PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the special called meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE AUTHORITY TO SUBMIT TO THE LEGISLATIVE RESEARCH COMMISSION EMERGENCY AND ORDINARY ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE GUIDELINES FOR THE KENTUCKY INFRSTRUCTURE AUTHORITY DRINKING WATER AND WASTEWATER GRANT PROGRAM

Commissioner Keene asked if anyone had any questions. Secretary Rebecca Goodman responded and noted she had discussed the questions with Deputy Director Williams. Ms. Goodman asked how the projects would be prioritized. She noted that the Regulations do contain the statutory language, on the list of criteria that will be considered, but wanted to know how the projects will be prioritized. If initial ARC or ALM funding would be eligible to return for additional funding should the need arise. From the Regulations, it looks like the projects would need to be funded through KIA in order to come back for project overrun funding. She asked if Water Districts that have project overruns be eligible for funding from these monies as well.

Ms. Williams thanked Secretary Goodman for the questions and stated that the Legislation divided the \$250 million into 3 separate pools of funding: \$150 million allocated based on population, \$50 million for unserved drinking water customers in rural areas and consent decree projects, and the final \$49.9 million which would be available for projects that did not receive adequate funding to complete their projects. KIA believes that the intent of that section, would be if there wasn't enough grant money awarded within a county to complete a whole project that funding could be used to supplement for projection completion. As the Board knows, many of the projects currently going before the Board have been subject to project overruns and this grant funding could be used in those instances.

Mr. Ron Lovan noted that from his understanding of the proposed Regulations, they do not prevent those types of projects.

Ms. Williams stated she does not believe it would prevent a utility from using their allocated grant funding to make up the difference in projects from other sources.

Secretary Goodman also asked if there was an unserved population and there is a project for their unserved population, would the Utility go to their county officials and the local Water Management Council Coordinator, at the Area Development District and ask them to submit the project for consideration.

Ms. Williams stated she does not believe any projects would ever be held back from consideration. Secretary Goodman asked if there would be any prioritization by the Area Development District. Ms. Williams noted that within the Project Profiles in the Water Resource Information System (WRIS), there is a Budget tab, when the Coordinator chooses the Drinking Water and Wastewater Grant funding as a funding source that is the trigger that lets KIA know the project is applying for those funds. If that funding is listed the project is immediately eligible. Secretary Goodman asked if a regulatory group, such as the Public Service Commission, (PSC) feels a utility deserves a higher priority would they have the opportunity to discuss the award process with KIA. Ms. Williams noted that KIA always listens to their partners within state government. Yes, there would be the opportunity for our Board members and other state agencies to discuss.

Secretary Goodman stated that the EEC and Division of Water strongly encourage regionalization. Where does regionalization fall in the criteria, as listed in the Regulations? Ms. Williams noted Section 2, beginning with only water or wastewater projects addressing one or more of the following conditions shall be eligible for funding: Under Section C: The proposed project shall address the provisions of KRS 224A.300-224A.314; that is the section of the Regulations that addresses regionalization. Mr. Ron Lovan noted in regards to regionalization, the Utilities assume when project profiles are submitted through the WRIS that the Utilities will be able to highlight that in the submitted information. Ms. Williams noted that that is correct. That Utilities would address that in their Project Description.

Ms. Goodman noted a provision stating the proposed project shall alleviate existing conditions that pose a serious and immediate threat to the health and welfare of the community. She assumes those are those troubled Water Utilities, the ones with outstanding NOVs or have not risen to the level of a Federal Consent Decree, Correct? Ms. Williams stated that was a correct assumption. Ms. Goodman asked Ms. Linda Bridwell if she had any additional information to share from the PSC perspective. Ms. Bridwell said she had spoken with Ms. Williams and stated that any of the projects subject to the regulatory process would still need to come the PSC for the CPCN even though it was grant funding. The debit authorization requirement would not need to be met. The PSC does not look at other planning projects during the process.

Mr. Russ Rose asked if through the Water Management Councils and County Councils, if a County has already prioritized their projects could the Authority potentially change those rankings if the County has already agreed to an order? Ms. Williams noted the that KIA listens to local government officials and the utilities to let KIA know which project(s) are priorities to them. Mr. Rose questioned Subsection F on line 11 on page 3, The proposed project shall promote social, economic, or environmental benefits'; but with respect to industrial sites funds my only be awarded if the site has committed occupants. Why is that a requirement? Ms. Williams stated that KIA feels it important to know that a business has committed to the site before state funding is awarded.

Secretary Goodman asked if funding could be used for flood prone areas. Ms. Williams said this funding is to be used for Water or Wastewater projects.

Mr. Bob Amato asked about projects under Federal Consent Decree stipulation, could that also be used for State Enforcement Actions? Ms. Williams noted that in Senate Bill 36 it specifically identified the \$50 million pool of money to have two eligible pool of projects, one to provide drinking water to unserved customers or projects that under a Federal Consent Decree.

Mr. Russ Rose asked if Water Associations would be eligible to apply for funding. Ms. Williams noted that under KRS.224A.070 the authority is restricted from providing funding to governmental agencies. A Water Association can apply through their county. The county would be the applicant, which would require a Memorandum of Agreement between the County and the Water Association.

Mr. Ron Lovan asked about timing, when the Resolution is passed and then goes to the Legislative Research Commission will it be delayed there for a period of time? The Water Management Council and the ADDs are anxiously awaiting the go ahead to get things moving as quickly as possible. What is the next step from KIA? When will the Call for Projects be sent out? Ms. Williams stated the Regulations will be filed simultaneously as an Emergency Regulation as well as an Ordinary Regulation, which are identical to the Emergency Regulations. When the Emergency Regulations are filed, they go into effect immediately and can remain in effect for 270 days, which would give the Ordinary Regulation time to go through the regular process, which includes a public comment period and then KIA would evaluate the comments to include or exclude those as deemed necessary, then it would go before the Administrative Regulations Subcommittee.

Mr. Lovan asked how KIA would move forward. Ms. Williams noted the Regulations are now public, as of this meeting. Mr. Bryan Bunch, KIA Systems Engineer IT, has coded the Project Profiles in the WRIS to show the funding source for the grant program, but has not made it active as of yet. The Area Development Districts have the opportunity to determine if the projects meet criteria in whole or part of a Federal Consent Decree or through the mapping attribute can designate whether a project has, in whole or in part, water components of unserved customers, as stated in Senate Bill 36. Those are the two major changes to the profiles. This is the same process KIA uses for its other funding sources. The Utilities are familiar with the process and going to their Water Management Councils, submitting their projects and having them approved is standard. This is how the Utilities apply for the State Revolving Fund monies, as well and Fund B and C funding. The changes have been very small in the process. We have allowed the Utilities to note that they want to use this funding source. There is a drop-down box that allows them to enter an amount of funding needed and that is the application. The next step, possibly as early as next week, we would start the Call for Projects, file our Administrative Regulations accordingly, should the Board approve. We do not foresee a Call for Projects deadline, like with our SRF Program funding because the projects are all at different stages of life, some are ready to go tomorrow and some have not even been thought of as of yet. We want to be as flexible as possible and give everyone the opportunity to get viable projects ready for submission. KIA staff will review the submissions and will start sending out Conditional Commitment Letters. The Utilities will need to comply with the conditions. All Water Districts will have to seek PSC approval and follow the process that they normally follow. DOW will approve their plan and specifications, as usual. When all the conditions are met, KIA will enter into a Grant Agreement with the Utility and the project can then begin drawing funds.

Mr. Lovan asked about Ms. Williams saying the Call for Projects could be open as soon as next week, what if some Water Management Councils still need to meet to revise their projects. Will they be at a disadvantage to others that may file their projects next week. Ms. Williams stated they will not. KIA wants to be inclusive and give everyone the time they need to prepare their projects. If the Area Development Districts tell us they are not ready to submit currently, we want local officials to have time for their input.

Mr. Rose stated since the funding is allocated per county there is no fear of one county getting another county's allocation. Ms. Williams said that is correct and that is stated in Senate Bill 36.

Mayor Stapleton made the motion to approve the submission of the Emergency and Ordinary Administrative Regulations to the Legislative Research Commission for the Drinking Water and Wastewater Grant funding. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved. Ms. Grigsby noted that with her Aye vote, her hope is that the Ordinary Regulation stays closely to what has been submitted versus the Emergency Regulations.

Mr. Lovan expressed his gratitude to the staff members of DLG, KIA and the Division of Water for pulling all the information together in such a short period of time.

There being no further business, Mr. Lovan moved to adjourn. Mayor Stapleton seconded and the motion carried unanimously. The May 27th Special Called meeting of the Board of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority was adjourned.

PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

- I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)
 - 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of May 6, 2021

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the May 6, 2021, regular board meeting. *Mr.* Ron Lovan seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

- B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS
- 1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-012) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,709,970 TO THE CITY OF TOMPKINSVILLE, MONROE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Tompkinsville's request for a Fund A loan increase for an amount up to \$848,822 to fund additional work for the Waste Water Treatment Plant Expansion and Sanitary Sewer Collection Improvements project. Since the loan was initially approved in May, 2019, the system has been experiencing equipment failures that affect the day-to-day operations of the main influent pumps. In order to protect the integrity of the project, the failing pumps must be replaced before they stop working completely. The pump replacements were not part of the original budget but were added to the project for bids. This increase will bring the total project cost up to \$1,709,970.

The City has been experiencing overflows due to dilapidated sanitary sewer collectors and mains throughout the City. These damaged mains allow infiltration and inflow to enter the collection system during wet weather and thus cause health hazards to the public. An agreed order was issued in February, 2020 by the Division of Water with a Corrective Action Plan to address these issues. The project will correct the overflows by expanding the existing wastewater treatment plant ("WWTP") to a sequential batch reactor WWTP with a larger capacity. It will also rehabilitate the first 8,750 LF of old sewer main and install 11,600 LF of new force main with a lift station to eliminate the need for a local package treatment facility. The expansion and rehabilitation work are expected to reduce power consumption by 50%. The savings will provide the City with additional cash flow to fund future projects.

The City is serving approximately 1,000 retail customers within the Monroe County.

Mayor thanked KIA for the opportunity. He noted there had been financial difficulties with previous administrations and that The City was working hard to reduce spending and have contracted out

their sanitation and was actually making a little bit of money compared to previous years. He was seeing things turnaround and things were in better financial standing.

Ms. Geri Grigsby moved to approve the Fund A Loan increase, (A19-012), for the amount of \$848,822 for a total loan of \$1,709,970 to City of Tompkinsville with the standard conditions and the following special condition: By June 30, 2021, the City will add a CPI clause to the current rate ordinance to automatically adjust water and sewer rates each year based on the Consumer Price Index. The CPI adjustment will start to take effect in FY 2023. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-018) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$19,725,000 TO THE CITY OF FRANKFORT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Frankfort's request for a Fund A Loan in the amount of \$19,725,000 for the East Frankfort Interceptor Phase III Wet Weather Facility project. This project is also necessary to obtain compliance with Agreed Order 07-CI-1243. It is the first step in Frankfort Sewer Department's Long Term Control Plan. It includes new installation of approximately 11,000 LF of 42-inch diameter gravity sewer around the east side of the FSD service area, rehabilitation of approximately 3,000 linear feet of 24 and 36" PVC interceptor sewer, a 2.5 MG wet weather storage facility, approximately 30 manholes, two sets of double barrel siphons, control gates, flow control/metering, and SCADA integration. Farmdale SD currently has multiple failing PWWTPs within their system. This will allow them to move forward in the elimination of multiple package wastewater treatment plants. This project opens capacity in the southern sewers of FSD's service area by redirecting the sanitary flow around the east and north of the City via the new interceptor to FSD's WWTP. Through this available capacity, Farmdale SD can convey all sanitary flow to FSD's collection system, thus be able to decommission the listed PWWTPs and making the East Frankfort Interceptor project regional in nature.

The City of Frankfort serves approximately 14,373 customers.

Mr. Bobby Aldridge moved to approve Fund A Loan, A21-018, to the City of Frankfort for an amount up to \$19,725,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-024) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$223,000 TO THE CITY OF KUTTAWA, LYON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Kuttawa's request for a Planning and Design loan. The City of Kuttawa owns and operates its separated sanitary sewer system collection and treatment system. In 2013, the City began focusing on the elimination of infiltration and inflow into the Old Kuttawa portion of their system. Since that time, the City has completed four sewer rehabilitation/replacement projects, which have focused on the replacement of aged, undersized, and structurally deficient sewers. Using data collected during the four previous sanitary sewer evaluation studies, completed between 2016-2019, this Phase

V project will continue in those efforts. In addition, this project will include the evaluation of sewers in the Magnolia and Body Shop lift station areas of the City's system. These areas are directly tied to the Old Kuttawa basin, in that much of the gravity sewers have conveyed the sewer flows from Old Kuttawa for decades, and have contributed to the deterioration and less than ideal condition of the sewers.

Phase I (Planning & Design Loan for FY21) of this project will be to complete a SSES on the collection system located in the Magnolia & Body Shop basins. The SSES will include manhole inspections, CCTV of mainlines, and CCTV of lateral sewers. The work will include the inspection of approximately 120 manholes, 24,000 l.f. of sewer main, and 235 laterals. Upon completion of the SSES, this phase will include the design for the rehabilitation of the sewers inspected in the Magnolia and Body Shop basins, as well as the required design work for the replacement of the sewers identified during previous SSES work in the Old Kuttawa basin.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Planning & Design Loan of \$223,000 to the City of Kuttawa with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-032) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$817,000 TO THE CITY OF NICHOLASVILLE, JESSAMINE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Nicholasville's request for a Fund A Planning & Design loan in the amount of \$817,000 for the Nicholasville SSES and Sewer Rehabilitation Phase 1 project. In accordance with Agreed Order Case No. DOW 19-3-0038, the City of Nicholasville is required to take steps to address inflow and infiltration (I&I) and overflows within the sanitary sewer collection system. In order to begin this task, the first step is to document the condition of the existing infrastructure, evaluate the data accumulated and begin to identify and prioritize system improvements projects to address I&I and capacity deficiencies. This project will begin the process by completing a Sanitary Sewer Evaluation Survey (SSES) focused on the oldest areas of the City's collection system, which are the basins containing vitrified clay pipe (VCP). This project will CCTV all pipe, as well as evaluate all manholes in the selected basins, plus provide smoke testing, dye testing and lateral investigations as needed within the identified basins.

SSOs will be addressed in the following areas: Railroad Crossing Rehab, Cherry Brook Ct., Ironwood/Runnymeade, Maple Grove Cemetery, 300 Edgewood and other miscellaneous areas.

Currently the City of Nicholasville serves over 10,400 residential and over 830 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Bob Amato abstained from the vote. *Mr.* Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A21-032) in an amount up to \$817,000 to the City of Nicholasville with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL

COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B21-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$256,200 TO THE CITY OF BEREA, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Berea's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$256,200 for the Madison County Airport – Sewer Line Extension project.

Currently, the Madison County Airport lacks the necessary infrastructure to adequately meet future transportation needs. Compounding the issue are EKU's Aviation Program, workforce training and increased airport traffic. The increase in people utilizing the airport daily will strain the existing infrastructure and the outdated septic system used for sewer treatment. The existing septic system has already been expanded once and is quickly approaching capacity. In addition, there are residents and planned developments along the proposed route that currently do not have benefit of a sewer system. Design and construction of a new force main would allow those developments to benefit from this new sewer system. This project will result in the construction of approximately 12,000 LF of 4" sewer lines and approximately two new manholes.

The Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) funding portion is still pending at this time.

Currently the City of Berea serves over 5,450 residential and over 450 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Bobby Aldridge moved to approve the Fund B Loan, (B21-001), in an amount up to \$256,200 to the City of Berea with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F21-045) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,680,000 TO THE CITY OF ALBANY, CLINTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Albany's request for a Fund F Loan, F21-045, in the amount of \$2,680,000 for the Water Treatment Plant (A & B) improvement project. "WTP A" portion will replace flocculator No. 1, install variable frequency drives (VFDs) on high service pumps No. 1 - 3, replace 6" sedimentation basic drain valve, remove existing sludge from sludge lagoons for proper disposal, repair existing chemical lift elevator, furnish one chemical drum transfer pump, replace filter media, and repair or replace miscellaneous electrical system. "WTP B" portion will replace raw water pump No. 3, refurbish exterior of raw water MCC building, install VFDs on each high service pump, replace 10" gate valves at each high service pump, remove existing fans and louvers, install new chemical feed pumps, replace filter media, repair raw water control valve, repair or replace miscellaneous electrical system, and replace various SCADA system items. The project will also install nine new master meters throughout the distribution system.

The City currently serves approximately 6,200 retail customers and provides wholesale water to the Cumberland County Water District which is a PSC regulated utility. The wholesale rates are subject to PSC approval.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund F Loan, in an amount up to \$2,680,000 to the City of Albany with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Keene commended Ms. Williams, Transportation Secretary Jim Gray and State Budget Director, John Hicks for their presentation. He said several of his colleagues had contacted him and told him how well they represented KIA with their discussion on the Grant Programs.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A17-028 to the Oldham County Environmental Authority on February 2nd, 2017, in the amount of \$6,300,000, and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved an assumption November 7th, 2019 of Oldham County Environmental Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan A17-028 by the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District in the amount of \$6,300,000, and

WHEREAS, the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District requested to increase loan A17-028 loan by \$1,100,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$7,400,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Orchard Grass Regional WWTP Phase 3 – Ash Avenue Interceptor Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of July, 2021.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District (MSD) is requesting a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$1,100,000, to the loan originally approved February 2nd, 2017 to the Oldham County Environmental Authority (OCEA) in the amount of \$6,300,000 for a new KIA total loan amount of \$7,400,000. The increase is to fund additional work including eliminating a pump station and increasing the pipe diameter to facilitate future regionalization opportunities. MSD acquired OCEA effective July 1st, 2020 and assumed all of OCEA's outstanding debt with KIA. The original loan terms remain the same.

The project's additional costs are associated with eliminating the Fox Run Pump Station and increase pipe diameter to facilitate future regionalization and pump station elimination opportunities. Upper Floyds Fork Interceptor will have connection upgrades that include a stream crossing of Floyds Fork, will reduce excess pumping and advance regionalization initiatives. Overall the sewer is now primarily gravity reliant which has increased construction costs due to larger pipe, deeper sewers and increased rock removal.

Currently the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD system serves 221,796 residential and over 21,700 commercial and industrial customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018 (census data for OCEA used to originally set the interest rate), the Utility's Oldham County population was 60,940 with service area population of 24,679 and a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$60,002. The median household income for the Commonwealth was \$48,392. The project will continue to qualify for a 1.75% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the

operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 14.3% from \$279 million in 2018 to \$319 million in 2020. The \$319 million includes \$6.9 million in wastewater revenues that are related to the OCEA acquisition. MSD's board can approve rate increases up to 7% without needed approval from Louisville Metro Council which they have done in 2018 and 2019 audited years and 5% in 2020 driving the annual increases in revenue. Wastewater service charges totaled \$237.8 million in 2020 while storm water service charges totaled \$75 million. Operating expenses increased 17.6% during the same time period from \$93.8 million to \$110.3 million. Expense increases were attributed mostly to increased operations and maintenance expenses in connection with the OCEA as well as various weather events (flooding) that occurred during the audited period observed. The debt coverage ratio for 2018-2020 was 1.62, 1.63, and 1.71 respectively (includes only net operating income).

The 1993 Sewer and Drainage System Revenue Bond Resolution requires MSD to provide available revenues sufficient to pay 110% of each year's aggregate net debt service on revenue bonds and 100% of operating expenses. Each year MSD's audit contains a Comparative Schedule of Debt Service Coverage which includes net operating income as well as other sources of revenue including investment income and current period payments of property owner assessments. When factoring in those additional revenue streams, MSD's debt coverage ratio from 2018-2020 was 1.6, 1.6, and 1.7 respectively. Moody's Investors Service affirmed an Aa3 rating for MSD on September 14, 2020 for outstanding senior revenue bonds with a stable outlook. S&P Rating Service affirmed an AA long term rating and stable outlook on September 11, 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 3.6, 31.1 days sales in accounts receivable, and 10.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 6.9% each forecasted year due to rate increases anticipated from MSD's Board.
- 2) Expenses will increase 4% for inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses for pending projects.
- 3) The forecast includes debt service for three approved KIA loans for MSD including A19-015, A19-028 and A21-022 (total of \$34,140,000).
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 and above during the projected FY 2021-2025.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-023) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,106,295 TO THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A20-023) to the City of Bedford on July 9th, 2020, in the amount of \$909,500 and the City of Bedford has requested to increase loan A20-023 by \$196,795; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Bedford, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such

statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$1,106,295 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Bedford for the Bedford Wastewater System Improvements Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$454,750 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$651,545 shall be repaid

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$54,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of July, 2021.

Bedford has repaired, rehabilitated, and replaced the components in the three stations until the suppliers and other utilities could no longer provide parts due to being obsolete. Pump station #1 serves the Trimble County High School and Elementary School. If it fails, the schools would be forced to close until it became operational again. This pump station will also be relocated to avoid stream erosion. Pump station #2 will be relocated away from its current steep incline for easier access and service. Pump station #3 serves nearly the entire wastewater collection system of Bedford. It receives flow from the other stations and pumps to the treatment plant. All three pumps/motors have surpassed their life expectancy. One has failed completely, one leaks significantly and the failure of the third pump would leave the system without the ability to convey the wastewater to the treatment plant and cause significant sanitary sewer overflows.

The City serves 320 customers in Trimble County.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2013-2017, the Utility's service area population was 957 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$31,399. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$46,535. The project will continue at a 0.5% interest rate with a 30-year loan.

VIII. 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2018-2020 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2020 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Sewer revenues decreased 5.0% from \$233 thousand in 2018 to \$221 thousand in 2020, and operating expenses decreased 8.6% from \$209 thousand to \$192 thousand during the same period primarily due to a reduction in repairs, maintenance and salary expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 0.7, 1.0, and 0.8 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.7, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 38.5 days sales in accounts receivable, and 4.0 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will need to increase 3% for each fiscal year 2022, 2023 and 2024 to meet the 1.1 debt coverage ratio.
- 2) The City of Bedford has confirmed \$250,000 in county stimulus funds, \$107,000 in city ARPA funding and \$500,000 in Trimble County Fiscal Court ARPA funding for this project. The \$857,000 in total committed funds are envisioned to reduce the need for a larger loan increase request.
- 3) Expenses will increase at a 2% due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$54,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$1,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-040) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,944,345 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DEPARTMENT (MSD), OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer Department, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$2,944,345 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD for the Oldham County Environmental Authority (OCEA) Lift Station Rehab, Renovation and Replacement Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of July, 2021.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's Oldham county population was 60,940 with a service area population of 19,684 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$56,372. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. The project will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate since the project contributes to regionalization of the system.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020 from the combined wastewater and storm water funds. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 14.3% from \$279 million in 2018 to \$319 million in 2020. The \$319 million includes \$6.9 million in wastewater revenues that are related to the OCEA acquisition. MSD's board can approve rate increases up to 7% without needed approval from Louisville Metro Council which they have done in 2018 and 2019 audited years and 5% in 2020 driving the annual increases in revenue. Wastewater service charges totaled \$237.8 million in 2020 while storm water service charges totaled \$75 million.

Operating expenses increased 17.6% during the same time period from \$93.8 million to \$110.3 million. Expense increases were attributed mostly to increased operations and maintenance expenses in connection with the OCEA as well as various weather events (flooding) that occurred during the audited period observed. The debt coverage ratio for 2018-2020 was 1.62, 1.63, and 1.71 respectively (includes only net operating income).

The 1993 Sewer and Drainage System Revenue Bond Resolution requires MSD to provide available revenues sufficient to pay 110% of each year's aggregate net debt service on revenue bonds and 100% of operating expenses. Each year MSD's audit contains a Comparative Schedule of Debt Service Coverage which includes net operating income as well as other sources of revenue including investment income and current period payments of property owner assessments. When factoring in those additional revenue streams, MSD's debt coverage ratio from 2018-2020 was 1.6, 1.6, and 1.7 respectively. Moody's Investors Service affirmed an Aa3 rating for MSD on September 14, 2020 for outstanding senior revenue bonds with a stable outlook. S&P Rating Service affirmed an AA long term rating and stable outlook on September 11, 2020.

The 2020 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.2, a debt to equity ratio of 3.6, 31.1 days sales in accounts receivable, and 10.9 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will increase 6.9% each forecasted year due to rate increases anticipated from MSD's Board.
- 2) Expenses will increase 4% for inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses for pending projects.
- 3) The forecast includes debt service for three approved KIA loans for MSD including A19-015, A19-028 and A21-022 (total of \$34,140,000).
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 and above during the projected FY 2021-2025.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains Debt Reserve Accounts equal to the maximum annual debt service requirements on its senior lien obligations (currently \$151.1 million). No additional replacement reserves will be required for this loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B21-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$200,000 TO THE CITY OF MIDWAY, WOODFORD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Midway, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund Ioan commitment for an amount up to \$200,000 of project expense, to the City of Midway for the Gayland Drive Rehabilitation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the Ioan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this Ioan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$10,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 1st day of July, 2021.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 1,722 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$60,573. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a standard 2.00% interest rate for 20 years.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues decreased 23.1% from \$291,201 in 2018 to \$224,006 in 2020 due to a 25% decrease in sewer rates as reflected in the rate chart above. The rate decrease was implemented as a result of the retirement of all sewer system debt. Operating expenses increased 22.5% from \$197,911 to \$242,452 during the same period primarily due to increases in contractual services, materials, insurance and supply costs. The debt coverage ratio was 0.6, 0.2 in 2018 and 2019. The city had no debt associated with the sewer system in 2020.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 23.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.0, 40.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer rates will remain constant.
- 2) The City of Midway pledges \$60,000 per year in General Fund revenues to the Sewer Fund beginning FY2022 for the repayment of debt service for the life of this loan.
- 3) Expenses will rise 2% due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$10,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 1st day of July, 2021.
