#### **PROCEEDINGS**

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

#### I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of February 4, 2021

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the minutes of the February 4, 2021, regular board meeting, Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$12,350,000 TO THE CITY OF MOUNT STERLING, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Mt. Sterling's request for a Fund A Loan, (A21-005), for an amount of \$11,825,000 for the construction portion of the Wastewater Capacity Upgrade Project that will bring the total cost of the project up to \$12,500,000 after a contribution of \$150,000 in local funds. The planning and design phase has been concluded with KIA loan A20-007 previously approved on July 1, 2019. This project will increase the capacity at Hinkston Creek WWTP from 3.0 MGD up to 6.0MGD and will increase the designed organic loadings from estimative 6000lbs up to 10,000lbs/day. The expansion will be constructed on adjacent site. Also, this project will increase capacity on the South Queen Street main sewer that is

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experiencing overflows. Statistical data indicates the facility is reaching its capacity, being at 79% hydraulically and 141 % capacity based on the design criteria concerning organic overloads. In addition, this project will reduce inflow and infiltrations during substantial rainfall events to adequately maintain compliance.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A21-005), for the amount of \$11,825,000 for a total loan of \$12,350,000 to the City of Mt. Sterling with the standard conditions. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-021) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$700,000 TO THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, WEBSTER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Providence's request for a Fund A Planning and Design Loan, A21-021, for an amount up to \$700,000 for the Providence Sanitary Sewer Upgrades project.

The City of Providence has received Notices of Violation from the KY Division of Enforcement concerning the current state of the Providence Wastewater Treatment System and is currently under an Agreed Order. This project will document and prioritize needed repairs and cleaning in the collection system: approximately 42,000 LF of sewer line, 120 manholes and 6 pump stations in order to prevent overflows and reduce excessive inflows & infiltration in the worst identified areas. Also, this project includes planning and designing the WWTP improvements.

The sewer project will be associated with a project of replacing waterlines that are running directly parallel on the sewer lines. The total cost of the two projects will be \$7,230,000.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve Fund A Loan, A21-021, to the City of Providence for an amount up to \$700,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,270,000 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT (MSD), JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the District's request for a Fund A Loan, A21-022, in an amount of \$8,270,000 for the Rosa Terrace, Sanders, Wathen and Sonne Pump Station project. This project will eliminate the Rosa Terrace and Sonne Avenue pump stations and replace the Wathen Lane and Sanders Lane pump stations. These are some of the most problematic pump stations in Jefferson County and

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all four are in low to moderate income areas. All of the pump stations are in the Dixie Highway area of Louisville adjacent to or just outside this significant commercial corridor.

The Rosa Terrace pump station will be eliminated with nearly 1,500 linear feet of eight-inch gravity sewer. Construction will occur in a residential/commercial area and will involve a railroad crossing. Some of the proposed sewer will be relatively deep which may require some more specialized construction techniques such as stacked trench-boxes or shoring, larger excavation equipment, and/or trench-less installation methods (jack-and-bore, micro-tunneling, etc.). Overall, the average depth of the sewer is approximately 17-feet.

Over 2,700 linear feet of eight-inch gravity sewer will be used to eliminate the Sonne Avenue Pump Station. In addition to having to cross a state road (Dixie Highway - 31W), portions of the sewer will be somewhat deep and in a residential area. Fortunately, there are numerous detour options and the impact to residents will be relatively minor.

To eliminate the Wathen Lane pump station rehabilitation project consists of a full replacement of the existing pump station. The existing pump station will be replaced with a new, modern station and will utilize the existing 6" force main. As part of the layout of the proposed station, a dedicated entrance drive and concrete maintenance pad will be constructed to provide MSD staff with a safe and secure area to service the pump station in the future.

The Sanders Lane pump station rehabilitation project consists of the replacement of approximately 450 linear feet of existing 4" force main from the existing pump station. The new force main will follow the same general alignment of the existing. In addition to the force main replacement, there will be additional site improvements to the area immediately adjacent to the existing pump station. A dedicated entrance drive and concrete maintenance pad will be constructed to provide MSD staff with a safe and secure area to service the pump station in the future. This new concrete pad will also house a new emergency backup generator and the upgraded electrical components.

Currently MSD serves over 220,000 residential and over 21,000 commercial and industrial customers.

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A21-022), in an amount up to \$8,270,000 for the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-031) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000 TO THE CITY OF FRANKFORT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Frankfort's request for a Fund A loan (A21-031) for an amount up to \$1,500,000 for the Miami Trails Sanitary Sewer project. This project involves the decommissioning and removal of the Miami Trails

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Pump Station (MTPS), which is an aging pump station at the end of its useful life. This station is in the Indian Hills Neighborhood. The flow from the existing MTPS will be conveyed to the existing Chinook Pump Station (CPS) by approximately 3,400 LF of new 12" gravity sewer. Currently the flow is pumped from MPTS to CPS, causing redundant pumping of flow, energy, and O&M cost. This project will reduce the life cycle costs of conveying the flow currently coming to MTPS. All homes within the new gravity sewer will be connected and new cleanouts will be installed.

The City of Frankfort serves approximately 14,373 customers.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A21-031) in an amount up to \$1,500,000 to the City of Frankfort with the standard conditions. Mr. Kurt Stafford seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-013) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,491,916 TO THE MCKINNEY WATER DISTRICT, LINCOLN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the McKinney Water District's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-013, for an amount up to \$2,491,916. This project combines two projects WX21137017 and WX21137052. The McKinney Water District is under an Agreed Order by the Division of Water for disinfection byproduct limits and the City of Stanford is having issues providing water to the McKinney Water District. This project is for the construction of a new water tank and replacing and enlarging at least a portion of the main asbestos cement water supply line. Replacing the asbestos line will eliminate the biofilm layer built up by fiber inside the lines. The system currently has two 100,000 gal standpipes that are over 50 years old. Only a portion of the water is usable in the tanks due to pressure problems in the system. This project will allow McKinney Water District to connect to the City of Danville system.

The McKinney Water District serves 4,274 customers and is regulated by the PSC.

Mr. Russ Rose asked about the discrepancy with the numbers in the credit analysis. Mr. Marty Spears with AGE Engineering Services noted the 1,800 listed is the correct number of customers. Ms. Sandy Williams stated the 4,274 is the population.

Mr. Kurt Stafford asked about the \$500,000 funding from ARC. It was noted by Commissioner Keene that that funding would be from the Appalachian Regional Commission coming through the Department of Local Government in the next week or so.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F21-013) in an amount up to \$2,491,916 to the McKinney Water District with the standard conditions and the following special conditions: 1) The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,491,916 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through

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no less than 2025; 2) By March 31, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the McKinney Water District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$202,000, which equates approximately to rates increased by 22% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023; 3) Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$696,500 TO THE CITY OF SCOTTSVILLE, ALLEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Scottsville's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-026 for an amount up to \$696,500, for the AMR and Smart Water Meter Replacement project.

This project is to replace all existing traditional water meters (approx. 2,400 meters) with new, more accurate AMR or AMI/smart meter radio-read type water meters to help reduce non-revenue water. Additionally, labor efficiencies will be enhanced with the installation of electronic endpoints at each meter location. This will provide a safer manner for meter reading and more timely collection of customer usage. Also, the project will include the assessment and mitigation of potential water quality issues throughout the distribution system with the installation of check valves and backflow prevention devices on susceptible customer connections.

Currently the City of Scottsville serves 2,074 residential and over 300 industrial and commercial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund F Loan, F21-026, to the City of Scottsville for an amount up to \$696,500 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

7. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

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This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Deputy Executive Director Sandy Williams addressed the group and mentioned that KIA staff will be participating in an EPA Workgroup on April 7-8, 2021. This is a great opportunity to catch up with EPA officials as well as other states' representatives and get any updates on the State Revolving Fund programs.

The Project Rankings are on schedule to be completed by the deadline.

The Division of Water has been working on the Drinking Water Needs Survey and is progressing as planned. She said if anyone hears of. a Utility that received the survey, please encourage them to complete and return. Mr. Becker noted DOW sent the survey out yesterday via email.

Ms. Williams stated at the last Board meeting there was a question regarding all the loan increases that KIA has recently been presenting. While all projects are slightly different, it is her understanding that projects are being hit with increases to both materials costs and labor costs. KIA was notified that PVC pipe costs have risen more than 25% over the past year and could continue to rise. Recent adverse weather conditions have significantly impacted polymer supply lines and production facilities resulting in a supply chain disruption and potentially higher costs. It is also her understanding that costs for concrete and stone have risen 3% to 5%. We are also hearing that contractors are experiencing an unprecedented labor shortage exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic. Both Ms. Williams and Mr. Becker will be attending the ACEC quarterly meeting later this month and Mr. Becker plans to raise this issue with members of the group. If anything new is discussed, Ms. Williams will bring the information back to the Board.

Mr. Russ Rose asked Director Williams if KIA was on target to meet the goal of completing the project list for this year. Ms. Williams noted that was the plan, all the projects have been assigned to the financial analysts for review and they are progressing through the list, unless something unforeseen happens that is out of our control with project

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slowdowns, or environmental surveys, etc. KIA plans to get all the projects reviewed and presented.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A15-026) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,788,138 TO THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT (LFUCG), FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$15,788,138 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for the West Hickman WWTP Wet Weather Storage Tanks Phase 2 Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$209,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$2,090,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2021.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2013-2018, the Utility's service area population was 311,529 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$48,779. The median household income for the Commonwealth was \$42,610. The project qualifies for a 1.75% interest rate as it is a component of the Remedial Measures Plan submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to comply with the Consent Decree.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Revenues increased 21.3% from \$63.7 million in 2018 to \$77.2 million in 2020 due to previously approved rate increases. Operating expenses increased 20.9% from \$37.1 million to \$44.9 million during the same period primarily due to administrative expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 3.3, 3.1 and 2.3 respectively for 2018, 2019, and 2020.

The LFUCG has adopted since 2014 a new Sewer Indenture that outlines parity provisions for the issuance of additional bonds for the acquisition or construction of sewer system facilities. The Net Revenues of the System, as defined in the bond ordinance, must provide coverage of 120% of Maximum Annual Debt Service.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.1 and a debt to equity ratio of 0.9, 18.7 days sales in account receivables, and 9.1 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase approximately 2% annually based on the Consumer Price Index.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in FY 2024 when full-year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 2.5% (\$2,090,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$209,000 yearly) each December 1 for 10 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2018-2020 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 and 2020 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Revenues have increased 5.4% from \$9.14 million in 2018 to \$9.63 million in 2020 mostly due to rate increases. Expenses have increased 4.7% from \$4.45 million in 2018 to \$4.66 million in 2020. Debt coverage was 3.0, 2.9 and 2.3 in 2018, 2019 and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.5, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 52.8 days sales in accounts receivable, and 15.5 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat throughout the forecast. The JSA Board has the ability to raise rates according to the CPI-U but does not do so automatically therefore this assumption was not made in the forecast.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% based on inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2023 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The Agency currently has designated reserves of \$3,000,000. The reserves are specifically for high dollar capital equipment purchases, for emergencies, or for rate stabilization in the event of a loss of a substantial revenue stream. No additional reserves will be required.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,558,120 TO THE CITY OF FLEMING NEON, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Fleming Neon, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$1,558,120 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Fleming Neon for the Fleming-Neon Sewer Rehabilitation project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$779,060 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$779,060 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$78,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of April, 2021.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The City of Fleming Neon ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,558,120 for the Fleming Neon Sewer Rehabilitation project. This project will create a working map of the sewer system suitable for a flow study and for use during construction. Flow monitoring at 3 to 5 key locations in the sewer system to determine where Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) is excessive will be conducted. This project will televise and smoke test the sewers which are found to have excessive I/I and repair sewer sections and manholes. The city will be assessing presently mapped areas which will focus on vitrified clay pipe that is known to be leaking.

The existing sewer system experiences high flows during and after rainfall events that wash out the wastewater treatment plant making it very difficult to meet the KPDES permit. During rainfall-induced high flow periods the main pump station often runs continuously. This pump station affects two other pump stations which pump into the same force main and cannot overcome the pressure from the mains pump station and must be turned off. If the pumps in the other stations are allowed to run, the motors sometimes burn up because there is no flow through the pumps for an extended period.

Currently the City of Fleming Neon serves 755 residential and 15 commercial customers.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Fleming Neon ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,558,120 for the Fleming Neon Sewer Rehabilitation project. This project will create a working map of the sewer system suitable for a flow study and for use during construction. Flow monitoring at 3 to 5 key locations in the sewer system to determine where Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) is excessive will be conducted. This project will televise and smoke test the sewers which are found to have excessive I/I and repair sewer sections and manholes. The city will be assessing presently mapped areas which will focus on vitrified clay pipe that is known to be leaking.

The existing sewer system experiences high flows during and after rainfall events that wash out the wastewater treatment plant making it very difficult to meet the KPDES permit. During rainfall-induced high flow periods the main pump station often runs continuously. This pump station affects two other pump stations which pump into the same force main and cannot overcome the pressure from the mains pump station and must be turned off. If the pumps in the other stations are allowed to run, the motors sometimes burn up because there is no flow through the pumps for an extended period.

Currently the City of Fleming Neon serves 755 residential and 15 commercial customers.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 2,696 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$29,440. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 0.25% interest rate.

#### VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$779,060 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 32.1% from \$642 thousand in 2017 to \$848 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 51.5% from \$473 thousand to \$717 during the same period primarily due to cost increases in materials, supplies and service charges. The debt coverage ratio was 2.2, 0.3, and 1.4 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.8, a debt to equity ratio of 0.2, 29.1 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Revenues for both water and sewer will increase as shown below as already approved in ordinance by the city:

- 2) Expenses will rise 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Both city loans A21-026 and F21-004 are factored into the debt service coverage.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments

begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$78,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$3,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-034) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$682,000 TO THE CITY OF RUSSELL SPRINGS, RUSSELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Russell Springs, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$682,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Russell Springs for the KY 80 Gravity Sewer Rehab project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$341,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$341,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,700 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$34,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2021.

The City of Russell Springs plans to rehabilitate existing sanitary sewer lines to reduce the infiltration and inflow in portions of the sewer system along KY 80, Butler Drive and Roy Drive, including manhole rehabs, point repairs, sewer line repairs and reconnection of lateral lines. Slip line approximately 5,900 LF of 8" VCP and reconnect 50 existing customers.

Currently the City of Russell Springs serves over 1,300 residential and 220 commercial customers.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 4,218 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$37,880. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 0.25% interest rate.

#### VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$341,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Combined water, sewer and sanitation revenues increased 15.6% from \$2.95 million in 2017 to \$3.41 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 12.8% from \$1.93 million to \$2.18 million during the same period primarily due to a 13.9% increase in sanitation expenses. Since sanitation is factored into the water and sewer fund the large increase in sanitation expenses has been a major contributor to overall operating expense increases from 2017 to 2019. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 1.8, and 1.9 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.7, 61.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues for sewer and water are set to increase according to city ordinance based upon the consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical workers (CPI-W). The annual increase will be at least 2% and not to exceed 6%. The projection years reflect 2% annual rate increases.
- 2) Expenses are to increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.4 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$34,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$1,700 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,191,114 TO THE CITY OF FLEMING NEON, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Fleming Neon, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,191,114 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Fleming Neon for the Fleming-Neon Waterline Improvement Project Phase 1. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$595,557 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$595,557 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$60,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2021.

Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$595,557 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Revenues increased 32.1% from \$642 thousand in 2017 to \$848 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 51.5% from \$473 thousand to \$717 during the same period primarily due to cost increases in materials, supplies and service charges. The debt coverage ratio was 2.2, 0.3, and 1.4 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.8, a debt to equity ratio of 0.2, 29.1 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 0.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

1) Revenues for both water and sewer will increase as shown below as already approved in ordinance by the city:

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$60,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$3,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,487,495 TO THE LETCHER COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Letcher County Water and Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,487,495 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Letcher County Water and Sewer District for the Regional Interconnect & Distribution Lines Cumberland

River Phase 4 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,487,495 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$6,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$124,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2021.

#### XII. RECOMMENDATIONS

KIA staff recommends approval of the loan with the standard conditions and the following special conditions.

- 1. The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,487,495 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than 2025.
- 2. By April 30, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the Letcher County Water and Sewer District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$73,391, which equates approximately to rates increased by 5% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023.
- 3. Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement.

## XII. RECOMMENDATIONS

KIA staff recommends approval of the loan with the standard conditions and the following special conditions.

- 1. The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$4 million loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than 2025.
- 2. By April 30, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the Letcher County Water and Sewer District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$73,391, which equates approximately to rates increased by 5% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2022.

The Louisville Water Company is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$537,850 for the Roe Hill Road Area Water Main Extension and Pump Station project.

This project will install 12,040 feet of 4-inch water main and a booster pump station to provide potable water to 37 unserved residences on Roe Hill Road, Kerr Lane, P'Poole Lane and Perkins Court in Bullitt County, Kentucky for an estimated project cost of \$1,075,700.

The project will construct a booster pump station at the bottom of Roe Hill Road, providing the capability to pump water up the hill to the residences. The booster pump station will be a 100 gallons per minute (GPM) unit and will utilize Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) motor control systems.

## I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Louisville Water Company is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$537,850 for the Roe Hill Road Area Water Main Extension and Pump Station project.

This project will install 12,040 feet of 4-inch water main and a booster pump station to provide potable water to 37 unserved residences on Roe Hill Road, Kerr Lane, P'Poole Lane and Perkins Court in Bullitt County, Kentucky for an estimated project cost of \$1,075,700.

The project will construct a booster pump station at the bottom of Roe Hill Road, providing the capability to pump water up the hill to the residences. The booster pump station will be a 100 gallons per minute (GPM) unit and will utilize Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) motor control systems.

The project will then install a water main along Roe Hill Road beginning 1,200 feet northwest of Highway 1526 to the end of Roe Hill Road in Bullitt County, Kentucky and to residents along Kerr Lane, P'Poole Lane and Perkins Court, which all branch off of Roe Hill Road. There will be 2,500 linear feet of 4-inch ductile iron water main laid along Roe Hill Road from the existing dead end water line to an elevation of 795 feet and then 5,370 linear feet of PVC 4-inch water main will be laid from the 795 elevation point to the end of Roe Hill Road. ## VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's county population was 807,578 and a service area of 275,788 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of the Roe Hill Road area is \$35,000. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 20-year loan term at a 0.25% interest rate.

## VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

## IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2017 through December 31, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 8.6% from \$184.6 million in 2017 to \$200.4 million in 2019 while operating expenses increased 11.9% from \$93.3 million to \$104.4 million during the same period primarily due to operating and maintenance expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 3.2, 3.2, and 3.4 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.5, a debt to equity ratio of 0.5, 22.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues are projected flat during the projected years.
- 2) The pending CDBG grant funding will provide the other 50% of the project cost of \$537,850.
- 3) Expenses are expected to increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 3.1 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$26,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$1,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-052) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$80,000 TO THE CITY OF AUGUSTA, BRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS,** the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Augusta, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$80,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Augusta for the Augusta Lagoon Cleaning project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by

further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.0%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$4,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, 2021.

Due to accumulated solids, the lagoons have become very shallow and are not functioning at a required level. The system has findings on their Sanitary Survey and has an NOV due to the lagoons. The Water Treatment Plant provides water to the City of Augusta and Bracken County Water District. Bracken County Water District sells water to the City of Brooksville and East Pendleton Water District. Due to the scope of a lagoon cleanup, an engineer is not needed for this project.

The City of Augusta serves 575 customers.

## VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Revenues are from combined water, sewer, and gas operations. Revenues remained steady from \$1,143,644 in 2018 to \$1,148,013 in 2020. Operating expenses decreased 2.1% from \$941,479 in 2018 to \$922,103 in 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.6, a debt to equity ratio of 0.8, 29.7 days sales in accounts receivable, and 10.7 months operating expense in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain constant with gas revenues pledged for debt repayment of this loan.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

## REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$4,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 1st day of April, 2021.
