I. PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of July 1, 2021

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the minutes of the July 1, 2021, regular board meeting. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-007) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000 TO THE CITY OF PAINTSVILLE F/B/O PAINTSVILLE UTILITIES COMMISSION, JOHNSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Paintsville F/B/O the Paintsville Utilities Commission's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the KY Hwy 23 Sewer Extension project. This project will expand the sewer system to free up capacity at the Paintsville WWTP by diverting waste to the Honey Branch WWTP. Currently Paintsville WWTP is operating over capacity and is under a Sewer Sanction so it is unable to issue any additional sewer taps.

The project will provide new infrastructure to create some sewer redundancy in the community, aid the overcapacity issue at the Paintsville WWTP, eliminate the Sewer Sanction tap freeze and eliminate two package treatment plants (one at Highland Elementary and the other at VIP Fuels in Hagerhill). By lifting the tap freeze this project will open up opportunities to add potential sewer taps including additional residential, commercial and industrial customers.

Currently the Paintsville Utilities Commission serves over 2,200 residential and over 490 commercial and industrial customers.

Johnson County Judge Executive Mark McKenzie abstained from the vote. Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A21-007) in an amount up to \$1,500,000 to the City of Paintsville F/B/O the Paintsville Utilities Commission. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-044) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF SOMERSET, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Somerset's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$4,500,000 for the Pitman Creek WWTP Improvements and S US 27 Phase 2 Sewer Extensions project.

Project scope:

- Construct a new Sludge Dewatering Facility and Septage Receiving Station at the Pitman Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).
- Rehabilitation of Somerset's Grit Removal Structure located upstream of Pitman Creek WWTP.
- Installation of permanent inflow and infiltration (I & I) detection equipment at Sinking Creek WWTP.
 - The I & I monitoring system will allow the city to accurately determine the amount of inflow and infiltration within the oldest portions of the collection system.
 - Sinking Creek WWTP is no longer a permitted discharge facility; however, the city continues to maintain and operate the aerated facultative lagoon that serves as pre-treatment for Pitman Creek WWTP.
 - Construct a 50-foot riparian buffer including riparian plants along Pitman Creek.
 - Construct a new 150 gpm sewage pumping station, sewage force main and gravity sewers to accommodate flow from the new Horse Soldier Distillery. These sewers will tie into an existing 10-inch gravity sewer located on South US 27.

The City of Somerset has had numerous violations involving solids processing at Pitman Creek WWTP and is under an Agreed Order to correct related issues. Somerset is currently limited in the times they can land apply sludge to their permitted land farm due to Climate Change, with the area seeing frequent record breaking rainfall events.

Additionally, the current owner of Somerset's Land farm has given Somerset notice of their intention to terminate the property lease to Somerset, forcing the City to seek a permit for a new site. This means that Somerset needs to haul sludge to a nearby landfill, but they cannot accomplish this task without first dewatering waste sludge.

Currently, the City of Somerset serves almost 5,000 residential and over 2,000 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Bob Amato moved to approve the Fund A (A21-044) in an amount up to \$4,500,000 to the City of Somerset. Mr. Carey Johnson seconded and the motion was unanimously approved

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F20-002) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,602,975 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON F/B/O LEBANON WATER WORKS COMPANY INC., MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Lebanon, F/B/O the Lebanon Water Works Company's request for a Fund F Loan increase in the amount of \$1,602,975 to the originally approved amount of \$5,238,230 to supplement the Main Line Replacement project initially approved on March 5th, 2020, which will bring the new total KIA loan amount up to \$6,841,205. The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted due the escalating prices of 6" and 8" PVC pipe. Additionally, the city has elected to remove some replacement of meters along with a small number of roads to limit the cost overruns.

This project will replace old water mains located along Old Calvary Road and other main feed lines through downtown and central supply areas. The scope of work involves replacing 80,000 linear feet of old cast iron lines, galvanized water mains of various sizes, and adjacent old service lines. Many of the older service lines may still have lead gooseneck connections that will be removed. The purpose of this project is to improve water quality and increase flow in areas where pipes are prone to frequent breaks and leaks. The removal of potential lead connections will also ensure safe water distribution to the customers.

The City produces 86% of its water supply and purchases the remainder from the City of Campbellsville ("Campbellsville") to serve approximately 2,600 retail customers and supplies wholesale water to the Marion County Water District (MCWD) which is a PSC regulated utility.

The City serves over 2,500 residential and 89 commercial and industrial customers in Marion County.

Mr. Bob Amato asked if the increase was needed due to the higher costs of supplies. Ms. Holly Nicholas, Kentucky Engineering Group, noted that it was due to the increased cost of PVC pipe.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund F Loan increase (F20-002) in an amount up to \$1,602,975 to the City of Lebanon F/B/O the Lebanon Water Works. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Deputy Executive Director Sandy Williams addressed the group. She noted that yesterday KIA gave a report to the Interim Joint Committee on Appropriations and Revenue on the Broadband Deployment Fund Grant as well as the Drinking Water and Wastewater Grants. These are the new federal funds KIA received through the American Rescue Plan for broadband and water and sewer projects. The Cleaner Water Fund has already made two awards, the first to the City of Shelbyville, for a 36" gravity sewer line totaling \$1,800,000 and the second award went to the Lexington-Fayette County Urban Government for a total of \$11,800,000 for a UV Disinfection Treatment process that will replace their current chlorine system at their two current Wastewater Treatment Plants.

To date, KIA has received 403 applications, for a total of \$648,569,643 from 100 of our 120 counties. Ninety of the 403 projects are requested for Unserved Drinking Water projects in rural areas, totaling just over \$151,491,802 and 17 or those projects are for Consent Decree projects for a total of \$127,083,119.

On the Broadband side, KIA has released a Request for Information, through the Finance and Administration Cabinet. Twenty-six Internet Service Providers have submitted information. Those responses are being used to craft a Request for Proposals, (RFP). The Broadband application will be an RFP. She thanked Deputy Secretary Grigsby for allowing KIA to use the Finance Cabinet to manage this process. The hope is to have that information out within a couple of weeks.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked Deputy Director Williams if it would be possible for her to do a written summary on what she just presented and send it out to the Board members, stating it would be helpful for them to answer questions that they are receiving. Mr. Lovan also asked which funds the two Cleaner Water projects are being funded through. Ms. Williams reminded everyone there are three funding pools totaling \$250,000,000, 1. County Allocations is \$150,000,000, based on population, 2. Unserved Drinking Water or Consent Decree, totaling \$50,000,00 and finally 3. Surplus/Contingency, that can be used for projects that exceeded their county allocation, for a total of \$49,900,000.

Mr. Bob Amato asked about the Shelbyville project and with more than one provider how was the allocation determined. Ms. Williams noted there is more than one provider in Shelby County and a group of the County's leadership, the Judge Executive, the Mayors and the Utility Managers met with the KIPDA Water Management Coordinator and had a Shelby County Water Management Council meeting. The attendees unanimously agreed that Shelbyville would be the award recipient. They sent KIA official minutes from their meeting. This is a great example and the true meaning of consensus and cooperation.

Director Williams reminded everyone that there will not be an October Board meeting, the September meeting will not be held on the typical first Thursday, but will be held on Thursday, September 23rd.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-003) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$30,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE F/B/O HOPKINSVILLE WATER ENVIRONMENT AUTHORITY, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A19-003) to the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority on January 7th, 2021, in the amount of \$14,000,000 and the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority has requested to increase loan A19-003 by \$16,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$30,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Expand Hammond-Wood WWTP & Interceptor project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$29,000,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$75,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$1,500,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 23rd day of September, 2021.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Hopkinsville, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), is requesting a Fund A19-003 loan increase in the amount of \$16,000,000 for continued multi-year phased funding for the Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. Prior KIA loan funding cycles for this project total \$14,000,000. This additional increase will bring the total KIA loan project amount to \$30,000,000.

HWEA is proposing renovation and expansion of the Hammond-Wood WWTP, located on the North Fork of the Little River, south of Hopkinsville. Renovation will occur by replacing the existing river siphon with a new influent interceptor river crossing, new influent pump station, new head works (screening and grit removal), new anaerobic phosphorus release tank, renovation of two existing oxidation ditches and two existing clarifiers, modification of the existing activated sludge pump station, modifications to return and waste activated sludge pumping station, post aeration steps and new outfall, new operations building, new electrical building and standby power, controls and Instrumentation, demolition of existing structures, construction of two sludge holding tanks, aeration, and dewatering equipment, and renovation of the existing ultraviolet disinfection process.

Expansion of the plant to 9 MGD with a hydraulic capacity of 27 MGD will occur with the construction of a new oxidation ditch and site development, addition of a third clarifier, excavation, grading, and site piping, new sludge holding tank, new belt filter presses with additional pump, conveyor system, and a new blower building, controls, and instrumentation. Improvements to the 36" and 48" influent interceptor transporting wastewater to the plant will occur as determined through inspection.

The total project cost is currently estimated to be \$48,300,000 and the budget and funding breakdowns are shown below.

Hammond-Wood WWTP currently serves over 12,000 customers in Christian County including the cities of Hopkinsville and Pembroke. In addition, Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority also provides sewer service to the cities of Crofton and Oak Grove and drinking water to the cities of Hopkinsville, Pembroke and Crofton.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 34,674 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$35,846. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate based on MHI.

VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does qualify for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020 and include both the water and sewer funds. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 to 2020 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined revenues for sewer and water increased 10.7% from \$16.8 million in 2018 to \$18.6 million in 2020. Sewer revenues have increased around 25.9% from \$7.8 million in 2018 to \$9.8 million in 2020 whereas water revenues have decreased 2.4% from \$9.0 million in 2018 to \$8.8 million in 2020. Sewer revenue growth can be attributed to rate increases during the observed time period for ongoing capital projects. The water revenues decreased marginally due to various pandemic changes. Combined expenses increased 18% from \$8.9 million to \$10.5 million from 2018 to 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.7, a debt to equity ratio of 1.5, 23.5 days' sales in accounts receivable, and 9.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase according to the approved rate increases by the utility (FY 2021 14%, FY 2022, 2023 and 2024 projected 9% and flat for 2025). Water revenues will remain flat for growth and volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 3) All debt service and replacement reserves for pending KIA loans A11-08, A16-005, F13-020, and F16-001 have been included in this analysis.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.48 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$1,500,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$75,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-033) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,063,992 TO THE CITY OF SEBREE, WEBSTER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A20-033 to the City of Sebree on November 7th, 2019, in the amount of \$910,828 and the City of Sebree has requested to increase loan A20-033 by \$1,153,164; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Sebree, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and

Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$2,063,992 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Sebree Sanitary Sewer Replacement Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$104,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 23rd day of September, 2021.

The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted due the shortage of supplies, the project scope remains the same.

This project will include replacing approximately 8,900 linear feet of existing 8-inch clay pipe, extending an 8-inch gravity sewer 101 linear feet to add five unserved customers, lowering a main that is currently exposed in a creek, and replacement of a retaining wall that protects a 12-inch main.

The City serves 592 customers sanitary service in Webster County.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2013-2017, the Utility's service area population was 1,471 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$33,171. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$46,535. Based on the MHI of the service area of the utility, the project will qualify for a 30-year loan at a non-standard 0.50% interest rate.

Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

The City has experienced nearly flat revenues between 2018 and 2020, while experiencing an increase in operating expenses of 19.4% due to increased contractual services. This has resulted in an overall reduction in cash available for debt service over the same period.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.9, a debt to equity of 0.3, 42.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.4 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) The City increased sewer rates by ordinance this month to the first proposed 4,000-gallon rate for both in and outside city shown in the rate section above. Additionally, the City approved by ordinance the second proposed sewer increase to take effect 7/1/2022.
- 2) The Cleaner Water Grant funds represent all of Webster County's allocation and are under review.
- 3) Expenses are expected to increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$104,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$5,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

X. <u>DEBT OBLIGATIONS</u>

From the 2020 audit the City of Sebree does not have any sewer debt obligations.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F20-019) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$9,510,000 TO THE CITY OF SOMERSET, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Loan (F20-019) to the City of Somerset on December 5th, 2019, in the amount of \$7,027,878 and the City of Somerset has requested to increase loan (F20-019) by \$2,482,122; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Somerset, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$9,510,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Somerset for the Storage Tank Replacement, Booster Stations and Water Main Extension project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$23,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$476,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 23rd day of September, 2021.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F20-021) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,040,100 TO THE CAVE RUN WATER COMMISSION, MENIFEE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Loan (F20-021) to the Cave Run Water Commission on June 4th, 2020, in the amount of \$1,171,350 and the Cave Run Water Commission has requested to increase loan (F20-021) by \$868,750; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Cave Run Water Commission, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$2,040,100 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Cave Run Water Commission for the Elevated Water Storage Tank Construction project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$102,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 23rd day of September, 2021.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Cave Run Water Commission is requesting a Fund F loan increase of \$868,750 to supplement the Elevated Water Storage Tank Construction project initially approved on June 4th, 2020, which will bring the new total KIA loan amount up to \$2,040,100. The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted due the shortage of supplies and increased material costs. The project scope remains the same.

This project will construct a new water tank in order to provide purchase source water protection and water supply redundancy that is currently lacking in the system. A new 300,000 gallon elevated storage tank will be constructed on the Menifee and Morgan County Line to service the City of Frenchburg, City of Jeffersonville, and the Morgan County Water district. SCADA will be installed at the tank to enable remote reading and level control from the Water Treatment Plant along with a security fence and approximately 800 LF of 12" PVC waterline to connect the new tank to the existing transmission line.

With Cave Run Water Commission's current system configuration and operations, Morgan County Water District's Ezel Water Tank (150,000 gallons) empties in 10-12 hours when Cave Run stops producing water at the water treatment plant. The Ezel Water Tank has been emptied two times in the past year because it cannot be filled when the plant isn't producing water. By constructing a new water tank, Cave Run Water Commission will be able to provide additional storage for the service area and allow the Ezel Water Tank to be filled when the water treatment plant is shutdown between production.

Cave Run Water Commission provides approximately 40-50% of Morgan County Water District's water; 95-99% of the City of Frenchburg's water; and 95-99% of the City of Jeffersonville's water. In total, Cave Run Water Commission indirectly services a population of 18,900 from the Cave Run Tank and sells an average of 1 million gallons of water to wholesale customers each day.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2013-2017, the Utility's service area population was approximately 18,900 based on the three wholesale customers it provides service to in Morgan, Menifee, and Montgomery counties. The project will qualify for the non-standard 1.5% interest rate because Cave Run Water Commission is a regional provider.

VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 7% from \$1.02 million in 2018 to \$1.09 million in 2020 due to wholesale rate increases and volume growth. Operating expenses increased 1.3% over the same period due to increased payroll expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 2.0, 2.1, and 2.2 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.1, debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 42.6 days' sales in accounts receivable, and 17.4 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Recently passed rate increase of 8.6% will go into effect January 2022, which will provide the water commission ample coverage for this loan's debt service. The rate is projected flat after that increase.
- 2) Volume growth will remain flat for the projected years.
- 3) Expenses will grow 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$102,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$5,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the loan.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 23rd day of September, 2021.
