### **PROCEEDINGS**

Commissioner Dunahoo called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order.

Greg Ladd, DLG General Counsel, was asked to confirm the press notification and the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

### I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

### A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of March 1, 2018

Mr. Mark Bunning moved to approve the minutes of the March 1, 2018, regular board meeting. Mr. Bruce Scott seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### **B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS**

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A15-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$31,944,188 TO THE LEXINGTON FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT, FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, addressed the group to present information on the Lexington-Fayette County Urban Government's request for an increase of \$31,944,188 to a \$36 million Fund A loan (A15-026) previously approved on December 4, 2014. The total project cost is \$67,944,188. KIA is funding the project over multiple funding cycles and this increase will substitute for funds LFUCG otherwise would have contributed. Below is the original project description.

The project will reduce the potential for 23 wet weather sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) locations. The existing sewer system lacks the capacity to meet LFUCG's EPA mandated Capacity Assurance Program. The project is a component of the Remedial Measures Plan that was submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to comply with the Consent Decree.

The project involves the design and construction of a multi-phase wet weather storage facility at the West Hickman Wastewater Treatment Plant on Ashgrove Pike in Jessamine County. The first phase will construct a 20 million gallon wet weather storage tank and a pumping station complex that provides influent pumping to both the storage tank and the secondary treatment phase of the wastewater treatment plant.

Fine screens, grit separators and odor control are components of the new pump station. Modification to the existing leaping weir and non-potable water systems are necessary to make the Phase I project fully functional. A portion of the engineering cost is for the storage tank / WWTP influent pumping station, which meets the needs of the current and future project phases. When all phases are complete, the total storage volume will be approximately 40 million gallons with a projected cost in the range of \$120 million.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Kentucky Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet (KYEPPC) filed a law suit in federal court against the Government in 2006 alleging various violations of the Clean Water Act. The Government completed negotiations with EPA and KYEPPC to resolve the alleged violations. The resulting Consent Decree agreement was entered in the United States District Court – Eastern District of Kentucky on January 3, 2011. The settlement agreement requires the Government to undertake extensive studies, sewer improvement projects, and management plans to correct the problems that were alleged. The settlement affords the Government up to 13 years to correct the problems The Government has estimated that the cost of remedial measures would approach \$600 million over the life of the Consent Decree. The Government increased sanitary sewer rates to fund obligations under the Consent Decree and adopted a storm water management fee. To date, Lexington has completed every Consent Decree requirement and met every deadline.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A15-026) increase up to the amount of \$31,944,188 to the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government with the standard conditions. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,000,000 TO THE OLDHAM COUNTY ENVIRONMENTAL AUTHORITY, OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the Oldham County Environmental Authority's request for a Fund A loan (A18-010) in an amount up to \$2,000,000 to address inflow and infiltration (I/I) issues during wet weather events. It is part of the Corrective Action Plan in response to an Agreed Order with the KY Division of Water, to prevent sanitary sewer overflows in the Ash Avenue and County Village areas of Oldham County. The project consists of correcting identified defects and cross connections in approximately 33,000 linear feet of collection system. The defects will be identified by closed circuit TV and smoke testing. The rehabilitation work will consist primarily of slip lining, manhole lining, and replacement where necessary. The total estimated I/I reduction is 498,393 gallons per day.

Judge David Voegele abstained from voting. Mr. Mark Bunning moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A18-010) up to the amount of \$2,000,000 to the Oldham County Environmental Authority with the standard conditions along with the following special condition: Sewer revenues must be increased at 6% or \$407,072 by July 1, 2018. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-016) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,121,200 TO THE LAGRANGE UTILITIES COMMISSION, OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Melissa Rife, KIA discussed with the group the LaGrange Utilities Commission's request for a Fund A Loan (A18-016) in an amount up \$3,121,200 to construct a lift station and interceptor sewer upgrade project. The need for the project arises from enforcement action taken by the KY Division of Water mandating the elimination of a sanitary sewer overflow at a manhole on the north side of I-71. The proposed project will replace approximately 2,750 linear feet of 15 and 16 inch gravity interceptor line along I-71 with 24-inch PVC. The existing gravity line will be decommissioned upon completion of the new line however the line will stay in place for future use if needed. Additionally, a new 2,000 GPM tri-plex lift station with variable frequency drives will replace the existing 1,200 GPM South Pump Station. The new interceptor, in conjunction with the increase in capacity at the new pump station, will allow flow during wet weather events to be diverted thereby eliminating a sanitary sewer overflow.

The LaGrange Utilities Commission was created by the City of LaGrange to manage and control the waterworks and sewer systems. The Commission serves 2,845 customers.

Judge David Voegele abstained from voting. Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A18-016) up to the amount of \$3,121,200 to the LaGrange Utilities Commission with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A PLANNING & DESIGN LOAN (A18-027) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$146,000 TO THE CITY OF PINEVILLE, BELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the City of Pineville's request for a planning and design loan in the amount of \$146,000 for the Virginia Avenue and Courthouse Square Utility Replacement and Revitalization Project. The City is currently under a Consent Judgement with the Kentucky Division of Water to eliminate sewer overflows into the Cumberland River that result from having a combined sanitary and stormwater system during wet weather events. This loan will pay for engineering services to design approximately 7,500 linear feet (LF) of sanitary sewer and stormwater separation in downtown Pineville that will ultimately result in a reduction of combined sewer overflow entering the Cumberland River.

The portion of the project being funded with SRF does not include the revitalization aspect of the downtown area and the funds allocated will be used to address the public health concerns affiliated with having a combined sanitary and stormwater system.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A18-027) up to the amount of \$146,000 to the City of Pineville with the standard conditions Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A18-028) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,610,667 TO THE CITY OF PADUCAH, MCCRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Melissa Rife, KIA, discussed the City of Paducah's request for a Fund A loan (F18-028) in the amount up to \$4,610,667 to provide significant rehabilitation to the Flood Wall Pump Station #2 located along the floodwall in downtown Paducah. It is one of several pump stations, but is considered the largest and most significant in controlling flooding by pumping stormwater to the Ohio River. The seven individual pumps within Pump Station #2 are approximately 65 years old and have exceeded their useful life. All seven pumps, motors, controls, and appurtenances will be replaced and/or reconditioned.

Mr. Judge David Voegele moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A18-028) up to the amount of \$4,610,667 to the City of Paducah with the standard conditions Mr. Paul Lashbrooke seconded and the motion was unanimously approved. 6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F18-016) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE FRANKFORT ELECTRIC & WATER PLANT BOARD, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Frankfort Electric and Water Plant Board's (Plant Board) request for a Fund F loan, (F18-016) in the amount of \$4,000,000 for their Water Storage Improvement Project. The current storage facilities consist of two 125+ year old, 4.6 million gallon (MG) earthen embankment tanks with a concrete cover and are located side-by-side, within the same footprint (North and South Basin). There are currently no known compliance issues, however, the tanks have been actively leaking for some time. The proposed project consists of a new 7.0 MG, partially buried tank that would replace the South Basin. Long-range plans allow room for a second 7.0 MG tank in place of the North Basin should demand increase. The new facilities will incorporate a SCADA system, a mixing system to improve turnover, and will incorporate current design standards for leak prevention and seismic activity.

The Plant Board directly serves customers within and outside the Frankfort City limits and in part of Northern Woodford County. They provide wholesale service to Elkhorn, Farmdale, Northeast Woodford County, Peaks Mill, South Anderson, and US 60 Water Districts which are all PSC regulated. They also service the North Shelby water Company and the City of Georgetown.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F Loan, (F18-016) up to the amount of \$4,000,000 to the Frankfort Electric & Water Plant Board with the standard conditions Mr. Mark Bunning seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F18-018) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$834,430 TO THE CITY OF LOUISA, LAWRENCE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA discussed the City of Louisa's request for a Fund F,(F18-018) loan in the amount of \$834,430 for the Downtown Water Rehab Project. The project consists of the replacement of approximately 6,600 linear feet (LF) of two and six-inch cast iron waterline with six inch PVC. The existing waterlines were constructed in the 1930s when the first water plant was built and are some of the oldest in the system. Over time, corrosion has caused the lines to become tuberculated which causes reduced pressure and water quality degradation. The City has also been battling frequent leaks and breaks due to the age of the waterline. This rehabilitation project will reduce water loss for the City and allow for improved service and reliability to the residents and businesses within the project area.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund F Loan, (F18-018) up to the amount of \$834,430 to the City of Louisa with the standard conditions. Judge David Voegele. seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

8. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Bruce Scott seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

9. Commissioner Dunahoo turned the floor over to Director Donna McNeil to discuss data requests that KIA has been receiving. In years past, the WRIS portal had a selection that could be used for public download. Due to security concerns, the selection was deactivated. A WRIS workgroup has recently met to discuss ways to improve the WRIS portal. Director McNeil stated the current policy upon receiving a request, if it is for a specific system, KIA staff contacts the entity and asks permission to fulfill the request. If there is a memorandum of agreement in place, the requester is asked to contact the system directly to make their request. After discussion, the Board elected to leave things status quo until the workgroup comes back with additional information and recommendations for consideration. The group will meet again in the coming months and will put together a game plan.

### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil asked Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, to come forward and discuss the recent Bond Sale. Mr. Abshire updated the group on the recent sale of KIA Bonds. The transaction went very well.

Director McNeil and Mr. Abshire attended the Council of Infrastructure Financing Authorities' (CIFA) at the end of March in Washington, DC. Ms. McNeil is also a member of the US EPA State SRF Workgroup. In the Consolidated Appropriations Act, both SRF programs were awarded \$300 million more than anticipated. With that being said, there will be more dollars going out to the states for 2018. The 2015 Needs Survey has been released, Kentucky's allocation will be based on that Needs Survey. Kentucky's needs have increased \$8.2 billion. In comparison to the last Needs Survey, Kentucky moved up 3 places on the list, now in 21st place. The Drinking Water SRF program will receive additional funding. EPA suspects a 30% increase. We would like to have the final numbers before we complete the Intended Use Plan (IUP), which we hope to complete by the end of the month.

WIFIA was awarded \$63 million and they have sent out letters of invitation with responses due by July 6, 2018. Indiana is the only state that submitted a letter of intent last year. Kentucky will not be submitting a letter of interest because there are too many unknown factors, several different fees associated with the program. Currently, WIFIA has not made any loans at this point in time. No system in Kentucky has shown interest in the WIFIA.

KIA is currently working internally on an income survey in cooperation with CDBG, on low to moderate incomes, including Median Household Incomes (MHI). This will allow one survey to be done for both organizations. The hope is to eventually include Rural Development into the process. A form has been established and will be given to Oldham County.

We are also working with something in the WRIS, to use customer meters or address points versus the mapped lines to better establish the MHI. A three tiered process has been developed, the initial MHI, the survey process and now the address points/customers meters. Morehead Utility Commission will be the first to use this process.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A18-022) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$625,000 TO THE PADUCAH MCCRACKEN JOINT SEWER AGENCY, MCCRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS,** the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses; \$92,544, (\$109,351), (\$178,994) respectively.

Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### HISTORY

Revenues increased 14.8% from \$6.9 million in 2015 to \$7.9 million in 2017 due to previously approved rate increases. Operating expenses increased 5.2% from \$4.3 million in 2015 to \$4.6 million in 2017. The debt coverage ratio was 2.1, 2.2, and 2.5 from 2015 to 2017, respectively.

The 2017 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.5, and a collection period of 19.4 days. Unrestricted cash equals 17.2 months of operating expenses.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 13.2% in 2018 due to a previously approved rate increase. The utility has a CPI clause that states they may adjust rates based on CPI-U each April although no CPI assumptions for revenue growth were factored into this analysis.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.3 in 2020 when principal and interest repayments for this loan begin. The debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin for all outstanding loans.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The Agency currently has designated reserves of \$3,000,000. The reserves are specifically for high dollar capital equipment purchases, for emergencies, or for rate stabilization in the event of a loss of a substantial revenue stream. No additional reserves will be required.

#### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Lancaster is requesting \$4,000,000 in loan funding to construct a new 3.0 million gallon per day (MGD), conventional water treatment facility. The current 2.1 MGD plant was constructed in 1951 with the last major improvement occurring in 1994. Many of the plant components have exceeded their life spans and are in need of replacement. In addition, the City currently has no means for sludge holding after a backwash or basin cleaning and has received Notice of Violation (NOV) for high total suspended solids in their discharge to a nearby stream. To address these issues, a new treatment facility, with lagoon system to accept wastewater discharge, will be constructed at a nearby site already owned by the City. Other improvements will include improved coagulation and filtration, maximizing efficiency of the carbon feed system and points of chlorination, and a larger diameter intake pipe and screen on the Kentucky River. Expansion at the current site was ruled out due to the age of the current water treatment plant components and unavailability of land to expand the footprint. The City will leave two pumps at the abandoned treatment plant site that will have the ability to pump raw water to the new treatment plant site from the Lancaster Reservoir as a backup source water supply.

Lancaster Water Works is a regional facility, selling to the Crab Orchard Water Works and the Garrard County Water Association.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements combining both water and sewer operations for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. An accounting error applying \$117,082 grant income to water revenues has been deducted from operating revenues. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has also been removed from fiscal year 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses.

This project is a joint financial effort of multiple funding sources. Other funding sources include commitments of a \$1.5 million RD grant, a \$4.5 million RD loan, and a \$0.5 million HB265 state grant. The City has applied for an ARC grant in the amount of \$0.5 million and is anticipating the award in the near future.

#### HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues went up 10.6% from \$1.85 million in 2015 to \$2.05 million in 2017 due to CPI adjustments and volume increase. Operating expenses increased 8.4% from \$1.43 million in 2015 to \$1.55 million in 2017 due to higher contractual expenses and general inflation. The debt coverage ratio was 1.2, 1.2, and 1.9 for 2015, 2016, and 2017 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.7, debt to equity ratio of 0.8, 57.2 days sales in accounts receivable, and 2.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Total revenues reflect all previously approved rate increases. Retail water revenues will increase approximately 6% equivalent to \$40,000 by April 1, 2019.
- 2) Wholesale water will go up annually based on the rate schedule in the water purchase agreements with the Garrard County Water Association and the City of Crab Orchard.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 4) The City will receive a grant in the amount of \$500,000 from ARC in addition to this loan, the RD grant and loan, as well as the HB265 state grant.
- 5) After 2019, the City will continue to automatically adjust retail water and sewer rates based on the Consumer Price Index.
- 6) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2022 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$200,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$10,000) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

The City of Salyersville f/b/o Salyersville Water Works is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$655,854 for the Church Street Storage Tank project. This is the construction portion of a prior Planning and Design loan funded by KIA during the Fiscal 2016 funding cycle. This project will construct a 500,000 gallon water storage tank to replace an aging 200,000 gallon tank. The tank is being replaced due to insufficient capacity, issues with leaking, and the need for a higher tank elevation. The tank has been out of service for approximately one year and is around fifty years old.

Salyersville Water Works provides service to approximately 1,000 customers in Magoffin County and sells about 200 million gallons of water annually to the Magoffin County Water District at a cost of \$2.73 per thousand gallons.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for Salyersville Water Works (the Utility) for the years ended June 30, 2014 through June 30, 2017. The Utility is comprised of both water and sewer operations which are combined in the Financials Presentation. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016 and 2017 operating expenses from which the forecast is based. Percentage

references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented. A significant amount of the Utility's financial information was lost during the March 2, 2012 tornado.

#### FINANCIAL REPORTING AND COMPLIANCE

- 1. The Utility has had consistent audit findings about underfunding of a reserve requirement on KIA loan A02-08. The original loan amount was \$2,035,486 with a reserve requirement of \$529,290, or 26% of the loan. The reserve was calculated under a methodology that is no longer used by KIA. KIA has agreed to revise the requirement to the amount that would be required based on current reserve methods.
- 2. KIA loan A02-08 was restructured in 2010 to require monthly payments via ACH. This was the result of prior non-payment issues.
- 3. Audited financial statements were not provided to KIA from 2008 2014.
- 4. Audited performance for 2015 in this credit analysis has been adjusted for a \$95,000 (6%) overstatement of revenues due to a financial statement error. This error was not identified when the Board approved KIA loans A16-077 and F16-038 totaling \$665,230 on April 7, 2016.
- 5. Five of the seven beginning balances for long term debt line items from the 2017 audit were restated from the 2016 audit, however, the offset could not be identified as there was no restatement of retained earnings or identification of the restatement in the footnotes.
- 6. The original Planning and Design loan for this project came with loan conditions to increase rates 3% on a yearly basis. Although the Utility passed meeting minutes (dated April 5, 2016) stating they would change rates effective January 1, 2017 and each January thereafter, the January 2017 increase did not occur. The Utility has since adjusted rates on June 27, 2017 and January 22, 2018.

#### HISTORY

Revenues increased 11% from \$1.3 million in 2014 to \$1.5 million in 2017. Wholesale water revenues (34% of 2014 revenues) declined 7% or \$36,000 during the same period. Operating expenses averaged \$1.3 million each year with no significant year to year variation. Cash flow after debt service was (\$169,910), (\$71,754), (\$55,980), and (\$33,553) for 2014 through 2017, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 33.8 days sales in accounts receivable. The utility had a cash deficit of \$8,400. We do not have sufficient information to determine the extent to which accounts payable balances were more than thirty days in arrears at the end of fiscal 2017.

Given the Utility's financial condition, they do not have the capacity to absorb inflation

cost increases, unanticipated expenses, or the effect of increases in pension contribution rates beginning in fiscal 2019.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase slightly in 2018 and 2019 due to previously implemented rate increases. Revenues will remain flat thereafter.
- 2) The Utility requires an immediate annual revenue increase of approximately \$145,000 (approximately 14% of non-wholesale revenues) beginning in fiscal 2019 to offset existing and predicted negative cash flow, decrease inflationary expense sensitivity, and to mitigate some balance sheet weaknesses. The effect on the affordability index for each rate is as follows:

- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Pension expense will increase by \$12,000 beginning in fiscal 2019 as a result of contribution rate changes made during the 2018 Legislative Session.
- 5) The Utility will discontinue the grinder pump project (A16-077), which was originally approved for \$615,230, at the end of current commitments resulting in a final loan amount of approximately \$362,000.
- 6) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2019 when full principal and interest repayments begin for the Planning & Design loan (F16-038).

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The annual replacement cost is 5% (\$36,000) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded in monthly installments (\$142) over 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

#### XII. <u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>

KIA staff does not recommend approval of the loan due to the Utility's current financial condition and its extensive history of financial reporting issues and failure to comply with terms of existing loans.

Staff recommends the following:

1) The Utility will implement a mandatory CPI ordinance for retail rates which will be effective each July 1 beginning in 2018 based on the twelve months ended December of each prior calendar year. They will be required to provide documentation of this annual adjustment when requested.

- 2) Rates will be adjusted effective no later than December 21, 2018 to increase annual non-wholesale revenues by \$145,000 (approximately 14% of non-wholesale revenues).
- 3) The Utility will initiate wholesale rate adjustments with the PSC at least every two years beginning in January 2019 (subsequent to the December 31, 2017 due date for completion of the 2018 audit).
- 4) Principal repayment of the existing KIA Planning and Design Loan (F16-038) will be deferred until December 1, 2019.

KIA will consider a new application for the project upon receipt of the audited financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2019 (due to KIA by December 31, 2019) and demonstration of credit worthiness based on loan policies that are in effect at that time.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY **AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS** OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE **KENTUCKY** INFRASTRUCTURE **AUTHORITY TO** SUCH **GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES** 

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 8<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2018.
