#### I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

#### A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of May 1, 2025

*Mr.* Russ Rose made the motion to approve the May 1, 2025, minutes. *Mr.* Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-035) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$20,000,000 TO THE REGIONAL WATER RESOURCE AGENCY, DAVIESS COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the Regional Water Resource Agency's (RWRA) request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$20,000,000 to fund the Locust Force Main Replacement/Rehabilitation project. This project will replace or rehabilitate 11,000 linear feet (LF) of 30-inch force main connecting the Locust and Dublin Pump Stations to the Max Rhoads Wastewater Treatment Plant, serving 6,374 residential, commercial, and industrial parcels. As part of a combined sewer system, it also conveys stormwater runoff from 1,544 acres. The existing infrastructure was installed in 1955 and has exceeded its lifespan, causing infiltration and inflow and long-term maintenance issues.

The project will include environmentally and energy-efficient methods, including tree planting along the project path to restore the urban canopy and improve permeability, reducing stormwater runoff. An energy audit will assess lighting and pumps, with potential upgrades to high-efficiency pumps to cut electricity use and maximize treatment plant capacity, reducing combined sewer outflows (CSOs). The new force main is designed to handle increased flow from severe storms, minimizing CSOs into the Ohio River.

RWRA serves 29,016 residential, 2,972 commercial, and 23 industrial customers

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A25-035, for an amount up to \$20,000,000 with the standard conditions. Deputy Secretary Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion was approved.

#### 2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-011) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,200,000 TO THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN, NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Bardstown's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$3,200,000 for their Gunning Sewer Pump Station and Force Main Upgrade project. The existing pump station is obsolete and has been operating on a rental bypass system since the existing pumps failed after the flooding and ice in February 2025. This project will upgrade the existing 200 GPM station to 600 GPM and replace 4" force main with 3,970 LF of 8" sewer force main. Nine new manholes will also be installed as well as 1,030 LF of 12" gravity sewer to direct the wastewater to the new Gunning Sewer Lift Station. The new station will be located downstream at a new site to allow for continued service during construction. The upgraded sewer lift station will include hook-ups for a portable bypass pump and an electrical generator. This project will handle future development at The Nelson County Fairgrounds, which is not currently served by public sewer.

The city currently serves 7,420 residential customers, 1,285 commercial customers and 46 industrial customers.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B25-013 to the City of Bardstown for an amount up to \$3,200,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded the motion, and the motion was unanimously approved.

**3.** A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-013) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$226,000 TO THE CITY OF EVARTS, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Evarts' request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$226,000 for their Lift Stations Renovation Project. This project will consist of the renovation of the seven lift stations in the City's sewage collection system. This is required to keep the aging system functioning and prevent failure of the system allowing the discharge of untreated sewage into the environment. This will include some minor repairs at the WWTP as well.

The city currently serves 320 residential customers and 35 commercial customers

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B25-013, to the City of Evarts for an amount up to \$226,000 with the standard conditions. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-018L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$182,255 TO THE CITY OF JAMESTOWN, RUSSELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Jamestown's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$182,255 for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. The project consists of a comprehensive inventory of each service connection

within the system to determine the service line material on both sides of the meter. To accomplish this, the City first sent out a survey and informational brochure to all customers, from which they were able to obtain pipe identification information. For those who didn't respond to the survey, city employees visited the customer meters and identified pipes through the use of a vac trailer, which employs the use of water power and a vacuum system to basically wet and then suction out the dirt through a hole about the size of a basketball. The project work takes place at the water meter on customer property. Once the identification has been made, the small holes are filled back in with a mixture of soil and sand and returned to their pre-project condition. The City will utilize ARC GIS Online asset management tools and dashboards to assist with inventory development, record-keeping, and required documentation submissions to regulatory agencies.

The City currently serves 3,784 residential customers and 174 commercial customers. They provide wholesale service to Russell Springs Sewer and Water Works and Columbia/Adair Utilities District Water System.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund F loan, F25-018L, for an amount up to \$182,255 to the City of Jamestown with the standard conditions. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

6. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY 4.AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

#### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for attending the meeting. She mentioned that KIA staff would be requesting travel approval to attend the EPA Region IV's All States Meeting in Chattanooga, Tennessee. This is an opportunity for staff to network with other states' staff members.

On Friday, KIA staff will be meeting with the auditors regarding the 2025 KIA audit. KIA Treasurer, Jim Carpenter and James Nelson have begun working on the documentation for Blue & Co. to begin the process. The timeframe is to present the information to the KIA Board at the October 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting to meet the November submission deadline to the Office of the Comptroller.

All the Federal FY 2025 Capitalization Grant Applications have been submitted to EPA Region IV for review.

Notification of the opening of the application window for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (KYWWATERS) program has been sent out via email to over 1,800 recipients with application instructions. All information is available on the KIA website. The deadline for application submittals is August 29th. This will give KIA staff two months to review the applications and prepare the scoring rubric for presentation to the KIA Board at the November 6th meeting to meet the General Assembly's December 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. As a reminder, this year's available funding is \$55 million out of the original \$75 million appropriation. Director Williams noted that at the back of the Board Book there is a status report listing all the current recipients and it is updated each month for the Board meetings.

KIA has a new underwriter for the upcoming year. Morgan Stanley was chosen by a selection committee put together by the Office of Financial Management that included KIA staff members, Jim Carpenter and John Brady. Mr. Brady will be working closely with Morgan Stanley on the KIA interest rates that will be presented for consideration at the July 10<sup>th</sup> KIA Board meeting. Even though last year interest rates were higher, KIA kept the rates the same. After the initial review, we are not sure we will be able to recommend leaving rates the same this year. The Board will make that decision in July.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A25-023S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$6,916,881 TO THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Shepherdsville, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$6,916,881 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Shepherdsville for the Shepherdsville Blue Lick Road Drainage & Sanitary Sewer Improvement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than ten percent (10%) of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$17,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$346,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 10<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2025.

#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

The City of Shepherdsville is requesting a \$6,916,881 Fund A loan for the second phase of the Blue Lick Road Drainage & Sanitary Sewer Improvement project. The first phase of this project has been completed and included the rehabilitation of two pump stations and elimination of a third pump station through the installation of gravity sewer. Phase Two, which is the portion being presented for consideration, will include the construction of a stormwater trunk line along a portion of Bullitt Lick Middle School Road, which will create an outlet for trapped runoff that is inundating the sewer system and nearby homes. Construction of the trunk line, along with work completed in Phase One, will help to reduce water runoff and infiltration and inflow into the sewer system. Based on the successful completion of Phases One and Two, a third phase is planned to install additional gravity sewer and convey flow directly from the Blue Lick Road area to the influent pump station at the sewer treatment plant. This will allow Shepherdsville to eliminate three pump stations in the area. ### I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Shepherdsville is requesting a \$6,916,881 Fund A loan for the second phase of the Blue Lick Road Drainage & Sanitary Sewer Improvement project. The first phase of this project has been completed and included the rehabilitation of two pump stations and elimination of a third pump station through the installation of gravity sewer. Phase Two, which is the portion being presented for consideration, will include the construction of a stormwater trunk line along a portion of Bullitt Lick Middle School Road, which will create an outlet for trapped runoff that is inundating the sewer system and nearby homes. Construction of the trunk line, along with work completed in Phase One, will help to reduce water runoff and infiltration and inflow into the sewer system. Based on the successful completion of Phases One and Two, a third phase is planned to install additional gravity sewer and convey flow directly from the Blue Lick Road area to the influent pump station at the sewer treatment plant. This will allow Shepherdsville to eliminate three pump stations in the area. The completion of each phase will improve drainage infrastructure, reduce infiltration and inflow, and operations and maintenance costs associated with the pump stations.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$346,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$17,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

#### A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-024) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$967,785 TO THE CITY OF AUBURN, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Logan, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$967,785 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Auburn for the Lead Service Line and Water Main Remediation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 65.7%, not to exceed \$635,864 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$331,921 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,400 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$48,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 10<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2025.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

#### A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-024L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$482,215 TO THE CITY OF AUBURN, LOGAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the City of Auburn, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

### NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$482,215 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Auburn for the Lead Service Line and Water Main Remediation project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 71%, not to exceed \$342,443, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$139,772 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$1,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$24,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 10<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2025.

A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 10th day of July, 2025.
