#### **PROCEEDINGS**

Mr. Bruce Scott, First Vice-Chair, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He asked Ms. Suzanne Molley, DLG Staff Attorney, to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

#### I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

#### A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of January 8, 2019

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the minutes of the January 8, 2019, regular board meeting. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF VICE CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Mr. Robert Amato nominated Mr. Ron Lovan for the Vice Chair vacancy. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-045) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$251,000 TO THE CITY OF BURKESVILLE, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Jeff Abshire, discussed the City of Burkesville's request for Fund A Loan (A19-045) in an amount up to \$251,000. This is the Planning and Design portion of the Waste Water Treatment Plant Improvements project. It will allow the City to evaluate the plant's current condition, create a Preliminary Engineering Report, identify needed improvements, evaluate options for future treatment limits, and make recommendations for improvements.

The project will improve the plant's headworks facilities, which includes replacing the grit removal system and influent sampler, refurbishing the influent piping, HVAC, electrical and architectural components. It will replace the oxidation ditch equipment (motors, gear boxes, line shafts, bearings, etc.), the final clarifier equipment, and the chlorine gas disinfection

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system with a peracetic acid system. The scope of work also covers improvements to the chlorine contact basin, installation of new RAS/WAS pumping and new sludge processing equipment, upgrades to the existing electrical and instrumentation equipment, and replacement of an existing pump station that serves one major industrial customer.

The system currently serves approximately 600 customers within the city limits and Cumberland County and supplies wholesale water to the Cumberland County Water District which is regulated by the PSC.

Mr. Mark Bunning inquired about the appearance of declining population and the ability for the 1% annual increase requirement being sufficient, based on the automatic adjustment clause adopted in the 2011. Mr. Abshire noted he was unsure about the accuracy of the census data and the population numbers and that the Cumberland County Water District is a customer and should counter balance the numbers.

Ms. Gwen Pinson abstained from voting. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-045) for an amount up to \$251,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-047) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,400,000 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, discussed the City of Bardstown's request for a Fund A loan, (A19-047) in an amount up to \$5,400,000. The City is requesting funding for the Rowan Creek Sewer Upgrade project. The project will replace the existing 0.75 million gallon per day (MGD) Pottershop pump station with a 3.5 MGD station and will upgrade approximately 17,000 linear feet of sewer lines with 12 to 36 inch lines. Mechanical screening facilities will also be constructed at the headworks of the treatment plant to remove trash and debris prior to waste treatment. The pump station is a recurring sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) location due to hydraulic overloading during wet weather while the Rowan Creek trunk sewer has high levels of inflow and infiltration (I/I) and has numerous defects. Existing and proposed development within the Rowan Creek sewershed will exceed the capacity of the existing trunk sewer and pump station, thus justifying the replacement and upgrades. Replacement of the influent sewer at the Town Creek WWTP is needed to eliminate a hydraulic constriction that causes the headworks to back up during high influent flows while the screening facilities are needed to remove trash and debris from the influent to prevent plugging problems with floating aerators and the biological reactor.

The City of Bardstown provides wastewater service to approximately 7,500 customers and also treats waste for the City of Bloomfield's 455 customers.

Mr. Robert Amato moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-047) for an amount up to \$5,400,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

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4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,050,049 TO THE CITY OF LA CENTER, BALLARD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the City of La Center's request for a Fund A Loan, (A19-026) in an amount up to \$1,050,049 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrade and I/I Reduction project. This project will consist of upgrading the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the collection system. The City is under an agreed order (DOW 130159). The City plans to upgrade the WWTP by adding Actiflo tertiary treatment and ultra-violet disinfection to ensure effluent falls within their permitted limits. The City discharges into an Impaired Stream, Humphrey Creek, and must meet stringent discharge limits. Other work at the treatment plant will be done to ensure the proper operation of all components including a sludge pump station, slide gates, and necessary yard piping.

The city's gravity system was constructed in excess of 50 years ago and is mostly Vitrified Clay pipe. The pipes have deteriorated significantly over time and are contributing excessive inflow/infiltration into the system. The city has been doing repair work based on the 2000 SSES report with its own funds. In order to continue the necessary repairs a new SSES study and report is required, as well as, the estimated 36,000 linear feet of line that will need repair. The majority of the line repairs will utilize trenchless technology methods (I.E. Cured-in-place pipe, pipe bursting, etc.). This approach will reduce disturbance to the community during construction, reduce the strain on the WWTP, adding to its longevity and resulting in substantial improvements to the customers' service. The City will also complete camera work to determine the most egregious portions for Inflow and Infiltration of their system. Once those portions are identified, the city will rehab the system lines.

The City of La Center provides sewer service to 364 residential and 66 commercial customers and water service to 372 residential and 73 commercial customers in Ballard County. The primary goal of this project is to improve water service and quality to the entire system served by Green-Taylor Water District. The District is currently struggling to keep their disinfectant byproducts within regulated standards due to elevated levels received from one of their current suppliers among other issues.

Mr. Mark Bunning asked Mr. Becker what trenchless technology involved. Mr. Becker said it was boring or a material is pushed through the pipe that coats the existing pipe and makes a new one. Director McNeil noted KIA staff is seeing trenchless technology used fairly often and there aren't many contractors doing the process at this point in time. KIA is actively looking for more vendors.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-026) in an amount up to \$1,050,049 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City of La Center shall implement a CPI clause in their proposed rate ordinance, consolidate all miscellaneous fees into their normal rates by ordinance, and raise rates, at a minimum, as indicated in Section VI, B of the credit analysis. The ordinance will be reviewed and approved by KIA staff prior to execution. Mr. Robert Amato seconded and the motion unanimously was approved.

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5. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

#### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil noted that the American Society of Engineers released there report card on Kentucky's Infrastructure, 10 different areas are taken into consideration when scoring, Kentucky received a C-, which is a bit better than the national average, but slightly lower than the one done seven years ago. The national average in 2017, was a D. Drinking Water received a C+ due to the enactment of SB 409 in 2000. Wastewater received a C. The full report can be found on the ACEC website. Director McNeil and Division of Water Director, Peter Goodmann made a presentation at the ACEC meeting yesterday.

Director McNeil is working with DLG staff member, Ryan Helfenbein to create a new, KIA logo. They hope to have draft soon for review.

Ms. McNeil noted two handouts, a Concurrent Resolution and Joint Resolution on water infrastructure. One is with the Natural Resources Committee and the other with Local Government. Mr. Bruce Scott will be contacting legislators.

Mr. Mark Bunning asked if there were thoughts of President Trump sending funding to Kentucky for infrastructure. Director McNeil said that there is a working list of potential projects should monies become available. Mr. Bunning asked if KIA should be proactive and get legislation in place should funding become available to secure loans to have matching funds available.

Mr. Ron Lovan noted that there is tremendous need for transportation infrastructure and that will most likely be the avenue the federal funds.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-032) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,650,000 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Morehead, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$3,650,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Morehead for the US 60 West and KY 801 SSO Correction Project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.0%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$9,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$182,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2019.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

This project will address capacity issues and sanitary sewer overflows (SSO) throughout sections of the US 60 West and KY 801 sections of Morehead Utility Plant Board's collection system. This will be accomplished by rehabilitating over 65,000 linear feet (LF) of line and 5 different lift stations. Some of the lift station rehabilitation will include increasing capacity as well as installing energy efficient VFD devices and SCADA. Approximately 62% of the recorded 396 SSO events that have occurred since 1998 in the collection system have occurred in the proposed project area.

### KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY WASTEWATER REVOLVING LOAN FUND (FUND A) CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY PROJECT REVIEW SX21205037

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Morehead Plant Utility Board is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$3,650,000 for the US 60 West and KY 801 SSO Correction project. This project will improve the sanitary sewer collection system in order to address capacity issues and sanitary system overflows (SSO). MUPB began recording SSO events circa 1998. In 2000, MUPB was released from their Agreed Order with the Kentucky Division of Water. Since 1998, MUPB has recorded 396 SSO events throughout their collection system; 245 of the recorded 396 SSO events, approximately 62%, have occurred in the proposed capital improvement project area. Currently, the majority of the SSO events occur at the lift station wet wells in the proposed project area. However, the manholes found in lower elevation areas, such as Salt Lick, often overflow when the pump stations become backed up. Increasing the line capacity will alleviate the bottleneck and allow the lift stations to pump at their designed capacity, thus reducing SSO events. Approximately 65,500 linear feet of line will be rehabilitated as well as 5 lift stations and related appurtenances. Two of the lift stations will be equipped with SCADA and three will be equipped with VFD devices to increase energy efficiency.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board currently serves 5,581 sewer customers, 3,453 water customers, and also provides natural gas to customers in Rowan County.

Water rates will be evaluated and adjusted on an annual basis for the next few years based on pending capital projects in the system. The Utility is exploring the implementation of a CPI clause in the future to keep up with inflation.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 15,128 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$38,498. #### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. Morehead Plant Utility Board is comprised of water, sewer, and gas operations and has limited segregation in their financial statements. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial

Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues including water, sewer, and gas have increased 20% from 2016 to 2018 mostly due to rate increases. Water revenues increased 15% during that period, sewer revenues increased 18%, and gas revenues increased 33%. Historically, water has contributed the majority of cash available for debt service to the operation while also making up for deficits in sewer. Rate increases in the beginning of fiscal year (FY) 2019 will bring water and sewer almost equal in terms of cash flow available for debt service and other capital improvements. Total operating expenses increased 20% from 2016 to 2018. Water, sewer, and gas share administrative expenses which saw a 20% increase during this time period while water saw a 6% increase, sewer an 11% increase, and gas a 42% increase in operating expenses.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 51.8 days sales in accounts receivable, and 1.6 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. The debt coverage ratio from 2016 to 2018 was 2.0, 2.0, and 2.3, respectively.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues for both residential and wholesale customers will increase approximately 16% in FY 2019 as a result of a rate increase. Water revenues will continue to increase in the five year forecast according to planned rate increases by the Utility based on their capital improvements plan and updated annually with KIA. Residential water rates are anticipated to increase an average of 16% from FY 2019-2021 while wholesale rates will be adjusted based on the wholesale customer's responsibility for debt service coverage for plant expansion projects. Only the currently known 2019 increase is factored into this analysis.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase approximately 39% due to a rate increase in FY 2019 and remain flat thereafter.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt coverage is 1.4 in 2022 when full principal and interest payments for loan A19-032 and the first four increments of pending KIA loan F19-002 go into repayment.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$182,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$9,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A PLANNING AND DESIGN LOAN (A19-048) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$388,400 TO THE LINCOLN COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Lincoln County Sanitation District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A Planning and Design loan for an amount up to \$388,400 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to

the Lincoln County Sanitation District for the US 127 Corridor Sanitary Sewer Phase 2 Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 5 years at an interest rate of 3.0%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. No replacement reserve is required for Planning and Design Loans. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2019.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Lincoln County Sanitation District is requesting a Fund A Planning and Design loan in the amount of \$388,400 for the US 127 Corridor Sanitary Sewer Phase 2 project. This project will fund the planning and design of a project that will bring sanitary sewer to approximately 355 homes and 8 commercial customers that are currently on private septic systems nearing the end of their useful life. The area has seen rapid residential growth over the recent past and is currently underserved. This second phase will complete service to virtually all subdivisions on the east and west side of US 127 from the Norfolk Southern Railroad North to KY Hwy 1194.

The District has received national recognition from US EPA for their accomplishments with Phase 1 of this project including an Honorable Mention for the 2018 PISCES award. The first phase brought service to over 600 households and commercial customers in Lincoln County. The District is still in process of bringing all of those customers online and should have that completed somewhere near the end of 2019 per their estimated timeline. Connection delays have been experienced due to a shortage of plumbers able to perform the work and poor weather conditions, but the District will continue to push forward.

The District was established on May 10, 2011 by the Lincoln County Fiscal Court. It is governed by five directors who are appointed by the County Judge Executive and approved by the fiscal court. Connection to the public wastewater system is mandatory within four months of the date that a property owner is notified that service is available.

Phase 1 of the project was funded by a Fund A loan (A13-030) from KIA, an RD loan/grant, CDBG, ARC, and local funds (Lincoln County Fiscal Court, City of Houstonville, Lincoln County Industrial Authority). Loans totaled \$4,715,793 with \$3,208,500 in grant and local source funding for a project total of \$7,924,293.

During FY 2018 the District started collecting revenues from customers and inspection fees. As of January 2019, the District has 378 customers fully online with the rest of the Phase 1 project area estimated to be connected by the end of 2019. All eligible connections are being billed regardless of connection status based on provisions in the District's ordinance at this time. Based on financial data obtained from the District, average annual revenues for Phase 1 will total around \$308,000. Treatment expenses to the City of Danville will be around \$50,000 annually in addition to another \$84,000 in additional operating expenses. The District made their first debt service payment in

#### FY 2018 to KIA.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat for growth and volume for Phase 1 and average \$308,000 annually.
- 2) Treatment costs will remain flat per the current contract with Danville at around \$60,000 annually while other operating expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- Phase 2 will be completed in approximately 2022 with anticipated construction costs being \$4,956,500. Debt service for the full construction project will begin the same year.
  - The District will pursue at least \$1.5 million in grant funding for the project.
  - Construction project assumptions are based on debt service being approximately \$130,000 per year with grant funding (CDBG, ARC) and no principal forgiveness associated with the loan. Debt service will increase approximately \$54,000 with no grant funding.
  - At this time, it is estimated that revenues will need to increase approximately \$60,000 above Phase 2 expected revenues to support inflation, additional operating expense, and debt service if no grant funding is secured.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin. If, for any reason, Phase 2 construction does not occur and anticipated Phase 2 revenues are not added, The District will need to increase revenues approximately \$80,000 annually to repay the P&D loan.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan when Phase 2 has become operational.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

There are no replacement reserve requirements for this loan because it is only funding Planning and Design.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,554,200 TO THE CITY OF MOREHEAD, ROWAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Morehead, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$6,554,200 including permanent financing for planning & design loan F18-004 in the amount of \$1,297,200 and

\$5,257,000 for construction, and capitalized interest during the construction period, to the City of Morehead for the Water Treatment Plant Construction project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$13,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$262,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2019.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Morehead Utility Plant Board is requesting the first increment of a Multi-Phased Fund F loan in the amount of \$5,257,000 for the Regional Water Treatment Plant Construction project. Prior KIA Loan F18-004 (\$1,297,200) which funded the planning and design of this project will be rolled into this increment of the loan for a total of \$6,554,200. KIA plans to fund this major project in annual increments from the 2019 funding cycle through 2023. Each year the Utility will undergo a financial analysis and reapply to KIA for authorization of supplemental funding. Project progress and finances will be reviewed with each supplemental application.

Phase One will be completed in the first year (2019) and will include a new raw water intake and raw water transmission line. Phase Two will begin in the second year and be completed in the fourth year (2020-2022); the second phase will include the construction of the new water treatment plant. The final phase of the project will begin in the fourth year and be completed in the fifth year (2023) and will include the construction of a new ground storage tank and a finished water line.

The new raw water intake will replace the existing intake structure located approximately three miles below the Cave Run Lake Dam on the Licking River. It will be a fixed structure on Cave Run Lake and will include variable intake depths. The new Cave Run Lake raw water intake structure will include a new 1,000 kW standby diesel generator. The intake structure will feature security fencing to encompass the site. Approximately 6,500 LF of 24" DI pipe will be installed to connect the intake structure to the water treatment plant. The relocation of the intake is expected to significantly improve raw water quality with a much better turbidity.

The new 12 million gallons per day (MGD) regional water treatment plant (WTP) will replace the existing 8 MGD WTP. The proposed 12 MGD regional WTP will feature new and improved technologies that have been introduced to the treatment process since the last major expansion of the existing plant in 2002. The plant will employ pretreatment flocculation using flash mix and a flocculation basin, a membrane pressure filtration system, and a granular activated carbon (GAC) adsorption system for treatment. The new WTP will include all new treatment and administration facilities on a site near the existing WTP, upgraded SCADA/telemetry for the WTP and distribution system sites along with an increased clearwell capacity of 1,800,000 gallons (currently 1,237,000 gallons). Three 1 MG earthen lagoons will be constructed (for a total capacity of 3 MG) for residual sludge containment of the washwater generated from

membrane backwashes, flux maintenance, enhanced flux maintenance, and clean-inplace operations. The site will be secured through the construction of security fencing to surround the facility.

Approximately 4,500 LF of finished waterline will be extended to a new million gallon ground storage tank. The existing US 60 tank will be decommissioned (621,000 gallons) and the new tank will serve as its replacement. The project will increase the net storage volume of the utility by 379,000 gallons once the increased clearwell capacity is obtained and the US 60 tank is decommissioned. Given the demand for potable water in the area, no issues are anticipated with respect to mixing or turnover for the new tank. To reduce the risk of disinfection by-product (DBP) formation, this issue will be taken into consideration during the design phase and site identification of the storage tank.

The Morehead Utility Plant Board currently serves 5,581 sewer customers, 3,453 water customers, and also provides natural gas to customers in Rowan County. In addition, they sell approximately 434 MG of water to the Bath County Water District and approximately 620 MG to Rowan Water, Inc. annually. Both of these systems will contribute to debt service for this project through wholesale rate increases which will be passed on to customers of those systems. Both Bath County Water District and Rowan Water are PSC regulated.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 34,827 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$36,586 according to WRIS. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. Morehead's water system has historically qualified for KIA's Disadvantaged Community status and subsequent loan terms, however, as ACS data estimates have become more skewed in recent years, the Utility elected to conduct a Modified Weighted Proximity Analysis (MWPA) to better identify the community's MHI. The MWPA demonstrated that the MHI of the water system service area is actually \$35,387. As a result, the Utility will qualify for Disadvantaged Community status and a 0.50% interest rate for the entirety of the multi-phased funded loan.

#### VIII. 2018 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- Additional Subsidization This project was not allocated principal forgiveness in this funding cycle. The project could be eligible for principal forgiveness in other funding cycles.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. Morehead Plant Utility Board is comprised of water, sewer, and gas operations and has limited segregation in their financial statements. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues including water, sewer, and gas have increased 20% from 2016 to 2018 mostly due to rate increases. Water revenues increased 15% during that period, sewer revenues increased 18%, and gas revenues increased 33%. Historically, water has contributed the majority of cash available for debt service to the operation while also making up for deficits in sewer. Rate increases in the beginning of fiscal year (FY) 2019 will bring water and sewer almost equal in terms of cash flow available for debt service and other capital improvements. Total operating expenses increased 20% from 2016 to 2018. Water, sewer, and gas share administrative expenses which saw a 20% increase during this time period while water saw a 6% increase, sewer an 11% increase, and gas a 42% increase in operating expenses.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 51.8 days sales in accounts receivable, and 1.6 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. The debt coverage ratio from 2016 to 2018 was 2.0, 2.0, and 2.3, respectively.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues for both residential and wholesale customers will increase approximately 16% in FY 2019 as a result of a rate increase. Water revenues will continue to increase in the five year forecast according to planned rate increases by the Utility based on their capital improvements plan and updated annually with KIA. Residential water rates are anticipated to increase an average of 16% from FY 2019-2021 while wholesale rates will be adjusted based on the wholesale customer's responsibility for debt service coverage for plant expansion projects. Only the currently known 2019 increase is factored into this analysis.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase approximately 39% due to a rate increase in FY 2019 and remain flat thereafter.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt coverage is 1.4 in 2022 when full principal and interest payments for loan A19-032 and the first four increments of F19-002 go into repayment.
- 5) Debt coverage is 1.2 in 2024 when full principal and interest payments for the final two increments of F19-002 go into repayment.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve for this loan increment will be 5% (\$262,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$13,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 7<sup>th</sup> day of March, 2019.
