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I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of September 5, 2024

Mr. Shaun Youravich noted there needed to be a change on page three of the minutes noting the approval amount on the Western Pulaski County Water District loan. There are two-dollar signs. It should be changed to \$5,055,000. With that changed, he made the motion to approve the minutes of the September 5, 2024, regularly scheduled meeting. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A24-021S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$22,500,851 TO THE CITY OF SHEPHERDSVILLE, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed the City of Shepherdsville's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$22,500,851 for their WWTP Improvements and Hydraulic Expansion project. The proposed project will upgrade the peak hourly flow at the WWTP from 12 MGD to 22.7 MGD which will help the city avoid sanitary sewer overflows. The project will replace critical process equipment that has exceeded its useful life to maintain compliance with KPDES Permit limitations and the Clean Water Act including improvements to influent flow metering and sampling, construction of sludge storage tanks and clarifiers, upgrades to the SCADA system and several energy efficiency improvements, to name a few. The integrity of the main pump station will be restored by repairing structural damage caused by corrosion and the application of a protective coating and sealing known continuous infiltration sources while making these repairs.

The city currently serves 4,776 residential customers and 466 commercial, industrial and institutional customers.

Mayor Jose Cubero addressed the group stating that they have had multiple requests for additional sewer lines and flooding issues are a large concern that this project will address.

Mr. Andy Luttner made the motion to approve Fund A loan, A24-021S, to the City of Shepherdsville for an amount up to \$22,500,851 with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-010S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,471,056 TO THE LOGAN -TODD REGIONAL WATER COMMISSION, TODD COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders, KIA, discussed the Logan -Todd Regional Water Commission's (LTRWC) request for Fund F loan in the amount of \$4,471,056 for the LTRWC Additional Sedimentation Train/General Plant Expansion project. The Commission will expand the plant capacity from 13 to 15 MGD by adding membrane filtration and granular activated carbon to address emerging contaminants, primarily PFOS and PFOA. This

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expansion includes the addition of a third sedimentation train along with upgrades to plant components.

The LTRWC currently serves 13 wholesale customers which includes Logan, Todd and Christian counties in Kentucky and Springfield, Tennessee.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Fund F Loan, F25-019S, for an amount up to \$4,471,056 to the Logan-Todd Regional Water Commission with the standard conditions. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR FINANCING FROM THE EMERGENCY KENTUCKY WWATERS FUND (W25-002E) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,827,600 TO THE CITY OF MARION, CRITTENDEN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the Emergency Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance Fund which was established to provide funding for troubled or economically restrained systems. The funding is dedicated to capital and non-capital expenses relating to restoring or avoiding imminent interruption of utility service provided by a public water or wastewater system after a declaration of emergency has been declared. The Governor and the City of Marion have declared a state of emergency due to an ongoing water shortage because of the need to empty Lake George in response to a levee failure. Lake George is the primary reservoir supplying water to the residents and businesses of the city and conditions have endangered public health and safety. The city is requesting a grant in the amount of \$1,827,600 to address water supply and water loss while a long-term solution is being completed. Maintaining control of water loss is necessary to safeguard diminished raw water capacity.

This project will include the replacement of all existing water meters in the city. Radio read meters will allow the city to more precisely locate leaks and alleviate water loss. Approximately 5,000 linear feet of existing galvanized waterlines will be replaced with 6" ductile iron waterline. The project encompasses system improvements necessary to achieve water security during the next several years while the Crittenden-Livingston Water District's expansion project is complete.

The city currently serves 1,238 residential customers and 180 commercial and industrial customers.

Mr. Tim Thomas addressed the group and noted that this is one step in a long-term solution to Marion's situation. This project will assist in protecting their current water supply. Their local water maintenance crew has worked diligently to keep their water losses down in the 20% range and installing new lines will help in their efforts.

Secretary Goodman asked Mr. Thomas the impact on the residential customers. Mr. Thomas noted that customers are under use restrictions and have been for some time. He also said that this project would not eliminate those restrictions but would keep the problem from worsening. Ms. Goodman asked what happens to their rates. He mentioned that there was a rate increase last summer and they are waiting to see what long-term the rates would become. She asked if the City could undertake this loan without raising the rates again. He stated this is a grant. She asked with regionalizing with Crittenden-Livingston what those projected rates would be. He mentioned they do not know what the rate will be in two to three years. Some debt will be incurred to expand their plant.

Commissioner Sawyers asked about the status of the dam. Mr. Thomas said they have been working closely with DOW and Emergency Management. He said currently the lake has about a third of capacity before the failure and that's where the City has been pulling water from the last couple of years.

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Mr. Russ Rose asked if any of the funding will be used on the levee itself and what type of water loss they are experiencing. Mr. Thomas noted water loss had been at 50%, but they have been working on the issue and have it down to 15-20% currently. Mr. Rose mentioned that most of the requested funding will be going to meter replacement. Mr. Thomas stated it was about \$700,000. Mr. Rose asked the appropriateness of using this funding for residential meter replacement and if that followed the intent of the program. Director Williams stated that if it was a standard meter replacement it would not qualify. But this project is part of a larger plan for regionalization in the area to address water supply and she feels it is completely appropriate.

Ms. Shelley Porter abstained from voting. Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the Emergency Kentucky WWaters funding for an amount up to \$1,827,600 to the City of Marion with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was passed.

4. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Mr. Bob Amato made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

II. SPECIAL PRESENTATION BY LOUISVILLE MSD

Mr. Tony Parrott, Chief Executive Officer, at Louisville MSD addressed the group to update everyone on the status of their consent decrees and the progress they've been making. To date, they have invested \$1.4 billion.

- 1. Twenty-five LTCP projects complete and reduced CSOs by 5.85 billion gallons per year
- 2. Forty-four SSDP projects complete and reduced 70% of modeled SSO locations for 2-year storm (14 remaining)
- 3. Eight of 9 Critical Interceptor Projects Completed (\$70 million total)
- 4. Asset Management spending a greater than \$183 million spent through year 4 (\$25M/year through 2035)
- Special Remedial Projects underway for MFWQTC Biosolids (2030) and Paddy's Run Flood Pump Station (2027)

SRF funding impacts on Amended Consent Decree (ACD)

To date, MSD has spent nearly \$1.4 billion on named ACD project infrastructure; The projected ACD program total is expected to exceed \$2.2 billion; SRF is a small, but critical component of MSD's funding plan (3%); Meaningful principal forgiveness (currently only 0.3%) would help ease the burden on taxpayers

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams introduced Mr. Jeremy Skinner as the newest KIA staff member. He comes to KIA from LRC and prior to that he was a commercial banker. Mr. Skinner will be working closely with Mr. Rick Harris on the KYWWATERS program, as well as working with Mr. John Brady and Ms. Sandy Sanders on the SRF program.

Director Williams updated the group on the KYWWATERS program. KIA received about 170 applications in total. A significant portion of those did not submit a complete application. KIA staff is reaching out to those applicants and asking for the required information to be considered for funding. We anticipate having about 150 applications when all is said and done for review by the Board. The average ask is around \$4 million and with the current applications that would be a total of about \$625-675 million for this round of funding, with a total funding amount of \$75 million for this year. Pursuant to the statute, staff is verifying both applicant and project eligibility.

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With the Board's approval at the September meeting, staff has developed the objective score card and we will, within the required 60 days, be determining the eligibility of each applicant. The application will be brought to the Board in November at either the regularly scheduled November 7th meeting or a special called meeting. The Board will be required to establish a score for each project and a funding recommendation to be submitted to the General Assembly on or before December 1st. To remind the members, standard terms approved at the last Board Meeting are principal forgiveness if considered will be at the rate of 50%, the standard loan term will be 30 years, a debt coverage ratio of 1.1, which is the same as all other KIA loans. The four funding scenarios are Scenario One: full principal and interest repayment; Scenario Two: principal repayment with zero interest; Scenario Three: principal repayment with 50% principal forgiveness and zero interest; and Scenario Four: straight grant funding. Staff will evaluate each application under each of the four scenarios to determine where they would first meet the 1.1 debt coverage. This will be staff's funding recommendation to the Board.

Our audit is proceeding with Blue & Company, and we anticipate presenting the audit information at the November 7th meeting as well.

KIA staff continues to go through previously submitted SRF loan applications and the Call for Projects has gone out with a submission deadline of December 13th.

Staff completed and filed the Annual Report to the EPA, detailing everything that was accomplished, based on our Intended Use Plan (IUP).

The Cleaner Water Program deadline to obligate all funding is the end of this calendar year. We are on-track to meet that deadline. As a reminder, KIA has 918 grants, 20% are complete. There are a significant amount of draw requests that staff continues to process. There are a few outstanding Grant Agreements that we are waiting on. We have 8 grants for the EKSAFE program that are for high ground subdivisions. There are also line items grants from both 2022 and 2024. Fiscal year 2022 had 19 projects and FY 2024 had 40-line items. We are awaiting a response from 9 recipients.

Director Williams and Deputy Director Milward Dedman testified before the Interim Joint Committee on General Government, Finance, Personnel and Public Retirement on September 18th to update them on the KYWWATERS and the Cleaner Water Program. They asked several questions and asked about KIA's other programs. Director Williams will also be presenting on October 17th to the Interim Joint Committee of Natural Resources and Energy.

Over the past four years, KIA has administered over \$1.3 billion of funding.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF CARROLLTON F/B/O CARROLLTON UTILITIES, CARROLL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the City of Carrollton f/b/o Carrollton Utilities, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund Ioan for an amount up to \$4,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Carrollton f/b/o Carrollton Utilities for the Industrial Customer Expansion – Treatment Plant

Expansion & Enhancement (ICE-TEE) project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness, not to exceed \$1,878,993, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$2,621,007 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$11,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$226,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 8,525 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$48,508. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 1.25% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer, water and gas revenues increased 76.7% from \$37.2 million in 2021 to \$65.8 million in 2023 while operating expenses increased 77.2% from \$35.1 million to \$62.2 million during the same period. These increases were due to a merger with West Carroll Water District and significant increases in gas prices. The debt coverage ratio was 3.8, 4.2, and 3.8 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.4, 14.8 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sewer and water revenues will increase 3% in FY25 and 4% in FY26 due to rate increases effective July 2024 and July 2025.
- 2) Expenses for sewer and water will increase 2% each year due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 4.1 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$11,300 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$226,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDEMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B21-001) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$917,600, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,173,800 TO THE CITY OF BEREA, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority previously entered into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the City of Berea in the amount of \$256,200 and the City of Berea has requested to increase the loan B21-001 by \$917,600, for a total loan amount up to \$1,173,800.

WHEREAS, the Authority intends to utilize money in the Infrastructure Revolving Fund to make the loan to the governmental agency for the aforementioned purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Infrastructure Revolving Fund loans.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the Amendment of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,173,800 of project expense, to the City of Berea for the Madison County Airport Sewer Line Extension project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,900 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$58,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2014-2018, the Utility's service area population was 16,060 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$44,179. The MHI for the Commonwealth was \$48,392. The loan will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. HISTORY

Total revenues increased 2.5% from \$18.33 million in 2021 to \$18.79 million in 2023. Operating expenses increased 7.7% from \$12.06 million to \$12.99 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 3.2, 3.1, and 3.1 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.6, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.3, 52.6

days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat in future years.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 8.7 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$58,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$2,900 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Infrastructure Revolving Loan Program with the Farmdale Sanitation District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$4,000,000 of project expense, to the Farmdale Sanitation District for the Farmdale SD Interceptor Sewer System Phase I project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$10,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$200,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$1,651,384 of project expense, to the City of Mayfield f/b/o Mayfield Electric and Water Systems for the Clearwell project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$4,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$82,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of November, 2024.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues decreased 0.3% from \$4.54 million in 2021 to \$4.53 million in 2023 due to issues associated with the December 10, 2021 tornado. Operating expenses increased 10.3% from \$3.53 million to \$3.90 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 5.4, 3.7, and 3.5 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 2.3, 34.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 1.5 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water and sewer revenues will both increase 4% in 2026, 2027, and 2028 due to proposed rate increases.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.5 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$82,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$4,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-020L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$600,000 TO THE CITY OF PRINCETON F/B/O PRINCETON WATER & WASTEWATER COMMISSION, CALDWELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. Principal forgiveness of 100%, not to exceed \$600,000, will be deducted from the approved loan amount.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 7th day of November, 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 12.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.5, 32.2 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 17.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

No repayment is required for this funding. There is also no service fee or replacement reserve required.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 7th day of November, 2024.
