I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

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A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of February 6, 2025

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the February 6, 2025, minutes. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$74,006,047 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's (Louisville MSD) request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$20,000,000 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) and Capacity Improvements project. This project is receiving funding over multiple cycles. They received approval for \$27,783,547 from the KIA Board on December 7, 2023, and approval for an additional \$26,222,500 on July 11, 2024. This brings their total KIA loan amount up to \$74,006,047.

The project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include six new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of lifethreatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

The Louisville MSD currently serves 236,020 residential customers, 21,919 commercial customers, and 394 industrial customers.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Fund A loan increase of \$20,000,000 for a total loan amount up to \$74,006,047 to the Louisville MSD with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

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2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007E) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,207,760 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District's (Louisville MSD) request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$2,544,580 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) and Capacity Improvements project. This project is receiving Bipartisan Infrastructure Law Emerging Contaminants (EC) funding over multiple cycles. Louisville MSD previously received EC funding approval for \$1,118,600 from the KIA Board on August 3, 2023, and approval for an additional \$2,544,580 on May 9, 2024. This brings their total KIA EC loan amount up to \$6,207,760.

The project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include six new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. 3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-007) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$300,000 TO THE CITY OF BURNSIDE, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the he City of Burnside's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$300,000 for the Burnside Water Storage Tank project. This loan will supplement previously awarded Cleaner Water Program grants to fully fund the project after bids came in over budget. The project will add a second water storage tank to the distribution system providing the City with greater capacity and the ability to take one tank

out of service in the event of an emergency or for inspection or maintenance. The project consists of the construction of approximately 130 linear feet of 8-inch PVC water line and a 200,000-gallon steel ground storage tank. Additionally, the 300-foot access road to the tank will be re-graveled.

The City of Burnside serves 568 residential customers and 35 commercial and industrial customers. The City produces approximately 85 percent of its water and purchases the remaining 15 percent from the Southeastern Water Association

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund B loan for an amount up to \$300,000 to the City of Burnside with the standard conditions. Deputy Secretary Grigsby seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

4 A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-008S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$8,000,000 TO THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE, CHRISTIAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Holly Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed \the City of Hopkinsville's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$8,000,000 for their HWEA Phase V-E - Hopkinsville DWTP - GAC & Membrane Filtration project. This project includes construction of a new 8MGD GAC filtration system and 5MGD membrane filtration system. These improvements will allow for the removal of PFAS in accordance with proposed EPA MCL's and are part of the expansion to 20MGD which is currently recommended due to demand.

The Hopkinsville Water Environmental Authority currently serves 13,789 residential customers, 2,236 commercial, industrial and institutional customers and 1 wholesale customer.

Mr. Bob Amato made the motion to approve the Fund F loan for an amount up to \$8,000,000 to the City of Hopkinsville with the standard conditions. Mr. Jory Becker seconded, and the motion passed. Ms. Linda Bridwell made the caveat that her approval of this project does not in any way represent the PSC's approval of the potential rate increase for the Christian County Water District. She noted that she would normally abstain, but since Hopkinsville is not regulated by the PSC, she is eligible to vote on this project.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution with the removal of the Elkhorn City project that was removed from consideration. Mayor Fraley seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Sawyers noted that KIA staff would like to roll Agenda items 6-12 into one action item.

Deputy Secretary Grigsby made the motion to follow KIA staff's recommendation for one action item, covering Agenda items 6-12. Mr. Russ Rose seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

Mr. John Brady, KIA, noted that the following agenda items represent KIA's application to the EPA on the seven 2025 Capitalization Grants and gave a briefing, noting KIA had not been given exact funding amounts at this time.

<u>CWSRF Funding</u>: Base: \$10,390,000, allotment not determined at this time, FY2024 referenced; **Supplemental**: \$31,353,000; and **Emerging Contaminants**: \$2,707,000.

<u>DWSRF Funding</u>: Base: \$5,674,000, allotment not determined at this time, FY2024 referenced; **Supplemental**: \$30,311,000; **Emerging Contaminants**: \$9,301,000; and **Lead Service Line Replacement**: \$34,991,000, allotment not determined at this time, FY2024 referenced

The EPA requires KIA Board approval to apply for this funding each year.

Ms. Linda Bridwell made the motion to approve agenda items 6-12 pertaining to the submission of applications to the EPA for Capitalization Grant funding. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for their participation. She gave an update on the two pieces of legislation going through the General Assembly that pertain to KIA. The first is House Joint Resolution 30 that provides a list of the Kentucky WWaters projects that have been chosen for funding. The joint resolution was introduced in the House on February 18th and passed on February 27th. It was received by the Senate and had its first reading on March 5th. The House passed the Joint Resolution 88 to 6. There was some displeasure that their areas did not receive funding. There were slight changes to the list that the KIA Board recommended and approved so the House did follow the recommendations. There were two projects taken from the list that were submitted because they were providing new service, not repairing existing. There were three amounts that were reduced to just provide planning and design, not funding the entire project and some award amounts were rounded. Overall, the list of projects submitted by KIA mirrored the Board's recommendations.

The other Bill is House Bill 741, which also relates to Kentucky WWATERS, and it amends some of the scoring criteria, eliminating the accounts receivable and accounts payable criteria. It requires an applicant to meet three criteria to be deemed an eligible applicant, as well as amends the Agreed Order timing. The original legislation said that the utility had to have entered an Agreed Order within a year. The year requirement was removed and the new requirement that the project had to assist with compliance and added Consent Decree. The changes also allow for phased funding of projects and then made certain that any projects that have received planning and design funding would remain eligible for construction funding. House Bill 741 was introduced on February 19th and had its first reading on March 5th.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-008) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$841,383 TO THE EAST CLARK COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, CLARK COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the East Clark County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$841,383 of project expense, to the East Clark County Water District for the Mt. Sterling Rd. and KY 89 Water Line Upgrade project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$42,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 3rd day of April, 2025.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The East Clark County Water District is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$841,383. This loan will be used in conjunction with a previously awarded Cleaner Water Program grant to fund the Mt Sterling Rd and KY 89 Water Line Upgrade project. This project will replace some of the oldest water lines in the District's system. The existing water lines experience frequent leaks and breaks causing service disruptions as well as potential health hazards.

The project will replace approximately 3,200 linear feet (LF) of 6-inch water line along Mt. Sterling Road (US 60), approximately 7,200 LF of 6-inch water line along KY 89, and approximately 750 LF of 3-inch water line along Hilltop Drive with new Class 250 SDR 17 PVC. Creek crossings will be installed by directional drill method using DR 11 HDPE water line. The project will also include either new meter settings and service line from the new water mains or reconnection to the existing meter settings. Other proposed project components include valves, flush hydrants, and road bores with steel cover pipe.

East Clark County Water District serves 2,720 residential and 17 commercial customers. The District purchases water from Winchester Municipal Water and, to a lesser extent, Kentucky-American Water.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 6,573 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$90,075. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 2.25% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2021, through December 31, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 15.2 percent from \$1.53 million in 2021 to nearly \$1.76 million in 2023, outpacing operating expenses which increased 6.9 percent over the same period. Revenue growth was primarily driven by a March 2022 rate adjustment and, to a lesser extent, increased customer demand. Operating expenses rose just 2 percent in 2023 despite an increase in employee salaries due to a decrease in employee benefit costs and stable maintenance, equipment, and utility costs. The District's purchased water costs remained stable over the period, ranging from approximately \$390 thousand to \$410 thousand annually. The District's existing debt consists of revenue bonds with a total balance of less than \$600,000 that will be paid off by 2031. The debt coverage service ratio was 2.6, 3.5, and 4.6 for 2021, 2022, and 2023, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.8, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.3, 42.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 5.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will remain unchanged from 2023 due to there being no anticipated rate adjustments in the near-term and to account for possible fluctuations in consumer demand.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 3) The debt service coverage ratio is 2.5 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments commence.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

The ENTITY is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$841,383 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$42,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (C25-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,129,061 TO THE OLDHAM COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, OLDHAM COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Governmental Agencies Program (Fund C) with the Oldham County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Governmental Agencies Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Governmental Agencies Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Governmental Agencies Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$6,129,061 of project expense, to the Oldham County Water District for the US 42 West Improvements from KY-393 to KY-1694 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 2.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$15,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$306,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 3rd day of April, 2025.

This project will increase water pressure and flow to an underserved portion of the District's customer base. The new water line will also provide a looped connection to multiple points in this part of the District's distribution system, strengthening the existing infrastructure and maintaining water supply in the event of a break.

This project is one phase of a larger project intended to provide redundancy and improve the water pressure and flow in this part of the county. A second phase of the project, which includes the installation of water line from KY-1694 to South Buckeye Lane, will be funded with previously awarded Cleaner Water Program Grants.

Oldham County Water District serves 8,576 residential customers and 682 commercial and industrial customers. The District also sells water to the LaGrange Utilities Commission.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 18,569 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$113,804. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 2.75% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022, through December 31, 2024. The audited financial statement for the year ended December 31, 2024, was in a draft form as of the date of this analysis. The District does not anticipate any material changes in the financial information prior to the draft being finalized. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water revenues increased nearly 14 percent from \$5.20 million in 2022 to \$5.92 million in 2024 due to adjustments to the District's retail and wholesale water rates and, to a lesser extent, steady increases in retail water sales. Operating expenses increased 16.4 percent in 2023 and 9.6 percent in 2024 due to inflation-related price increases as well as increased employee wages. In addition to operating revenues, the District earns stable and consistent non-operating revenues in the form of income from cellular carriers leasing space to mount antennas on the District's water towers and in the form of fees from local sewer and sanitation districts outsourcing their billing to the District. The District's existing debt consists of revenue bonds with a year-end

2024 balance of \$11.38 million. The debt service coverage ratio was 1.9, 2.1, and 2.9 for 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 16.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, 59.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 32.1 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- Retail water and wholesale revenues will increase 2 percent and 17 percent, respectively, in 2025 due to rate increases previously approved by the Public Service Commission.
- 2) Retail water revenues will increase 1 percent annually starting in 2026 based on historical year-to-year increases.
- 3) Wholesale water revenues will remain unchanged following the 2025 increase based on historical wholesale sales data.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually due to inflation and general expense increases.
- 5) The District's debt service coverage ratio is 1.4 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments commence.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund C loan.

The ENTITY is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$6,129,061 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$306,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$15,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F22-030) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$619,180, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$2,304,263 TO THE CANNONSBURG WATER DISTRICT, BOYD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Loan (F22-030) to the Cannonsburg Water District on July 7 2022, in the amount of \$1,685,083 and the Cannonsburg Water District has requested to increase loan F22-030 by \$619,180, for a total loan amount up to \$2,304,263; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Cannonsburg Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$2,304,263 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Cannonsburg Water District for the Shoppes Road Water Line Replacement Phase 2 project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$5,800 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$116,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 3rd day of April, 2025.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 8,919 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$76,070. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total water revenues increased 11% from \$2.89 million in 2021 to \$3.21 million in 2023 due to water loss savings. Operating expenses increased 4.9% from \$2.5 million to \$2.65 million during the same period due to increased purchased water costs. The debt coverage ratio was 3.3, 2.1, and 2.0 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.8, 39.7 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 6.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 8.1% in 2025 due to an existing rate increase previously approved by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and 10.4% in 2026 due to a proposed rate increase.
- 2) General operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Purchased water expenses will increase 23.8% in 2025, 16.5% in 2026, and 12.3% in 2027 due to rate increases from the City of Ashland, which have been approved by the PSC.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.8 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The Water District is regulated by the PSC and will need to apply, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$2,304,263 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 3rd day of April, 2025.
