PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Sandra K. Dunahoo, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. She asked Greg Ladd, DLG General Counsel to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of November 11, 2018

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the minutes of the November 11, 2018, regular board meeting. Mr. Bruce Scott seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

Commissioner Dunahoo noted there were two projects for Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District that would be presented together and one vote would be taken at the end of the presentation.

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-015) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,870,000 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, addressed the group to present information on the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's (MSD) request for a Fund A loan (A19-015) in an amount up to \$3,870,000 for the Nightingale I&I Elimination project. Areas of sanitary sewer upstream of the Nightingale Pump Station were micromonitored in 2015 and over 40,000 linear feet (LF) of 6"-16" sewer lines were identified for rehabilitation in order to reduce inflow and infiltration (I&I) impacting the need for treatment of groundwater due to I&I in the area. Rehabilitation of the lines will include approximately 47,000 LF of cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) lining of the 6"-16" lines, installation of more than 1,000 top hats on the laterals of the CIPP lines, epoxy coating of the interior of 55 manholes, removal of intruding taps and inspections on more than 60,000 LF of sewer, as well as miscellaneous improvements like chimney seals, point repairs, and manhole frame adjustment.

In April 2009 (amended 2014), MSD entered into a Consent Decree with the Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet (KEPPC) and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to eliminate sewer overflows in its service area. The agreement sets forth requirements for MSD to design and implement projects in their Long-Term Control Plan estimated at over \$979 million by December 31, 2020. A Sanitary Sewer Discharge Plan was due by December 31, 2008 which was completed and includes schedules and deadlines for capital projects to be completed by the end of 2024. To date,

MSD has complied with all submittals and report requirements contained in the Amended Consent Decree. .

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-028) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$22,000,000 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's (MSD) request for a Fund A loan in an amount up to \$22,000,000 for the Hite Creek Water Quality Treatment Center project. Rehabilitation and expansion of Hite Creek (HC) Water Quality Treatment Center (WQTC) will consist of an expansion of the WQTC from 6.0 MGD to 9.0 MGD average daily flow and 24.0 MGD wet weather flow. The increase in capacity will eliminate SSOs upstream of the facility and allow for future growth demands. Rehabilitation of aging infrastructure will include the replacement of bar screens, existing ultraviolet (UV) system, and sludge holding tank blowers. The addition of aeration capacity/nutrient removal, aeration tank blower expansion and new tertiary disc filtration will increase treatment capacity to allow for future needs with the plant expecting to exceed the 6.0 MGD treatment capacity by 2021.

This project will also provide the first regional plant with the ability to dewater sludge onsite, eliminating over 400 truckloads of sludge being trucked to Morris Forman Treatment Center on the other side of the county. The rehabilitation of the original clarifiers for centrate equalization will also be an upgrade associate with the dewatering process. The project includes a treated effluent recycle system to supply non-potable water throughout the plant for general water use. The inclusion of this system prevents (backflow-prevented) potable water use for the same demands. Plant effluent will be supplied to continuous water uses like spray bars and polymer makeup water and periodic water uses like cleanup water. Following the project, potable water use will be limited to the administration building potable water demands. This feature will help with water efficiency and help plan for sustainable infrastructure.

In April 2009 (amended 2014), MSD entered into a Consent Decree with the Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet (KEPPC) and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to eliminate sewer overflows in its service area. The agreement sets forth requirements for MSD to design and implement projects in their Long-Term Control Plan estimated at over \$979 million by December 31, 2020. A Sanitary Sewer Discharge Plan was due by December 31, 2008 which was completed and includes schedules and deadlines for capital projects to be completed by the end of 2024. To date, MSD has complied with all submittals and report requirements contained in the Amended Consent Decree.

Judge David Voegele abstained from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A19-016) for an amount up to \$3,870,000 and Fund A Loan (A19-028) in an amount up to \$22,000,000 to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-025) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,262,600 TO THE CITY OF CORBIN F/B/O CORBIN CITY UTILITIES COMMISSION, KNOX COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Corbin, F/B/O Corbin City Utilities Commission's request for a Fund A Loan (A19-025) in an amount up to \$1,262,600. The Commission owns and maintains an existing sewer main along Master Street in the downtown area. The service line is undersized and often overwhelmed during rainfall resulting in sanitary overflow. This project entails the construction of 3,000 LF of 15 inch gravity relief sewer along Master Street to address the City's SSO problems. The gravity relief will increase capacity needed to process excess flow during increment weather.

The Commission currently provides services to approximately 4,000 electric customers, 6,500 water customers, and 4,500 sewer customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-025) for an amount up to \$1,262,600 with the standard conditions. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-040) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100,000 TO THE WESTERN MASON SANITATION DISTRICT, MASON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Western Mason Sanitation District's request for a Fund A loan (A19-040) in an amount up to \$100,000 for the Pinewood Subdivision Sewer Project. The primary objective of this project is the elimination of a failing package treatment plant. Because KIA has prioritized projects of this nature in the 2019 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan for special principal forgiveness consideration, 95% of this loan will be forgiven.

This project will extend an 8" PVC gravity sewer line approximately 566 linear feet in order to eliminate an outdated and aged sewer package treatment plant (PTP) currently serving the Pinewood Subdivision. The current PTP, which is over 30 years old, could fail at any time causing service loss to 75 households in the subdivision. The PTP was issued a Notice of Violation on August 30, 2016. Flow will be directed to the City of Maysville which currently treats all waste under service agreement with the Western Mason Sanitation District. The Sanitation District will retain all customer revenue as a result of the project.

Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-040) for an amount up to \$100,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Gwen Pinson seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Dunahoo noted that Ms. Ashley Adams, would do one presentation for both Warren County projects.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B19-006) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000,000 TO THE WARREN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, WARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Warren County Water District's request for a Fund B Loan (B19-006) in an amount up to \$2,000,000 for the Plum Springs Area Sewer Rehab and Replacement Project. The project will replace approximately 34,500 linear feet of cured-in-place gravity sewer line. Line sizes will range from 8" to 24". The project will replace lines that have been in service since the 1960s that are starting to experience failures.

Warren County Water District provides sewer service to citizens in Warren County and water service to both the County and surrounding area. The District buys all of its water from Bowling Green Municipal Utilities (BGMU) and sends all sewer flow back to BGMU for treatment. The District only owns the sewer collection system, they do not have any sewer treatment operations. On March 17, 2003, the District entered into a 41 year service agreement with BGMU. All rate adjustments are approved by BGMU, the District, and Kentucky Public Service Commission.

Ms. Gwen Pinson abstained from voting. Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund B Loan (B19-006) in an amount up to \$2,000,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded and the motion unanimously was approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C19-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000,000 TO THE WARREN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, WARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Warren County Water District's request for a Fund C loan (C19-002) in an amount up to \$2,000,000 for the Morgantown Road Area Improvements project. This project will replace an existing 100,000 gallon storage tank with a new 250,000 gallon elevated storage tank, install a new pump station, add approximately 4,300 linear feet (LF) of 8" water main, and install a new pressure reducing valve. In addition, another 7,600 LF of 2" and 4" waterline will be replaced. This project will improve service by increasing pressures and improving service reliability as well as enhance fire protection.

Warren County Water District provides sewer service to citizens in Warren County and water service to both the County and surrounding area. The District buys all of its water from Bowling Green Municipal Utilities (BGMU) and sends all sewer flow back to BGMU for treatment. The District only owns the sewer collection system, they do not have any sewer treatment operations. On March 17, 2003, the District entered into a 41 year service

agreement with BGMU. All rate adjustments are approved by BGMU, the District, and Kentucky Public Service Commission.

Ms. Gwen Pinson abstained from voting. Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund C Loan (C19-002) in an amount up to \$2,000,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. David Voegele seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-009) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,010,000 TO THE CITY OF PAINTSVILLE, JOHNSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, discussed the City of Paintsville for the benefit of the Paintsville Utilities Commission's request for a Fund F loan, (F19-009) in an amount up to \$2,010,000 for the Water System Improvements project. This project will address supply and pressure issues throughout the utility. Primary project components include: tie in to 24" transmission main, replace aged and undersized lines, replace obsolete pump station, replace 100,000 gallon tank with 150,000 gallon tank, install SCADA, install constant pressure booster pump, and install pressure reducing valves where needed.

The Paintsville Utilities Commission, a component unit of the City of Paintsville, provides water (8,100 customers), wastewater (2,600 customers) and natural gas service (1,450 customers) primarily in Johnson and Floyd Counties with very limited service also in Floyd and Magoffin Counties. Emergency supply connections also exist with the Big Sandy and Magoffin County Water Districts, Prestonsburg City's Utilities Commission and Salyersville Water Works. The Commission is a component unit of the City of Paintsville.

Ms. Gwen Pinson moved to approve the Fund F loan (F19-009) in an amount up to \$2,010,000 to the City of Paintsville F/B/O of The Paintsville Utility Commission with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-019) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000 TO THE CITY OF JAMESTOWN, RUSSELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Jamestown's request for a Fund F loan (F19-019) in an amount up to \$500,000. This project will replace 7,400 LF of 2", 4", and 6" cast iron and galvanized waterlines with 6" PVC, SDR-17 waterlines in downtown Jamestown on Shelby Street, Virginia Avenue, Main Street, Ballard Street, Jefferson Street, and Meadows Lane. Many of these waterlines have been in service since 1950's and are in need of replacement to help the City run a more efficient system. It will also include road bores, customer reconnects, tie-ins and all other necessary appurtenances to maintain compliance with the Safe Drinking Water Act

The utility currently serves approximately 3,629 retail customers and supplies wholesale water to the Columbia/Adair Utilities District Water System and the Russell Springs Sewer & Water Works.

Ms. Sandy Williams abstained from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F19-009) to the City of Jamestown in an amount up to \$500,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

9. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements combining both water and sewer operations for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. An accounting error applying \$117,082 grant income to water revenues has been deducted from operating revenues. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has also been removed from fiscal year 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues went up 10.6% from \$1.85 million in 2015 to \$2.05 million in 2017 due to rate and volume increases. Operating expenses increased 8.4% from \$1.43 million in 2015 to \$1.55 million in 2017 due to higher contractual expenses and general inflation. The debt coverage ratio was 1.2, 1.2, and 1.9 for 2015, 2016, and 2017 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.7, debt to equity ratio of 0.8, 57.2 days sales in accounts receivable, and 2.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Total revenues reflect all previously approved rate increases. Retail water revenues will increase approximately 15% and sewer revenues increase 10.40% by October 1, 2019.
- 2) Wholesale rates will go up annually based on the rate schedule in the water purchase agreements. Wholesale volume to the Garrard County Water District will exceed the minimum purchase requirement of 325 million gallons when the New Water Treatment Plant project is completed in 2021. In 2018, the Garrard County Water District purchased approximately 253 million gallons.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 4) After 2019, the City will continue to automatically adjust retail water and sewer rates based on the Social Security Consumer Price Index (CPI-W).
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2020 when annual repayments begin.
- 6) Should the City decide to pursue a construction loan from KIA after the planning and Design phase is completed, additional \$120,000 revenues will be required to support a total loan amount of \$4.2 million.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

Replacement reserve is not required for a planning and design loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Irvine for the benefit of Irvine Municipal Utilities is requesting a Fund F loan increase in the amount of \$1,200,000 to a loan previously approved by the KIA Board for \$5,732,000. The new loan total will be \$6,932,000 for the Water Plant Modernization project and the loan term will be extended from 20 years to 30 years. The increase is due to bids coming in higher than estimated in the original project budget.

Original Project Description: The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) will undergo an array of improvements including expansion of the existing filter buildings, upgrade of two existing filters, construction of a third new filter, as well as improvements to the existing raw water and treated water pumping facilities, chemical feed/storage facilities, and flocculation and sedimentation basins. In addition, the project will install approximately 20,100 LF of 12" PVC main, and add a 500,000 gallon water storage tank which will replace an existing 200,000 gallon tank. These improvements will address water quality issues at the WTP and in the distribution system by reducing disinfection byproducts, add needed capacity to meet current regulations and aid in maintenance and redundancy needs, eliminate existing water transmission hydraulic bottlenecks, and facilitate water storage tank turnover.

Irvine Municipal Utilities serves approximately 4,500 customers. They also provide Estill County Water District No. 1 with approximately 255 million gallons of water annually at a rate of \$2.94/1,000 gallons (approximately 50% of total water revenue).

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization in the amount of 50%, not to exceed \$1,100,000.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for Irvine Municipal Utilities combined water and sewer fund, for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016, and 2017 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Consolidated water and sewer revenues increased 8% from \$2 million in 2015 to \$2.2 million in 2017 while operating expenses increased 15% from \$1.6 million to \$1.8 million during the same time period. Increases in water revenue were due largely to the City's CPI clause. Sewer revenue increases can be attributed to CPI rate increases as well as the acquisition of Estill County Sewer District No. 1 in 2014 and the realization of that revenue stream in Fiscal 2016. Operating expense increases can also be attributed to normal inflation as well as the acquisition.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.8, debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 41.9 days sales in accounts receivable, and 2.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase approximately \$250,000 by 2019 due to previously approved rate increases for the original loan and CPI adjustments.
- 2) Sewer revenues will experience an increase in 2020 as service for approximately 200 customers is completed through the Wisemantown Sewer Project. The anticipated debt (RD) for this project will be offset by the additional customer revenue and is included in this analysis.
- 3) Indirect operating expenses will normalize in 2018/2019 upon completion of the Wisemantown Sewer project.
- 4) Overall expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation but will be offset by the City's CPI clause.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.5 in 2021 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$17,300. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$346,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,227,000 TO THE CITY OF BURNSIDE, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Burnside, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,227,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Burnside for the Burnside Combined Waterline Improvements project. Such amounts are subject

to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,113,500 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,113,500 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$112,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 8th day of January, 2019.

The City of Burnside is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,227,000 for the Burnside Combined Waterline Improvements project. This project will replace approximately 28,375 LF of waterline with valves and fire hydrants in residential and commercial areas in the Burnside Water System. The replacement lines will be 6" PVC. The completion of the project will restore proper fire protection by upsizing lines and replacing fire hydrants. It will also improve domestic service and reduce water loss to Burnside's customers by eliminating leaks as well as provide a direct connection between the WTP and old Burnside.

The City of Burnside produces more than 80% and purchases around 15% of its water supply from the Southeastern Water Association to serve approximately 590 customers within the system. VIII. 2018 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,113,500 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016 and 2017 operating expenses.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 9.0% from \$545,221 in 2015 to \$594,558 in 2017 due to annual CPI increases while operating expenses increased 2.5% during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 0.8 in 2015 and 1.4 in 2017. The ratio fell below zero in 2016 due to significantly higher maintenance and treatment costs for renovation of the water treatment plant and serious water leaks.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.5, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 39.7 days sales in accounts receivable, and 0.3 month operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- Combined water and sewer revenues will increase 10% or \$55,000 in fiscal year 2020 after the City implements necessary rate increases effective July 1, 2019.
- 2) The City will deposit \$5,000 additionally into the Reserve and Sinking Fund accounts starting 2020 for 4 years to replenish the minimum fund balances. This will be subject to annual KIA administrative compliance monitoring.
- 3) The City will continue to adjust rates based on the Consumer Price Index in 2020 and going forward.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 5) Debt coverage ratio is 1.2 in 2022 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$112,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$5,600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan. As of June 30, 2017, the Reserve and Sinking Fund balances were under funded by approximately \$20,000. The City will set aside additional cash to fund the balances appropriately.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-018) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$564,600 TO THE GREEN-TAYLOR WATER DISTRICT, GREEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Green-Taylor Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$564,600 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Green-Taylor Water District for the Distribution Upgrades project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$28,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 8th day of January, 2019.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Green-Taylor Water District is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$564,600 for the Distribution Upgrades project. The primary goal of this project is to improve water service and quality to the entire system served by Green-Taylor Water District. The District is currently struggling to keep their disinfectant byproducts within regulated standards due to elevated levels received from one of their current suppliers among other issues.

This project will add mixing stations to the Mell Ridge, Pierce, Sandy Y, and Summersville tanks in order to help remedy issues with stagnant water, high levels of disinfection byproducts, and inconsistent contact time resulting in varying levels of disinfectant throughout the distribution system. There will also be rehabilitation of four pump stations including Donansburg, Exie, Mac-Pittman, and Pikeview pump stations. Rehab of the stations will include the installation of new Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) controls to help improve energy efficiency.

In addition to the above-mentioned system improvements, the District will construct an interconnect with the Adair County Water District which will allow for another source of water on the Southern side of Green County along Highway 1913.

Green-Taylor Water District is a PSC regulated regional provider currently serving nearly 5,000 residents and businesses mainly in Green and Taylor counties. The District purchases approximately 350 MG of water annually from three providers including Campbellsville Municipal Water & Sewer System, Green River Valley Water District, and the Greensburg Water Department.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-059) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$760,280 TO THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, BRECKINRIDGE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Hardinsburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$762,280 of project expense including capitalized interest for the loan term, to the City of Hardinsburg for the Harned Pump Station Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by

further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$38,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 8th day of January, 2019.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Water revenues increased 3.7% from \$3.14 million in 2015 to \$3.25 million in 2017 due to annual CPI increases while operating expenses increased 3.4% from \$1.70 million to \$1.76 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.1, 1.0 in 2015 and 2016. In 2017, the ratio dropped to 0.9 because the City paid off an existing KIA loan (C89-023).

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.7, a debt to equity ratio of 1.5, 41.6 days sales in accounts receivable, and 3.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will grow 2% to 3% each year based on the Consumer Price Index.
- 2) The line extension will add 60 new customers to the system when the project is completed in 2020.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.

4) The debt coverage ratio is 1.2 in 2021 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$38,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$1,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANTTO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 8th day of January, 2019.
