PROCEEDINGS

Mr. Ron Lovan, First Vice-Chair, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He asked Ms. Suzanne Molley, DLG Staff Attorney, to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of June 18, 2019

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the minutes of the June 18, 2019, regular board meeting. Ms. Gwen Pinson seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,500,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE F/B/O HOPKINSVILLE WATER ENVIRONMENT AUTHORITY, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, and Mr. Derrick Watson, HWEA, discussed the City of Hopkinsville's, for the benefit of the Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority (HWEA), request for a Fund A loan, (A19-003) in an amount up to \$7,500,000 for the Expand Hammond-Wood Wastewater Treatment Plant and Interceptor project. Prior KIA Loan A16-005 (\$1,500,000), which funded the planning and design of this project, will be rolled into this increment of the loan for a total of \$9,000,000.

The purpose of this project is to improve water quality of local streams as well as improve the ability of the system to meet permit limits due to aging and failing infrastructure. This project will renovate and expand the Hammond-Wood Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) from 6MGD to 9MGD capacity. The expansion and renovation of the plant is needed in order to serve the current and future needs of Hopkinsville and the City of Pembroke. Capacity will be reached in the foreseeable future, particularly considering the WWTP receives additional flows from the recent closing of the Northside WWTP in Hopkinsville and continued industrial expansion projects in the Hopkinsville area. The project will also ensure that the effluent meets the permit requirements, and allow an increase in flow to the plant to handle surcharge in the collection system due to inflow and infiltration.

This project will include a bid option for a new bio-solids drying process with solar drying equipment at the treatment plant. If the utility determines that this is a viable option financially, the project will be modified. The total project cost without solar drying is currently estimated to be \$42,880,000. The project with the solar drying cost estimate is \$51,680,000. If HWEA determines that they will go with the solar drying option, KIA will perform the next incremental funding analysis based on those numbers.

Hammond-Wood WWTP currently serves over 12,000 customers in Christian County including the cities of Hopkinsville and Pembroke. In addition, Hopkinsville Water Environment Authority also provides sewer service to the cities of Crofton and Oak Grove and drinking water to the cities of Hopkinsville, Pembroke, and Crofton. HWEA will be expanding to include gas operations in the near future. The Utility currently has a gas line construction project in progress to serve commercial customers along US 41A and Hopkinsville's Southpark Industrial Park. Lines in that area could be operational as early as July 2019.

Mr. Derrick Watson, HWEA, thank the KIA Board and Staff for the funding opportunity.

Ms. Sandy Williams inquired about the \$33,800,000 in the projected KIA financing for 2021 and 2022 and the possibility of funds not being available in the future. Executive Director McNeil said the future funding should be available with repayments and through the projections for the Capitalization Grant for the upcoming years.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-003) in an amount up to \$7,500,000 with the standard conditions. Ms. Sandy Williams seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Ron Lovan noted that Agenda items #2 and #3 for the City of Elkton would be presented together, with two separate votes at the conclusion of discussion.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A19-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,934,451 TO THE CITY OF ELKTON, TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, and Mr. Arthur Green, City of Elkton, discussed the City of Elkton's request for a Fund A loan, (A19-001) in an amount up to \$3,934,451 for the Wastewater System Rehabilitation and Improvements project. This loan total includes the existing Planning and Design loan for the project, A18-015, in the amount of \$500,000. The purpose of this project is to eliminate sanitary sewer overflows and improve efficiency in the wastewater treatment process for the City of Elkton. The City has significant issues with excessive wet weather sanitary sewer flows in its wastewater collection system including existing constructed overflows (located at two existing pumping stations). These overflows are active during significant rainfall events. The Kentucky Division of Water has issued a deadline of June, 2020 for the elimination of Elkton's two existing sanitary sewer overflows (SSO's). On several occasions during the recent past, it has been noted that wet weather flows at the Elkton Wastewater Treatment Plant were greater than 1,000,000± gallons per day compared to typical dry weather average daily flow of 100,000± per day. This resulting wet weather to dry weather flow peaking factor is over 10:1 and is very high. The planned system evaluation and rehabilitation will result in reduced overflow events, and the improvements to pump stations and treatment facilities will maximize the effectiveness of the process and improve efficiency throughout the treatment process.

The planning portion of the project included field investigations, evaluation of pump stations and the wastewater treatment plant, preparation of an SSES report, and a

Preliminary Engineering Report. The alternatives and recommendations included in these reports resulted in the design of two construction contracts.

Contract 1 - Sewer System Rehabilitation

Work to be included under the Wastewater Collection System Rehabilitation Contract includes the installation of cured-in-place pipe of the following amounts and sizes: approximately 403 LF of 6 inch pipe, 18,508 LF of 8 inch pipe, 918 LF of 10 inch pipe, and 268 LF of 15 inch pipe. The project also includes the replacement of 50 LF of 8 inch gravity sewer lines, 20 point line repairs, 58 service lateral connection replacements, installation of one 4 foot diameter manhole, and repairs to approximately 54 manholes, along with all related work. These repairs are located throughout the sewer system.

Ms. Adams noted that the City of Elkton had already met their first special condition of raising rates to generate the \$95,000 minimum in annual review.

Ms. Gwen Pinson moved to approve the City of Elkton's request for a Fund A Loan (A19-001) for an amount up to \$3,934,451 with the standard conditions and the following special conditions: 1.) The City of Elkton shall pass an ordinance to increase rates enough to generate a minimum of \$95,000 in additional annual revenues (approximately 9% of total water and sewer revenues or 20% of sewer revenues) by July 1, 2019. 2.) A conditional assistance agreement will be executed if the contracts are not bid and awarded at the same time. Mr. Brent O'Neill seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-035) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$170,000 TO THE CITY OF ELKTON, TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Ashley Adams, KIA, and Mr. Arthur Green, City of Elkton, discussed the City of Elkton's request for a Fund F Loan, (F19-035), in an amount up to \$170,000 for the Water System Rehabilitation and Upgrade project. The purpose of the project is to improve pressures and flows for water service as well as address ongoing severe line breaks in the project area. This project will replace two existing 4 inch galvanized lines that are undersized along Popular Street and West Main Street along with a line on North Williams Lane that will be replaced with six inch main. In addition to the line upgrades, a new fire hydrant will be installed at the corner of Weathers Lane and West Main Street, capping off the line and taking out of service an existing 4 inch line that currently dead ends at the Court Square.

The City of Elkton serves approximately 900 customers in Todd County.

Mr. Arthur Green, City of Elkton addressed the group and thanked KIA for the opportunity and said that both DOW and KIA staff had been very helpful during the process.

Ms. Gwen Pinson moved to approve the Fund F Loan (F19-035) for an amount up to \$170,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Claude Christensen seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F19-044) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$835,000 TO THE CITY OF MORTONS GAP, HOPKINS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, and, Mayor Chris Phelps, discussed the City of Mortons Gap's request for a Fund F Loan, (F19-044) in an amount up to \$835,000 to fund the Water System Improvements project. The purpose of the improvements is to reduce water losses by minimizing response time and efforts in the event of a severe line break. The City has been experiencing significant water losses for a few years, creating a financial hardship on the City.

This project will replace existing plastic fittings with ductile iron, add valves to allow isolation of lines for maintenance, add or replace fire hydrants, install new radio read meters, replace all service tubing from the main to the meter, and create a new Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition system (SCADA) for the tank and master meter. The SCADA will allow the utility to remotely monitor (via radio or cellar) tank levels, master meter flows, pump on/off, etc.

The City purchases 100% of its water supply from the South Hopkins Water District, which is regulated by the Kentucky Public Service Commission, to serve approximately 450 customers in the city and surrounding areas.

Mayor Phelps, thanked the KIA Board for their assistance. He became Mayor in 2016 after the sudden retirement of the previous mayor. He said there had been major water loss issues throughout his time in office. The City had submitted paperwork for a Community Block Grant and now on their 4th submission, have gotten approval.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A19-044) for an amount up to \$835,000 with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Brett O'Neill seconded and the motion was unanimously approved

5. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

Ms. Sandy Williams moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. *Mr.* Claude Christensen seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND A INTEREST RATES AND ADMINSTRATIVE FEES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2019 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2020

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA discussed the interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund A loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.50% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.50% and 0.50% based on the income parameters defined in the 2020 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan. This is a .25% rate lower than 2018, for the standard and first non-standard rates.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority, may on a case by case basis, direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund A loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund A loan.

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, discussed the interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund "F" loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.50% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.50% and 0.50% based on the income parameters defined in the 2020 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan. This is a .25% rate lower than 2018, for the standard and first non-standard rates.

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA discussed the interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund B loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and three nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.50%. Two nonstandard rates shall be 1.50% and 0.50% based on the income parameters defined in the 2020 Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plans. The rate for all broadband projects shall be 4.00% (the third nonstandard rate). This is a .25% rate lower than 2018, for the standard and first non-standard rates.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may, on a case by case basis, direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund B loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund B loan

9. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND C INTEREST RATES AND ADMINISTRATIVE FEES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2019 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2020

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA discussed the interest rates for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund C loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, shall be as follows:

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund C loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, shall be 0.20%.

Ms. Sandy Williams asked if all the interest rates were lower than in 2018. Mr. Abshire stated they were, based on the bond rates lowering and market conditions at present time.

Mr. Claude Christensen made the motion to approve the interest rates as presented for Fund A, F, B, and C for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. Ms. Sandy Williams seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil noted the capital reimbursement resolution included an increase for the City of Cynthiana in an amount up to \$95,457, which is under the 10% of the total loan

amount of \$1,050,022, which the Executive Director can approve without Board approval. Their bids came in higher than expected.

She mentioned that at the June Board meeting Deputy Director Bridwell referenced the possibility of 11 projects being presented at the July Board meeting. Four projects were withdrawn from consideration at this time, but may come back in this next fiscal year. One borrower contacted KIA staff this morning to say they are possibly reconsidering. The financial analyst has already been done and the project could possibly be presented at the August 6th meeting if they chose to pursue the funding. The City of Hodgenville has accepted 2020 funding and will come back in the next fiscal year. The Greenup Joint Sewer Agency did not submit their application so their invitation expired. KIA plans to issue them another invitation this next funding cycle; tabled for the August meeting is a Fund A increase request from the City of Nicholasville and the City of Mayfield will be submitting a Fund B application. The City of Lebanon will be asking for a Fund A increase, due to bid overruns, which is the current trend. We expect to see more overruns in the future. An invitation will be sent to City of Hazard for a gas U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) project. KIA would be co-funding with EDA, which would be presented in August or possibly September.

Following the June 18th Board meeting, KIA held a public hearing for the 2020 Intended Use Plan (IUP) for the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. The public review and comment period ran from June 5th through July 5th. There were 26 invitations accepted, with 4 declinations, totaling \$59 million. There were no public comments submitted at that meeting.

The public hearing for the 2020 IUP Drinking Water State Revolving Fund will be held on July 17th at 1:30 p.m. at the KIA offices. The public review and comment period is from June 21st to July 22nd. Ten invitations have been accepted already, totally \$19.4 million, which is enough to cover our Federal Cap Grant, with four declinations. There is still \$40 million pending in invitations, with 25 additional applications possibly being submitted.

Director McNeil noted that KIA management and the financial analysts would be attending an EPA State Revolving Fund meeting in Atlanta the first week in August and would not be readily available for assistance during that timeframe.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A15-090) INCREASING THE AMOUNT TO \$906,446 TO THE CITY OF NICHOLASVILLE, JESSAMINE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Waste Water Revolving Fund Loan (A15-090) to the City of Nicholasville on April 2, 2015 in the amount of \$340,980 and the City of Nicholasville has requested to increase loan A15-090 by \$565,466; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Wastewater Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Nicholasville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of its Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and

Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Wastewater Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount to \$906,466 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Nicholasville for the Orchard SSO Relief and Brittany Heights Lift Station Elimination Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Authority staff at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the project cost authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a .20% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. A replacement reserve will not be required for this project. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2019.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

This project is requesting an increase of \$565,466 to an existing loan of \$340,980 originally approved on April 2, 2015. The increase is needed to fund a change in scope due to a completed sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) project that reduced the capacity of the sewer line into which this project was originally planned to flow.

The project consists of the installation of approximately 5,000 linear feet of 10-inch through 12-inch gravity sewers and related appurtenances. The project also includes the elimination of the existing Brittney Heights Lift Station, and modifications to the East Jessamine Middle School Lift Station to handle the diverted flows.

The original project description was: The project will replace and enlarge approximately 2,445 linear feet (LF) of existing gravity sewer lines to provide sufficient capacity to convey wastewater flows. The parallel and replacement sewers would be a combination of 10 and 12 inch diameter pipes.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Nicholasville is requesting a Fund A loan increase in the amount of \$565,466 for the Orchard SSO Relief and Brittany Lift Station Elimination project. The project was originally approved on April 2, 2015 in the amount of \$340,980.

The purpose of the project, as originally approved, was to provide sufficient capacity to convey wastewater flows downstream of, and in, the Orchard area of Nicholasville to improve surface water quality while also reducing the incidence and duration of wet weather overflows from seven existing manholes. The increase is needed to fund a change in scope due to a completed sanitary sewer overflow (SSO) project that reduced the capacity of the sewer line into which this project was originally planned to flow.

The City of Nicholasville experiences several recurring sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs) in the vicinity of Lake Mingo Park northeast of downtown. The sanitary sewer system in that area receives flow from the Brittney Heights Lift Station (BHLS), which serves several residential subdivisions including the Orchard Subdivision. Studies have shown that increasing system capacity downstream of the SSOs, per the original design, would likely cause new SSOs in the downtown area. Therefore the current project scope involves elimination of the Brittney Heights Lift Station with a new gravity sewer and upsizing a portion of the existing sewer system to divert the BHLS flow to the 30-inch Town Fork Interceptor downstream of downtown Nicholasville. The new gravity sewers will include capacity for potential new development along the route.

The project consists of the installation of approximately 5,000 linear feet of 10-inch through 12-inch gravity sewers and related appurtenances. The project also includes the elimination of the existing BHLS, and modifications to the East Jessamine Middle School Lift Station to handle the diverted flows.

The Nicholasville Sewer Department currently serves approximately 11,319 customers in Jessamine County.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2013 through June 30, 2018 (2016-2018 presented). The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

The City of Nicholasville accounts for sewer operations as a part of its Utilities Fund. The utilities fund encompasses water, sewer, and electricity. Certain categories of revenue and expense are combined between these activities thus preventing a completely independent analysis of the sewer system alone. For this reason the entire utility fund was analyzed and projected while separating out information for the sewer system where practical. Combined Revenues increased six percent from \$24.2 Million in 2016 to \$25.7 million in 2018. Expenses, not including depreciation, increased 7.6% from \$20.7 million in 2016 to \$22.3 million in 2018.

Cash flow before debt service available for debt service decreased 3.4% from \$3.7 million in 2016 to \$3.6 million in 2018.

The debt coverage ratio was 0.9 in 2016, 1.1 in 2017, and 0.9 in 2018.

The financial statements between 2013 and 2018 were reviewed extensively to determine the areas (water, sewer, or electric) that were contributing to the subpar debt coverage ratios. Between 2013 and 2018 the average yearly change in the net operating income (revenue minus expenses) generated by the individual funds was: electric 10% decrease, water 3.4% decrease, sewer 1.5% increase.

Electric had the biggest impact on the overall fund. Not only because it showed the largest decline but also because its revenues and expenses are much larger than that of water and sewer combined. 2018 Electric revenue was \$16.1 million compared to \$8.8 million for water and sewer combined. Of all expenses, not including depreciation, electric directly accounted for 69%. The purchase of electric alone was 63% of all expenses.

Analysis suggested that in recent years the electric purchase cost fluctuations were not being fully reimbursed through the city's system of rate adjustment. Projecting this trend into the future produced poor financial results.

Despite the above, the city was able to maintain current ratios of 1.1 or higher. Debt to equity of 0.8 or higher. Months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash of 9.6 in 2018.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues are projected at 0% growth through 2023, except:
 - A water rate increase of 6.4% was put into place during the 2019 FY.
 - Electric Revenues were adjusted based on a revised rate schedule proposed to go into effect during FY 2020.
- 2) Expenses were projected to increase 2% each year, except:
 - Water Purchases were projected to increase at 0.4% each year based on a very small amount of water purchases that are subject to possible rate increases without the normal wholesale rate recovery process.
 - Electric Purchase Costs:
 - Electric purchases costs for FY 2019 were adjusted based on overpayment refunds received.
 - FY 2020 purchase costs were revised downward reflecting

reduced rates from Kentucky Utilities.

- The electric purchase costs from 2020 to 2023 are projected to be flat. This is based upon the City's proposal to review the electric net operating income each year and True-Up costs not recovered during the past year. Those costs would be recovered in the rate adjustments for the coming year.
- 3) The debt coverage ratio is 1.6 in FY 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The Utility maintains a "Repair and Replacement fund" to make major repairs and replacements and to pay the cost of construction of additions, extensions and improvements. Based on this the original project was approved without a replacement reserve requirement. During the increase analysis, it was determined that the account averaged \$2,444,641 or 3.2% of property, plant, and equipment between 2016 and 2018. Based on this, the original credit review recommendation of no replacement reserve requirement is continued.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$2,450,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Allen County Water District for the US 231 Elevated Water Tank project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$6,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$122,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2019.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Allen County Water District ("District") is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,450,000 to fund the US 231 Elevated Water Tank project. The purpose of this project is to increase storage and improve water quality for the existing customers in a high growth area of Allen County.

This project will replace the existing Lambert Road ground storage with a 500,000 gallon elevated tank to address the short fill cycles and the lack of adequate storage in this part of the ACWD distribution system. The existing Lambert Road storage tank will be removed from operation and ultimately be decommissioned. In addition to the new elevated tank, approximately 9,000 LF of 8 inch PVC water line will be run along Bowling Green Road to transport water pumped via the Halfway Booster Station to the Walker Chapel Pressure Zone. The Halfway Booster Station will have some internal piping switched out for installation of a new master meter to aid in the District's water loss program.

The District is a Kentucky Public Service Commission regulated utility, purchasing 100% of its water supply from the City of Glasgow and the City of Scottsville to serve approximately 5,500 retail customers within Allen County and providing wholesale water to the City of Scottsville.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2018. In 2018, the District spent approximately \$245,000 in repair and maintenance work for the Highway 98 tank. As this is a non-recurring expense, the amount has been deducted from the operating expenses to provide a more realistic projection. The non-cash impact of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions has been removed from the operating expenses. GASB 75 – Other Postemployment Benefits is not applicable to the District's financial reporting. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Water revenues decreased 4.4% from \$2.61 million in 2016 to \$2.50 million in 2018 due to an exceptionally wet year and the District's efforts to conserve water consumption. Operating expenses increased 13.3% from \$2.08 million to \$2.36 million during the same period as a result of increased Transmission and Distribution costs for the Highway 98 tank repair and maintenance. The debt coverage ratio was 1.9, 2.0 and 0.8 for 2016, 2017, and 2018 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.3, debt to equity ratio of 0.4, 35.2 days sales in accounts receivable, and 1.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) The metered water sales will go up 7% in 2021 as required by the special condition assigned to this loan.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.4 in 2021 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$122,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$6,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$112,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS

The City of Mayfield is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$2,221,117 for the following four projects, two of which are already complete:

Existing 10th St. Wetwell and Force Main Project (SX21083055):

This project is to construct a new wet well and pump station, adjacent to the existing 10th St. wet well and pump station. The existing wet well will be rehabilitated with the pumps removed, and flow into the new wet well in order to prevent the relocation of four upstream gravity sewer lines that feed into the existing wet well. Additionally, a new force main (4" or 6") will be constructed to replace the existing 4" asbestos cement force main that currently flows away from the existing wet well. This new line will follow the alignment of the existing line. This is a change from the original project profile, which proposed a much larger 15" force main with a different alignment leaving the new pump station.

The purpose of the project is to alleviate the I/I from three manholes in the immediate vicinity of the existing wet well. The project scope has been reduced from the original project profile to eliminate the effort to consolidate flows from three existing package treatment plants. The smaller force main leaving the new wet well does not allow for adequate capacity for additional flows from the package plants. However, that consolidation is still part of the long term plans for Mayfield sewer service. Further engineering work will be necessary to complete that component.

Bar Screen for Todd Lift Station Project (SX21083061):

This project will replace the bar screen at the Todd lift station which frequently experiences issues due to an increase in garbage and medical waste.

Combination Sewer Cleaning Truck (SX21083047):

Reimbursement for the purchase of a sewer cleaning truck. This truck will help alleviate debris that builds up within sewer lines that restrict flow capacity. This will eliminate safety issues that workers encounter by limiting the confined space entries required for maintenance operations. The system has already purchased the truck.

Water Line Extension to Wildwood Subdivision (WX21083021):

This project, which has already been completed, ran approximately 3,300 linear feet of 6 inch water line to provide water and fire service to the unserved Wildwood Subdivision from Douthitt Road across the 121 bypass. Another 6 inch water line (approximately 1,000 LF) was installed from Douthitt Road across the 121 bypass to provide water and fire services to a commercial location.

Mayfield Electric and Water System serves nearly 5,000 water and sewer customers in the City of Mayfield and surrounding Graves County. Their operations also include electric and broadband.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2012-2016, the Utility's service area population for drinking water was 10,709 and 10,472 for waste water with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$26,755 and \$26,297, respectively. The median household income for the Commonwealth is \$44,811. The projects will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate based on MHI.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the water and sewer funds for the years ended June 30, 2016 through June 30, 2018. The noncash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016-2018 operating expenses and GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, has been removed from 2018 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 10% from \$3.7 million in 2016 to \$4 million in 2018. Historically, water and sewer revenues average about the same each year with sewer contributing slightly more during the observed time period. Combined operating expenses increased 6% from \$2.7 million in 2016 to \$2.9 million in 2018. Increases in operating expenses are mostly attributed to General and Administrative expenses which includes salaries and benefits.

The 2018 balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.1, a debt to equity ratio of 1.2, and 2.8 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash. Days sales in accounts receivable information was not available for the utility as accounts receivable is reported only in the electric fund and the focus of this analysis was on water and sewer, specifically.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase around 6% through 2021 while the majority (96%) of sewer revenues will increase 2% based on prior approved rate increases.
- 2) Expenses will increase 7% yearly for inflation as well as historical trends.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 4.8 in 2022 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$112,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$5,600 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6TH day of August, 2019.
