#### **PROCEEDINGS**

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

#### I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of March 4, 2021

Mr. Paul Miller moved to approve the minutes of the March 4, 2021, regular board meeting. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### **B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS**

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A15-026) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$15,788,138 TO THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT (LFUCG), FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's request for a Fund A Loan increase, (A15-026), for an increase of \$15,788,138 as part of Phase 2 of the West Hickman WWTP Wet Weather Storage Tanks. This project was initially approved on December 4, 2014 and had one increase on April 9, 2018 that brought the total of Phase 1 to \$67,944,188.

With this Phase 2 increase it will bring the total loan amount to \$83,732,326. This project is to design and construct Phase 2 of the Consent Decree required wastewater storage facility located at West Hickman WWTP in Jessamine County.

Phase 1 included a 22 million gallon (MG) above ground storage tank along the necessary pumping facilities, piping and site work needed to place Phase 1 into service and integrate Phase 2 into future service.

Phase 2 will consist of a second 18 MG above ground storage tank along with infrastructure needed to operate Phase 1 and 2 in series. As recently as calendar year 2019, 13 sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) where documented / reported on the trunk sewer immediately upstream from the Phase 1 tank. Completion of Phase 2 will further mitigate wet weather SSOs on this trunk sewer while at the same time providing sewer service to unserved customers within Fayette / northern Jessamine counties.

In parts of the existing sanitary sewer it lacks sufficient capacity to meet LFUCG's EPA

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mandated Capacity Assurance Program. This \$15.8 M project is listed in LFUCG's approved Remedial Measures Plan submitted to USEPA on October 12, 2011 with capital construction schedule with a full compliance completion date of 12/31/2023.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan increase, (A15-026), for the amount of \$15.788,138 for a total loan of \$83,732,326 to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government with the standard conditions. Mr. Paul Miller seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-032) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,216,410 TO THE PADUCAH-McCracken Joint Sewer Agency, McCracken County, Kentucky

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Paducah-McCracken Joint Sewer Agency's request for a Fund A loan increase, (A20-032), for an amount up to \$2,046,410, for the Fund A LTCP Project #3 — Outfall 003 Fine Screening Phase 1 project due to bids coming in higher than budgeted. This will bring the total loan amount for A20-032 to \$7,216,410. The project work and scope remain the same.

Project is phase one of a multi-phase project related to Paducah's Long Term Control Plan and one of the combined sewer outfalls (Outfall 003) here at Paducah. During design of this first phase, all efforts were made to achieve the lowest overall project cost for all phases. Decisions were made to size the wet well for this project for future phases and purchase the pumps for future phases now, which will reduce future costs. In addition, the combination of the project's unique design, location in a Brownfield, and location in Paducah where no local contractors were able to bid on the project also made the project difficult to estimate.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve Fund A Loan increase, A20-032, to the Paducah-McCracken Joint Sewer Agency for an increase of \$2,046,410, for a total loan amount up to \$7,216,410 with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,558,120 TO THE CITY OF FLEMING NEON, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Fleming-Neon's s request for a Fund A Loan, A21-026, in an amount of \$1,558,120 for the Fleming Neon Sewer Rehabilitation project. This project will create a working map of the sewer system suitable for a flow study and for use during construction. Flow monitoring at 3 to 5 key locations in the sewer system to determine where Inflow and Infiltration (I/I) is excessive will be conducted. This project will televise and smoke test the sewers which are found to have excessive I/I and repair sewer sections and manholes. The city will be assessing presently mapped areas which will focus on vitrified clay pipe that is known to be leaking.

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The existing sewer system experiences high flows during and after rainfall events that wash out the wastewater treatment plant making it very difficult to meet the KPDES permit. During rainfall-induced high flow periods the main pump station often runs continuously. This pump station affects two other pump stations which pump into the same force main and cannot overcome the pressure from the mains pump station and must be turned off. If the pumps in the other stations are allowed to run, the motors sometimes burn up because there is no flow through the pumps for an extended period.

Currently the City of Fleming Neon serves 755 residential and 15 commercial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A21-026), in an amount up to \$1,558,120 for the City of Fleming-Neon with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-034) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$682,000 TO THE CITY OF RUSSELL SPRINGS, RUSSELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Russell Springs's request for a Fund A loan (A21-034) for an amount up to \$682,000 for the KY 80 Gravity Sewer Rehab project. The City of Russell Springs plans to rehabilitate existing sanitary sewer lines to reduce the infiltration and inflow in portions of the sewer system along KY 80, Butler Drive and Roy Drive, including manhole rehabs, point repairs, sewer line repairs and reconnection of lateral lines. Slip line approximately 5,900 LF of 8" VCP and reconnect 50 existing customers.

Currently the City of Russell Springs serves over 1,300 residential and 220 commercial customers.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A21-034) in an amount up to \$682,000 to the City of Russell Springs with the standard conditions. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,191,114 TO THE CITY OF FLEMING NEON, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Fleming-Neon's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-004 for an amount up to \$1,191,114 for the Fleming-Neon Waterline Improvement Project Phase 1. In order to combat high water loss due to aging water lines, the City of Fleming-Neon is planning to replace and modernize their water system. When the original system was created, GIS mapping was not available and data and information as to locations, line size and material have been lost over the years, making it almost impossible to detect or prevent breaks.

Phase 1 will replace approximately 10,200 feet of 8" PVC and 4,400 feet of PVC waterlines from the water treatment plant on Shea Fork to the Neon city limits on Hwy 343 and Northeast along

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Hwy 343 to its intersection with Chopping Branch in the McRoberts area and any side roads. The project will address lines from the water treatment plant along Shea Fork to its end. The McRoberts area has been deemed the worst in the system. This phase will enhance the systems conversion to radio read meters by adding 149 new meters and provide flow-leak detectors in the system. Creek crossings will be directionally drilled to prevent biological disturbance. Trenchless/low-impact technology will be used when applicable.

The City of Fleming- Neon currently serves over 1,000 residential customers in Letcher County.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund F Loan, (F21-004) in an amount up to \$1,192,114 to the City of Fleming-Neon with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,487,495 TO THE LETCHER COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Letcher County Water and Sewer Water District's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-010, for an amount up to \$2,487,495 for the Regional Interconnect & Distribution Lines Cumberland River Phase 4 project. The proposed project will provide a first time source of potable water for approximately 200 households in Letcher County through the establishment of a regional interconnect with the City of Cumberland and the construction of distribution lines along the KY HWY 119 corridor in Letcher County. Residents of Collier's Creek and Lewis Branch will be served as part of this project. The project will also lay the foundation from which distribution can be expanded through the remainder of the Cumberland River area in subsequent Phases I, II and III. The project will be installed primarily on state and county rights of way and will utilize trenchless technology to accomplish any and all stream crossings.

The distribution lines portion of the project has been reviewed and approved by KYDOW. Construction will include 13,753 LF of 6" PVC, 10,385 LF of 4" PVC, and 16,157 LF of 3" PVC for a total of 40,295 LF of new waterline extension. The project will also construct a 100,000-gallon storage tank, a 250 GPM Pump Station, six flushing hydrants, six blow off valves, sixteen 6" Gate Valve, six 4" Gate Valves, four 3" Gate Valves, three air release valves, one pressure Stabilizing valve, and a master meter. The project does include telemetry.

Currently Letcher County Water and Sewer serves 2,989 residential and 10 commercial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund F Loan, F21-010, to the Letcher County Water and Sewer Ms. District for an amount up to \$2,487,495 with the standard conditions and the following special conditions: 1. The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,487,495 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than (2025); 2. By April 30, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the Letcher County Water and Sewer District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff

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review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$73,391, which equates approximately to rates increased by 5% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023; 3. Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-033) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE LETCHER COUNTY WATER AND SEWER DISTRICT, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Letcher County Water and Sewer District's request for a Fund F loan, F21-033, for an amount up to \$4,000,000 for the Letcher County WTP project. This project will construct a 1,000,000 GPD water treatment plant at the Letcher and Perry County line on Highway 7. The project will include construction of the plant, the intake with 387 LF of 8" DI to the intake and approximately 295 LF of 8" DI to tie into the existing LCWSD system. The plant will be owned and operated by the LCWSD.

The WTP will include VFD raw water and high service pumps, LED lighting (interior/exterior), Energy Star rate appliances/fixtures, stand-by diesel generators, Low E windows, Reflective Membrane Roof, Raw water intake and screen with permanganate feed and forced air backwash, Chemical feed, Flocculation basins, Settling Basins, Filtration Basins, Finish water chemical feed, Clear well, Side storage, Sedimentation / backwash basin, Sludge Drying bed/and or sludge hopper, and Primary Disinfectant will be chlorine liquid.

Currently the Letcher County Water District serves 2,989 residential and 10 commercial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell abstained from voting. Mr. Bobby Aldridge moved to approve the Fund F Loan, F21-033, to the Letcher County Water and Sewer District for an amount up to \$4,000,000 with the standard conditions and the following special conditions: District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$4,000,000 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than (2025); 2. By April 30, 2021, the District will need a resolution from the Letcher County Water and Sewer District Board, demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increase by \$73,391, which equates approximately to rates increased by 5% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023; 3. Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

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8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-040) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$537,850 TO THE LOUISVILLE WATER COMPANY, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Louisville Water Company's request for a Fund F loan, F21-040, for an amount up to \$537,850 for the Roe Hill Road Area Water Main Extension and Pump Station project.

This project will install 12,040 feet of 4-inch water main and a booster pump station to provide potable water to 37 unserved residences on Roe Hill Road, Kerr Lane, P'Poole Lane and Perkins Court in Bullitt County, Kentucky for an estimated project cost of \$1,075,700.

The project will construct a booster pump station at the bottom of Roe Hill Road, providing the capability to pump water up the hill to the residences. The booster pump station will be a 100 gallons per minute (GPM) unit and will utilize Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) motor control systems.

The project will then install a water main along Roe Hill Road beginning 1,200 feet northwest of Highway 1526 to the end of Roe Hill Road in Bullitt County, Kentucky and to residents along Kerr Lane, P'Poole Lane and Perkins Court, which all branch off of Roe Hill Road. There will be 2,500 linear feet of 4-inch ductile iron water main laid along Roe Hill Road from the existing dead end water line to an elevation of 795 feet and then 5,370 linear feet of PVC 4-inch water main will be laid from the 795 elevation point to the end of Roe Hill Road. Once on top of the knob that Roe Hill Road traverses, the project will install 2,100 linear feet of 4-inch PVC water main along Kerr Lane from Roe Hill Road to the end of Kerr Lane. There will be 1,420 linear feet of 4-inch PVC water main installed along P'Poole Lane starting at the intersection of Roe Hill Road to the end of P'Poole Lane and then 650 linear feet of 4-inch PVC water main will be installed along Perkins Court starting at the intersection of Roe Hill Road and ending at the end of Perkins Court.

Currently the Louisville Water Company serves over 250,000 residential and over 23,500 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Russ Rose asked if the 37 customers would be contributing to the construction costs. Mr. Fisher said there is a portion of the tapping fees that Louisville Water will be providing over a period of time to help with the costs. Customers will be paying a bit more due to the higher elevation which will require them to get a booster station put in. Ms. Linda Bridwell noted that this area of Bullitt County was economically challenged and they have worked very hard to get this project done and Louisville Water Company was doing everything possible to help these residents.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund F loan, F21-040, in an amount up to \$537,850 to the Louisville Water Company with the standard conditions. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

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9. Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Augusta's request for a Fund F loan, F21-052, for an amount up to \$80,000 for the Augusta Lagoon Cleaning project. This project will involve cleaning out the two lagoons the system has. Due to accumulated solids, the lagoons have become very shallow and are not functioning at a required level. The system has findings on their Sanitary Survey and has an NOV due to the lagoons. The Water Treatment Plant provides water to the City of Augusta and Bracken County Water District. Bracken County Water District sells water to the City of Brooksville and East Pendleton Water District. Due to the scope of a lagoon cleanup, an engineer is not needed for this project.

The City of Augusta serves 575 customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund F loan, F21-052, in an amount up to \$80,000 to the City of Augusta with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Paul Miller seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

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#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Deputy Executive Director Sandy Williams addressed the group and noted that Governor Beshear had issued a press release discussing the details of a bipartisan bill, applauding lawmakers for providing a bill that will provide broadband, clean drinking water and to provide improved school infrastructure to boost Kentucky's economy. Part of that funding will be processed through KIA. We are working quickly to develop a plan to ensure our part of the funding gets out to the local communities as quickly as possible after the legislation has been put in to place, which will be 90 days upon adjournment, basically around the beginning of the fiscal year, around July 1<sup>st</sup>.

In the legislation, there is \$250 million for water and sewer projects. \$150 million of those funds will be based on county populations, \$50 million will be available to provide drinking water to unserved, rural customers or consent decree utilities. The remaining \$49.9 million will be available to provide supplemental grants to projects to communities that have underfunded projects. Staff is working on getting administrative regulations passed as quickly as possible to outline the process and ensure these federal dollars will be used per the requirements given before we can let utilities know how to apply.

The next piece of the legislation, will be \$300 million in broadband grants, while slightly different, but not unheard of with KIA funding. It will be used for broadband deployment for unserved or underserved areas with a 50% required match.

Mr. Rose asked if the \$250 million would be loans or grants and what would the criteria be to get funding. Ms. Williams noted that details are very preliminary now, but these would be grants. We are unsure how the approval process will be done.

Ms. Bridwell asked if there would be any issues in putting together a timeline for getting these grants processed. Ms. Williams noted that KIA had handled grant from since 2000-2001 and KIA has received line item grant funds through three different sessions of the General Assembly, these will be slightly different, but the process will be similar to those in the past. Ms. Bridwell asked if the ADDs Water Management Council and the AWWA will be asked to provide input on the prioritization of the process and how that will work. Ms. Williams noted prioritization was one of the requirements put in the Bill and the process to determine prioritization has not been determined yet.

Mr. Amato asked if the \$150 million was for water and sewer or one or the other. Ms. Williams noted she believes it is for both water and sewer projects.

Mayor Stapleton asked if the broadband money would be allowed for P3 contracts or agreements matching with private funding. Ms. Williams said that she does not have an answer at this time.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-003) INCREMENT FUNDING FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$19,410,364 TO THE CITY OF MARION, CRITTENDEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A18-003 to the City of Marion on November 7, 2019, in the amount of \$9,593,790 and the City of Marion has requested an increment funding of \$9,816,574; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Marion, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such

statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$19,410,364 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the New Wastewater Treatment Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,300,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,8110,364 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$48,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$970,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 5. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2021.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

This is the final of the four funding cycles that KIA has established with the City of Marion to provide incremental fundings through 2021 for the New Wastewater Treatment Plant project. The City obtained a KIA planning and design loan in the amount of \$587,200 in 2016 to complete the Facility Plan and design on the collection system and the wastewater treatment plant. The City was subsequently approved of 2 incremental fundings in 2018 and 2020 totaling \$9 million for the construction portion. This request and the remaining funds from the prior increments will fund the construction of the new wastewater treatment plant.

This phase will construct a new 1.5 million gallon per day wastewater treatment plant adjacent to the current plant, which consists of influent pumping, screening, aeration, clarification, disinfection, return activated sludge/waste activated sludge pumping, solids processing, administration building, and maintenance garage. The existing WWTP will be decommissioned.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Marion is requesting an additional \$9,816,574 from the 2021 funding cycle to fund the New Wastewater Treatment Plant project for the construction of a 1.5 million-gallon per day (MGD) Oxidation Ditch (OD) wastewater treatment plant and collection system rehabilitation. This will bring the total funding to \$19,410,364. The new treatment facility will be located approximately half a mile from the existing treatment plant and will also include a new administration building and maintenance garage. The existing 0.66 MGD treatment facility was constructed in the 1970s and can no longer handle wet weather flows during moderate to heavy rains. The City considered alternatives for reducing flow and optimizing treatment as part of the Facility Plan, under review by the KY Division of Water, and has selected this project as the best alternative. The collection system work consists of the rehabilitation of approximately 43,336 linear feet of existing gravity sewer to reduce inflow and infiltration.

The City was under an Agreed Order with the KY Division of Water, mandating the completion of a Facility Plan and proper operation and maintenance of the wastewater treatment facilities and collection system. This project will fully satisfy the requirements of the Agreed Order.

KIA has established a multi-year funding strategy with the City to provide incremental funding through FY2021. The City obtained a KIA planning and design loan of \$587,200 in FY2016 to complete the Facility Plan and subsequent design on the collection system and the treatment plant. The approval of the planning and design loan allowed the City to receive priority funding for three increases to fund the construction portion of the collection system and the wastewater treatment plant. The loan outlay is as below:

The City passed an ordinance in June, 2016 applying a flat-rate environmental assessment fee to all water and sewer customers to raise funds for capital projects. The rate has been reassessed and adjusted in 2018, 2019 and 2021. The latest rate increases approved in March, 2021 will take effect in July 2021 and July 2022.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2017, the Utility's service area population was 3,175 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$29,068. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$46,535. This project qualifies for a 0.50% interest rate because its MHI is below 80% of the Commonwealth.

#### VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

Additional Subsidization – This loan qualifies for a one-time subsidization in the amount of \$1.3 million for the entire project.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements combining both water and sewer operations for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The pension and OPEB liabilities and related deferred inflows and outflows were reported under governmental activities. Percentage references in the History section below were based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Combined water and sewer revenues went up 14.5% from \$1.28 million in 2018 to \$1.47 million in 2020 due to previously approved environment assessment fees collected from all water and sewer customers. Operating expenses increased 7.3% from \$0.96 million in 2018 to \$1.03 million in 2020 as a result of higher contractual services and material & supplies costs. The debt coverage ratio was 2.2, 2.7, and 2.7 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflected a current ratio of 2.9, debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 78.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 7.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash. The accounts receivable turnaround time was noticeably higher in 2020 as compared with 45 days in 2018 due to financial impact from COVID on the customers.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) The City will raise additional \$500,000 revenues by FY 2024 from increases of the Environment Assessment Fees.
- 2) The City will recover \$16,500 delinquent payments and reduce insurance expenses by \$15,000 from changing distribution base.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2024 when full year principal and interest repayments begin. The ratio is calculated by applying the approved 52% increase on the Environmental Assessment Fee effective July 1, 2021 and another 34% increase effective July 1, 2022.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$970,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$48,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

#### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 749 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$35,966. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 2.50% interest rate.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses for 2018 and 2019. The City of Frenchburg was not required to have an audit for 2020 so those items were not calculated for 2020. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Operating revenues increased 16.5% from \$1.16 million in 2018 to \$1.36 million in 2020 while operating expenses decreased 5.5% from \$659,000 million to \$623,000 during the same period. The debt coverage ratios from 2018 to 2020 were 0.2, 0.9, and 2.4, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.3, a debt to equity ratio of 0.5, 50.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain steady until 2024 when the City may need to implement a total 5% rate increase on water and sewer. The City has already signed a commitment to increase the rates up to 5% annually for up to 5 consecutive years to meet funding requirements for this total project. This increase may need to occur sooner depending on when construction begins.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2024 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 34,827 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$36,586 according to WRIS. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. Morehead's water system has historically qualified for KIA's Disadvantaged Community status and subsequent loan terms, however, as ACS data estimates have become more skewed in recent years, the Utility elected to conduct a Modified Weighted Proximity Analysis (MWPA) to better identify the community's MHI. The MWPA demonstrated that the MHI of the water system service area is actually \$35,387. As a result, the Utility will qualify for Disadvantaged Community status and a 0.50% interest rate for the entirety of the multi-phased funded loan.

#### **VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES**

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total revenues including water, sewer, and gas have increased 33.3% from 2017 to 2019 mostly due to rate increases. Water revenues increased 21.6% during that period, sewer revenues increased 61.2%, and gas revenues increased 16%. Historically, water has contributed the majority of cash available for debt service to the operation while also making up for deficits in sewer. Rate increases in the beginning of fiscal year (FY) 2019 will bring water and sewer almost equal in terms of cash flow available for debt service and other capital improvements. Total operating expenses increased 15.6% from 2017 to 2019. Water, sewer, and gas share administrative expenses which saw a 27.6% increase during this time period while water saw a 11.9% increase, sewer had a 14.4% increase, and gas a 21% increase in operating expenses.

The 2019 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, a debt to equity ratio of 0.8, 53.0 days sales in accounts receivable, and 1.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. The debt coverage ratio from 2017 to 2019 was 2.0, 3.14, and 3.4, respectively.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues for both residential and wholesale customers will increase approximately 16% in FY 2019 as a result of a rate increase. Water revenues will continue to increase in the five year forecast according to planned rate increases by the Utility based on their capital improvements plan and updated annually with KIA. Residential water rates increased 10.2% in FY2021 and expect to increase another 9.23% in FY2022 while wholesale rates will be adjusted based on the wholesale customer's responsibility for debt service coverage for plant expansion projects.
- 2) Sewer revenues will remain flat.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt coverage is 1.3 in 2025 when full principal and interest payments for the F19-002 full loan go into repayment.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$1,422,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$71,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,262,000 TO THE MORGAN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, MORGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Morgan County Water District subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$3,262,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Morgan County Water District for the KY Hwy 191 Waterline Replacement project. Such amounts are

subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,262,,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$8,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$164,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2021.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### **HISTORY**

Revenues increased 4.1% from \$1,423,025 in 2017 to \$1,466,816 in 2019 due to a rate increase. Operating expenses increased 8.8% from \$1,167,276 in 2017 to \$1,270,427 in 2019.

The 2019 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 38.7 days sales in accounts receivable, and 0 months operating expense in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase by approximately 23% by July 2021, pending PSC approval.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.5 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$164,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$8,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

#### XI. RECOMMENDATIONS

KIA staff recommends approval of the loan with the standard conditions and the following PSC conditions.

- 1) The District will need to apply to the Public Service Commission (PSC), pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$3,262,000 loan. This debt authorization application should include a forecast for meeting debt service projected through no less than 2025.
- 2) By June 30, 2021, the District will need a resolution demonstrating their intentions to increase revenues as necessary and authorized by the PSC to meet the loan requirements over the life of the loan. KIA Staff review indicates that revenues would need to be increased by 15% in 2022, to meet expenses and debt service in the first full year of debt service in 2023.
- 3) Prior to the assistance agreement being executed, the District must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020, from the PSC for any portion of the project that may require it, or provide an opinion from legal counsel or the staff of the PSC, or a declaratory order from the PSC, that a CPCN is not required for any portion of the assets to be constructed as part of the loan agreement.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-027) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,100,000 TO THE WARREN COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, WARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Warren County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$2,100,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Warren County Water District for the WCWD – Woodburn Tank Replacement & Hwy 68W Reservoir

project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$106,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of May, 2021.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-060) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$994,648 TO THE CITY OF WILMORE, JESSAMINE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Wilmore, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$994,648 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Wilmore for the Wilmore Elevated Storage Tank Rehabilitation project. Such amounts are subject

to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$50,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of May, 2021.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 6,428 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$49,386. #### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Revenues increased 8.7% from \$1.74 million in 2018 to \$1.89 in 2020 while operating expenses increased 7.2% from \$1.58 million to \$1.69 million during the same period primarily due to the increased utility expenses for both water and sewer. The debt coverage ratio was 0.6, 9.2, and 9.2 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 46.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 6.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will continue to rise 2% annually, which is consistent with the past 10 years that rates have continued to increase 2% each year.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 5.4 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$50,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of May, 2021.
