PROCEEDINGS

Mr. Ron Lovan, Vice Chair, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

Mr. Ron Lovan addressed the group and recommended that the Election of Officers be done before addressing other business matters.

Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to proceed with the Election of Officers. *Mr.* Claude Christensen seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Ron Lovan nominated Commissioner Dennis Keene for the position of KIA Chair.

Ms. Holly Johnson made the motion to approve the recommendation and *Ms.* Rebecca Goodman seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Dennis Keene, as Chair, then presided over the remainder of the meeting.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Russ Rose nominated Mr. Ron Lovan for the position of KIA Vice-Chair.

Judge David Voegele made the motion to approve the nomination. Mr. Claude Christiansen seconded. The motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF 1ST VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY Mr. Ron Lovan nominated Mr. Bob Amato for the KIA First Vice-Chair position.

Judge David Voegele moved to approve the nomination. Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of December 5, 2019

Mr. Claude Christensen noted his name was misspelled on Page 7 and asked that it be corrected.

Judge David Voegele moved to approve the minutes of the December 5, 2019, regular board meeting with the above mentioned correction. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-002) INCREASE OF \$688,578, FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,028,166 TO THE CITY OF LOUISA, LAWRENCE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Mayor Harold Slone, representing the City of Louisa, discussed the City's request for a Fund "A" loan increase in an amount up to \$688,578 to the original loan approved on May 7, 2019 for the Inflow and Infiltration Rehabilitation project. The project went to bid in October, 2019 but all bids came in higher than budgeted. The increase will bring the total project cost up to \$4,028,166 with no additional work or change of scope.

The purpose of this project is to eliminate inflow and infiltration in the Louisa Sewer System by constructing a portion of the storm water sewer facilities.

In 2009, a Sewer Evaluation Study ("SSES") was performed on the entire Louisa Sewer System, which yielded a delineation of three priority zones for rehabilitation. This project will address the downtown area (Zone 1), which is considered to have the oldest infrastructure and is the highest priority of the City. The planning and design portion paid for camera inspection of approximately 23,250 linear feet of sewer line and determined exactly what measures are necessary to address the issues. The construction portion will replace storm sewer along Lock Avenue and Pike Street in downtown Louisa, with an intent to separate the combined sewer in parts of the area and eliminate other inflow and infiltration concerns.

By separating the storm sewer from the City's sanitary sewer, the City will be able to lower the cost of wastewater treatment as well as reduce the risk of sanitary sewer overflow for approximately 1,900 customers within Lawrence County.

Mayor Slone thanked KIA for their support. He noted the increase was necessary to compensate for the higher than expected bids. Originally, they had five bidders and through the process only one came back in with an acceptable bid. They were concerned if they rebid they would have no one bidding.

Mr. Russ Rose asked about the CPI clause, was it up to the CPI or was it an automatic annual increase. Mayor Slone said it was an automatic annual increase.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A19-002), increase in an amount up to \$688,578 for a total authorized amount up to \$4,028,166 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-032) INCREASE of \$850,000 FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, and Ms. Holly McGrath-Rosas, representing the City of Morehead discussed the City's request for a Fund "A" Loan increase, (A19-032), in an amount up to \$850,000 to a loan originally approved by the KIA Board on March 7, 2019 in the amount of \$3,650,000 for the US 60 West and KY 801 SSO Correction project. The increase will bring the loan total to \$4,500,000. During the design phase of the project modifications were made to better accommodate the flows in the proposed project area. The modifications were made because of the high elevation of the existing lift station and its inability to adequately perform during peak flows. Bids came in higher than originally anticipated resulting in the need for additional funds to complete the project.

This project will improve the sanitary sewer collection system in order to address capacity issues and sanitary system overflows (SSO). The Morehead Utility Plant Board ("MUPB") began recording SSO events circa 1998. In 2000, MUPB was released from their Agreed Order with the Kentucky Division of Water. Since 1998, MUPB has recorded 396 SSO events throughout their collection system; 245 of the recorded 396 SSO events, approximately 62%, have occurred in the proposed capital improvement project area. Currently, the majority of the SSO events occur at the lift station wet wells in the proposed project area. However, the manholes found in lower elevation areas, such as Salt Lick, often overflow when the pump stations become backed up. Increasing the line capacity will alleviate the bottleneck and allow the lift stations to pump at their designed capacity, thus reducing SSO events. Approximately 65,500 linear feet of line will be rehabilitated as well as 5 lift stations and related appurtenances. Two of the lift stations will be equipped with SCADA and three will be equipped with VFD devices to increase energy efficiency.

The MUPB currently serves 5,581 sewer customers, 3,453 water customers, and also provides natural gas to customers in Rowan County.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked the engineers in the room if everyone is seeing higher bids. Mr. Becker noted that from DOW's perspective everyone is seeing higher bids than in the past. Mr. Matt Curtis mentioned that there are a limited number of companies that have the capacity to handle a project like Morehead's and with the costs associated with the American Iron and Steel requirements, things are significantly higher.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman moved to approve the Fund A Loan increase (A19-032) in an amount up to \$850,000 for a total authorized amount up to \$4,500,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-025) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$227,000 TO THE CITY OF HODGENVILLE, LARUE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Ms. Laura Gilkerson, GRW Engineers representing the City of Hodgenville, discussed the City of Hodgenville's request for a Fund "A" loan in an amount up to \$227,000 for a Planning and Design loan for the WWTP Upgrade and Wet Weather Storage project. The project will evaluate current and future wastewater flows and treatment processes to design appropriate upgrades to the existing wastewater treatment plant. Flow monitoring, CCTV inspection, evaluation of pumping facilities, review of existing treatment processes and results, projections of future flows (volumes and characteristics), consideration of wet weather flow storage, and comparisons of alternate treatment processes will be performed to provide a review of the options that will achieve better treatment in the most efficient manner. The planned upgrades and improvements include additional wet weather retention, additional treatment units, and updated treatment equipment. The system currently serves approximately 1,400 existing customers in the City of Hodgenville ("City") and the surrounding Larue County.

Judge David Voegele asked why the rates outside the city were different than the in city rates. Ms. Gilkerson stated that is common practice since residents outside city limits do not pay city taxes. City Officials feel that residents outside the city limits should not get the same benefits as those in town with customers being further from the plant and requiring additional lines. Ms. Linda Bridwell confirmed that this is generally the case for customers outside city limits. Mr. Ron Lovan concurred and noted that often times the cost of services survey are regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and it has been determined the further out you go the cost to provide services is higher than within city limits. In his District they do require a surcharge to extend the water lines.

Ms. Bridwell noted in regards to special conditions, sometimes when the ordinance has not been approved yet, that is added as a special condition. KIA staff does not take it to the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee until the ordinance has been approved. The loan does not move forward until all the conditions have been met. Ms. Meili Sun noted the first reading is scheduled for January 13th, with the second reading on the 15th.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A20-025) in an amount up to \$227,000 to the City of Hodgenville with the standard conditions and one special condition: The City shall pass a modified ordinance no later than January 31, 2020 to increase sewer rate by 3% on July 1 each year through 2024. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-031) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000 TO THE CITY OF RUSSELL, GREENUP COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Ms. Joy Conley, representing the City of Russell, discussed the City's request for a Fund "A" loan in the amount up to \$500,000 to evaluate the condition of the existing sewer collection infrastructure for upgrades and repairs to reduce inflow and infiltration. An Inflow and Infiltration Study will identify areas in the system that have cracked or broken pipes, deteriorated manholes, faulty manhole covers or frames, uncapped clean outs, and connections that discharge storm water into the collection system. The study area will cover approximately 13,800 linear feet of sewer pipeline. Preliminary engineering will include reviews of previous field investigations and condition assessments, and collection of new field data to update the condition assessments. Once the needs are identified and prioritized, the rehab of the collection system will begin. The most effective methods will be utilized for the rehab efforts, which may include, but are not limited to, replacing pipelines, slip-lining, and point repairs.

As a Kentucky Inter-System Operational Permit ("KISOP") system, the City of Russell ("City") is charged for the flow that is sent to the Greenup County Environmental Commission. By repairing and rehabilitating the points of inflow and infiltration, the City will be able to reduce the cost of treatment. The project will also lower the risk of sanitary overflows in the City and improve public health for the existing 500 sewer customers.

Mr. Bob Amato asked Ms. Conley if they pay Greenup County Environmental Commission a per gallon rate. Ms. Conley noted it was, they had meters of their own that are monitored. Mr. Russ Rose asked how long their agreement was with The Greenup County Environmental Commission. Ms. Conley said it would be forever, there is a board in place with communities in the area that have no other option than to use the Greenup County Environmental facility. Mr. Becker noted that the agreement is a term of the GCEC permit.

Mr. Kurt Stafford asked about the cost savings. Ms. Conley said there were a couple of things that are doing, the City chose to hire the engineers they did, many years ago, there was a sewer I & I, issue and mapping was done, which is mostly completed. The City has decided to purchase the equipment to do their own testing, which will save additional funds.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A20-031) loan in an amount up to \$500,000 to the City of Russell with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Claude Christensen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F19-005) INCREASE of \$573,000 FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,800,000 TO THE CITY OF BURNSIDE, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Mayor Robert Lawson, representing the City of Burnside, discussed the City's request for a Fund F loan increase to its Fund (F19-005) loan. The Combined Waterline Improvement project was initially approved on January 8, 2019 for \$2,227,000. The project has gone to bids in November and all bids came out higher than budgeted. An increase of \$573,000 is requested to fund the new total project cost of \$2.8 million.

The project will replace approximately 28,375 LF of waterline with valves and fire hydrants in residential and commercial areas in the Burnside Water System. The replacement lines will be 6" PVC. The completion of the project will restore proper fire protection by upsizing lines and replacing fire hydrants. It will also improve domestic service and reduce water loss by eliminating leaks as well as provide a direct connection between the WTP and old Burnside.

The City produces 85% and purchases around 15% of its water supply from the Southeastern Water Association to serve approximately 600 customers within the system. In a Town Hall meeting held on December 10, 2018 to address the need for the project and the KIA assistance, the City received full support from its residents to move forward with the project.

Mayor Lawson thanked the Board for their assistance. The funds are needed due to the bids coming in higher than previously expect, as with other projects on today's agenda.

Mr. John Lyons asked about their water loss percentage and asked if it would affect their contract with Southeastern Water District. Mayor Lawson said the loss has been around 50%, so the savings could be huge. They will have to continue purchasing from Southeastern, because they do not have lines on that side. It can be monitored very closely.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked the Mayor about the economy of Burnside and the MHI. The Mayor said things were going well. Burnside is considered a retirement community and they are working hard to change that and hope to fill up the island, with development plans in the future. The old town is very low income.

Mr. Russ Rose asked what type of pipes will be replaced. The mayor noted that there were cast iron pipes in place.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F19-005) loan increase to the City of Burnside in an amount of \$573,000 for a total loan up to \$2,800,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Russ Rose seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

6. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Judge David Voegele seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Deputy Director Linda Bridwell addressed the group and discussed two presentations that took place in December, the 2019 H20 Award Recipient City of Fleming-Neon received their drinking water award on December 11th at the KRADD Board of Directors meeting in Hazard. The Regional Water Resource Agency received the 2019 H2O Award for a clean water project on Monday, December 16th at their Board of Directors meeting in Owensboro.

Also mentioned was the 2019 USEPA Aquarius recognition program for the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund, which began this year. KIA's nomination was selected to receive this national honor. On December 18th, the City of Danville was presented the USEPA Aquarius Excellence Recognition award for the water treatment plant and intake project. The presentation will be at the water treatment plant. This drinking water project was the first H2O Award recipient.

The DWSRF and CWSRF Call for Projects deadline was December 16th. Staff is working through the ranking of the water and wastewater projects.

KIA has a standing partnership meeting with ACEC-KY (American Council of Engineering Companies of Kentucky). They have asked about using design-build. Currently, we are not set up for design build projects, but are in the process of

setting up a taskforce to see how that will work. Other states are currently using these under their SRF funding and we want to see if it could be beneficial to our borrowers, saving time and money on their projects.

Ms. Bridwell noted that there was a handout at everyone's seat with suggested Board Meeting dates for the remainder of 2020. The majority are the first Thursday of each month, other than in July, which we are recommending the 9th, due to the July 4th holiday. The September meeting is scheduled on the final Thursday to give the Board an opportunity to review the annual audit before it is submitted to Finance.

Mr. Bob Amato made a motion to accept the suggested dates. *Mr.* Ron Lovan seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/NOTIFICATIONS

Commissioner Keene announced a new KIA Executive Director has been hired. Edith Halbleib had been selected. She was asked to come say a few words. Ms. Halbleib is the former Jefferson County Master Commissioner in the Judicial Branch and an attorney. She looks forward to working with everyone and appreciates this opportunity.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F20-034) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,094,675 TO THE CITY OF LYON COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Lyon County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$2,094,675 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Lyon County Water District for the Water System and Storage Tank Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.5%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$104,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of February, 2020.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Lyon County Water District is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,094,675 for the Water System and Storage Tank Improvements project. This project will address several areas throughout the distribution system to help improve water age, water quality, pressure issues, and maintenance in the system.

Two water tanks will be rehabilitated including the Lamasco glass lined standpipe tank and the Jack Thompson tank. The Lamasco tank needs coating on the interior to mitigate a rust problem as well as installation of a mixing system and work on the exterior valve vault to install a bypass valve for better control at the tank site. The Jack Thompson elevated storage tank needs coating on the interior and exterior per the latest inspection.

The project will also loop several lines in the KY 295 area in order to increase circulation of water and improve water quality. This includes an interconnect between KY 295 and KY 373 and another between US 62 and KY 295. The KY 373 to KY 295 Loop project is a project that loops a line that dead ends at the City of Eddyville's master meter valve. The line is also the first phase in allowing the Crittenden Livingston County Water District to serve the City of Kuttawa as a backup source or possibly a primary source. In addition, the loop will allow additional water to be transmitted by the City of Eddyville to the City of Kuttawa as a backup water source.

The US 62 & KY 295 project provides another connection between the Lyon County Water District and the City of Kuttawa. Along with the KY 373 to KY 295 project described above, the project provides a means of allowing Kuttawa to receive water from the Crittenden Livingston County Water District and a higher volume feed from the City of Eddyville. The new feed will currently serve as a backup water supply for Kuttawa and could serve as Kuttawa's primary water supply in the event Kuttawa ceases operation of its water treatment plant.

In addition, an undersized 2" line in the Tinsley Creek Subdivision will be replaced with an adequately sized line to resolve water quality and pressure issues in the area and a creek crossing near KY 274 will also be replaced as the line is very shallow and in danger of immediate failure.

The Lyon County Water District is a PSC regulated distribution system that does not produce water. The District purchases approximately 111 MG of water annually

primarily from the Kuttawa Water Department (41 MG) and Princeton Water (41 MG) in addition to the Crittenden-Livingston County Water District (12 MG), and the Eddyville Water Department (6 MG).

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues have averaged approximately \$1.2 million from 2016 to 2018 while operating expenses have increased 3.4% from \$922,389 in 2016 to \$953,566 in 2018. The District's last rate increase occurred in 2016 when rates went up 25%. The District is currently undergoing a rate study by their engineering firm in order to apply for another rate increase at the PSC which will include projected revenue needs for this project as well as several other necessary capital projects for the system. Debt coverage was 2.3 in 2016, 3.2 in 2017, and 1.3 in 2018. Debt service was adjusted in 2017 to remove an interim financing payoff to Kentucky Rural Water Association which was replaced with KIA loan F12-02 for another water quality system improvement project to normalize the debt coverage ratio.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.0, a debt to equity ratio of 1.6, 52.5 days sales in accounts receivable, and 5.4 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will need to increase at least \$220,000 or 18% annually upon approval of the PSC in order to support inflation and debt service for this loan.
- Expenses will increase 2% for inflation starting in the year debt service begins on this pending loan. Inflation expense has been removed from projections in 2019-2021 as this is the only thing driving rate increase needs during that time period.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$104,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$5,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

XII. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

KIA staff recommends approval of the loan with the standard conditions and the following special conditions:

- The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,094,675 million loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than 2025.
- 2) By May 1, 2020, the District will need a resolution from the Lyon County Water District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to increase by \$220,000 annually which equates to an approximate 18% rate increase by January 1, 2022 to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of repayment.
- 3) Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Cannonsburg Water District is requesting a Fund C loan in the amount of \$622,000 for the Phase 1 Zone Metering project. The purpose of the project is to reduce unaccounted for water in the system through improved operating efficiency and capital planning. Currently the District has reported water loss of approximately 27%. The project is consistent with the efforts of the District to reduce unaccounted for water and has been presented to, and has the support of, the Public Service Commission.

This project will involve the installation of approximately 53 zone meters. The meters will be installed throughout the existing distribution system at critical locations identified by the owner and engineer. Of the 53 zone meters, 10 will replace existing malfunctioning metering devices. Installation of the zone meters will enable the Cannonsburg Water District to subdivide their existing system into designated metering areas (DMA) and sub-metering areas.

Metered output will be incorporated into the existing smart metering system currently used by the Cannonsburg Water District. The proposed project will allow the District to monitor system flows in real time and compare metered flows to metered billings within the established DMAs.

The District serves approximately 3,597 customers in Boyd, Greenup, and Carter counties. It is a distribution system only, purchasing the majority of its water (389 million gallons annually) from the City of Ashland. The District is under order from the PSC to reduce water loss from Case No. 2014-00267. Water loss has been reduced from approximately 55% in January 2017 to approximately 27% in January 2019.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues decreased 3% from \$2.5 million in 2016 to \$2.4 million in 2018. Fluctuations in revenue are attributable to the closing of a steel mill in the area which reopened at the end of 2018 under new ownership. Water revenue from the idled mill

in 2018 was around \$30,000 while revenues have since increased back to \$128,000 annually in 2019 according to the system (audit not yet complete). Operating expenses remained relatively flat at \$2.3 million during the same time period. Debt coverage was 3.0, 1.0, and 1.9 from 2016-2018, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.6, a debt to equity ratio of 1.0, 43.1 days sales in accounts receivable and 1.5 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Rate revenues will increase 4.1% based on a previously approved rate increase in May 2019 and remain flat thereafter.
- A surcharge was approved by the PSC in May 2019 to pay for this project. It is expected to generate approximately \$172,656 annually each year through 2023 (or until the surcharge collected equals \$680,000).
- Revenues will increase for the reopened steel mill, however, they were not factored into this analysis which should result in an even better cash position than what is forecasted.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2021 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund C loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$32,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$1,600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C20-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$100,000 TO THE CITY OF LEWISPORT, HANCOCK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Governmental Agencies Program (Fund C) with the City of Lewisport, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Governmental Agencies Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Governmental Agencies Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Governmental Agencies Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$100,000 of project expense, to the City of Lewisport for the UV & Headworks Upgrade project & Yellow Creek Waterline Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$6,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of February, 2020.

The City of Lewisport is requesting a Fund C loan in the amount of \$100,000 for the Lewisport UV & Headworks Upgrade project and the Yellow Creek Waterline Replacement project. This loan has both a water and sewer component.

The sewer project will involve upgrading the current UV systems at the Wastewater Treatment Plant as well as replacing the headworks. The UV upgrade will be a sole source upgrade with the original UV company in order to keep some of the existing components of the system as a cost savings measure.

The water project will add approximately 300 LF of 8" waterline at the Yellow Creek in order to create redundancy and prevent service loss to 400 customers in the area in the event the existing line fails. This will require boring under the creek in order to connect the line on both sides.

Lewisport Municipal Water Works serves approximately 1,086 drinking water customers and 700 sewer customers in Hancock County. The City also has a natural gas distribution system which services 1,238 customers including one industrial customer.

HISTORY

Total revenues have increased 26% from \$2 million in 2016 to \$2.6 million in 2018. The majority of the increase was realized in the gas fund which increased 35% from \$1.4 million in 2016 to \$1.9 million in 2018. Water revenues increased 9.5% from \$380,000 in 2016 to \$417,000 in 2018, and sewer revenues grew 3% from \$252,000 in 2016 to \$260,000 during the same time period. Total operating expenses increased 16% from \$1.9 million in 2016 to \$2.2 million in 2018. Gas expenses increased 18%, water 16%, and sewer 7.5%. Gas has historically greatly subsidized both water and sewer operations.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.5, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, and 5.1 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. Days sales in accounts receivable has been excluded because of the need to present a combined balance sheet of the water, sewer, and gas funds which results in skewed numbers.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 5% in 2020 due to a previously approved rate increase and remain flat thereafter. Sewer and gas revenues will remain flat for both growth and volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 12.0 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund C loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$6,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6^{TH} day of February, 2020.
