PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Meg Link, KIA Secretary was asked to call the Roll.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of July 9, 2020

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the July 9, 2020, regular board meeting. Mr. Robert Aldridge seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-018) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,908,500 TO THE CITY OF CALVERT CITY, MARSHALL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Calvert City's request for a Fund A Loan, A20-018, for an amount up to \$2,908,500 for the WWTP Influent Lift Station and Plant Improvements project. This project will rehabilitate the influent lift station and head works for the wastewater treatment plant, improve the disinfection, aeration and mixing systems, upgrade the SCADA and control system, and replace the outfall diffuser in the Tennessee River.

The City is currently under an Agreed Order issued by the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection to upgrade its wastewater collection and treatment facilities. The work associated with this project has been identified as necessary in the Corrective Action Plan to restore the ability to comply with the terms of the KPDES permit.

The City treats wastewater for approximately 1,000 retailer customers and supplies drinking water to 1,700 retail customers in the City and Marshall County.

Mr. Russ Rose asked about the discrepancy in the dollar amount on the agenda and the resolution. Ms. Sun noted that there had been a last minute change in the amount that was not reflected on the agenda.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A (A20-018), for an amount up to \$2,908,500 with the standard conditions. Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A20-019) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,000,000 TO THE CITY OF DAWSON SPRINGS, HOPKINS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Dawson Springs' request for a Fund A Loan, A20-019, for an amount up to \$1,000,000 for the Sanitary Sewer Rehab and wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements project.

This project is a two-prong approach to solving the problems that exist within the City's wastewater system. The collection system improvement portion involves an SSES investigation phase followed by a rehabilitation (construction) phase. The WWTP portion includes clarifier improvements, bar screen and scrapper mechanism replacement, grit removal equipment, and cleaning and repair of the effluent line.

These efforts will address an Agreed Order issued by the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection and bring the system in compliance with the KPDES permit. The City serves approximately 800 sewer customers and 950 water customers while providing wholesale water to the South Hopkins Water District. The Agreement between the City and the District expires in 2069 and permits rate adjustments every two years beginning in 2021 subject to the PSC approval.

Mr. Winston Miller moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A20-019), for an amount up to \$1,000,000 with the standard conditions. Judge David Voegele seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$750,000 TO THE CITY OF LEWISBURG, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA discussed the City of Lewisburg's request for a Fund A Loan, (A21-001) for an amount up to \$750,000 to fund the construction portion of the Sewer System Upgrade project. The total project cost is \$1,500,000 including a KIA Fund B P&D loan previously approved on December 6, 2017 and a \$750,000 CDBG grant. This project will rehabilitate approximately 3,650 linear feet of sanitary sewer line and 14 manholes in the City's collection system in order to reduce inflow and infiltration. The rehabilitation work will decrease sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs), improve services to the existing customers, and reduce the loading on the wastewater treatment plant. The wastewater treatment plant will also be upgraded to improve its operational efficiency by replacing obsolete equipment and structures that have exceeded their useful lives.

The purpose of this project is to address an Agreed Order issued by the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection. The scope of work is proposed in the

City's plan for Corrective Actions (CAP) to bring its facility and collection system into compliance with its KPDES permit.

The City is a home rule-class city in Logan County, purchasing 100% of its water supply from Logan-Todd Regional Water Commission while treating all of its wastewater to serve approximately 360 customers within the service area

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A21-001), for an amount up to \$750,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B20-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,472,400 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Bardstown's request for a Fund B Loan, B20-005, in an amount up to \$1,472,400 to increase the capacities of the Corman's Crossing, the Royal Crest, and the American Greetings pump stations. Other improvements include new valve vaults, conversions from suction lift or dry pit submersible to wet pit submersible pumps, access road upgrades, and an emergency generator. The improvements will allow the pump stations to meet current and anticipated demands efficiently and replace components that are at the end of the useful life expectancy. They will also make the stations safer to maintain by reducing confined space entry hazards.

The Bardstown Sewer System is a regional provider that serves approximately 8,000 retail customers and treats wastewater for the Bloomfield Wastewater Collection System through the Kentucky Inter-System Operational Permit (KISOP).

Mr. Bob Amato moved to approve the Fund B Loan, (B20-005), for an amount up to \$1,472,400 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F20-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,100,000 TO THE CITY OF WHITESBURG, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Whitesburg's request for a Fund F Loan, F20—026, for an amount up to \$1,100,000 for the Water Storage Tank Replacement project. This project will replace two tanks in the Whitesburg Water System. Both tanks have been experiencing leaks that are cost ineffective to repair. The Shady Drive tank is a 175,000 gallons tank which will be replaced with a 200,000 gallon tank to lessen pump cycling. The new tank will increase the overall storage for the system and improve the techniques of isolating areas during leaks. Hale Drive tank will also be replaced, but will remain at its current capacity of 275,000 gallons. The replacements will ensure that the

tanks are in an adequate and safe condition to continue serving the existing customers in the City and surrounding area.

The City provides retail water to approximately 1,400 customers and wholesale water to the Letcher County Water and Sewer District, which is a PSC regulated entity. Wholesale water is less than 10% of the total usage.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked how the City of Whitesburg did not qualify for principal forgiveness. Ms. Linda Bridwell noted that they were off by three projects to qualify.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F Loan, (F20-026), for an amount up to \$1,100,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Paul Miller seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Mr. Winston Miller moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

7. RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY APPROVING, RATIFYING AND AFFIRMING THE ACTIONS OF THE AUTHORITY'S EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND OTHER OFFICIALS IN EXECUTING AND ISSUING A SUBLEASE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE AUTHORITY AND THE KENTUCKY CABINET OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION.

Ms. Linda Bridwell discussed the resolution with the Board. This is a ratification of the lease arrangement with the Finance Cabinet negotiated by the KIA staff. This confirms the authority of the lease arrangement for the Finance Cabinet records and transparency in government.

Judge David Voegele moved to approve the motion. Mr. Winston Miller seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Edith Halbleib discussed The Call for Projects which opens September 15, 2020. KIA renewed its contract with the 15 area development districts, who are assisting in developing the project list for FY 2022. Last spring, KIA conducted a survey for additional projects, in the event additional federal stimulus funding would be available. The response from the area development districts identified 1001 clean water projects estimated at \$892 million, and 475 drinking water projects estimated at \$475 million.

The first two rounds of federal stimulus funding have not resulted in additional funding for the SRF programs. There is one new Overflow and Stormwater Grant (OSG), which should result in a small grant for Kentucky, that would be paired with a state match, which could include SRF funding. This opportunity is currently up for comment on the CFR. A couple of versions of the upcoming federal stimulus funding bills have a provision for a larger amount of funding for stormwater projects, according to our regional EPA administrators.

The IUPs are at their final review stage and should be on the website shortly. The DWSRF will include a table for project applications that have been allowed extensions past the end of the fiscal year, in light of COVID19 complications. The KIA has completed its second round of project invitations for FY 2021, and will continue to look closely at funding availability in the event a third round of invitations is possible.

The KIA will be presenting next Monday, August 10 at 1 PM for the legislative Water and Wastewater task force.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-047) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,471,088 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A19-047 to the City of Bardstown on February 7, 2019, in the amount of \$5,400,000 and the City of Bardstown has requested to increase loan A19-047 by \$1,071,088; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Bardstown, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$6,471,088 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Rowan Creek Sewer Upgrade project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$16,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$324,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 24th day of September, 2020.

Dear Mrs. Halbleib:

The Division of Water (DOW) hereby certifies that the City of Bardstown is eligible to receive a \$1,071,088 loan increase to its \$5,400,000.00 funding commitment from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. The new loan amount is \$6,471,088. The DOW certifies that the project scope is consistent with the scope that was used to rank the project on the FY 2019 Intended Use Plan-Project Priority List.

The City of Bardstown's status relative to the Clean Water State Revolving Fund General Conditions is provided below:

- 1. DOW issued the bid authorization letter for the Contract 3 construction plans and specifications on April 3, 2020.
- 2. On May 13, 2019, DOW approved the environmental document entitled *Rowan Creek Sewer Upgrade* dated December 17, 2018.
- 3. Construction bids were opened on May 11, 2020, and the Notice to Proceed was issued on June 30, 2020.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The financial reporting of the City's Proprietary Funds consolidates electric, water, wastewater treatment, garbage pickup, cable TV, and internet operations. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 6.4% from \$36.86 million in 2017 to \$39.24 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 6.2% from \$30.94 million to \$32.85 million during the same period primarily due to volume growth. Consolidated cash flow before debt service averaged \$6.89 million in the 3 audited years. Sewer cash flow averaged \$1.87 million or 27.2% of consolidated cash flow before debt service. The debt coverage ratio was 3.4, 4.5, and 3.7 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.7, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 25.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 5.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Consolidated revenues will go up steadily due to wholesale rate increases and volume growth.
- 2) Wholesale water rate will increase 22.5% from \$2.00 to \$2.45 per thousand gallons in January, 2020 and grow incrementally each July 1 through 2023 based on the rate schedule approved by the PSC.

3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.

- 4) The City will pay off the existing General Obligation Bond in 2021 to make available \$2.5 million cash flow for the new KIA debt.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 5.4 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$324,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$16,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A17-014) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,715,000 TO THE GREENUP JOINT SEWER AGENCY, GREENUP COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Greenup Joint Sewer Agency, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,715,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Greenup Joint Sewer Agency for the Lloyd project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further

action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$710,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,015,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of .50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$4,010 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$80,200 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 24th day of September, 2020.

This project will involve providing sanitary sewer service to approximately 363 existing residential, commercial and school buildings which are only served through failing septic systems in the City of Lloyd. Decommissioning and demolition of a package wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) serving the Greenup County Schools campus is included in this Phase. Low pressure sewer will be connected to a new pump station and force main, which will convey the wastewater from the Lloyd community to the existing GJSA WWTP in Wurtland.

The GJSA is a relatively new agency, providing wholesale sewer treatment for two customers, the City of Greenup and the City of Wurtland, in Greenup County.

HISTORY

Greenup Joint Sewer Agency is a relatively new sewer utility which combined the City of Greenup and Wurtland sewer treatment operations. Both communities have significant I&I issues. Revenue has steadily increased with stabilized financial information, billing and operations.

A significant incident with an industrial customer created higher than normal treatment expenses in 2019.

Cash flow for debt service has increased with revenue increases

Debt coverage ratio has improved from a -3.76 to a 0.80 over the 2016-2019 time period, and will continue to improve with the economies of scale provided by the Lloyd project. The Debt to Equity ratio has reduced from -47.5 to -12.6 while the Sales in Accounts Receivable was 61.7 in 2019.

Cost changes (ditto) (just cash costs)

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will grow with the additional 378 customers from Lloyd. The City of Lloyd will also be a wholesale customer.
- 2) Expenses are expected to grow 1.5% with inflation, in addition to treatment costs for Lloyd.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.49 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin and will remain at 1.1 into 2025.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$80,200 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$4,010 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan. Additionally, GJSA will make additional \$600 per month reserve payments until the reserve account for current loans is replenished.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B20-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,146,000 TO THE WESTERN PULASKI COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2020). The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2017-2019 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 and 2019 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 15.8% from \$2,921,392 in 2017 to \$3,277,409 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 8.7% from \$957,733 to \$1,040,827 during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 2.4 in 2017, 2.8 in 2019, and 2.1 in 2021 when debt service begins

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.2, debt to equity ratio of 1.0, 41.6 days sales in accounts receivable, and 12.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain constant in the future.
- 2) Expenses will increase by a 2% inflationary increase.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.
- 4) A Rural Development grant in the amount of \$719,000 will be awarded to help fund his project.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$58,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$2,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMMENDEMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C20-003) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$149,350 TO THE CITY OF LEWISPORT, HANCOCK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously entered into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Governmental Agencies Program (Fund C) with the City of Lewisport in the amount of \$100,000 and the City of Lewisport has requested to increase the loan C20-003 by \$49,350.

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Governmental Agencies Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Governmental Agencies Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Governmental Agencies Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$149,350 of project expense, to the City of Lewisport for its UV and Headworks Upgrade project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten (10%) percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$8,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 24th day of September, 2020.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Lewisport ("City") is requesting a Fund C loan increase of \$49,350 to supplement the UV system and replace the headworks project initially approved on February 6, 2020, which will bring the total loan amount up to \$149,350. The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted and the addition of work to the scope of this project. The bid for the Headworks Pipe Replacement came in at \$89,450 which is \$28,850 higher than originally budgeted. Additionally, since the headworks pipe will have to be replaced, the City of Lewisport wishes to install two new 8" plug valves with full rubber lined internals to the headworks. Installing the new plug valves now will allow the city to avoid having to remove the pipe on the influent and effluent of the current headworks again in the future.

The sewer project will involve upgrading the current UV systems at the Wastewater Treatment Plant as well as replacing the headworks. The UV upgrade will be a sole source upgrade with the original UV company in order to keep some of the existing components of the system as a cost savings measure.

The water project will add approximately 300 LF of 8" waterline at the Yellow Creek in order to create redundancy and prevent service loss to 400 customers in the area in the event the existing line fails. This will require boring under the creek in order to connect the line on both sides.

Lewisport Municipal Water Works serves approximately 1,086 drinking water customers and 700 sewer customers in Hancock County. The City also has a natural gas distribution system which services 1,238 customers including one industrial customer.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019 from the water, sewer, and gas funds. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2017-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2019 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues have increased 24.4% from \$2.17 million in 2017 to \$2.70 million in 2019. The majority of the increase was realized in the gas fund which increased 28.9% from \$1.52 million in 2017 to \$1.96 million in 2019. Water revenues increased 24.3% from \$0.37 million in 2017 to \$0.46 million in 2019, and sewer revenues grew 12.0%

from \$0.25 million in 2017 to \$0.28 million during the same time period. Total operating expenses increased 9.8% from \$2.34 million in 2017 to \$2.57 million in 2019. Gas expenses increased 10.5%, water 14.7%, and sewer 10.4%. Gas has historically greatly subsidized both water and sewer operations.

The 2019 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.7, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, and 5.7 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. Days sales in accounts receivable has been excluded because of the need to present a combined balance sheet of the water, sewer, and gas funds which results in skewed numbers.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 5% in 2020 due to a previously approved rate increase and remain flat thereafter. Sewer and gas revenues will remain flat for both growth and volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 8.1 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund C loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$8,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 24th day of September, 2020.
