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PROCEEDINGS

Commissioner Dennis Keene, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the press notification distribution had been done appropriately and confirmed a quorum was present. Meg Link, KIA Secretary was asked to call the Roll.

I. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of June 4, 2020

Mr. Russ Rose moved to approve the minutes of the June 4, 2020, regular board meeting. Mr. Winston Miller seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A20-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,600,000 TO THE CITY OF PINEVILLE, BELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Anshu Singh, DOW, and Ms. Linda Bridwell, KIA, discussed the City of Pineville's request for a Fund A Loan, (A20-004) for an amount up to \$2,6000,000 for the Virginia Avenue/Courthouse Square Utility Replacements project. The purpose of this project is to separate the existing the storm and sanitary sewers in the four block area surrounding the Courthouse and the side streets.

The project consists of construction of approximately 4430 linear feet of gravity sewer line and 4088 linear feet of storm sewers, new storm sewer inlets, new curb and gutters, and replacement of existing sidewalks. This project is being funded with a previous planning and design loan as well as CDBG funds. This project will be funded for 30 years and is necessary to satisfy agreed order DOW CS 060162.

The City of Pineville serves 802 customers in Bell County.

Mr. Ron Lovan moved to approve the Fund A (A20-004), for an amount up to \$2,600,000 with the standard conditions and the following special condition: The City of Pineville will increase revenues by either instituting a rate increase ordinance that phases in rates over the time period of 2022 through 2024, or consider doing a CPI increase ordinance beginning in 2022. They will need to have a rate ordinance, effective no later than January 1, 2022 that raises sufficient revenues in place before we process the loan. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A17-014) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$909,500 TO THE CITY OF BEDFORD, TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

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Ms. Anshu Singh, DOW, and Ms. Linda Bridwell, KIA, discussed the City of Bedford's request for a Fund A Loan, A17-014, for an amount up to \$909,500 for the for the Bedford Wastewater System Improvements Project. The purpose of this project is to replace the three wastewater pump stations that are original to the wastewater system constructed in the early 1980s. All three have reached the end of their design life and useful life.

Bedford has repaired, rehabilitated, and replaced the components within the stations to extend the operating life as long as possible. The parts are now simply no longer available from any source. In some cases, back-up pumps are no longer functional and should the primary pumps fail, overflows will occur. Pump Station #1 (PS#1) serves the Trimble County High School and the Elementary School. If this station fails, the schools would be forced to close until the pump station is returned to operating capacity. Pump Station #2 (PS#2) is similar in size and condition to PS#1. It's also positioned on the edge of a steep incline. Preliminary assessments indicate the station could be moved uphill & placed in a better position for access and service. This move may require property acquisition and a new piping configuration. Pump Station #3 (PS#3) serves nearly the entire wastewater collection system of Bedford. Besides a few connections that flow to the treatment plant by gravity, this station receives flow from the other stations in the system and pumps the flow to the treatment plant. This project is also using a match of CDBG funding in order to complete this and a 30-year loan term.

The City serves 320 customers in Trimble County.

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the Fund A Loan (A17-014) for an amount up to 909,500 with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Director Edith Halbleib and Deputy Director Bridwell discussed the interest rates for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund A, Fund B, Fund C and Fund F Loans for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021.

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4. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND A INTEREST RATES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

The interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund A loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be as follows: One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.5% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.5% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2021 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may on a case by case basis direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund A loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund A loan.

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund A loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be 0.20%.

5. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND B INTEREST RATES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

The interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund B loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and three nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.50%. Two nonstandard rates shall be 1.50% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2021 Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plans. The rate for all broadband projects shall be 4.00% (the third nonstandard rate).

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may on a case by case basis direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund B loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund B loan.

6. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND C INTEREST RATES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

The interest rates for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund C loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be as follows:

Term Rate:

1 - 5 Years 2.00% 6 - 10 Years 2.25% 11 - 20 Years 2.75% Broadband Projects 4.00%

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The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund C loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be 0.20%.

7. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING FUND F INTEREST RATES FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2021

The interest rate for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund F loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 2.50% and the nonstandard rates shall be 1.50% and 0.25% based on the income parameters defined in the 2021 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority may on a case by case basis direct staff to establish an interest rate on the Fund F loan that would in effect create an effective interest rate equal to the appropriate standard rate or the nonstandard rate for the entire funding provided by the Authority in cases where Fund C, Governmental Agencies Program, funding is provided as supplemental funding to the Fund F loan.

The administrative fee for all Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Fund F loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021, shall be 0.25%.

Mr. Ron Lovan made the motion to approve the interest rates as presented for Fund A, B, C, and F for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded and the motion unanimously carried.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Edith Halbleib discussed the Intended Use Plans and Loan Invitations: The intended use plans' draft public comment period and the time for borrowers invited for first round loans, all conclude July 10, 2020. From that point the borrowers will have an additional 30 days to complete the applications. Staff is keeping a close watch on the acceptances, so that in the event we have some additional funding available, we will be able to send out additional loan invitations.

Currently, KIA has submitted 19 loan invitations for clean water projects. Of those, 11 have accepted, and 7 are still pending. Restated, about \$45 million remains currently available, if the loan invitations are not accepted. The KIA submitted 29 invitations for drinking water projects. Of those, 15 projects have been accepted and 11 are pending. If the pending is not accepted, an additional \$32 million will be available for additional loan invitations. The KIA will be starting the process of second round invitations, as soon as we identify the amounts. Between both, about \$10 million will be available due to declined invitations.

KIA has had a number of personnel changes in the past month. Dustin Horn, Geoprocessing III Specialist, left on July 3rd. The office also has an open financial analyst position. And there is another loan analyst position available. A new loan specialist, Alex Fisher will be starting next week. KIA wants to acknowledge an employee from the Division of Water, Buddy Griffin Environmental Control Supervisor,

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He has been with the Division of Water for 29 years and is retiring this month. he has been the environmental supervisor. We appreciate his years of service and wish him well and in his retirement.

Due to the number of open financial analyst positions, KIA has been working behind the scenes to make sure that the end-of year financial presentations are ready to submit for annual reporting. The end of the fiscal year occurred June 30, 2020. In the interim, the KIA has contracted with a financial consultant pursuant, to a request for proposals, to prepare the financial statements for the annual report. In addition, a former treasurer, Denise Pitts, has returned part-time, to assist in completing the year-end closeout. Finally, in an effort for KIA to have more financial transparency, the KIA is reviewing to supply regular financial reporting to be presented to the board.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A20-018) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,908,500 TO THE CITY OF CALVERT CITY, MARSHALL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Calvert City, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$2,908,500 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Calvert City for the WWTP Influent Lift Station and Plant Improvements project. Such amounts

are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$7,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$146,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2020.

Calvert City ("City") is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$2,908,500 for the WWTP Influent Lift Station and Plant Improvements project. This project will rehabilitate the influent lift station and headworks for the wastewater treatment plant, improve the disinfection, aeration and mixing systems, upgrade the SCADA and control system, and replace the outfall diffuser in the Tennessee River.

The City is currently under an Agreed Order issued by the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection to upgrade its wastewater collection and treatment facilities. The work associated with this project has been identified as necessary in the Corrective Action Plan to restore the ability to comply with the terms of the KPDES permit.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Consolidated water and sewer revenues increased 23.4% from \$1.63 million in 2017 to \$2.01 million in 2019 due to a combination of previously approved water and sewer rate increases, meter replacements, and industrial sales volume growth. Operating expenses increased 18.3% from \$1.31 million to \$1.55 million during the same period attributable to higher treatment, maintenance, and utility costs associated with volume increase. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 1.3, and 1.6 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.3, a debt to equity ratio of 0.2, 49.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 8.5 months operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will go up 14% and sewer 11% based on the approved rate increases that took effect on January 1, 2019.
- 2) The City will continue to apply the CPI adjustments to both water and sewer rates annually.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 2.7 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$146,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$7,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A20-019) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,000,000 TO THE CITY OF DAWSON SPRINGS, HOPKINS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Dawson Springs, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$1,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Dawson Springs for the Sanitary Sewer System Rehabilitation and WWTP Improvements project.

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$475,500 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$524,500 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$50,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2020.

VIII. 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

Additional Subsidization – This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$475,500 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019 for the Waterworks and Sewer System. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 16.3% from \$1.44 million in 2017 to \$1.68 in 2019 due to previously approved water and sewer rate increases. Wholesale water revenues to South Hopkins Water District increased 30.4% or \$200,000 from volume increase related to the escalated water losses in the District. Operating expenses increased 12.0% from \$1.21 million to \$1.35 million during the same period attributable to higher treatment costs for the increased wholesale volume. The debt coverage ratio was 0.9, 1.3, and 1.6 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.4, a debt to equity ratio of 0.7, 36.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Retail water and sewer revenues will continue to grow from the rate increases effective January 1, 2019.
- 2) Wholesale water revenues will go up 17% for a rate increase approved by the PSC to take effect on July 1, 2019.
- 3) Wholesale volume may decrease as the South Hopkins Water District improves the water loss control, which is expected to be offset by a combination of declined operating costs and periodic rate adjustments.
- 4) Expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2022 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$50,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A21-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$750,000 TO THE CITY OF LEWISBURG, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Lewisburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$750,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Lewisburg for the Sewer System Upgrade project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by

further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$375,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower. The unforgiven principal balance of \$375,000 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$38,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2020.

The City of Lewisburg ("City") is requesting a KIA Fund A loan in the amount of \$750,000 to fund the construction portion of the Sewer System Upgrade project. The total project cost is \$1,500,000 including a KIA Fund B P&D loan previously approved on December 6, 2017 and a \$750,000 CDBG grant. This project will rehabilitate approximately 3,650 linear feet of sanitary sewer line and 14 manholes in the City's collection system in order to reduce inflow and infiltration. The rehabilitation work will decrease sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs), improve services to the existing customers, and reduce the loading on the wastewater treatment plant. Additional Subsidization – This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 50% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$375,000 will be credited to the loan balance upon release of liens on all contracts and disbursement of the final draw request by KIA to the borrower.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 7.8% from \$0.72 million in 2017 to \$0.78 million in 2019 due to previously approved sewer rate increase. Combined operating expenses increased 8.1% from \$0.67 million to \$0.72 million during the same period. The increase in expenses was attributable to additional repair & maintenance for line breakage and meter failures and higher utility and chemical usage in 2019. The debt coverage ratio was 0.5, 0.6, and 0.5 for 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.9, debt to equity ratio of 1.5, 34.0 day sales in accounts receivable, and 5.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Combined water and sewer revenues will go up 8% in FY2021 and again 6% in FY2022 from the approved rate increases. Starting FY2023, the City will either apply the annual CPI adjustment or raise rates as needed to ensure that debt service requirements are met.
- 2) The City will receive a \$750,000 grant from CDBG prior to KIA assistance agreement to co-fund the project.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% each year for inflation.
- 4) Debt coverage ratio is 1.1 in FY2023 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$38,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$1,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the loan Replacement reserve is not required for a planning and design loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B20-005) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,472,400 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Bardstown, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,472,400 of project expense, to the City of Bardstown for the Pump Station Improvements 2020 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,700 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$74,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2020.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The financial reporting of the City's Proprietary Funds consolidates electric, water, wastewater treatment, garbage pickup, cable TV, and internet operations. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 6.4% from \$36.86 million in 2017 to \$39.24 in 2019 while operating expenses increased 6.2% from \$30.94 million to \$32.85 million during the same period primarily due to volume growth. Consolidated cash flow before debt service averaged \$6.89 million in the 3 audited years. Sewer cash flow averaged \$1.87 million or 27.2% of consolidated cash flow before debt service. The debt coverage ratio was 3.4, 4.5, and 3.7 in 2017, 2018, and 2019 respectively.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F20-026) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,100,000 TO THE CITY OF WHITESBURG, LETCHER COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Whitesburg, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$1,100,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Whitesburg for the Water Storage Tank Replacement project. Such amounts are subject

to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$56,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 6th day of August, 2020.

The replacements will ensure that the tanks are in an adequate and safe condition to continue serving the existing customers in the City and surrounding area.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2017 through June 30, 2019. The City's proprietary funds consolidate water, sewer, and sanitation operations. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

On December 20, 2017, the Kentucky Auditor of Public Accounts released an Examination of Certain Policies, Procedures, and Financial Activity of the City of Whitesburg, Kentucky, which identified several findings regarding the City's financial and accounting practices. The Examination revealed more than \$350,000 in delinquent money for billing of water and sewer department. The cause of the delinquent payments was a combination of improper meter readings and erroneous customer billings. Based on the APA recommendations, the City had made drastic improvements to implement sound procedures for collecting all accounts receivable, establish a consistent process for the treatment of past-due accounts, and apply policies and procedures to the adjustment of water utility accounts. In 2019, a restatement of approximately \$550,000 was made to write off aged or inactive accounts.

HISTORY

Combined operating revenues of proprietary funds increased 3.8% from \$1.50 million in 2017 to \$1.55 million in 2019 while operating expenses decreased 8.1% during the same period as a result of less repairs and maintenance required. Consolidated cash flow before debt service was \$336,580 in 2019. Sewer cash flow was \$77,158 or 22.9% of consolidated cash flow before debt service. The debt coverage ratios of 2017 and 2018 were below 1.1 as there had been no rate increases since 2009. The ratio went up to 2.2 in 2019 after the City paid off 3 existing debts.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.8, a debt to equity ratio of 0.6, 56.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Inside City water revenues will go up 48.8% and outside city rates up 23.5% from the rate increases that took effect in July, 2019.
- 2) Wholesale water will remain at the current rate.
- 3) Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 4.0 in 2023 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$56,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 6th day of August, 2020.
