PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Meg Link, KIA Secretary was asked to call the Roll.

Commissioner Keene, announced Deputy Director Linda Bridwell's departure from KIA as of November 30th. She has assumed the Executive Director position with the Public Service Commission. She will resume a position on the Board of Directors. Commissioner Keene also introduced Ms. Sandy Williams the new Deputy Executive Director. She assumed the position on December 1st and was previously with the Office of Financial Management. Ms. Williams said she was very happy to return to KIA and was excited to hit the ground running.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of November 5, 2020

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the minutes of the November 5, 2020, regular board meeting. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,745,064 TO THE CITY OF EDDYVILLE, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Eddyville's request for a Fund A loan, (A21-003) for an amount up to \$2,745,064 to fund the Wastewater SSES and Rehabilitation – South of Fairview Ave Project. The requested loan amount includes \$423,964 for the planning and design portion previously approved in November, 2019. This project will rehabilitate and replace the lines and manholes as identified in the planning and design phase to reduce inflow and infiltration points in Eddyville's collection system. It will also replace the dry pit design of the existing lift station at the Industrial Park on US 62 East with a more appropriate and safer submersible pump station that will reduce repeated overflows. The new pump station is designed to accommodate the current demands and potential growth from the Industrial Park.

The City's sewer system currently serves approximately 900 retail customers and treats wastewater from the City of Fredonia. The KISOP (Kentucky Inter-System Operating Permit) wastewater treatment accounts for less than 4% of total volume treated annually.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A loan (A21-003), for an amount up to \$2,745,064 with the standard conditions. Mr. David Voegele seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR ASSUMPTION OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOANS (B10-01), (B10-04) and (B15-006) BY THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's request to assume the Fund B Loans, B10-01, B10-04 and B15-006 from the Bullitt County Sanitation District (BCSD) as part of MSD's acquisition of the BCSD wastewater system and all of its assets. The existing loans were approved between 2010-2016 by the KIA board to fund various wastewater system improvement and expansion projects in Bullitt County. At this time, it is estimated that the acquisition will be completed by the end of March 2021.

Upon the execution of this transfer of assets, MSD will assume total ownership of BCSD. This merger will help provide the residents of Bullitt County seamless transition while adding capacity to MSD's capacity and customer base. MSD will continue to honor the enacted ordinance increases for BCSD.

Mr. Lovan asked if there were operational issues that prompted this assumption. Mr. Fisher noted he was not aware of any, that in recent years, MSD had assumed loans from Oldham County Environmental along with others in the area and were continuing that process.

Mr. Russ Rose asked if the acquisition doesn't occur will the loans remain in the name of Bullitt County Sanitation District. Mr. Fisher confirmed that to be the case.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the assumption of Fund B Loans, (B10-01), (B10-04) and (B15-006) for an amount up to \$676,262 with the standard conditions. ADD NAME OF PERSON WHO SECONDED THE MONTION seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

A project has to be on the priority list to be eligible to receive funding from the federal programs. The Division of Water completes an initial review of the projects and requested modifications or answers to questions.

In regards to the KIA Audit, unfortunately, Dean Dorton's Partner-in-Charge of Audit Review had an emergency and was unexpectedly out of the office for several days, which has delayed completion of KIA's audit. Everything should be finished up shortly and will be presented at the next Board meeting.

There continues to be a handful of 2020 projects that have not moved forward due to Covid delays, so the Board will continue to see some of those projects.

We now have two borrowers that have requested a delay in their December payment due to reduced revenues during Covid. We have granted those requests and will continue to work with everyone who contacts us.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-003) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE F/B/O HOPKINSVILLE WATER ENVIRONMENT AUTHORITY, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A19-003 to the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority on July 9th, 2019, in the amount of \$9,000,000 and the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority has requested to increase loan A19-003 by \$5,000,000 and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Hopkinsville f/b/o Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$5,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Expand Hammond-Wood WWTP and Interceptor project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$35,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$700,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of January, 2021.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The City of Hopkinsville, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), is requesting a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$5,000,000 for the multi-phased Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. The initial phase of KIA Loan A19-003 (\$9,000,000), will bring the total current project amount requested to date to \$14,000,000.

HWEA is proposing renovation and expansion of the Hammond-Wood WWTP, located on the North Fork of the Little River, south of Hopkinsville. Renovation will occur by replacing the existing river siphon with a new influent interceptor river crossing, new influent pump station, new headworks (screening and grit removal), new anaerobic phosphorus release tank, renovation of two existing oxidation ditches and two existing clarifiers, modification of the existing activated sludge pump station, modifications to return and waste activated sludge pumping station, post aeration steps and new outfall, new operations building, new electrical building and standby power, controls and Instrumentation, demolition of existing structures, construction of two sludge holding tanks, aeration, and dewatering equipment, and renovation of the existing ultraviolet disinfection process.

Expansion of the plant to 9 MGD with a hydraulic capacity of 27 MGD will occur with the construction of a new oxidation ditch and site development, addition of a third clarifier, excavation, grading, and site piping, new sludge holding tank, new belt filter presses with additional pump, conveyor system, and a new blower building, controls, and instrumentation. Improvements to the 36" and 48" influent interceptor transporting wastewater to the plant will occur as determined through inspection.

The total project cost is currently estimated to be \$48,300,000 and the budget and funding breakdowns are shown below.

Hammond-Wood WWTP currently serves over 12,000 customers in Christian County including the cities of Hopkinsville and Pembroke. In addition, Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority also provides sewer service to the cities of Crofton and Oak Grove and drinking water to the cities of Hopkinsville, Pembroke and Crofton.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Hopkinsville, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), is requesting a Fund A19-003 loan increase in the amount of \$5,000,000 for continued progress in the Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. Prior KIA Loan A16-005 (\$1,500,000 planning and design loan) was rolled into the initial A19-003 construction loan totaling \$9,000,000. This additional loan increase will bring the total project amount requested to date to \$14,000,000.

Expansion of the plant to 9 MGD with a hydraulic capacity of 27 MGD will occur with the construction of a new oxidation ditch and site development, addition of a third clarifier, excavation, grading, and site piping, new sludge holding tank, new belt filter presses with additional pump, conveyor system, and a new blower building, controls, and instrumentation. Improvements to the 36" and 48" influent interceptor transporting wastewater to the plant will occur as determined through inspection.

The total project cost is currently estimated to be \$48,300,000 and the budget and funding breakdowns are shown below.

Hammond-Wood WWTP currently serves over 12,000 customers in Christian County including the cities of Hopkinsville and Pembroke. In addition, Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority also provides sewer service to the cities of Crofton and Oak Grove and drinking water to the cities of Hopkinsville, Pembroke and Crofton.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019 and include both the water and sewer funds. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2017-2019 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2019 operating expenses. Percentage references

in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined revenues for water and sewer increased 14.1% from \$15.6 million in 2017 to \$17.8 million in 2019. Sewer revenues have increased around 16% from \$7.5 million in 2017 to \$8.7 million in 2019 and water revenues have increased 8% from \$10.9 million in 2017 to \$11.8 million in 2019. Sewer revenue growth can be attributed to rate increases during the observed time period for ongoing capital projects while the water increase is due to normal growth. Combined expenses increased 17% from \$8.3 million to \$9.7 million from 2017 to 2019.

The 2019 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.6, a debt to equity ratio of 1.7, 22.8 days sales in accounts receivable, and 9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- Sewer revenues will increase according to the approved rate increases by the utility through FY 2021 (14% annually). Water revenues will remain flat for growth and volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 3) All debt service and replacement reserves for pending KIA loans A11-08, A16-005, F13-020, and F16-001 have been included in this analysis.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.43 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$700,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$35,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-009) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,500,000 TO THE CITY OF ALBANY, CLINTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Albany, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Albany for the Duvall Valley Area Water System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject

to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$6,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$126,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of January, 2021.

The City of Albany ("City") is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,500,000 for the Duvall Valley Area Water System Improvements project. This project will install 30,000 LF of 8-inch water lines to replace the current 6-inch and 4-inch water lines, which will extend from US Highway 127 to an existing water booster pump station located in Duvall Valley. The construction will include a water booster pump station upgrade, a new 500,000-gallon water storage tank, and associated appurtenances. The purpose of this project is to provide a reliable source of potable water to the existing residential customers and poultry farms that are experiencing water shortage due to high demand in the area. The new water lines, connection, and water storage tank will ensure a steady water flow and alleviate the water shortage problems.

The City currently serves approximately 6,200 retail customers and provides wholesale water to the Cumberland County Water District which is a PSC regulated utility. The wholesale rates are subject to PSC approval.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 5.2% from \$2.63 million in 2017 to \$2.76 million in 2019 from annual cost of living rate adjustments while operating expenses increased 4.3% due to general inflation during the same time period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.2, 1.2, and 1.3 for 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflected a current ratio of 1.0, debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 58.0 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.6 month of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Combined water and sewer revenues will go up 20% based on the approved rate increases effective October 1, 2020
- 2) Annual 2.5% cost of living adjustment will resume in October, SFY 2022.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.1 in 2023 when debt service for this loan is due.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$126,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$6,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-016) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,463,000 TO THE CITY OF HARLAN F/B/O HARLAN MUNICIPAL WATER WORKS, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Harlan, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,463,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Harlan for

the Harlan Municipal Water Distribution System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,700 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$74,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of January 2020.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-021) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,549,645 TO THE CITY OF HARLAN F/B/O HARLAN MUNICIPAL WATER WORKS, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Harlan, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,549,645 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Harlan for

the Harlan Municipal Water Treatment Plant project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of up to 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,549,645 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$6,400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$128,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of January, 2020.

The City of Harlan F/B/O Harlan Municipal Water Distribution System is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,549,645 for the Harlan Municipal Water Distribution System Improvements project. This project will involve upgrades to the existing raw water intake and water treatment plant to improve operational efficiency and overall treatment reliability. The project will also provide needed redundancy in various treatment components and improve operator safety. There will be replacement of raw water pump control valves, surge relief components, SCADA and electrical controls, and the permanganate feed system. There will also be improvement of the chemical feed system, modifications to sludge handling and storage facilities, installation of additional baffling in the clear wells, replacement of launders in the settling basins, replacement of backwash and surface wash valve actuators in the filter basin, replacement of flocculation basin paddles and drives, new filter basin controls, new influent and effluent controls, new bulk and day storage tanks, new SCADA and electrical controls, replacement of high service pumps, and miscellaneous site work.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Water revenues decreased 3.9% from \$1.41 million in 2017 to \$1.35 million in 2019 while operating expenses increased 19.8% from \$0.97 million to \$1.17 million during the same period. The increase in operating expenses was due to pump and control valve issues. These issues included replacement of a pump and some valves, the overtime caused by these issues, and two new service trucks being purchased.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.6, a debt to equity ratio of 0.3, 47.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 7.1 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase approximately 24% in 2022.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$128,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$6,400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.
