PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Sandra K. Dunahoo, Chair, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. She asked Mr. Greg Ladd, DLG General Counsel to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of April 4, 2019

Mr. Bruce Scott moved to approve the minutes of the April 4, 2019, regular board meeting. *Mr.* Chris Lewis seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,359,566 TO THE CITY OF LOUISA, LAWRENCE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Mayor Harold Slone, City of Louisa, discussed the City of Louisa's request for a Fund A loan (A19-002) in an amount up to \$3,106,922 to fund the construction portion of the Inflow & Infiltration Rehabilitation project. The total project cost is \$3,339,588 including the planning & design loan previously approved on December 1, 2016.

The purpose of this project is to eliminate inflow and infiltration in the Louisa Sewer System by constructing a portion of storm water sewer facilities.

In 2009, a Sewer Evaluation Study ("SSES") was performed on the entire Louisa Sewer System, which yielded a delineation of three priority zones for rehabilitation. This project will address the downtown area (Zone 1), which is considered to have the oldest infrastructure and is the highest priority of the City. The planning and design portion paid for camera inspection of approximately 23,250 linear feet of sewer line and determined exactly what measures are necessary to address the issues. The construction portion will replace storm sewer along Lock Avenue and Pike Street in downtown Louisa, with intent to separate the combined sewer in parts of the area and eliminate other inflow and infiltration concerns.

Mayor Harold Stone stated that "by separating the storm sewer from the City's sanitary sewer, the City expects to be able to lower the cost of wastewater treatment as well as reduce the risk of sanitary sewer overflow for approximately 1,800 customers within the Lawrence County.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-002) in an amount up to \$3,106,922 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Chris Lewis seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-012) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$861,148 TO THE CITY OF TOMPKINSVILLE, MONROE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Mr. Stephen Harris, Precision Engineering, representing the City of Tompkinsville, discussed the City's request for a Fund A Loan (A19-012) in an amount up to \$861,148. The purpose of the loan is to improve water quality through the elimination of sewer overflows during rain events.

The City has been experiencing overflows due to dilapidated sanitary sewer collectors and mains throughout the City. These damaged mains allow infiltration and inflow to enter the collection system during wet weather and thus cause health hazards to the public. The project will correct these issues by expanding the existing wastewater treatment plant ("WWTP") to a sequential batch reactor WWTP with a larger capacity. It will also rehabilitate the first 8,750 LF of old sewer main and install 11,600 LF of new force main with a lift station to eliminate the need for a local package treatment facility. The expansion and rehabilitation work is expected to reduce power consumption by 50%. The savings will provide the City with additional cash flow to fund future projects.

The City was a regional provider supplying wholesale water to the Monroe County Water District ("the District") until May, 2018 when the District began its production and ceased to purchase water from the City. There are currently 1,000 retail customers serviced by the City.

Director McNeil noted that late afternoon the day before the Board meeting it was brought to KIA staff's attention that the Monroe County Water District was no longer buying water from the City, after the Board books had been prepared and distributed. KIA staff did further investigation into the financial state and feels the City will be able to meet their financial obligations moving forward. Ms. Sun will update her credit analysis accordingly.

Mr. Bruce Scott asked how much of the Tompkinsville's wholesale sales were affected with the loss of the Monroe County Water District. KIA Staff noted 55% of water production. City representatives were also asked if the wastewater operators were familiar with the SBR system and its operation. It is a great system and can be cost-saving if operated correctly. Mr. Stephen Harris, Precision Engineering, noted that staff is familiar, but will attend additional training as needed.

Mr. Bruce Scott moved to approve the City of Tompkinsville's request for a Fund A Loan (A19-012) for an amount up to \$861,148 with the standard conditions. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Dunahoo noted Agenda items 3 and 4 for Paducah McCracken County Joint Sewer Agency would be presented together with two separate votes at the conclusion of presentation and any discussion.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-039) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,193,000 TO THE PADUCAH McCRACKEN COUNTY JOINT SEWER AGENCY, McCRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Paducah McCracken County Joint Sewer Agency's request for a Fund A Loan (A19-039) in an amount up to \$5,193,000 for the Perkins/Crooked Creek Wet Weather Tank project. This project will capture excess wet weather flows near the intersection of the Crooked Creek and Perkins Creek sanitary sewer interceptors, eliminating a sanitary sewer overflow and improving water quality. Construction will include a 3.0 million gallon above ground concrete storage tank, associated site improvements, and infrastructure to convey wet weather flows to/from the proposed storage tank. Additional infrastructure will include: a 5.0 million gallon a day (MGD) pump station, an influent diversion structure, an effluent flow control structure, approximately 400 linear feet of 24" sanitary sewer, and approximately 1,000 linear feet of 18" sanitary sewer. Electrical work and controls for the pump station and tank effluent flow control structure are also included. This project is in accordance with the sanitary sewer overflow plan to help comply with the system's Consent Decree (CWA-04-2008-4756).

The Paducah McCracken Joint Sewer Agency serves over 18,700 customers in the City of Paducah and McCracken County.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-039) for an amount up to \$5,193,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bruce Scott seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-044) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,476,652 TO THE PADUCAH McCRACKEN COUNTY JOINT SEWER AGENCY, McCRACKEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the Paducah McCracken Joint Sewer Agency's (JSA) request for a Fund A loan in an amount up to \$2,476,652 for the Massac Creek Phase III project. The project's primary goal is to improve water quality and eliminate sewer overflows by offloading dry and wet weather flows from the Perkins Creek Interceptor to the Massac Creek Interceptor. The Massac Creek Interceptor is served by a 6 million gallon per day pump station with adequate capacity to handle the diverted flows. By diverting this flow, wet weather flow impacts on the Perkins Creek interceptor will be reduced and the interceptor will regain additional dry weather capacity for continued growth and development of McCracken County. In addition, the Ross Lift Station will be upgraded for more pumping capacity, which the Perkins Creek Interceptor cannot handle during wet weather. Additional improvements to the Ross Lift station include an emergency generator. The rehabilitation of the Ross Lift Station will eliminate the sanitary sewer overflow associated with the station, which is included in Paducah JSA's Consent Judgment with Kentucky Division of Water. The project requires timely completion due to time constraints related to the JSA's sanitary sewer overflow plan. The project also includes 8,300 LF of new gravity sewer and 2,700 LF of new force main to be constructed in addition to the decommissioning of four

LF of new gravity sewer and 2,700 LF of new force main to be constructed in addition to the decommissioning of four existing lift stations. The Paducah McCracken Joint Sewer Agency serves over 18,700 customers in the City of Paducah and McCracken County.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked Agency officials how their engineers were selected. John Hodges noted they try to spread their work to different firms based on the needs of the projects and the engineers; experience and strengths. GRW was chosen because of their experience with tanks and hydraulics for A19-039, while HDR was chosen for their knowledge and experience with lines for A19-044.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-44) for an amount up to \$2,476,652 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bruce Scott seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-041) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,051,133 TO THE CITY OF SOUTH SHORE, GREENUP COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and Mayor Cheryl Moore, City of South Shore, discussed the City's request for a Fund F loan for an amount up to \$3,051,133. The purpose of this project is to improve drinking water quality in Greenup County by constructing a new water treatment plant building that will replace existing facilities to improve drinking water system reliability, treatment efficiency and maintain or exceed water quality compliance.

This project will construct a new 1.0 MGD water treatment plant control building to replace the dilapidated 1.0 MGD facility. The new building will be approximately 3,000 square feet in size to house a filter room, chemical feed rooms, a lab, offices, Restrooms, a mechanical room and an electrical room. There will be three filters in series with provisions for a fourth one in the future if necessary. The new filter system will be designed to take up to two filters out of service for backwashing, maintenance or repairs while still operating the other filter(s). The plant will be controlled by a Programmable Logic Computer (PLC) which will automatically make adjustments to the treatment process to allow for efficient use of chemicals. The new pumps will have premium efficiency motors and Variable Frequency Drives to reduce electrical costs. An electrical switch gear will be installed to allow for quick connection of a portable generator during prolonged power outages and be wired for a permanent generator in the future. The plant site will be fenced in for security.

The City produces 92% and purchases 8% of its water supply from the Garrison Quincy KY-O-Heights Water District, which is a PSC regulated entity. The project will improve drinking water quality for approximately 2,200 customers in the City of South Shore and the outlying areas of northwestern Greenup and northeastern Lewis Counties. Mayor Moore thanked the Board for their consideration and said it had been a difficult situation after buying the facility from a private individual six years ago that requires a lot of work.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F19-41) for an amount up to \$3,051,133 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bruce Scott seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

8. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING APPROVAL FOR THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT FOR THE DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND

Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the 2019 Drinking Water Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Application.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the filing of the 2019 Capitalization Grant for the Drinking Water Revolving Fund. Ms. Gwen Pinson seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

9. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING APPROVAL FOR THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION WITH THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR THE FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT FOR THE WASTEWATER REVOLVING FUND

Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, discussed the 2019 Wastewater Revolving Fund Capitalization Grant Application.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the filing of the 2019 Capitalization Grant for the Wastewater Revolving Fund. *Mr.* Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil discussed the Capitalization Grant Application Process. It is the initial subsidization for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (SRF), KIA is mandated to provide 10%, which is \$2,223,000 to our borrowers for the Congressional portion. KIA can then go up to another 30% through the WRRDA (Water Resources Reform and Development Act), that piece is \$6,128,400, we could give out \$8.1 million in subsidization. Her recommendation is to stay around the 30% to safeguard KIA's equity in the program. That is similar to what it has been this past year, giving just under 30%. In the Intended Use Plan (IUP) for both programs offers principle forgiveness up to 50%, or a maximum of \$1.3 million. Last year, the Board's ad hoc committee decided to limit principal forgiveness per project at \$1,000,000. There are a large number of projects that qualify for the disadvantaged community.

This year on the wastewater side, the cut-off is 1.5% affordability index, which is quite high. Last year, it was about 1.2 - 1.3% it is quite competitive to affordability. KIA will have about \$75,000,000 and will invite \$80,000,000 in the first round of invites for the CWSRF. The IUP has been drafted. The Division of Water has not had the opportunity to review as of yet. The expectation is to have the CWSRF IUP out by end of the week or the beginning of the following week and the DWSRF IUP out by the end of the month.

There is more to change on the for the Drinking Water program. Congress mandated 20% that has to be given out in additional subsidization and authorization also mandates an additional 6% up to 35% of the funding has to be given out in principal forgiveness. The Division of Water typically takes 30% of the set aside, KIA gets 1%., for a total of 31% off the top. If we take the total of 55%, which is the 20% Congress mandates and the up to 35%, 86% of the funding could be obligated before any projects were invited. Director McNeil recommends KIA stay around the 30-31% that was done last year to safeguard the fund's equity. This will go out in the IUP that will be open for a 30-day Public Comment Period. The state match is 20%, which leaves about \$52.5 million available for project funding. She estimates about \$56 million will be in the initial invite with \$52.5 million available on for the DWSRF program. The set aside amount for the 31% is \$5,620,920 so that will be coming off the top of the Federal Capitalization grant.

Kentucky, along with the other states that receives an allocation for Drinking Water in the Capitalization Grant, will be receiving a grant for small and disadvantaged communities. This is a grant program and will be subject to the federal requirements. It is called Assistance for Small and Disadvantaged Communities Grant Program. Kentucky's allocation for FFY 2018 and FFY 2019 is \$698,000. The grant requires a 45% match, which can be done in-kind and we have some solutions for the in-kind match that does require asking the Legislature for an increase for the match. The deadline is June 30, 2020 and a list a projects will need to be submitted and has to benefit for small and disadvantaged communities. The grant can be used for compliance or capacity development. Director McNeil has reached out to the Division of Water to come up with a strategy.

Director McNeil notified the Board that the next scheduled Board meeting set, for June 11th would need to be changed because she and Commissioner Dunahoo would not be available to meet. The following Tuesday, June 18th was suggested and approved.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-009) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$13,542,784 TO THE CITY OF GEORGETOWN, SCOTT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Georgetown, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$13,542,784 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Georgetown for the Georgetown/Scott County South Sewer Extension project Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,000,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$12,542,784 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$33,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$678,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 18th day of June, 2019.

This project will expand sanitary sewer service from the intersection of US-25 and Bypass US-62 to the intersection of US-25 and KY-1963 in Scott County. Approximately 10 properties will be provided sanitary sewer service along the project route, two of which are mobile home parks (Spindletop and Ponderosa), with a capacity of approximately 500 households that are currently served by two package treatment plants in severe disrepair. The project will install approximately 17,000 linear feet (LF) of gravity trunk sewers and appurtenances, one sanitary sewer pump station, and approximately 6,400 LF of force main. I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Georgetown is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$13,542,784 for the Georgetown/Scott County South Sewer Extension project. The purpose of this project is to eliminate the untreated sanitary discharges from two package treatment plants and remove major point sources of pollution to the Cane Run Creek and Cane Run Watershed thus improving the public health of the region. It will provide adequate sanitary sewer service to approximately 500 mobile home units (around 320 are currently occupied) with the Ponderosa and Spindletop mobile home parks (MHPs) by replacing all leaking collector sewers within the two MHPs and extending a gravity interceptor (approximately 17,000 LF) to a new pump station where the flows will be conveyed into Georgetown Municipal Water and Sewer Service (GMWSS) collection system. Once the two MHPs are fully connected to the new gravity collection system and pump station, the two existing package treatment plants, Ponderosa and Spindletop, will be decommissioned and demolished. The mobile home park collection systems will also undergo rehab and replacement of approximately 17,000 LF of collector sewers and various manholes as determined necessary. The gravity interceptor route will also provide sanitary sewer service for an area previously unserved. Both of the mobile home parks will be served by master meters billed to the owners of the parks with associated treatment and project costs being passed on to residents as part of their lot rent.

Georgetown Municipal Water and Sewer Service currently serves approximately 13,588 residential, commercial, and industrial customers in the City of Georgetown and Scott County.

However, this project received Disadvantaged Community Status after completing an Income Survey of the project area. There were 199 surveys completed of which 180 identified a household income below \$35,849 or 80% of Kentucky's median household income level (\$44,811). Because of this, the project will qualify for a 0.5% interest rate, a 30 year loan term, and \$1 million in principal forgiveness.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water and sewer revenues have increased 13% from \$11 million in 2016 to \$12.5 million in 2018 largely due to Georgetown's continued population growth. Water revenues as of 2018 contribute approximately \$4.4 million to the total while sewer revenues contribute approximately \$4.5 million. Total operating expenses for both water and sewer increased approximately 6% from \$7.7 million in 2016 to \$8.2 million in 2018 mostly due to inflation. Cash flow before debt service was \$3.4 million in 2016, \$3.3 million in 2017, and \$4.4 million in 2018. The debt coverage ratio was 2.9, 2.8, and 3.0 from 2016-2018, respectively.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.7, a debt to equity ratio of 0.2, 37.9 days sales in accounts receivable, and 0.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Both water and sewer revenues will remain flat.
- 2) The Utility is currently exploring a Capital Improvement Plan that could exceed \$80 million which will necessitate dramatic rate increases in the coming years.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.8 in 2023 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$678,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$33,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Regional Water Resource Agency (RWRA) is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$7,015,000 for the Tunnel Replacement, Lining, and Repair Project.

The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate/replace a deteriorated portion of the tunnel sewer system in downtown Owensboro. RWRA currently maintains over five miles of tunnel sewers that were all built in the 1930's with line sizes ranging from 60-90 inches in diameter at depths from 30-60 feet. Some portions of the tunnel have suffered significant deterioration and need immediate attention. The tunnels are situated under major road infrastructure with substandard and unstable soil conditions. Failure of any of the tunnels in the project area could result in catastrophic damage to RWRA's main conveyance systems as well as pose serious property damage and public safety risks.

The first phase of this project will address a section of the Eastern tunnel in particular which has already undergone emergency grouting to correct potentially dangerous issues in order to stabilize the ground until permanent rehabilitation can take place. More than likely this 1,100 LF section of tunnel will either be lined or replaced with a new pipe (to be determined). If the line is fully replaced, the existing tunnel pipeline will be abandoned and a new one will be direct buried at a more shallow depth, offset from the tunnel. This section of the tunnel could affect service to 2,400 properties including both residential and industrial customers if failure occurs along with significant traffic impacts and risk to public safety. After the necessary rehabilitation/replacement of this section of tunnel has been determined, RWRA will then proceed with further tunnel repair of other sections deemed to be of greatest need with the remaining project budget.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The current replacement reserve account of \$2,500,000 is adequate to cover reserves for all KIA loans. No additional reserves will be required as a result of this loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A18-007) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,607,745 TO THE REGIONAL WATER RESOURCE AGENCY, DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Regional Water Resource Agency (RWRA) is requesting an increase to loan A18-007 in the amount of \$560,745 for the Cedar Hills Subdivision Sewer Extension project due to bids coming in higher than estimated. The loan was originally approved for \$2,047,000 in June 2018 and the increase will bring the new loan total to \$2,607,745.

This project involves the extension of sewer service to the Cedar Hills neighborhood in eastern Daviess County via gravity sewers extending from the existing Countryside Pump Station. The sewer extension will require a combination of gravity sewers varying in size up to 15', a pump station, and a force main. This project will eliminate one failing package plant that presently serves 122 households and one church. As proposed, these 122 homes and a church will be connected into the RWRA sewer system. Without the current operation and ultimate replacement, approximately 125 homes will be left without viable sewer service and will subsequently become uninhabitable.

In addition, this project also involves the rehabilitation of the existing collection system within the Cedar Hills neighborhood. The level of decline of the package plant and collection system has accelerated in recent years, necessitating the development of an alternative to the existing package plant and substantial rehabilitation efforts (manhole rehabilitation, manholes adjusted to grade, main repairs, lateral repairs and pipe lining.)

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population was 31,643 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$47,132. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. The project originally qualified for a 1.75% interest rate based on MHI in the FY 2018 funding cycle and it will stay the same for the increased loan amount.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented

HISTORY

Revenues increased approximately 17% from \$19.6 million in 2016 to \$23 million from in 2018 mostly due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased approximately 11% from \$12.6 million to \$13.9 million during the same time period. Cash flow available for debt service was \$7.1 million, \$8.2 million, and \$9.3 million in 2016, 2017, and 2018 respectively, while the debt coverage ratio was 12.3, 3.0, and 2.7.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.2, debt to equity ratio of 0.9, and 32.5 days sales in accounts receivable.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase according to the rate plan established by RWRA through 2021.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 3) Debt service for both loans A19-024 and the increase to A18-007 have been factored into this analysis.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.8 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The current replacement reserve account of \$2,500,000 is adequate to cover reserves for all KIA loans. No additional reserves will be required as a result of this loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-013) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,131,000 TO THE CITY OF VANCEBURG, LEWIS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Vanceburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,131,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Vanceburg for the Meadowbrook and Black Oak Sewer Consolidation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 95% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$400,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$731,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$56,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 18th day of June, 2019.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Vanceburg ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,131,000 to fund the Meadowbrook and Black Oak Sewer Consolidation project. The purpose of this project is to address the Notice of Violation issued by the Division of Water and alleviate the threat of failing package treatment plants as well as eliminate health and sanitary hazards.

This project will replace four package plants with one 64,000 GPD cast activated sludge treatment plant. The new plant will be constructed at the Black Oak Industrial Park adjacent to the existing plant. Two of the package treatment plants to be eliminated are located at Meadowbrook, one at Echo Hills, and one at the Black Oak Industrial Park. The new plant will utilize the existing outfall of the current plant. The outfalls of Meadowbrook and Echo Hills will be eliminated. Both plants will be decommissioned and replaced with pump stations. The existing collection systems will be connected to the new plant via 4" and 6" forced main line.

In addition to serving approximately 2,600 retail customers within the City and surrounding areas, the City also provides wholesale water to the Garrison Quincy-O-Height Water District and the Fleming County Water Association. Both wholesale customers are regulated by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The financial activities of water, sewer, and gas operations are consolidated into the Gas, Water and Sewer Fund under the City's Enterprise Funds. The financial analysis is based on the combined reporting of the Gas, Water and Sewer Fund. The non-cash impact of GASB 68 - Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 - Other Postemployment Benefit has been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 16.1% from \$2.10 million in 2016 to \$2.44 million in 2018 because the City's largest gas customer nearly doubled its operations in the industrial park. Operating expenses went up 7.9% from \$1.69 million to \$1.82 million during the same period due to higher gas purchase cost incurred by the volume increase. The debt coverage ratio was 1.1, 0.9 and 1.5 for 2016, 2017, and 2018 respectively.

The 2018 Balance Sheet reflects 37.3 days sales in accounts receivable, 0.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash, a current ratio of 0.4, and a debt to equity ratio of 1.0.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- The City has proposed to implement a CPI clause effective July, 2022. The automatic annual rate adjustment will balance the risk associated with revenue loss if Gas operations are to be removed from the Gas, Water and Sewer fund. The annual CPI rate adjustment will be subject to KIA administrative compliance monitoring.
- 2) Combined water and sewer revenues will go up 2.7% by 2021 from the proposed rate increase effective February 1, 2020. Beginning in 2023, retail water and sewer rates will increase approximately 2% annually based on the Consumer Price Index while wholesale water rate will remain the same.
- 3) The City will receive \$1 million CDBG grant and \$0.9 million ARC grant to support the entire project.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% for inflation each year.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2023 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$56,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$2,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF EDMONTON, METCALFE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Edmonton, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$4,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Edmonton for the Water Improvement Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,300,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$3,200,000 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$11,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$226,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 18th day of June, 2019.

During the same year, the City incorporated large amount of flushing in the routine maintenance to improve water quality, causing water purchase cost and utility cost to increase significantly. The debt coverage ratio was 1.5, 1.9 and 1.5 for 2016, 2017, and 2018 respectively.

The 2018 Balance Sheet reflects 35.6 days sales in accounts receivable, 17.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash, a current ratio of 2.6, and a debt to equity ratio of 0.5.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will grow 20% by 2021 based on the proposed rate increases.
- 2) Sewer rates will go up 10% effective July 1, 2019.
- 3) Expenses will go up 2% each year for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2021 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$226,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$11,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 18th day of June, 2019.
