Dunahoo, called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. She asked Suzanne Molley, DLG Staff Attorney to confirm the press notification distribution as well as the presence of a quorum. Guests were asked to introduce themselves.

I. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

A. 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of August 2, 2018

Mr. Claude Christensen moved to approve the minutes of the August 2, 2018, regular board meeting. Ms. Linda Bridwell seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Dunahoo noted that Claude Christensen would like to address the group momentarily to discuss an event he is involved in.

Mr. Christensen mentioned a "Celebration of the Bluegrass" on October 11th at The Kentucky Castle. It is a fundraising event to benefit Bluegrass Tomorrow's Regional Land Use Planning Initiative and IdeaFestival Student Days.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A15-094) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,298,000 TO THE CITY OF GLASGOW, BARREN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, addressed the group to present information on the City of Glasgow's request for a \$1,798,000 increase to a previously approved loan (A15-094) in the amount of \$3,500,000. The new loan total is \$5,298,000. This increase will substitute for funds that were originally committed by the Glasgow Water and Sewer Commission. The project is complete and currently in the repayment phase. The additional KIA funding will allow the Commission to use rate generated revenues for other projects. The Commission will continue to make monthly repayment on the initial loan amount. Once the loan is fully disbursed, the repayment will be increased by the additional debt service from the additional funding.

The project consisted of relaying and upgrading a large portion of the southside interceptor to eliminate historical SSO's and provide additional capacity for future growth. This project upgraded 5,300 feet of existing 24 inch gravity line to 42 inch line from SSO #8 (old WWTP) to existing WWTP and upgraded 9,000 feet of existing 24 inch gravity line to 36 inch from SSO #13 (500' east of KY Hwy 249) to SSO #8 (old

WWTP). The project eliminated several SSO's and reduced ongoing maintenance on an aged interceptor.

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the Fund A Loan increase, (A15-94) for an amount up to \$5,298,000 to the City of Glasgow with the standard conditions. Ms. Melinda Hill seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B19-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$542,900 TO THE CITY OF CALVERT CITY, MARSHALL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Melissa Rife, KIA, discussed the City of Calvert City's request for a Fund B Ioan (B19-001) in the amount of \$542,900 for the Heights Phase IV Water Main Replacement – Cherry & Cedar Streets project. This project will increase flows, improve pressure, allow accessibility, and reduce the maintenance burden of the system by replacing the aged and undersized CIP mains located along the rear of the properties in the project area with 4,350 linear feet of 6 inch and 8 inch PVC and DIP water mains.

Mr. Paul Lashbrooke moved to approve the Fund B Loan (B19-001) for an amount up to \$542,900 to the City of Calvert City with the standard conditions. *Mr.* Robert Amato seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B19-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,599,630 TO THE CITY OF MOUNT WASHINGTON, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Meili Sun, KIA, discussed the City of Mount Washington's request for a Fund B loan (B19-004) in the amount of \$1,599,630 for the Bardstown Road Water Main Replacement project. This project will replace 6,625 feet of old 6-inch asbestoscement water main with a new 12-inch PVC water main to improve flow for residential and commercial customers and for the public schools. This will help with fire hydrant flow for the fire department, which has been experiencing volume problems in this part of the City. The project will also replace 114 service connections, new valves, and replace 14 old fire hydrants.

Ms. Melinda Hill moved to approve the Fund B Loan (B19-004) for an amount up to \$1,599,630 with the standard conditions. Mr. Ron Lovan seconded and the motion was unanimously approved.

4. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution:

Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve the reimbursement resolution. Mr. Robert Amato seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

5. CONSIDERATION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2018.

Mr. Jeff Abshire, KIA, discussed the audited financial statements for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. This year's audit is being compiled by Dean Dorton Allen Ford, PLLC. KIA staff prepared the bulk of the information, with the exception of the cash flow statements. Staff has been pleased with the new auditors. All Board members received a copy of the information prior to the meeting for their review.

General and administrative costs decreased \$867,241, inclusive of a \$691,000 decrease in net changes due to pension expenses under Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions. Additionally \$31,000 expenses was recorded in 2018 due to the implementation of GASB 75, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Post-Employment Benefits Other Than Pensions (OPEB) which was implemented at the beginning of fiscal year 2018.

Noted financial highlights were: at the close of fiscal year 2018, the Authority reported an ending net position of \$1,137,550,637, an increase of \$37,237,206 (11.5%) compared to the prior year; the Authority's total liabilities increased \$923,375 (0.3%); the Authority disbursed \$120,783,256 to borrowers for eligible expenditures under loan assistance agreements and \$5,552,611 to local governmental entities for state grants; and principal and interest in the amount of \$79,450,772 was collected from borrowers for assistance agreements. Ms. Linda Bridwell moved to approve submission of the audited financial information to the Auditor of Public Accounts in order to meet deadline requirements. Mr. Claude Christensen seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

There was no Executive Session as originally noted on the Agenda.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director McNeil addressed the group. She noted that EPA Region IV staff just concluded a two and a half day training with KIA and DOW staff earlier in the day. There were also three representatives from Alabama in attendance. It was a great training on the State Revolving Fund programs.

Director McNeil thanked the Board members that served on the selection committee for the H20 Awards. The awards were presented at the Governor's Local Issues Conference in Louisville in August.

The Lincoln County Sanitation District Number One was the winner for Clean Water award. Bill Payne, Chairman was very appreciative. This was an \$8 million project that included bringing in 500 customers, including some areas that had no service and Hustonville school system's small package treatment plant. This project has also been submitted to EPA for a national Pisces Award. They also received funding from CDBG and ARC as well. Lincoln County Sanitation has received an invitation from the second round of funding to begin their second phase of this project. They plan to move forward.

The Drinking Water Award winner, the McLean County Regional Water Commission had a ribbon cutting ceremony yesterday. This project eliminated four water treatment plants and combined them into one regional facility serving the McLean County Water District and the four cities of Livermore, Sacramento, Island and Calhoun. The Utility assumed Calhoun's debt for the water treatment plant, and also serves McLean County Water District. This project began in 2008 and cost almost \$10.9 million. They also received \$1 million in CDBG funding and also some Rural Development monies.

After the Board meeting, Director McNeil asked the Board members to stay to discuss principal forgiveness.

Two employment registers are being worked to fill the positions of a compliance team member as well as the position vacated by Jocelyn Gross in data management.

Amanda Yeary has given her notice as SRF Contractor. Her last day with KIA will be October 15th.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A19-031) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,450,000TO THE CITY OF MURRAY, CALLOWAY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Murray, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$1,450,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Murray for the Combined Sewer Project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$3,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$72,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 13th day of November, 2018.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Murray is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$1,450,000 for the Combined Sewer Project. The project will replace or re-route the existing sewer which flows into the new East Fork Clark's River Interceptor. It consists of upgrading approximately 5,200 linear feet (LF) of 12" VCP sewer main with 18" PVC, 300 LF with 10" PVC, and replacing 28 brick manholes with reinforced concrete manholes. This project will reduce the infiltration into the sewer system, eliminate an active SSO, and reduce pumping and operating costs for the wastewater system.

The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2016 and 2017 operating expenses. The audit includes a combined balance sheet and income statement for water and sewer. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 37% from 2015 to 2017 due to ongoing rate increases that started in 2012 in anticipation of a major sewer treatment plant project funded by KIA (A12-012) and other capital improvements. Operating expenses for water and sewer have remained relatively flat at 1% for the same time period. The debt coverage ratio was 9.5, 16.1, and 8.9 from 2015 through 2017, respectively. The City paid off their 2001 Revenue Bond series in FY 2017.

- Expenses will increase 2% annually for inflation. When the sewer treatment plant expansion funded by KIA Loan A12-12 becomes fully operational in 2020, operating expenses are expected to increase approximately \$400,000 annually.
- 3) Proposed debt service and replacement reserves for KIA loans B19-003 and A19-031 have been included in this analysis.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.3 in 2020 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B19-003) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,500,000 TO THE CITY OF MURRAY, CALLOWAY COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Murray, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,500,000 of project expense, to the City of Murray for the Clearwell at Water Treatment Plant project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. <u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 30 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.2% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$22,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues went up 5.5% from \$2.3 million in 2015 to \$2.5 million in 2017. Operating expenses increased 15.1% from \$1.6 million to \$1.9 million during the same period as a result of higher personnel costs in 2017. Based on the salary scale published by the Kentucky Rural Water Association, the District's employees had been paid well below the median rates. A decision was made in 2017 to increase all employee salaries to at or near the median level. Debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.5, and 1.2 in 2015, 2016, and 2017 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.2, debt to equity ratio of 1.5, 49.5 days sales in accounts receivable, and 8.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will go up 25% by 2020 based on the proposed rate increase pending PSC approval.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 3) Debt Coverage Ratio is 1.7 in 2020 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$22,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$1,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Water from the existing standpipe will be used to feed only the new pressure zone, which will improve the turnover of the tank and will reduce water age. The proposed project will be designed to increase pressure to residential and institutional customers by a minimum of 25 PSI during static conditions. In the event that the pump station is temporarily out of service, a valve will be opened and the existing tank will be used to supply water to the area by using the tank head. The pump station will also include a large pump that will provide fire flows for the Harrison Memorial Hospital and adjacent areas.

The utility currently serves 2,503 retail customers and supply wholesale water to the Harrison County Water Association which is a PSC regulated entity. The wholesale revenues account for approximately 35% of the total revenues.

VIII. 2019 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project does not qualify for additional subsidization.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The non-cash impact of GASB 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, has been removed from fiscal 2015, 2016, and 2017 operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Combined water and sewer revenues increased 2.7% from \$2.85 million in 2015 to \$2.93 million in 2017 due to previously approved sewer and wholesale water rate increases. Other Operating Revenues including \$147,528 from KYTC garage reimbursement and \$23,889 from miscellaneous revenues were reclassified to Other Non-Operating Income. Operating expenses remained flat during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.7, and 1.6 in 2015 through 2017 respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 0.6, a debt to equity ratio of 0.7, 46.3 days sales in accounts receivable, and 0.1 month operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will grow approximately \$170,000 or 7.0% by 2020 after the City implements necessary rate increases to meet the special condition assigned to this loan.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually for general inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage ratio is 1.2 in 2021 when full year principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$48,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT то LOANS MADE BY THE **KENTUCKY** INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 13th day of November, 2018.
