I. PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present.

Commissioner Keene noted there would be one vote for both sets of the submitted Minutes from the May 27th and the June 3rd meetings.

A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the minutes of the May 27th special called meeting and the June 3, 2021, regular board meeting. Mayor Les Stapleton seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Keene said the four submitted Interest Rates would be discussed by Ms. Williams and one vote would be taken for all four after the discussion.

B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND A INTEREST RATES AND ADMINSTRATIVE FEES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

Ms. Sandy Williams, KIA discussed the interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Loans. Fund A loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.0% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.0% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2022 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may establish an interest rate on the Fund A loan that would create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund A loan.

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund A loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022. shall be 0.2%.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND F INTEREST RATES AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

The interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund "F" loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.00% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.00% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2022 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may on a case by case basis direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund F loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund F loan.

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund F loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, shall be 0.25%.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND B INTEREST RATES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

The interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund B loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and three nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.00%. Two nonstandard rates shall be 1.00% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2022 Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plans. The rate for all broadband projects shall be 4.00% (the third nonstandard rate.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may establish an interest rate on the Fund B loan that would create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund B loan.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND C INTEREST RATES AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2021 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund C loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022, shall be 0.20%.

Mayor Les Stapleton moved to approve the 2021-2022 interest rates for Fund A, F, B, and C as presented. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded and the motion was unanimously passed.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE ENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A17-028) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,400,000 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT (MSD), OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the Louisville & Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's request for a Fund A Loan increase in the amount of \$1,100,000, to the loan originally approved February 2nd, 2017 to the Oldham County Environmental Authority (OCEA) in the amount of \$6,300,000 for a new KIA total loan amount of \$7,400,000. The increase is to fund additional work including eliminating a pump station and increasing the pipe diameter to facilitate future regionalization opportunities. MSD acquired OCEA effective July 1st, 2020 and assumed all of OCEA's outstanding debt with KIA. The original loan terms remain the same.

The project's additional costs are associated with eliminating the Fox Run Pump Station and increasing pipe diameter to facilitate future regionalization and pump station elimination opportunities. Upper Floyds Fork Interceptor will have connection upgrades that include a stream crossing of Floyds Fork, will reduce excess pumping and advance regionalization initiatives. Overall, the sewer is now primarily gravity reliant which has increased construction costs due to larger pipe, deeper sewers and increased rock removal.

Currently, the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD system serves 221,796 residential and over 21,700 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the Fund A Loan, (A17-028), increase in an amount up to \$1,100,000 to the Louisville & Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District for a total loan of \$7,400,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-023) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,106,295 TO THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Bedford's request for a Fund A Loan increase of \$196,795, to the originally approved amount of \$909,500 to supplement the Bedford Wastewater System Improvements project initially approved on July 9, 2020, which will bring the new total KIA loan amount up to \$1,106,295. The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted due the shortage of supplies, the project scope remains the same.

This project will replace the three wastewater pump stations that are original to the wastewater system since the 1980s, using the fourth station already in place in the system as the standard. Bedford has repaired, rehabilitated, and replaced the components in the three stations until the suppliers and other utilities could no longer provide parts due to being obsolete. Pump station #1 serves the Trimble County High School and Elementary School. If it fails, the schools would be forced to close until it became operational again. This pump station will also be relocated to avoid stream erosion. Pump station #2 will be relocated away from its current steep incline for easier access and service. Pump station #3 serves nearly the entire wastewater collection system of Bedford. It receives flow from the other stations and pumps to the treatment plant. All three pumps/motors have surpassed their life expectancy. One has failed completely, one leaks significantly and the failure of the third pump would leave the system without the ability to convey the wastewater to the treatment plant and cause significant sanitary sewer overflows.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A loan, (A20-023), increase to the City of Bedford in an amount of \$196,795, for a total loan amount of \$1,106,295 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City of Bedford will pass an ordinance to increase the sewer rate by 3% for each fiscal year 2022, 2023 and 2024 to be effective each July 1st. Mr. Carey Johnson seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

7. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-040) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,944,345 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DEPARTMENT (MSD), OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's (MSD) request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$2,944,345 for the OCEA Lift Station Rehab, Renovation and Replacement project. This project will rehab or replace 3 lift stations at Club Drive, Cliffwood Drive and Cardinal Harbor. MSD acquired the Oldham County Environmental Authority (OCEA) effective July 1st, 2020 and assumed all of OCEA's outstanding debt with KIA. The original loan invitation was made to OCEA.

The project will replace Cardinal Harbor lift station. The Cliffwood Drive lift station is being replaced and relocated. The Club Drive lift station is begin eliminated. The new lift stations will eliminate sewer overflows and basement backups due to lift station failures.

Currently the Louisville and Jefferson County MSD system serves 221,796 residential and over 21,700 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Bobby Aldridge moved to approved the Fund A Loan, (A20-040). to the Louisville & Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District for an amount up to \$2,944,345 with the standard conditions. Mr. Russ Rose seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

8. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B21-004) FOR

AN AMOUNT UP TO \$200,000 TO THE CITY OF MIDWAY, WOODFORD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Alex Fisher, KIA, discussed the City of Midway's request for a Fund B Loan in the amount of \$200,000 for the Gayland Dr. Rehabilitation project.

This project will replace 1,949 linear feet of aging storm water conveyance pipes and structures, sanitary pipes and structures, and rehabilitate affected roadways on Gayland Dr. and Merrywood Dr. Currently the City of Midway serves 730 residential and commercial customers.

Judge Mark McKenzie moved to approve the Fund B loan, (B21-004), for an amount up to \$200,000 to the City of Midway with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City of Midway shall pledge \$60,000 per year in General Fund revenue to the Sewer Fund beginning FY2022 for the repayment of debt service for the life of this loan. The Assistance Agreement shall be modified to reflect a lien on both system revenues and \$60,000 of pledged General Fund revenue of the city of Midway.

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Bobby Aldridge seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Deputy Executive Director Sandy Williams addressed the group and noted that as of the start of the Board meeting there had been 288 applications submitted for the Cleaner Water Program Grants, representing 71 of our 120 counties, totaling just over \$505,000,000 in grant requests. Fifty-six of those applicants are for unserved drinking water projects, totaling just over \$125,000,000 and 16 of are for Federal Consent Decree projects, totaling just over \$120,000,000. There is significant interest in these grant funds. KIA will begin announcing recipients as soon as they possibly can.

Regarding the Broadband Development Fund Grants, the Finance Cabinet has issued a Request for Information asking the Internet Service Providers, (ISP), some questions that will help KIA formulate our Broadband Grant Request for Proposals. Broadband is new to us and we are asking them "what we don't know." The Request for Information is due back on July 12th.

Regarding the Ordinary and Emergency Administrative Regulations that the Board passed for the Drinking Water and Wastewater Grants, also called the Cleaner Water Program Grants; the

Public Hearing is scheduled for July 27th at 10:00 a.m. at our office, 100 Airport Road, Frankfort. The public comment period runs through the end of the month, 11:59 p.m. on July 31st.

KIA staff has a meeting scheduled with the auditors to begin the 2020 audit on July 16th.

Ms. Williams has been appointed by the EPA Region IV to be on the State EPA Workgroup for the State Revolving Fund (SRF), as well as named State Co-Chair. Kentucky will be represented on the federal level working with state officials and EPA representatives.

Ms. Williams announced the hiring of Mr. John Brady as a new Financial Loan Analyst, beginning on June 16th. Mr. Brady said he was thankful to be at KIA and looked forward to working with everyone in the future. There will be two, possibly three additional positions posted in the near future, which should get us up to full staff. Commissioner Keene congratulated Ms. Williams on her appointment to the EPA Workgroup.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-007) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000 TO THE CITY OF PAINTSVILLE F/B/O PAINTSVILLE UTILITIES COMMISSION, JOHNSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Paintsville f/b/o Paintsville Utilities Commission, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,500,000 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Paintsville f/b/o Paintsville Utilities Commission for the Kentucky Hwy 23 Sewer Extension project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$750,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$750,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$76,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of August, 2021.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Paintsville ("City") f/b/o Paintsville Utilities Commission is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,500,000 for the KY Hwy 23 Sewer Extension project. This project will expand the sewer system to free up capacity at the Paintsville WWTP by diverting waste to the Honey Branch WWTP. Currently Paintsville WWTP is operating over capacity and is under a Sewer Sanction so it is unable to issue any additional sewer taps.

The project will provide new infrastructure to create some sewer redundancy in the community, aid the overcapacity issue at the Paintsville WWTP, eliminate the Sewer Sanction tap freeze and eliminate two package treatment plants (one at Highland Elementary and the other at VIP Fuels in Hagerhill). By lifting the tap freeze this project will open up opportunities to add potential sewer taps including additional residential, commercial and industrial customers.

Currently the Paintsville Utilities Commission serves over 2,200 residential and over 490 commercial and industrial customers.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 8,241 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$35,333. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 0.25% interest rate with a 30-year term.

VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

1) Green Project Reserve - This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.

2) Additional Subsidization – This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$750,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented. HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 7.3% from \$5.86 million in 2018 to \$6.39 in 2020 while operating expenses increased 7.6% from \$4.38 million to \$4.71 million during the same period primarily due to a 4.6% increase in maintenance, repair, material and supply costs. The audited proprietary fund consists of water, sewer and gas systems, and where feasible all gas system debt and revenues have been removed from the analysis. The debt coverage ratio was 0.7, 0.6, and 0.3 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.6, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 61.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues have been raised 2.3% and 1.4% for fiscal years 2021 and 2022 respectively. Both water and sewer have an annual CPI clause, which is set at 2% for projected years 2023, 2024 and 2025.
- 2) Operating expenses are projected to increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$76,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$3,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A21-044) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF SOMERSET, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Somerset, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$4,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Somerset for the Pitman Creek Improvement & S US 27 Phase 2 Sewer Extension Project. Such

amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$11,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$226,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of August. 2021.

The City of Somerset ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$4,500,000 for the Pitman Creek WWTP Improvements and S US 27 Phase 2 Sewer Extensions project.

Project scope:

- Construct a new Sludge Dewatering Facility and Septage Receiving Station at the Pitman Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP).
- Rehabilitation of Somerset's Grit Removal Structure located upstream of Pitman Creek WWTP.
- Installation of permanent inflow and infiltration (I & I) detection equipment at Sinking Creek WWTP.
 - The I & I monitoring system will allow the city to accurately determine the amount of inflow and infiltration within the oldest portions of the collection system.
 - Sinking Creek WWTP is no longer a permitted discharge facility; however, the city continues to maintain and operate the aerated facultative lagoon that serves as pre-treatment for Pitman Creek WWTP.
- Construct a 50-foot riparian buffer including riparian plants along Pitman Creek.
- Construct a new 150 gpm sewage pumping station, sewage force main and gravity sewers to accommodate flow from the new Horse Soldier Distillery. These sewers will tie into an existing 10-inch gravity sewer located on South US 27.

The City of Somerset has had numerous violations involving solids processing at Pitman Creek WWTP and is under an Agreed Order to correct related issues. Somerset is currently limited in the times they can land apply sludge to their permitted land farm due to Climate Change, with the area seeing frequent record breaking rainfall events. Additionally, the current owner of Somerset's Land farm has given Somerset notice of their intention to terminate the property lease to Somerset, forcing the City to seek a permit for a new site. This means that Somerset needs to haul sludge to a nearby landfill, but they cannot accomplish this task without first

dewatering waste sludge.

Currently, the City of Somerset serves almost 5,000 residential and over 2,000 commercial and industrial customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 12,942 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$27,420. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$48,392. The project will qualify for a 30-year term with a 0.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2020 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project does not qualify for Green Project Reserve (GPR) funding.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Wastewater total revenues increased 6.2% from \$2.76 million in 2018 to \$2.93 in 2020 while wastewater operating expenses increased 2.2% from \$2.13 million to \$2.18 million during the same period primarily due to increased maintenance costs. The debt coverage ratio was 0.8, 0.9, and 1.1 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.7, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 41.9 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

After discussing the need for a rate increases for the City's wastewater rates to keep up with inflation and debt service for this loan, Somerset set in ordinance these items:

 Wastewater revenues for Somerset residential customers will increase according to the Consumers Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U statistic) beginning July 1, 2021 (FY2022). 2) For fiscal years 2022 and 2023 the wastewater residential rates are set to increase 4% each year. Fiscal year 2024 the rate will increase 6% to continue to meet the 1.1 debt coverage ratio.

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) For projection years FY 2023, 2024 and 2025 the increase for CPI-U will be 2%.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2024 when principal and interest repayments begin with the projected increases.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$226,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$11,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F20-002) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,602,975 TO THE CITY OF LEBANON F/B/O LEBANON WATER WORKS COMPANY INC., MARION COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Loan (F20-002) to the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company Inc. on March 5th, 2020, in the amount of \$5,238,230 and the City of Lebanon has requested to increase loan F20-002 by \$1,602,975; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company Inc., subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$6,841,205 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lebanon f/b/o Lebanon Water Works Company Inc. for the Lebanon Main Replacement Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,300,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$5,541,205 shall be repaid

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$17,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$342,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of August, 2021.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Lebanon ("City") is requesting a Fund F loan increase of \$1,602,975 to the originally approved amount of \$5,238,230 to supplement the Main Line Replacement project initially approved on March 5th, 2020, which will bring the new total KIA loan amount up to \$6,841,205. The increase is due to higher bids than budgeted due the escalating prices of 6" and 8" PVC pipe. Additionally, the city has elected to remove some replacement of meters along with a small number of roads to limit the cost overruns.

This project will replace old water mains located along Old Calvary Road and other main feed lines through downtown and central supply areas. The scope of work involves replacing 80,000 linear feet of old cast iron lines, galvanized water mains of various sizes, and adjacent old service lines. Many of the older service lines may still have lead gooseneck connections that will be removed. The purpose of this project is to improve water quality and increase flow in areas where pipes are prone to frequent breaks and leaks. The removal of potential lead connections will also ensure safe water distribution to the customers.

The City produces 86% of its water supply and purchases the remainder from the City of Campbellsville ("Campbellsville") to serve approximately 2,600 retail customers and supplies wholesale water to the Marion County Water District (MCWD) which is a PSC regulated utility.

The City serves over 2,500 residential and 89 commercial and industrial customers in Marion County.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2013-2017, the Utility's service area population was 6,144 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$30,025. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$46,535. The increase will continue the original terms of 0.50% interest rate for 30 years and \$1,300,000 in principal forgiveness.

VII. 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

Additional Subsidization – This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$1,300,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2018 through June 30, 2020. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 11.2% from \$3.04 million in 2018 to \$3.38 million in 2020 due to volume and rate increases. Operating expenses decreased 1.7% from \$2.30 million to \$2.26 million during the same period. The water purchase costs went up from \$146,500 in 2018 to \$367,350 in 2019 after the City began to purchase water from Campbellsville in 2018. The Maintenance and Repairs and employee costs were higher in 2020, but were offset with decreases in power and miscellaneous expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 1.4, 1.4, and 1.4 in 2018, 2019, and 2020 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.7, a debt to equity ratio of 1.4, 49.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.1 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) In City and Outside City rates will go up 3.7% July 1st, 2021 due to a previously approved retail rate increase.
- 2) The amount of purchased water for the Campbellsville Service Agreement will remain stable through the projected years.
- 3) Water treatment costs will increase 2% during the projected years to account for potential added volume used by Diageo Distillery.
- 4) Operating expenses other than water purchase and treatment costs will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.5 in 2024 when full year principal and interest repayments are expected to begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$342,000 total) of the final amount borrowed prior to principal forgiveness to be funded annually (\$17,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 5th day of August, 2021.
