PROCEEDINGS

Chair Dunahoo called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order.

Ms. Dunahoo introduced DLG General Counsel Greg Ladd and asked him to introduce himself and confirm the press notification and the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of December 6, 2017

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the minutes of the December 6, 2017, regular board meeting. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-014) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,066,988 TO THE MARSHALL COUNTY FISCAL COURT, MARSHALL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, addressed the group to present information on the Marshall County Fiscal Court's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$3,066,988 for the Draffenville Sewer Expansion Phases 1-3 project.

This project will involve a sewer system expansion in Draffenville with approximately 13,200 linear feet (LF) of gravity sewer and 7,100 LF of force main along with a lift station, manholes, and appurtenances. The project will eliminate an existing package treatment plant located at the Marshall County High School which has reached the end of its useful life, an existing septic system at the Christian Fellowship School, as well as a no discharge lagoon treatment system in the Steeple Chase development.

This project will add approximately 70 residences and 2 institutional customers for the newly formed Marshall County Sanitation District. Previously, Marshall County had two separate Sanitation Districts which have now been combined by efforts of the Marshall County Fiscal Court in order to better improve managerial and financial capacity of the District.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A18-014) up to the amount of \$3,066,988 to the Marshall County Fiscal Court with the standard conditions. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-015) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$500,000 TO THE CITY OF ELKTON, TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Melissa Rife, KIA, discussed the City of Elkton's request for a Fund A (A18-015) Planning and Design loan in the amount of \$500,000 for the Wastewater System Rehabilitation and Improvements project.

The project will include field investigations (smoke testing, closed-circuit TV inspection, manhole inspections), preparation of a Sewer System Evaluation Survey, and evaluation/studies of pump stations, force mains, and the wastewater treatment plant. These activities will result in a Preliminary Engineering Report detailing problems and recommending solutions.

Recommendations will likely include repairs and replacements to sewer collection lines throughout the city, construction of two new wet weather pump stations, construction of a new wet weather storage basin (including pumping facilities), and construction of improvements to the existing wastewater treatment plant.

The City of Elkton provides water and sewer services to approximately 878 customers.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A18-015) up to the amount of \$500,000 to the City of Elkton with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN NFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B18-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$53,000 TO THE CITY OF ALBANY, CLINTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Melissa Rife, KIA, discussed the City of Albany's request for a Fund B Loan (B18-002) in the amount of \$53,000 for the Rowena Marina Water System Extension project.

The project will improve service for approximately 40 existing customers and provide potable water to the Rowena Marina by installing approximately 19,500 linear feet of 6 inch PVC water line along Kentucky Highway 558, adding a new master meter vault, and a new pressure reducing station. Roughly 12,500 linear feet of the new water line will replace an existing aging and undersized 3 inch water line. The remaining 7,000 linear feet will be installed in previously unserved territory.

The City provides water and sewer services to approximately 4,688 customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund B Loan, (B18-002) up to the amount of \$53,000 to the City of Albany with the standard conditions. Ms. Gwen Pinson seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B18-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$132,046 TO THE CITY OF FLEMINGSBURG, FLEMING COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Flemingsburg's request for a Fund B loan (B18-005) in the amount of \$132,046 for the Flemingsburg Marys Avenue & Tinnerman Drive Sewer Replacement project. This project will install approximately 2,700 linear feet of 6" Cured-In-Place pipe, reline 20 manholes, clean 2,700 feet of 6" sewer line and complete mechanical root cleaning of 1,400 feet of sewer line. The existing clay tile gravity line was constructed in the 1960's, which directly serves a factory and approximately 30 households. A sewer line from a mobile home park housing approximately 80 residences feeds into this line. The City has experienced inflow and infiltration due to problems with tree roots growing into the sewer line, causing backups, collapses, and overflows. In addition, there have been problems with debris collecting in the lines due to tree roots breaking the lines. This project will eliminate inflow and infiltration while reducing maintenance costs in the area.

Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the Fund B Loan (B18-005) up to the amount of \$132,046 to the City of Flemingsburg with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B18-008) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$796,000 TO THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, TAYLORSVILLE LAKE STATE PARK, SPENCER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the Kentucky Department of Parks, Taylorsville Lake's request for a Fund B Loan (B18-008) in the amount of \$796,000 to the Department of Parks of the Commonwealth of Kentucky Taylorsville Lake Sewer System Improvements project.

This project covers two phases. Phase 1 consists of an emergency project to address a failing package treatment plant and pump station that served the Department of Parks Campground, marina, and Premier AKA Edgewater Development. In the summer of 2016, a pump station failure resulted in a possible breach of flow into Taylorsville Lake. Immediate action was taken to temporarily repair the failing Pump Station #1 and bypass the Premier AKA Edgewater Package Treatment Plant, connecting to the City of Taylorsville collection system. This phase has been fully constructed.

Phase II consists of a complete rebuild of Pump Station #1 that is responsible for pumping flow to the City of Taylorsville for treatment as well as the demolition of the package treatment plant and the abandoned pump stations #2 and #3. This phase bid in December 2017 and is scheduled for construction in February 2018.

The City of Taylorsville is currently the legal receiver responsible for the overall operations of the package sewage facility. The City and Parks have agreed that Parks will retain ownership of the project through the life of the loan. Once the loan is paid off by Parks, the infrastructure will be conveyed to the City and the City will continue to have full authority regarding the operation and maintenance of the system.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund B Loan (B18-008) up to the amount of \$796,000 to The Kentucky Department of Parks, Taylorsville Lake with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRIINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F18-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$700,982 TO THE CITY OF SALYERSVILLE, MAGOFFIN COUNTY KENTUCKY

This project required additional information and will be presented to the Board at a later date.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F18-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,842,071 TO THE GREEN-TAYLOR WATER DISTRICT, TAYLOR COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Green-Taylor Water District's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$1,842,071 for the System Improvements in Taylor County project.

This project will replace problematic mains and utilize loops in an effort to improve service to existing customers, eliminate disinfection byproducts, and provide service to around 42 new customers. Two new loops will be created around HWY 323 and another around Bloyds Poplar Grove Road and an existing loop will be updated on Old Greensburg Road. A four inch water main will be replaced by six inch PVC line that serves the Summersville Community and the lines in the Shalawn subdivision will be replaced in order to address line breaks and substantial water loss in the area. A new line will be ran on Black Snake Creek Road in order to provide water service to citizens who have requested water service for several years. The District will also purchase two portable generators to be used in emergency situations. In addition, the District will create a Capital Improvement Plan in order to plan for future projects. This planning will utilize GPS to locate over 5,000 valves as well as meters and hydrants.

Green-Taylor Water District is a PSC regulated regional provider currently serving nearly 5,000 residents and businesses mainly in Green and Taylor counties. The District purchases approximately 350 MG of water from three providers including Campbellsville Municipal Water & Sewer System, Green River Valley Water District, and the Greensburg Water Department.

Ms. Gwen Pinson recused herself from voting. Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F18-005) to the Green-Taylor Water District up to the amount of \$1,842,071 with the standard conditions. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F18-006) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,641,680 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON, MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Lebanon's request for a Fund F (F18-006) loan in the amount of \$2,641,680 for the Lebanon Water Works System Improvements project.

This project will replace approximately 22,000 linear feet of 2, 4 and 6 inch cast iron water main with 6 inch PVC pipe in the western section of the City. The existing cast iron piping in this area has been prone to frequent leaks, breaks and service disruptions. The replacement will include service connections to reduce leakage and provide high quality services.

Modifications and upgrades will be made at the existing water treatment plant to improve water quality and efficiency. A gravity sludge thickener, a settling basin scraper, and a new fluoride room will be installed in addition to replacement of 4 existing filter media units as well as energy efficiency improvements to the raw

water intake. It will also add a belt press to reduce discharge and improve discharge water quality.

The Lebanon Water Works is a wholesale provider to the Marion County Water District. The latest rate increase was filed with the PSC but disputed by the Marion District. The PSC has issued an order to suspend the effective date of the proposed rate increase from November 15, 2017 to April 14, 2018.

Ms. Gwen Pinson recused herself from voting. Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F18-006) to the City of Lebanon up to the amount of \$2,641,680 with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

9. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Mark Bunning seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Dunahoo told the group that Jeff Abshire would present Agenda items 10 and 11 as one presentation and one vote would be taken following discussion.

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, presented the resolution and explained that existing cash on hand would be utilized to advance refund all or a portion of the remaining Series 2010A and Series 2012A bonds not previously advance refunded.

A RESOLUTION (THE PRELIMINARY BOND RESOLUTION) OF THE 11. **BOARD OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY (AUTHORITY) AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A SERIES TRUST INDENTURE DATED** OF MARCH 1, 2018 BY AND BETWEEN THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AND U.S. BANK NATIONAL ASSOCIATION, LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY WASTEWATER AND DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND PROGRAM REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2018A IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$60,000,000 UNDER THE TERMS OF THE SERIES TRUST INDENTURE AND THE GENERAL TRUST INDENTURE DATED AS OF MARCH 1, 2010 BETWEEN THE AUTHORITY AND U.S. BANK NATIONAL ASSOCIATION; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF SAID BONDS; AND REPEALING ALL RESOLUTIONS OR PARTS THEREOF IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS HEREOF.

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, presented the resolution and explained that the funds obtained from the bond issue would be used for program purposes.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve both resolutions. Mr. Mark Bunning seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil addressed the group. She noted a handout regarding the SRF 2019 Call for Projects. Between last year and this year there are \$96 million more in requests for funding. This is the largest request ever received. There are 22 additional drinking water and 34 sewer projects. This is with only 14 Area Development Districts (ADDs) reporting. One ADD did not submit any projects for the SRF Program, which upon further investigation, there should have been six or seven that should have been submitted. The Division of Water is prioritizing the list of projects with anticipated completion by the end of February. KIA's goal is to have the Intended Use Plan (IUP) out for public comment earlier this year, hopefully in March, but no later than April, with applications to EPA for Capitalization Grants in April or May. The plan is to have the

next call for projects earlier than in years past for two different reasons, inclusion of the ADD projects on the list that were not on the list previously and if the Infrastructure Bill comes out through the Trump Administration with additional funding.

She mentioned the ADD contracts. Past contracts were based upon lump sum agreements with half paid mid-year and the balance paid at year-end, without showing reimbursement costs.

In January 2017, a few of the ADDs did not demonstrate that they had costs that exceeded that amount and that was a concern. In reviewing the contracts, some of the wording was redundant and wordy so KIA staff streamlined and standardized the evaluation and reporting. Moving forward new contracts have been written, including payments for reimbursement, reduction in their scope of work with specific deadlines, new guidance for updating WRIS and reduction in contractual amounts.

All 15 ADD Executive Directors received an email from Director McNeil with their new contracts on December 20th, all have been signed and returned. To date, 14 have been approved through the finance process, one was just signed and is now being processed.

KIA receives \$1.2 million through the State's General Fund and has historically been written into these contracts to update the WRIS. The previous contracts dealt with GIS for all systems under 10,000 population, which included manholes and valves. This year's contracts are back to the basics. With the review of the year-end reports, on last year's work only one ADD successfully completed their contractual obligations. Several others did fairly well on meeting their contract requirements. There were a few that did poorly in meeting their obligations per the contract. The handout that was provided was compiled by information given to KIA by the various ADD staff. The Executive Directors were given this information in December as well. With that in mind, the new contracts included the reduction in work, based on their reporting and the reduction in funding by the Governor's request for 17.4%, prior to knowing the actual number of funding cuts. There were no contracts in place at that time.

Director McNeil was asked by the ADD Executive Directors on January 12th if they would receive additional funding since the actual budget cuts were significantly lower than originally thought. At the present time, there will be no additional funding. Last year, there was a budget reduction at the end of the year as well. The plan is to hold the money should this happen again at the end of the fiscal year. This year, the contracts have been simplified and the expected scope of work reduced, quite different than the last four years' contracts. The reduced funding amounts to \$208,000 for all the ADDs.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.75%. The City of Bardstown is requesting a Fund B loan increase in the amount of \$129,000 for the Water Treatment Plant Disinfection Conversion project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on May 4, 2017 in the amount of \$1,000,000. The new total loan amount is \$1,129,000.

The project includes the addition of ammonia chemical feed and monitoring equipment to convert from chlorine to chloramines at the plant. This will reduce disinfection byproducts (DBPs) in the distribution system and provide compatible treatment with Louisville Water who also services the North Nelson Water District. All four wholesale customers have received notices of violation and enforcement actions for DBPs.

The City provides water service to approximately 11,000 in Hardin, Nelson and Washington counties. They sell approximately 350 million gallons of water annually to the Bloomfield Water and Sewer Department, Larue County Water District #1, New Haven Municipal Water Works, and North Nelson Water District (PSC regulated) at a rate of \$2.00 per thousand gallons.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the City's audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through 2017 for the Combined Utilities Operating Fund which includes electric distribution, water treatment and distribution, wastewater treatment, garbage pickup, cable TV, and Internet services. While revenues and expenses are separated in the audit based on the above segments, the balance sheet and debt information is only presented on a consolidated basis. The non cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts as outlined in the audited financial statements.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 3.1% from \$35.8 million to \$36.9 million from 2015 to 2017, while operating expenses increased 5.1% from \$28.6 million to \$30 million. Consolidated cash flow before debt service averaged \$7 million during the three years. Water cash flow averaged \$1.2 million, or 17% of consolidated cash flow before debt service. The debt coverage ratio was 4.1, 4.1, and 3.9 for 2015 through 2017, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.0, debt to equity ratio of 0.3, days sales in account receivable of 23.0, and the number of months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash is 4.2.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat for volume.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 3.4 in 2019 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the proforma assumptions, the City shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is \$2,800. This amount should be added to the replacement account each December 1 until the balance reaches \$56,000 and maintained for the life of the loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of South Shore is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$878,000 for the Water System Improvement Project.

This project will complete various system improvements throughout the distribution system. The project includes an extension of 10,642 linear feet of 4-inch PVC waterline along Lower White Oak and Flat Hollow Roads that will serve approximately 40 residents currently utilizing cisterns and underperforming wells. Additionally, a new booster pump station with variable frequency drives and telemetry will be installed for the Maloneton tank to improve hydraulics. Fencing and telemetry will be installed at the Maloneton, Fullerton, and Windy Hills water storage tanks and fencing will also be installed at the Morton Hill tank providing for improved operations, reliability, and security.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years

ended June 30, 2014 through June 30, 2017.

Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues decreased 2.7% from approximately \$1,273,000 in 2014 to \$1,255,000 in 2017. During the same time period, operating expenses increased 18.7% from \$823,000 to \$976,000.

Cash available for debt service was \$453,489, \$451,824, \$414,445, and \$266,153 in 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2017, respectively. The debt coverage ratio was 19.7, 15.1, 1.5, and 1.1. In mid-2013, the City purchased South Shore Water Works. In 2014 and 2015, the City received revenues related to the water utility. However, payments for the related debt did not begin until 2016. The large debt coverage ratios shown for 2014 and 2015 are a result of those timing differences.

The 2017 Balance Sheet reflects 56.6 days sales in accounts receivable, 4.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash, a current ratio of 2.4, and a debt to equity ratio of 0.9.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Total revenue will increase 5.3% in FY2018 due to an increase in water rates.
- 2) Expenses are expected to remain flat. However, it is important to note that the City is sensitive to potential inflationary increases in expenses which may require an increase in revenue to maintain a 1.1 debt coverage ratio.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2021 when full principal and interest payments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$44,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$2,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY **AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS** OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE **KENTUCKY** INFRASTRUCTURE **AUTHORITY TO** SUCH **GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES**

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 1st day of March, 2018.
