### I. PROCEEDINGS

Chair Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory was properly distributed. He also confirmed a quorum was present.

### A. BUSINESS (Board Action Required)

### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of September 4, 2025

Judge Mark McKenzie made the motion to approve September 4, 2025, minutes. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

### 1. CONSIDERATION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUDIT REPORT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2025

Mr. Allen Norvell, and Mr. Daniel Buckles, Blue & Co., LLC met with the group to discuss the Audit for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2025. He noted the following financial highlights:

- As of the close of fiscal year 2025, the Authority reported an ending net position of \$1,619,050,000 an increase of \$131,361,000 (8.8%) in comparison with the prior year.
- The Authority's total liabilities increased \$180,410,000 (94.9%) during fiscal year 2025.
- The Authority disbursed \$145,514,000 to borrowers for eligible expenditures under loan assistance agreements.
- Principal in the amount of \$75,606,000 was collected from borrowers for assistance agreements.
- The Authority recorded grant expenditures to local governmental entities of \$143,437,000 in federal grants and \$37,566,000 in state grants.

It is Blue & Company's opinion, that the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the Authority as of June 30, 2025, and the respective changes in financial position, and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the 2025 Audit Report as submitted. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A26-004) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,873,142 TO THE CITY OF LEITCHFIELD, GRAYSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the City of Leitchfield's request for a Fund A planning and design loan in the amount of \$1,873,142 for the Leitchfield Wastewater Plant project. The purpose of this funding is for the planning and design of a new 3.0 MGD wastewater treatment plant to replace the City's existing facility, which is nearing the end of its useful life. As part of this project, the City will shift to biological nutrient removal (BNR), which will allow for the removal of phosphorus and position the City to better meet the future total nitrogen

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limit. The proposed facility will be designed with the intent of regionalization, enabling the City to be a regional WWTP and potentially treat waste flows from the City of Clarkson and the City of Caneyville.

Via the Leitchfield Utilities Commission, the City of Leitchfield provides sewer services to 2,020 residential, 383 commercial, and 15 industrial/institutional customers.

Mr. Russ Rose made the motion to approve the City of Leitchfield's request for a Fund A loan, A26-004, for an amount up to \$1,873,142 with the standard conditions. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A26-011) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,858,207 TO THE CITY OF LOUISA, LAWRENCE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Louisa's request for a Fund A loan in the amount of \$4,858,207 for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) project. A new 1.0 MGD WWTP will be constructed to replace the existing 0.75 MGD plant that is aging and has reached its operational design lifespan. Flow will be pumped to the new WWTP by a combination of the Town Branch Lift Station and the High Bottom Lift Station. Both Lift Stations will utilize the same force main entering the treatment plant property. Flow will go through an influent magnetic flow meter prior to entering screening and grit removal. Following grit removal flow will travel by gravity into one of two Sequencing Batch Reactor (SBR) basins. Treatment process will be designed for removal of BOD, TSS, and TKN. The SBR will also be capable of treatment for phosphorus removal in the future if required. Following treatment in the SBR basins flow will travel by gravity through an effluent flow meter where peracetic acid will be dosed based on flow rate and enter a contact tank for proper disinfection. Following the contact tank flow will be discharged to the Big Sandy River from the existing discharge structure. A backup Generator will be provided on site which will be capable of operating the Town Branch Pump Station, administration building, influent screening, grit removal, SBR treatment processes, and disinfection system in the event of a power failure. Sludge produced will be wasted to an aerated sludge holding tank for reduction of volume and then further dried prior to disposal by use of an inclined screw press.

The project is necessary to bring the city into compliance with an Agreed Order with the Division of Water and will have a positive impact on water quality from improved discharges.

The city currently serves 1,624 residential customers and 366 commercial customers.

Judge Mark McKenzie the motion to approve the Fund A loan, A26-011, to the City of Louisa for an amount up to \$4,858,207 with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B26-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$617,823 TO THE SOUTHEASTERN WATER ASSOCIATION, PULASKI COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. Jeremy Skinner, KIA, discussed the Southeastern Water Association's request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$617,823. This loan will be used in conjunction with nearly \$840,000 in combined Cleaner Water Program grants and local funds to fund the 2023 Various Waterline Upgrades project.

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This project will replace existing undersized waterlines in service areas that are struggling to keep up with customer demand. The project consists of the replacement of existing 6" waterline along US 27 and Heather Way with a combined 8,500 linear feet of 8" waterline. If funds remain following project completion, the Association will replace undersized waterline along KY 769 with 800 LF of 8" waterline and install 2,800 LF of 4" waterline extension along Mayfield School Road, 300 LF of 4" waterline extension along Mark Welborn Road, and 2,600 LF of 3" waterline extension along Broyles Road.

The Southeastern Water Association serves 7,901 residential and 139 commercial customers. Additionally, the Association has one wholesale customer – the Burnside Municipal Water Works. The Association purchases water from the City of Somerset (Somerset Utilities).

Mr. Brian Thomas abstained from the vote. Mr. Shaun Youravich, made the motion to approve the Fund B loan, B26-002, to the Southeastern Water Association for an amount up to \$617,823 with the standard conditions. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded and the motion passed.

Commissioner Sawyer had to leave the meeting and Vice Chair Russ Rose took the lead.

5. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND F LOAN (F21-021) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$1,463,000, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,012,645 TO THE CITY OF HARLAN, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Harlan's request that two previously approved KIA loans be combined to fully fund their Water Treatment Plant (WTP) and Raw Water Intake project. The KIA Board approved a \$1,463,000 loan (F21-016) for the Water Distribution System Improvements project and a \$2,549,645 loan (F21-021) for the WTP and Raw Water Intake project on January 7, 2021. Both projects are important to the city but critical parts of both the intake and WTP are failing, which could lead to a lack of water production for the entire city and majority of Harlan County. The WTP project has experienced several delays in recent years and in this time the budget has increased significantly. In order to complete the critical work at WTP the city requests to transfer the funds originally approved for the F21-016 loan to the F21-021 loan.

The proposed project includes numerous upgrades to both the raw water intake and at the plant. The city's existing 100,000-gallon storage tank at the WTP site will also be painted. Work at the intake includes the replacement of raw water pump control valves, new surge relief components, installation of an additional air compressor and air storage tank, along with SCADA and electrical upgrades. Work at the WTP includes new sludge handling and storage facilities, chemical feed system improvements, influent and effluent controls, replacement of service pumps, SCADA, and various other upgrades. The overall project will improve the system's operational efficiency and treatment reliability.

The city currently serves 1,604 residential customers and 313 commercial customers.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve combining two previously approved loans by the KIA Board into one, F21-016 and F21-021 for a total loan amount of \$4,012,645 with the standard condition and the following special condition: The city will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that service revenues will need to increase

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approximately \$215,000, or 16%, by FY2028 to meet the loan requirements. Secretary Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F26-025S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$373,000 TO THE CITY OF FLATWOODS, GREENUP COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Flatwoods' request for a Fund F loan in the amount of \$373,000 for their Flatwoods Clay Street Waterline Replacement and KY 207 Interconnect project. The proposed project includes the replacement and extension of the City of Flatwoods' existing water distribution system. Approximately 3,500 LF of new 6" water line will be installed along KY 207 including all associated valves and appurtenances. A critical new interconnection between the City of Flatwoods and the City of Greenup water systems will also be created. Included in the new interconnect will be a two-way control valve and a master meter housed in a shared valve pit which will allow either system to serve as a backup to the other and improve regional water system resiliency.

The City currently serves 3,139 residential customers, 72 commercial, industrial and institutional customers and 9 wholesale/other customers.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund F loan to the City of Flatwoods for an amount up to \$373,000 with the standard conditions. Judge Mark McKenzie seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

7. RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered.

Secretary Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

### II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams thanked everyone for attending the meeting. She noted that there had been 164 applications submitted for consideration for the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Trouble or Economically Restrained Systems (KY WWATERS) program. One hundred and fifty-two

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qualified for consideration, two did not meet the statutory requirements. There was a total request for funding of \$444,912,924. This year, there is a total allotment of \$53 million available. So, the Board's consideration and ranking of the projects will be critical. The awards were done strictly by scoring last year. KIA staff has looked at several different ways to sort the projects. If a utility submitted 27 applications and they ranked number one, they received 27 awards. We will provide information based on scores, as well as looking at it based strictly on median household income (MHI) and categories that appeared quite often in the requests. She apologized that the information was not completed in time for today's meeting and allowing adequate time for the Board's review in advance of the meeting. We do need to have a special meeting called to address this matter due to the statutory requirement of a December 1st submission to the General Assembly.

### **NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)**

1, KENTUCKY WATER AND WASTEWATER ASSISTANCE FOR TROUBLED OR ECONOMICALLY RESTRAINED SYSTEMS (KYWWATERS) PROGRAM SCORING AND RECOMMENTATIONS PRESENTATION

Director Williams reminded everyone that the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems Fund was created by House Bill 563 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly and codified in Acts Chapter 185, creating a new section in KRS Chapter 224A for the program. The KY WWATERS Program, as it is known, provides a funding application and evaluation process for eligible public water and wastewater systems to seek funding from the General Assembly. The program will be administered by the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority. The Kentucky WWATERS Program was established to provide for an orderly process to apply for funds for eligible projects and for applications to be evaluated, scored, and presented to the General Assembly for consideration for funding. There was \$150 million appropriated for the program with \$75 million available in each year of the biennium. The fund was created to be a revolving loan fund, but it does allow for multiple types of funding assistance. Funding can be approved by the KIA Board for emergency projects.

She thanked Rick Harris and Cynaman Jones and other KIA staff for compiling the information for today's meeting. A copy of the Summary on Scoring and Recommendations is attached.

Director Williams provided a summary of KY WWATERS progress in 2025.

### **2025 SUMMARY**

- Scoring rubric approved by KIA Board

Director Williams then discussed an overview of the 2026 applications.

Mr. Rick Harris then discussed the application scoring process. For 2026, multiple ranking lists were developed to give the General Assembly flexible decision-making options.

 Applications scored by KIA and ranked in 3 different ways (based on score, based on MHI, and based on project category (last year, GA did not allow line extension projects).

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- List Based on Score (Page 326 Attachment B)
  - o Fund 17 projects, 8 unique entities
- List Based on MHI (Page 334 Attachment C)
  - o Fund 24 projects, 19 unique entities
- List **Based on Category** (Page 342 Attachment D)
  - o Fund 24 projects, 15 unique entities
  - Project Category given highest preference was paying off debt service because that would provide the largest cashflow benefit to the system and they could use that cash to directly pay for other needed items.
  - Project Category given second highest preference was infrastructure rehabilitation because that would help reduce repair and maintenance expenses for the system.

Staff recommends the KIA Board accept: 1.) the project evaluation and scoring as completed by staff based on the KIA Board approved scoring rubric; 2.) approve a ranking methodology to be recommended in the annual report, and 3.) approve the annual report to be presented to the Legislative Review Commission on or before December 1 as required.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to accept the project evaluation and scoring based on the KIA Board approved scoring rubric, as well as approving the annual report to be presented to the Legislative Review Commission. Mr. Bob Amato seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

Judge Mark McKenzie asked to recognize Representative Bobby McCool, serving Johnson, Martin and Pike Counties who was in attendance. He thanked him for attending today's meeting.

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$8,500,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the City of Hopkinsville, Kentucky for the HWEA Phase IX – Priority 3 – Sewer Rehabilitations project

operated and controlled by the Hopkinsville Water Environmental Authority on behalf of and for the benefit of the City. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness not to exceed \$2,010,104 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$6,489,896 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$21,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$426,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2025.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the Hopkinsville Water Environmental Authority for the years ended June 30, 2022, through June 30, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total water and sewer revenues increased 8.4% from \$20.67 million in 2022 to \$22.4 million in 2024 due to an increase in sewer rates. Operating expenses increased 15.2% from \$12.98 million to \$14.96 million during the same period primarily due to increases in chemicals and repairs and maintenance. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.3, and 1.3 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.9, 29.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Wholesale water rates/revenues will increase in FY26 and FY27 per Municipal Order 42-2024 pending PSC approval; all other revenues will remain the same.
- 2) Expenses for water and sewer will increase 2% each year due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2029 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$426,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$21,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND A LOAN (A26-018S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$20,000,000 TO THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT, FAYETTE COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS,** the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund A) with the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund A loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Clean Water Revolving Fund A loan for an amount up to \$20,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Lexington-

Fayette Urban County Government for the LFUCG – North Elkhorn Wet Weather Storage Tank project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.75%. In addition to debt service, a 0.25% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$50,000 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$1,000,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4th day of December, 2025.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2019-2023, the Utility's service area population is 311,463 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$67,655. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$62,417. The loan will qualify for a 1.75% interest rate because the project includes components that will help the system comply with a federal consent decree.

#### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ending June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024 for the Sanitary Sewer system. The Storm Water system is reported separately. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

User revenues for the sanitary sewer system increased 18 percent from \$71.8 million in fiscal year (FY) 2022 to \$84.6 million in FY 2024 due to annual CPI-based rate adjustments and increased customer demand. Total Operating revenues decreased slightly over the three-year period due to fluctuations in investment-type revenues. Core revenues – user charges and fees – continued to grow steadily each year. Operating expenses decreased more than 25 percent from \$63 million in FY 2022 to \$46.6 million in FY 2024. The decrease is somewhat misleading because administrative expenses were unusually high in 2022 and 2023 due to non-recurring payments for personnel and large software purchases.

Sanitary Sewer System debt consists of revenue bonds with a combined balance of \$55.4 million and 11 KIA loans with a balance of nearly \$130 million as of FYE 2024. All existing KIA loans have been fully drawn with ongoing principal and interest payments. The debt service coverage ratio was 1.5, 2.4, and 3.2 in 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 12.3, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, 27.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 19.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Sanitary sewer revenues will increase 2.3 percent in FY 2025 due to CPI-based rate adjustments that were implemented July 1, 2025.
- 2) Sanitary sewer revenues will increase annually according to the Consumer Price Index, which is assumed to be 2.5 percent for FYs 2026 through 2029.
- 3) Revenue projections do not consider potential increases in customer base or demand and, as such, are deemed to be conservative in nature.
- 4) Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually due to inflation and to account for possible non-recurring expenses.
- 5) The debt service coverage ratio calculation assumes that the system will obtain an additional 15,000,000 in bond financing to fund most of the remaining project costs. For calculation purposes, this additional debt is assumed to be \$15 million over 20 years at 4.50%.
- 6) Debt service coverage is 2.4 in 2029 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$1,000,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$50,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

Section 2. The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Infrastructure Revolving Fund loan commitment for an amount up to \$3,280,350 of project expense, to the City of Grayson for the Water Treatment Plant Lagoons and Sludge Handling project operated and controlled by the Grayson Utility Commission on behalf of and for the benefit of the City. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an annual interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.20% annual administration fee on the unpaid, principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$8,200 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$164,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this  $4^{th}$  day of December, 2025.

#### VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2019-2023, the Utility's service area population is 10,995 with a Median Household

Income (MHI) of \$41,314. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$62,417. The loan will qualify for a 1.00% interest rate.

#### VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements of the Grayson Utilities Commission (a component unit of the City of Grayson) for the years ended June 30, 2022 through June 30, 2024. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Total water and sewer revenues increased 19.6% from \$4.02 million in 2022 to \$4.81 million in 2024. This is due in part to rate adjustments in prior years but also to projects that have lowered water loss and allowed the utility to accurately capture billable gallons. Operating expenses increased 18.4% from \$3.08 million to \$3.65 million due to increases in salaries and contractual services. The debt coverage ratio was 2.3, 1.3, and 1.6 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 7.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.5, 66.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 13.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 3% in both 2025 and 2026 due to existing rate increases and 1% in other projected years due to the city's annual CPI rate adjustment.
- 2) Sewer revenues will increase 3% in both 2025 and 2026 due to existing rate increases and 1% in other projected years due to the city's annual CPI rate adjustment.
- 3) Operating expenses will increase 3% annually due to inflation and general system expenses.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$164,000 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$8,200 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

### VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2019-2023, the Utility's service area population is 14,967 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$56,145. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$62,417. The loan will qualify for a 1.75% interest rate.

### IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022, through December 31, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 — Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 — Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

### **HISTORY**

Total water revenues remained consistent from \$4.66 million in 2022 to \$4.64 million in 2024. Operating expenses increased 7.5% from \$3.59 million to \$3.86 million during the same period due to increases in payroll-related expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 1.3, 1.5, and 1.0 in 2022, 2023, and 2024.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 4.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.7, 32.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 4.7 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 19.9% in 2025 for residential customers and 16.7% for wholesale customers due to increases approved by PSC in October of 2024.
- 2) Operating expenses will increase 2% yearly due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.2 in 2028 when full principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The ENTITY is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$6,196,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$310,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$15,500 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F26-014S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$835,000 TO THE SANDY HOOK WATER DISTRICT, ELLIOTT COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Sandy Hook Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$835,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Sandy Hook Water District for the Sandy Hook New Well & Distribution Improvements project. Such

amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 35.5%, not to exceed \$296,263 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$538,737 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$2,100 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$42,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2025.

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2022, through December 31, 2024. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

#### HISTORY

Operating revenues increased 18 percent from \$868 thousand in 2022 to over \$1.02 million in 2024. This growth was driven primarily by a PSC-approved rate adjustment implemented in August 2022 and, to a lesser extent, increased customer demand. Operating expenses – less non-cash items such as depreciation – were relatively stable, increasing 7 percent over the three-year examination period. The District has agreements to purchase water with the Rattlesnake Ridge Water District and Rowan Water, Inc.; however, it only does so during periods of limited supply. No wholesale water purchases were required in 2022 or 2024, and wholesale water purchases in 2023 were minimal (less than \$10,000).

The District's existing long-term debt consists of Waterworks Revenue Bonds with a combined balance of \$3.92 million as of CYE 2024. The debt service coverage ratio was 2.1, 1.4, and 2.4, for 2022, 2023, and 2024, respectively.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 1.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.6, 43.4 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 5.6 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

#### **PROJECTIONS**

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Water revenues will increase 1.1 percent in 2025 and 12.3 percent in 2026 because of a rate increase that took effect in late-2025.
- 2) Water revenues will remain unchanged for CYs 2027-2029 due to there being no further rate adjustments scheduled.
- Operating expenses will increase 3 percent annually starting 2025 due to inflation, general expense increases, and to account for possible instances where the District must purchase wholesale water.
- 4) Debt service coverage is 1.6 in 2028 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

The Sandy Hook Water District is regulated by the Public Service Commission (PSC) and will need to apply to the PSC, pursuant to KRS 278.300, for debt authorization for the \$835,000 loan and must receive a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity, pursuant to KRS 278.020.

#### REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$42,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness) to be funded annually (\$2,100 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F26-017S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$7,848,000 TO THE GRAYSON COUNTY WATER DISTRICT, GRAYSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Grayson County Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

**WHEREAS,** the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$7,848,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Big Sandy Water District for the East-West Connector Phase III project. Such amounts are subject to

adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than 10% of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 35.5%, not to exceed \$2,784,517, will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$5,063,483 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 30 years at an interest rate of 1.00%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$19,600 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$392,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2025.

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4A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in <a href="Exhibit A">Exhibit A</a> (collectively, the "Project"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

**Section 2.** The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

**Section 3.** The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

**Section 4.** The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

**Section 5.** The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

**Section 6.** This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 4th day of December, 2025.
