I. PROCEEDINGS

Vice Chair Russ Rose called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. **BUSINESS (Board Action Required)**

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of May 9, 2024

Mr. Shaun Youravich moved to approve the minutes of the May 9, 2024, regular board meeting. *Ms.* Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING THE ELECTION OF CHAIR OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY

Ms. Rebecca Goodman nominated Mr. Matt Sawyers, the new Commissioner of the Department for Local Government. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and nominations were closed.

A voice vote and show of hands was taken. The nomination of Mr. Matt Sawyers was approved to serve as the KIA Board Chair.

Vice Chair Rose turned the meeting over to Chair Sawyers to run the remainder of the meeting.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-023L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$120,000 TO THE CITY OF HARDINSBURG, BRECKINRIDGE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. Jory Becker, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Hardinsburg's request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$120,000 for the Lead Inventory and Replacement Plan project. The City will conduct the inventory of public and private service lines and connections in the distribution system to determine which, if any, are comprised of lead piping. The City will gather data within areas that were constructed prior to 1987 and establish a data management system and GIS inventory. PVA records have been reviewed and surveys sent out to all customers. It is estimated that 95% of surveys have been sent back into the City. A contractor will be hired to vacuum out meter boxes

that have been in place before 1987 to see the water lines coming into the box and then out of the box to the house or building. The exposed lines will be photographed, and the data uploaded to a software program. Once all data is collected, a determination will be made as to where the replacements must take place.

The City currently serves 5,553 residential customers and 310 commercial and industrial customers. They provide wholesale service to Cloverport Water & Sewer System and Irvington Water System.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Fund F Loan, F24-023L, for an amount up to \$120,000 to the City of Hardinsburg with the standard conditions. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

3. Mr. Brady discussed the four interest rates beginning on July 1st. He noted that it was recommended that the current KIA rates and administrative fees stay the same and he presented a summary.

<u>Funds A, B, and F</u>: Standard Rate: 2.25%; Non-standard (a) Rate: 1.25% and Non-standard (b) rate: 0.50%

<u>Fund C</u>: 1-5 years: 1.75%; 6-10 years: 2.25%; 11-20 years: 2.75% and Broadband: 4.25%

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve agenda items 4-7 pertaining to the 2025 Interest Rates for Funds A, F, B and C. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone and noted that she was very happy to report that all the notifications have been sent out pertaining to the 40 line-item grants that had been authorized in House Bill 1 in the 2024 Regular Session of the General Assembly. All recipients have been notified and asked to submit their specific project information with the WRIS SX/WX number. Grant Agreements should be sent out very soon.

She noted that the application and program handbook for the new Kentucky WWATERS loan program was authorized in House Bill 563 in the 2024 Regular Session. KIA is staffing up to review those applications and get them to the Board to review the scores. The Bill says that KIA is to evaluate and score the projects. KIA staff will present these applications to the Board in the coming months. The application handbook is under final review and should go out early next week. Applications will be accepted through August 16th. The deadline for submission to the General Assembly is December 1st.

A special thanks to John Brady for compiling the draft Intended Use Plan (IUP) and to James Nelson for completing and submitting the seven Capitalization Grants to EPA Region 4. The draft Intended Use Plans will be out for public comment in the next couple of weeks. Our hope is to receive the CAP Grant

award in the first year of the appropriations and, if we do, KIA will be eligible for any additional funding the second year that other states do not use. That funding will be reallocated so it's very important to get the applications submitted in a timely manner to be in the running for any additional funding that may be available in the second year.

Commissioner Sawyers thanked everyone and noted former Commissioner Dennis Keene's service to KIA and wished him well in his future endeavors. He said he looks forward to working with everyone.

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. <u>NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W25-001E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$354,899 TO THE CITY OF SALYERSVILLE, KENTUCKY F/B/O SALYERSVILLE WATER WORKS

Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed the City of Salyersville's request for emergency funding through the Emergency Kentucky WWaters Fund. The Emergency Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance Fund was established to provide funding for troubled or economically restrained systems. The funding is dedicated to capital and non-capital expenses relating to restoring or avoiding imminent interruption of utility service provided by a public water or wastewater system after a declaration of emergency has been declared. The City of Salyersville f/b/o Salyersville Water Works has declared an emergency due to a 14-inch sewer line collapse which allowed raw sewage to run atop the surface and is requesting a grant in the amount of \$354,899 for related expenses. A temporary line has been installed on top of the surface for the sewage to be transported to the WWTP. The City will install 673 LF of 14-inch PVC piping and other appurtenances to replace the line. A notice of the need to revise and resubmit the Corrective Action Plan was sent from the Energy and Environment Cabinet to the City on June 14, 2024.

Judge Mark McKenzie asked representatives from Salyersville if this funding would cover all the costs of clean-up and reconstruction. They said the funding requested was for the total project.

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve the Emergency Kentucky WWaters grant funding, (W26-001E), for an amount up to \$354,899 to the City of Salyersville f/b/o Salyersville Water Works with the standard conditions. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A23-007) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$54,006,047 TO THE LOUISVILLE AND JEFFERSON COUNTY METROPOLITAN SEWER DISTRICT, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Loan (A23-007) to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on December 7, 2023, in the amount of \$27,783,547 and the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District has requested to increase Ioan A23-007 by \$26,222,500; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS: <u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$54,006,047 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District on the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 3.4%, not to exceed \$1,812,951, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$52,193,096 shall be repaid

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 11th day of July, 2024.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Louisville and Jefferson County Metropolitan Sewer District is requesting a Fund A loan in the amount of \$26,222,500 for the Paddy's Run Flood Pumping Station (FPS) and Capacity Improvements project. This project is receiving funding over multiple cycles. They received approval for \$27,783,547 from the KIA Board on December 7, 2023. This brings their total KIA loan amount up to \$54,006,047.

The project will construct a new FPS that will provide a total estimated pumping capacity of 1,900 MGD. It will also include six new flood pumps, motors, and discharge pipes. SCADA and associated electrical and mechanical components will be installed to operate the new flood pumps in addition to the required aesthetic, plumbing, and HVAC equipment. The existing FPS, designed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and put into service in 1953, will be decommissioned.

The existing Paddy's Run FPS routinely pumps combined sewer overflows during wet weather events when the river is elevated, further protecting the public and many critical assets within MSD's sewer system. In addition to providing critical flood protection, the Paddy's Run FPS serves as essential wastewater infrastructure for combined sewer overflow control and is a required project in MSD's Consent Decree. This project will also help protect critical infrastructure within Rubbertown which could have catastrophic consequences if flooded, including releasing volatile chemicals and contaminants into the Ohio River. Failure to act on this project could result in an ever-increasing risk of life-threatening flooding in the community. Additionally, the inadequate capacity of the existing pump station would worsen the impact of a flood event by allowing a higher portion of wastewater in flood waters.

MSD currently serves 236,020 residential customers, 21,919 commercial customers, and 394 industrial customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 427,764 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$64,724. The project area population was 46,411 with an MHI of \$36,514. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for \$15,082,000 of Green Project Reserve funding. The majority of the green project components fall under the environmentally innovative category.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of \$1,812,951 will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years

ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 19% from \$329.4 million in 2021 to \$392 million in 2023 due to annual increases in service charges and revenues from a new customer base following MSD's acquisition of the Bullitt County Sanitation system. Operating expenses increased 13.6% from \$109.7 million to \$124.6 million during the same period due to higher service and administration costs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.8, and 1.9 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 3.1, 27 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 6.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase 6.9% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase and 6.1% in 2025 due to a proposed rate increase.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 6% annually beginning in 2026 due to rate increases anticipated from the MSD's Board.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 4% annually due to inflation and general expenses for pending projects.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.9 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

MSD maintains debt reserve accounts on its senior obligations equal to at least 10% of the face amount of all bonds issued outstanding, 100% of the maximum aggregate net debt service in the current year or any future fiscal year, or 125% of the average aggregate net debt service in the current or any future fiscal year.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A24-014S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$13,600,000 TO THE CITY OF PRINCETON F/B/O PRINCETON WATER AND WASTEWATER COMMISSION, CALDWELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Princeton f/b/o Princeton Water and Wastewater Commission, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$13,600,000 of project

expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Princeton f/b/o Princeton Water and Wastewater Commission for the Princeton Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 26%, not to exceed \$3,538,202, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$10,061,798 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$34,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$680,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 11th day of July, 2024.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 6,108 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$46,348. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The project will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 10.5% from \$3.59 million in 2021 to \$3.97 million in 2023. Operating expenses increased 16% from \$2.71 million to \$3.14 million during the same period primarily due to costs related to wastewater treatment. The debt coverage ratio was 3.5, 3.1, and 3.7 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 12.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.5, 32.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 17.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will remain flat in projected years.
- 2) Retail water revenues will increase 17.4% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase.
- 3) Wholesale water revenues will increase 9.8% in 2025, 9% in 2026, and 8.2% in 2027 due to future rate increase approved by the Public Service Commission.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 5) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2028 when the first full year of principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$680,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$34,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F23-006S) INCREASE FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,577,650 TO THE ADAIR COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, ADAIR COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously approved a Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund Loan F23-006S to the Adair County Water District on February 2, 2023, in the amount of \$4,377,650 and the Adair County Water District has requested to increase loan F23-006S by \$1,200,000; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Adair County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such

statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan increasing the amount up to \$5,577,650 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Adair County Water District for the Phase 23 Water Treatment Plant and System Improvements project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the Ioan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this Ioan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 65%, not to exceed \$3,629,468 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,948,182 shall be repaid

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$13,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$278,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 11th day of July, 2024.

- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of \$3,629,468 will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2021 through December 31, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 20.4% from \$5.47 million in 2021 to \$6.59 million in 2023 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 22.8% from \$3.33 million to \$4.09 million during the same period due to costs of materials and repairs. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.3, and 1.5 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.7, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.2, 31.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 8.2% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase approved by the Public Service Commission (PSC).
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 12.9% in 2024 due to an existing rate increase approved by the PSC.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.7 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The Water District is regulated by the PSC and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$5,577,650 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$278,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$13,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F23-134L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$32,134,730 TO THE LOUISVILLE WATER COMPANY, JEFFERSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Louisville Water Company, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$32,134,730 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Louisville Water Company for the Private Lead Service Line Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 71%, not to exceed \$22,791,330 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$9,343,400 shall be repaid.

<u>Section 4.</u> The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 11th day of July, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from

the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 1% from \$8.5 million in 2021 to \$8.6 million in 2023 primarily due to increased sales. Operating expenses increased 37.6% from \$2.6 million to \$3.5 million during the same period primarily due to increases in utility and chemical expenses as well as taxes associated with property in Tennessee. The debt coverage ratio was 1.7, 1.7, and 1.6 in 2021, 2022 and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.7, a debt-to-equity ratio of 6.6, 33.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 13.3 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues are expected to remain flat in projected years.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$326,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$16,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Danville is requesting a Fund F loan in the amount of \$2,320,394 for the Danville Lead & Copper Replacements project. This project would replace any known lead/copper service lines and connections, thereby reducing the potential for lead contamination in the water distribution system. This replacement would be performed upon the completion of the lead service line inventory project. This project will include only the line and component replacements needed for eliminating lead service lines moving the system into compliance with the Lead & Copper rule.

The City currently serves 11,142 residential customers and 38 commercial/industrial and 6 wholesale customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2017-2021, the Utility's service area population was 24,951 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$50,967. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$55,454. The project will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness not to exceed \$1,333,983 will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2020, through June 30, 2022. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer and water revenues increased 9.7% from \$9.58 million in 2020 to \$10.51 million in 2022 due to rate increases. Operating expenses increased 11.0% from \$7.11 million to \$7.89 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 1.0, 0.9, and 0.9 in 2020, 2021, and 2022.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.7, 20.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 9.4 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$345,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 2) Water revenues will increase by approximately \$350,000 in FY2023 and \$330,000 in FY2024 due to recent COLA increases and 2% thereafter.
- 3) Expenses for both sewer and water will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$116,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$5,800 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <u>Exhibit A</u> (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 11th day of July, 2024.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHING INTEREST RATES FOR THE WWATERS PROGRAM FOR THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025

WHEREAS, KRS 224A, as amended, establishes terms and conditions for establishing interest rates for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems Program (the "WWATERS Program") and,

WHEREAS, the aforementioned statute requires that rates of interest be established by the Authority using a recommendation from the Executive Director based on market conditions, availability of funds and funding demand, except that interest rates for Loans awarded pursuant to the WWATERS Program shall be set at least on-half of one percent lower than they would have been if awarded from the federally-assisted water supply and wastewater revolving funds, provided that a loan interest rate for a loan awarded pursuant to the WWATERS Program shall not be less than zero percent (0%).

NOW, THEREFORE, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority hereby resolves as follows:

The interest rate for all Kentucky WWATERS loans approved by the Authority during the period July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, shall be as follows:

One standard interest rate and two nonstandard interest rates will be offered to borrowers. The standard rate shall be 1.75% and the nonstandard rates shall be 0.75% and 0.00% based on the income parameters defined in the 2025 Clean Water State Revolving Fund Intended Use Plan.

The Resolution is effective upon its adoption this 11th day of July, 2024.
