be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$15,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (insert after investments, page 16 of 2016 audit)

Assistance Agreements Receivable and Allowance for Loan Losses

Assistance Agreements receivable are stated at their outstanding principal balances net of allowances for loan losses. The Allowance for Loan Losses is evaluated not less than annually and is established through a Provision for Loan Losses and is charged to expense. Loans are charged against the allowance for loan losses when management believes that the collectability of the principal is unlikely. The allowance is an amount that management believes will be adequate to absorb losses on existing loans that may become uncollectible and is based on individual assessments of their collectability. The Authority has never incurred a loss of principal on a loan. Therefore, prior loan loss experience is not considered in the evaluation. Management believes the allowance for loan losses is adequate. While management uses available information and considers potential remedies to recognize the amount of losses on loans, these evaluations are subjective and future adjustments to the allowance may be necessary if the results of mitigation efforts differ substantially from the original loss estimates.

Note 6 - Assistance Agreements Receivable

Assistance agreements receivable are for loans made to governmental entities for construction of infrastructure projects. The principal and interest are due in periodic installments that are used to either meet the principal and interest requirements of the Authority's revenue bonds or to fund additional projects. For the years ended June 30, 2017 and 2016, Assistance Agreements Receivable, net of Allowances for Loan Losses, was as follows:

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

BYLAWS

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority ("the Authority") was created pursuant to the authority of House Bill 217 enacted by the 1988 Regular Session of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, now codified as KRS Chapter 224.A and has been subsequently amended by SB409 of the 2000 Regular Session of the General Assembly and SB 20 of the 2009 Regular Session of the General Assembly of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") as a body corporate and politic, and an agency and instrumentality of the Commonwealth, to provide assistance to local governments and private entities in planning and financing the acquisition, construction, and rehabilitation of infrastructure projects as defined in the Act, for the purpose of protecting the health and safety, and promoting the welfare and well-being of the general public within the Commonwealth; and,

WHEREAS, infrastructure projects have the further desired and intended effects of aiding the Commonwealth and its political subdivisions in retaining existing businesses and industries, attracting new businesses and industries, promoting the creation of jobs, alleviating unemployment, and otherwise improving the quality of life for all citizens of the Commonwealth; and,

WHEREAS, the Authority is authorized by the Act to adopt Bylaws to govern the conduct of its affairs;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Authority hereby adopts the following Bylaws, which shall be in effect until changed by the Authority, to wit:

ARTICLE I Definitions

All words or phrases used in these Bylaws, and in proceedings and resolutions of the Authority under the Act, as amended, shall have to the extent defined in the Act, the same meanings as assigned such words or phrases by the Act. Any conflict between language used in these Bylaws, or in any proceedings of the Authority, and the Act, shall be resolved in favor of the language of the Act which is, in all such respects, controlling.

ARTICLE II Office

The principal office of the Authority shall be the office of the Governor, 1024 Capital Center Drive, Suite 340, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601, or at such other location as the Board may designate.

ARTICLE III Membership

Membership of the Authority is as established by KRS 224.A, as amended. Specifically, the affairs of the Authority shall be managed and carried out by a board consisting of eleven (11) members. The Secretaries of the Economic Development, Finance and Administration and Energy and Environment Cabinets, the Executive Director of the Public Service Commission, and the Commissioner of the Department for Local Government shall serve as ex-officio members of the Authority and may designate alternates. In addition, the Governor shall appoint six (6) at-large members, one (1) each from three (3) nominees submitted respectively by the Kentucky Association of Counties, the Kentucky League of Cities, the Kentucky Rural Water Association, the Kentucky section of the American Water Works Association and the Kentucky Municipal Utilities Association, and one (1) individual representing private water utilities. All members of the Authority shall have full voting rights on any matter pending before the Authority. Pursuant to statue, the terms of ex-officio members shall run with the appointment to the respective office or position and the term of the at-large members shall be four (4) years; except for the initial terms which vary.

ARTICLE IV Officers and Employees

- A. Officers of the Authority shall be a Chair, a Vice Chair and a 1st Vice Chair, who shall be selected from the membership. The Chair shall be selected from among the ex-officio membership, and a Vice Chair shall be selected from among the at-large members. The 1st Vice Chair shall be selected from the membership. The terms of office for the board officers so elected shall be two (2) years. Members may be re-elected to serve as a board officer.
- B. The Authority may appoint an Executive Director and, pursuant to statute, shall appoint a Secretary and a Treasurer and other staff as may be determined by the Board to be necessary or appropriate for conduct of the Authority's business. Neither the Executive Director, the Secretary, the Treasurer, nor any other staff members shall be members of the Authority. Appointments of such employees shall be made upon recommendation of the Chair. If no Executive Director, Secretary or Treasurer are appointed, their respective functions or other functions determined by the Board to be beneficial to the Authority may be performed on an "acting" basis by staff of other agencies as per a Memorandum of Agreement between the Authority and the assisting agency.

All agreements to which the Authority is a party shall be executed manually by the Chair or by the Executive Director, as so authorized, and the manual signature of the Secretary shall attest the Chair's or the Executive Director's signature.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Bond Certificates representing debt obligations of

the Authority may be executed with the facsimile signatures of the Chair and Secretary; provided, however, that the legal document under which such debt obligations are authorized shall provide that each such Bond Certificate so executed with the facsimile signatures shall be manually executed by a duly authorized officer of a bank or trust company as the Authority's designated Bond Registrar and Transfer Agent.

ARTICLE V Executive Committee

- A. There is hereby created an Executive Committee of the Authority consisting of the duly elected officers of the Authority. The Chair shall preside at meetings of the Executive Committee. If a member of the Executive Committee resigns or is unable to serve on the Executive Committee for any reason, the Chair shall appoint a member or members of the Authority to fill the vacancy or vacancies until the next meeting of the Authority, at which time a new member or members of the Executive Committee shall be elected.
- B. The Executive Committee shall review and recommend business items to be submitted to the Authority for consideration and final approval, provided that any member of the Authority may propose additional items for consideration by the Authority. Except as specifically authorized by a resolution, or a motion recorded in the minutes of a meeting of the Authority, a majority of the members present voting in favor thereof, the Executive Committee shall have no power to take final action with respect to the implementation of any infrastructure project proposed for approval for financial assistance under the Act. Following adoption of a preliminary authorizing resolution by the Authority with respect to the issuance of specific bonds, notes or other obligations of the Authority, the Executive Committee may from time to time be vested with the power to act on behalf of the Authority in approving the final principal amount of such bonds, notes or other obligations to be issued by the Authority and the forms of contracts and offering documents relating thereto.

ARTICLE VI Meetings

A. The Authority shall meet in Frankfort on the first Thursday of each month and for special meetings at the call of the Chair. The time of each regularly scheduled monthly meeting shall be established at least annually by resolution approved by a majority of the members of the full membership of the Authority acting at either a regular meeting or at a special meeting. If a meeting is to be held at the call of the Chair, the call may be made in writing or orally, by telephone or otherwise, and shall advise members of the Authority of the time, date, and place of the meeting, and the nature of the business to be considered at such meeting. Unless the Chair is of the opinion that an emergency exists that requires the Authority to convene sooner, or if an emergency arises that requires the postponement or re-scheduling of a meeting, meetings of the Authority shall be held at the designated times and locations at least forty-eight (48) hours after issuance of the call for the meeting. The Secretary shall

provide notice of all meetings of the Authority and of the Executive Committee to the press, electronic media, and the public, as required by the Kentucky Open Meetings Act, KRS 61.805 to 61.850.

- B. The Chair, or in his absence the Vice Chair, shall preside at Authority meetings. If the Chair, Vice Chair, and 1st Vice Chair are absent from a meeting, the Chair may designate a member or the Executive Director of the Authority to preside over the meeting. Meetings of the Authority shall be conducted generally according to the rules of proceedings outlined in the most current edition of Roberts' Manual of Parliamentary Rules.
- C. Actions of the Board, and committees thereof, including election of officers may be conducted by correspondence in a manner determined by the Board, such as mail, fax, voice phone, or similar means.
- D. Any and all meetings of the Board and any committees thereof may be conducted by means of video teleconferencing upon compliance with the requirements of KRS 61.820 or 61.823 as appropriate.

ARTICLE VII Administrative Functions

- A. The administrative functions of the Authority shall be performed by the Executive Director under the supervision and direction of the Chair. The Executive Director shall be authorized, with the approval of the Chair, to take all action specifically or by necessary implication authorized by the Authority to carry out the Authority's administrative functions. The Executive Director shall supervise the functions of the Secretary and/or Treasurer and all other staff of the Authority as may exist. If no Secretary and/or Treasurer of the Authority are appointed, the respective functions may be provided by other staff as so directed.
- The Secretary of the Authority shall take, transcribe, distribute copies to members of the Authority, and maintain and preserve a permanent record at the Authority's office, of the minutes of all meetings of the Authority and of all meetings of the Executive Committee. The Secretary shall prepare and maintain an accurate record of the proceedings of both the Authority and the Executive Committee, and shall maintain and preserve the Authority's official correspondence files, and all books and other records of the Authority at the Authority's office. The Authority's records shall be open to public inspection as provided by the Kentucky Open Records Act, KRS 61.870 to 61.884. The Executive Director shall acquire, and the Secretary shall maintain a seal for the Authority, which shall bear the legend "Kentucky Infrastructure Authority." The seal shall be impressed or reproduced upon documents to which the Authority is a party, but the absence of the seal from any document shall not invalidate the legal effect of such document when executed on behalf of the Authority by the Chair or the Executive Director and the document is otherwise properly authorized, ratified, or approved for execution by the Authority. The signature of either the Executive Director

or the Secretary shall attest the Authority's official acts.

- C. The Treasurer of the Authority shall receive and disburse funds of the Authority and shall keep all monies of the Authority deposited in its name as required by the Act, KRS 224A.110. The Treasurer shall report to the Authority not less often that semiannually on all funds coming into the hands of the Treasurer as custodian for the Authority. The Treasurer shall disburse the funds of the Authority for any purpose for which such disbursement may be made under the Act, or for any other purpose for which they may be properly and legally expended, upon authorization by the Chair, the Executive Director, or as approved by the Authority by resolution or motion recorded in the minutes and duly adopted at a meeting of the Authority.
- D. To ensure proper accountability for its programs, the Authority shall annually adopt an operation plan and budget which shall contain in addition to any other information that may be necessary or desirable, an estimate of revenues accruing to and proposed expenditures by the Authority during the ensuring fiscal year. The Executive Director shall prepare and submit to the Authority in a timely manner budgetary information necessary to the formulation and adoption of such a budget.
- E. The Treasurer of the Authority shall prepare a complete operating and financial statement covering the Authority for each fiscal year which, after review and approval by the Authority, shall be submitted to the Governor and the General Assembly within 120 days after the close of the fiscal year.

ARTICLE VIII Amendment of Bylaws

These Bylaws may be amended only upon approval of a majority of the members of the full membership of the Authority acting at either a regular meeting or at a special meeting called for the purpose of amending these Bylaws.

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION

It is hereby certified that the foregoing Bylaws of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority were adopted by the Authority at a meeting held on the 12th day of November, 2009, all members of the Authority being present at such meeting, and a majority of the members voting in favor of adoption of the Bylaws.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in Exhibit A plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 7th day of September, 2017.
