I. PROCEEDINGS

Chairman Matt Sawyers called the meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) Board to order. He noted that the media advisory had been distributed. He confirmed a quorum was present.

A. <u>BUSINESS (Board Action Required)</u>

1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

For: KIA Regular Board Meeting of October 3, 2024

Mr. Shaun Youravich made the motion to approve the minutes of the October 3, 2024, regularly scheduled meeting. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

B. NEW PROJECTS/ACTION ITEMS (Board Action Required)

1. CONSIDERATION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUDIT REPORT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2024

Mr. Allen Norvell, Blue & Co., LLC met with the group to discuss the Audit for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2024. He noted the following financial highlights:

- As of the close of fiscal year 2024, the Authority reported an ending net position of \$1,487,689,000 an increase of \$107,416,000 (7.8%) in comparison with the prior year.
- The Authority's total liabilities decreased \$19,515,000 (-9.3%) during fiscal year 2024.
- The Authority disbursed \$93,514,000 to borrowers for eligible expenditures under loan assistance agreements.
- Principal in the amount of \$73,780,000 was collected from borrowers for assistance agreements.
- The Authority recorded grant expenditures to local governmental entities of \$83,441,000 in federal grants and \$249,000 in state grants.

It is Blue & Company's opinion, that the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the Authority as of June 30, 2024, and the respective changes in financial position, and cash flows thereof for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the 2024 Audit Report as submitted. Ms. Shelley Porter seconded, and the motion unanimously passed.

2. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED CLEAN WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (A25-010) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,500,000 TO THE CITY OF CARROLLTON F/B/O CARROLLTON UTILITIES, CARROLL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Hollie Delaney, DOW, and Ms. Sandy Sanders-Rankin, KIA, discussed the City of Carrollton, for the benefit of Carrollton Utilities' request for a \$4,500,000 Fund A loan for their Industrial Customer Expansion - Treatment Plant Expansion & Enhancement (ICE-TEE) project. This project will include increasing the flow capacity along the U.S. 42 Corridor with approximately 15,000 LF of 10" main due to increased discharge into the system from existing customers as well as new users. Additional components include increasing the emergency storage at the Ghent regional pump station and upgrading SCADA communication at the pump stations along the route. The project will also include updating the current 201 Facilities Plan and explore replacing headworks grinders, rehabbing lagoon liners, renewing clarifiers and

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non-potable system, adding a UV bank and other miscellaneous improvements as identified in the updated Facilities Plan. Carrollton Utilities currently serves 2,765 residential customers, 473 commercial customers, 142 industrial/institutional customers and 1 wholesale customer.

Ms. Geri Grigsby made the motion to approve Fund A loan, A25-010, to the City of Carrollton for the benefit of the Carrollton Utilities for an amount up to \$4,500,000 with the standard conditions. Mr. Russ Rose seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

3. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AN AMENDEMENT TO THE CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B21-001) INCREASE FOR AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT UP TO \$917,600, FOR A TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,173,800 TO THE CITY OF BEREA, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Berea's request for a Fund B loan, increase in the amount of \$917,600 for the Madison County Airport Sewer and Waterline Extension project. The original loan was approved by the KIA Board on June 3, 2021. The increase will bring the total loan amount to \$1,173,800. The original budget is several years old and updated cost estimates reflect the need for additional funds. Also, the original project included only the sewer portion and now includes the water portion as well.

This project aims to extend wastewater collection and treatment services along with upgrading existing waterlines to the area. The Madison County Airport lacks the necessary infrastructure to adequately meet future transportation needs. It is strategically positioned to serve Garrard, Lincoln, Madison, Clark, Estill, Jackson, and Rockcastle Counties. These counties are currently underserved in aviation infrastructure, which is increasingly vital for industrial recruitment and economic development. Compounding the issue is EKU's growing Aviation Program, workforce training, and increased airport traffic. There is significant support for the project from communities surrounding the airport.

Mayor Bruce Fraley recused himself from the vote. Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund B Loan increase, for an amount up to \$1,173,800 to the City of Berea with the standard conditions. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried.

4. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-001) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$4,000,000 TO THE FARMDALE SANITATION DISTRICT, FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Ms. Sandy Sanders-Rankin, KIA, discussed the Farmdale Sanitation District's request for a Fund B loan for the Farmdale SD Interceptor Sewer System Phase I project. Farmdale SD acquired seven (7) private wastewater package plants with a history of poor performance and KPDES permit violations. To provide customers with reliable sewer service, in Phase I of this project, Farmdale proposes eliminating five (5) of the failing package treatment plants and constructing a sewer interceptor to convey flow from those areas to the City of Frankfort's sewer treatment plant. This includes the package treatment plants serving Coolbrook, Edgewood, Farmgate, Meadowbrook and Evergreen. In total, Phase I will benefit approximately 651 customers and includes 12,500 LF of gravity sewer, 25,500 LF of force main and four (4) pump stations, as well as decommissioning of five (5) package WWTP's.

The District currently serves 651 residential customers in the Phase I project area.

Ms. Rebecca Goodman made the motion to approve the Fund B Loan for an amount up to \$4,000,000 to the Farmdale Sanitation District with the standard conditions and

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the following special condition: The District will pass a resolution demonstrating their intention to increase revenues as necessary to maintain KIA's required 1.1 debt coverage ratio. KIA staff review indicates that service revenues will need to increase approximately \$140,000, or 16%. Ms. Geri Grigsby seconded, and the motion was passed.

5. RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING FUND LOAN (B25-002) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$1,651,384 TO THE CITY OF MAYFIELD F/B/O MAYFIELD ELECTRIC AND WATER SYSTEMS, GRAVES COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Mayfield, for the benefit of the Mayfield Electric and Water Systems' (MEWS), request for a Fund B loan in the amount of \$1,651,384 for the MEWS Clearwell project. The Mayfield Water Treatment Plant was constructed in the early 1990's and a combination of age and damage from the December 2021 tornado has increased the need for repairs and redundancy. A new 400,000-gallon Clearwell will be constructed to provide necessary additional capacity and redundancy and the existing 400,000-gallon Clearwell will be rehabilitated. Other project components include three high service pumps, a new aerator, flash mixer, and the addition of an automated valve. These upgrades and repairs will allow MEWS to continue to provide quality service to the city of Mayfield and Graves County for decades to come.

MEWS currently serves 4,227 residential customers and 575 commercial customers

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Fund B loan request to the City of Mayfield F/B/O Mayfield Electric and Water Systems for an amount up to \$1,651,384 with the standard conditions. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was passed.

6. A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F25-020L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$600,000 TO THE CITY OF PRINCETON F/B/O PRINCETON WATER & WASTEWATER COMMISSION, CALDWELL COUNTY, KENTUCKY

Mr. John Brady, KIA, discussed the City of Princeton, for the benefit of the Princeton Water & Wastewater Commission's, request for a \$600,000 from KIA's Fund F Lead Service Line Replacement program for the Lead Service Line Inventory project. The Commission conducted an inventory of all system service lines and submitted the findings to the Kentucky Division of Water. Initially records were reviewed to verify service line material at the county's PVA office. The Commission then began potholing the service lines. Over 4,000 connections were inspected using a two-point verification method to look at both the public and private side of the meter and determine which lines will need to be replaced. All research was recorded, and all expenses were tracked. This project was required in order stay in compliance with EPA's lead and copper rule.

The Commission currently serves 2,805 residential customers and 540 commercial and industrial customers.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the Fund F loan request to the City of Princeton F/B/O Princeton Water and Wastewater Commission for an amount up to \$600,00 with the standard conditions. Ms. Rebecca Goodman seconded, and the motion was passed.

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7. A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

This is a routine resolution allowing KIA to reimburse expenses that are paid out of the Authority's funds with bond proceeds. The projects listed below are covered under this resolution.

Ms. Shelley Porter made the motion to approve the Capital Reimbursement Resolution. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

8. KENTUCKY WATER AND WASTEWATER ASSISTANCE FOR TROUBLED OR ECONOMICALLY RESTRAINED SYSTEMS (KYWWATERS) PROGRAM SCORING AND RECOMMENTATIONS PRESENTATION

Director Williams reminded everyone that the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems Fund was created by House Bill 563 of the 2024 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly and codified in Acts Chapter 185, creating a new section in KRS Chapter 224A for the program. The KY WWATERS Program, as it is known, provides a funding application and evaluation process for eligible public water and wastewater systems to seek funding from the General Assembly. The program will be administered by the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority. The Kentucky WWATERS Program was established to provide for an orderly process to apply for funds for eligible projects and for applications to be evaluated, scored, and presented to the General Assembly for consideration for funding. There was \$75 million appropriated for this year and an additional \$75 million for next year. It was created to be a revolving loan fund, but it does allow for multiple types of funding assistance.

She thanked Rick Harris and Jeremy Skinner and other KIA staff for compiling the information for today's meeting for consideration. A copy of the Summary on Scoring and Recommendations is attached. The Board approved the weighted score rubric at the September 5th Board meeting:

Director Williams noted that the application deadline was August 31st and there were 165 applications submitted. Six applications were not fully completed and were not eligible for consideration. Nine applicants submitted everything except their corrective action plan, which was a requirement, so their applications were not eligible for consideration. The final number of applications for consideration was 150 for a total funding request of just over \$657 million, with only \$75 million available. Out of the \$75 million KIA was allowed to use one half of one percent for administrative fees, which is \$375,000 off the top. We have granted funding to two emergency projects.

Director Williams turned the floor over the Mr. Rick Harris to discuss a request for emergency funding that came in earlier in the week for the City of Livingston. Mr. Harris received a call

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that they City's water had been shut off due to an outstanding bill of \$114,000 to the Wood Creek Water District. There are approximately 260 people living in Livingston and downstream there are 1,400 people that receive water from Kentucky American Water.

There was a lengthy discussion by and among the board members, staff and representatives from Kentucky American Water and Rockcastle County regarding the history that led to such a large amount being owed by Livingston and whether the situation qualified as an emergency.

Mr. Russ Rose took over the meeting as Commissioner Sawyers stepped out briefly. The Board then moved forward with the original agenda item on the KYWWATERS scoring and recommendations.

Director Williams noted that there were no projects excluded because of the project type. All the funding applicants were considered eligible because each was a public water system that met one of the criteria. The Board previously approved the scorecard/scoring rubric. KIA staff has evaluated each application in accordance with the criteria to establish a score for each.

Mr. Russ Rose commended staff on the thoroughness of the information and the debt service ratio, etc. Secretary Goodman said she is pleased with the information provided and ok with submitting the information to the legislators. Mr. Russ Rose agreed with Secretary Goodman's recommendation to submit the information as presented.

Mayor Bruce Fraley made the motion to approve the KYWWATERS Recommendations and Scoring as submitted. Mr. Shaun Youravich seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

II. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Director Williams mentioned the change in the conference room. Space has been provided to the Office of Broadband Development and the room size has been reduced to accommodate additional office space to their agency. KIA staff is evaluating ways to update the outdated audio-visual equipment for the conference room. If anyone has any suggestions, we would appreciate their input. Several suggested to update the volume on the speakerphone.

Director Williams acknowledged Jim Carpenter for assisting the auditors on completing this year's clean audit.

III. OTHER BUSINESS

After a brief recess, the Board reconvened to further discuss the City of Livingston's emergency request. Commissioner Sawyers noted that the City of Livingston was not compliant with submittal of their audit to the Department for Local Government. Therefore, the state cannot provide financial assistance to the city. Secretary Goodman offered a solution that the emergency funding request be submitted by Wood Creek Water District. She noted that based upon conversations with the Division of Water, the County Judge and various others that have an interest in this issue, Wood Creek has agreed to accept an amount less than the \$114,000 that is owed to them, noting that \$57,000 would need to be paid.

Mr. Ron Parritt and Ms. Shelley Porter abstained from voting. Secretary Goodman made the motion that the Board conditionally approve the payment of \$57,000 for Livingston's arrearage payable directly to Wood Creek upon the receipt of an emergency KY WWATERS application from Wood Creek overnight or within the next few hours demonstrating financial need to be paid that sum of money. It would be conditional approval based upon the receipt of that application and she noted Wood Creek is an eligible applicant. Mayor Bruce Fraley seconded, and the motion was approved.

Mayor Fraley asked if the water would be turned back on, and Secretary Goodman said as soon as they receive the \$57,000 payment.

VII. <u>DEMOGRAPHICS</u>

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 1,643 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$47,477. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve This project qualifies for Green Project Reserve funding for \$85,300.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness not to exceed \$408,159 will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total sewer and water revenues increased 15.1% from \$1.9 million in 2021 to \$2.2 million in 2023 while operating expenses increased 15.6% from \$1.8 million to \$2.0 million during the same period. These increases were due to implemented rate increases as well as increases in salaries and wages. The debt coverage ratio was 2.4, 3.6, and 2.8 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.1, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.9, 30.6 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 23.9 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues are projected to remain flat in the projected years.
- 2) Operating expenses for sewer and water will increase 2% each year due to inflation. Purchased water expenses will increase 3.1% in FY25 due to a rate increase.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 1.8 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund A loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$48,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$2,400 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The City of Midway is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$250,000 for the I-64 Waterline Extension project. This project will construct an 8" PVC line to connect the City's 500,000-gallon elevated water tower to the town of Midway. Currently the line connecting the tower is owned by Kentucky American Water (KAW). The new 8" line will run from the City's existing infrastructure along Leestown Road and Coach Station Road to existing infrastructure on McKinney Ave. The new line will be a total of approximately 1300 linear feet (LF) and will include a 400 LF bore under I-64 and a 100 LF bore under Leestown Road. There will be a 6" spur to serve the Green Gables Development which is currently served by the KAW line and in operation in the City's system. This portion of the project will be 750 LF of 6" line from I-64 to Green Gables Drive where there is existing infrastructure. This project aims to provide consistent service for the City's existing customers and is necessary because they will no longer be purchasing water from KAW.

I. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The City of Midway is requesting a Fund B loan in the amount of \$250,000 for the I-64 Waterline Extension project. This project will construct an 8" PVC line to connect the City's 500,000-gallon elevated water tower to the town of Midway. Currently the line connecting the tower is owned by Kentucky American Water (KAW). The new 8" line will run from the City's existing infrastructure along Leestown Road and Coach Station Road to existing infrastructure on McKinney Ave. The new line will be a total of approximately 1300 linear feet (LF) and will include a 400 LF bore under I-64 and a 100 LF bore under Leestown Road. There will be a 6" spur to serve the Green Gables Development which is currently served by the KAW line and in operation in the City's system. This portion of the project will be 750 LF of 6" line from I-64 to Green Gables Drive where there is existing infrastructure. This project aims to provide consistent service for the City's existing customers and is necessary because they will no longer be purchasing water from KAW.

The City currently serves 699 residential customers and 53 commercial and industrial customers.

VII. DEMOGRAPHICS

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 1,776 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$64,069. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 2.25% interest rate.

VIII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended June 30, 2021 through June 30, 2023. General Fund revenues are being pledged for repayment of this loan and were reviewed. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Revenues increased 2.9% from \$2.06 million in 2021 to \$2.12 million in 2023. Expenses increased 5.4% from \$1.95 million to \$2.06 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 4.8 in 2022 and 2.1 in 2023.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues will remain flat in projected years
- 2) General expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.0 in 2026 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund B loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$1,300 total) of the final amount borrowed to be funded annually (\$26,000 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-008L) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$5,000,000 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Northern Kentucky Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$5,000,000 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for the Newport Water Main and Lead Service Line Replacements

project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

<u>Section 3.</u> Principal forgiveness of 71%, not to exceed \$3,550,725 will be deducted from the approved loan amount. The unforgiven principal balance of \$1,449,275 shall be repaid.

Section 4. The unforgiven principal shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 0.50%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid, unforgiven principal balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$12,500 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$250,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

<u>Section 5.</u> This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of December, 2024.

The MHI of the project area is \$50,278. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183. The loan will qualify for a 0.50% interest rate.

VIII. 2023 CAPITALIZATION GRANT EQUIVALENCIES

- 1) Green Project Reserve The Drinking Water capitalization grant does not contain a "green" requirement.
- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for additional subsidization. Principal forgiveness of 71% of the assistance amount, not to exceed \$3,550,725, will be credited to the loan balance.

IX. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2021 through December 31, 2023. The non-cash impacts of GASB 68 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and GASB 75 – Accounting and Financial Reporting for Other Postemployment Benefit have been removed from the operating expenses. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues increased 12.2% from \$60.07 million in 2021 to \$67.40 million in 2023 due to rate increases and higher water consumption. Operating expenses increased 22.3% from \$29.96 million to \$36.64 million during the same period due to mostly costs associated with salaries and chemicals. The debt coverage ratio was 1.6, 1.6, and 1.8 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 3.2, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.8, 94.3 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 13.8 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

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A RESOLUTION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF A CONDITIONAL COMMITMENT FOR A FEDERALLY ASSISTED DRINKING WATER REVOLVING FUND LOAN (F24-008S) FOR AN AMOUNT UP TO \$3,305,825 TO THE NORTHERN KENTUCKY WATER DISTRICT, KENTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has been duly created as a body corporate and politic constituting a public corporation and a governmental agency of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Authority is duly and legally authorized to make loans to Governmental Agencies for the purpose of providing funds for the construction and acquisition of sanitary sewer facilities, water facilities or other types of infrastructure, and in that regard, to enter into Assistance Agreements with such Governmental Agencies governing the provisions in respect of which such loans are to be made, the amounts thereof and the repayment provisions in respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates entering into an Assistance Agreement for a loan from the Authority's Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Loan Program (Fund F) with the Northern Kentucky Water District, subject to final determination of amount when the factors involving such financing have been determined; and

WHEREAS, the Authority will, in the near future, authorize and issue a series of Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds for the purpose of funding loans to various governmental agencies, such series of Bonds to be known as Kentucky Infrastructure Authority Revenue Bonds with the appropriate Series designation; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to establish terms and conditions on said Fund F loans prior to the issuance of Authority Revenue Bonds and recognizes that additional planning and design of the financed projects are required.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS AS ITS DULY AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED GOVERNING BODY, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AND ORDER, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> All statements of fact set forth in the preambles to this Resolution and Order are incorporated herein by reference, the same as if set forth verbatim. All such statements of fact are hereby declared to be true and accurate in all material respects.

<u>Section 2.</u> The Authority hereby authorizes the issuance of a conditional Federally Assisted Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan for an amount up to \$3,305,825 of project expense including capitalized interest for the construction period, to the Northern Kentucky Water District for the Newport Water Main and Full Lead Service Line

Replacement project. Such amounts are subject to adjustment by further action of the Authority or may be adjusted by action of the Executive Director at the time of the issuance of bonds based on adjustment in project costs of not more than (10%) ten percent of the loan amount authorized by this resolution. Upon satisfaction of all conditions of the commitment, execution of an assistance agreement for this loan is authorized.

Section 3. The loan shall be repayable over 20 years at an interest rate of 2.25%. In addition to debt service, a 0.30% annual administration fee on the unpaid loan balance will be charged. From annual revenues, \$8,300 must be set aside in a borrower held replacement reserve each December 1 until the balance reaches \$166,000 and maintained for the life of the loan. These terms are subject to adjustment upon execution of the loan agreement, upon changes in the project conditions or determination that the project will require authority financing to be done on a taxable basis.

Section 4. This Resolution and Order shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption at a properly held meeting of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority this 5th day of December, 2024.

Total revenues increased 2% from \$5.3 million in 2021 to \$5.4 million in 2023 primarily due to increased sales. Operating expenses increased 34.3% from \$4.0 million to \$4.9 million during the same period due to an overall increase in the cost of goods, in particular increases in chemical expenses. The debt coverage ratio was 4.0, 4.1, and 2.6 in 2021, 2022 and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 2.4, a debt-to-equity ratio of 0.3, 66.5 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 8.0 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

PROJECTIONS

Projections are based on the following assumptions:

- 1) Revenues are expected to remain flat in projected years.
- 2) Expenses will increase 2% annually due to inflation and expected increases in general operational expenses.
- 3) Debt service coverage is 2.4 in 2027 when principal and interest repayments begin.

Based on the pro forma assumptions, the utility shows adequate cash flow to repay the KIA Fund F loan.

REPLACEMENT RESERVE

The replacement reserve will be 5% (\$146,000 total) of the final amount borrowed (prior to principal forgiveness, if any) to be funded annually (\$7,300 yearly) each December 1 for 20 years and maintained for the life of the loan.

Following a meticulous assessment, 0 out of 361 randomly selected service lines throughout the system were found to contain lead. There is 95% confidence that fewer than 1% of the unverified service lines contain lead.

The Water District currently serves 5,935 residential customers and 444 commercial and industrial customers.

Based on current Census data from the American Community Survey 5-Year Estimate 2018-2022, the Utility's service area population is 15,541 with a Median Household Income (MHI) of \$57,431. The MHI for the Commonwealth is \$60,183.

- 2) Additional Subsidization This project qualifies for 100% principal forgiveness, in the amount of \$400,000.

VII. FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Financial information was obtained from the audited financial statements for the years ended December 31, 2021 through December 31, 2023. Percentage references in the History section below are based on whole dollar amounts and not the rounded amounts presented.

HISTORY

Total revenues decreased 0.5% from \$3.41 million in 2021 to \$3.39 million in 2023. Operating expenses increased 14.6% from \$1.88 million to \$2.15 million during the same period. The debt coverage ratio was 3.5, 2.2, and 1.9 in 2021, 2022, and 2023.

The balance sheet reflects a current ratio of 5.0, a debt-to-equity ratio of 1.4, 33 days of sales in accounts receivable, and 12.2 months of operating expenses in unrestricted cash.

No repayment is required for this funding. There is also no service fee or replacement reserve required.

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A RESOLUTION OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF OBLIGATIONS OF THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO REIMBURSE CAPITAL EXPENDITURES MADE BY GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES PURSUANT TO GRANTS OR LOANS MADE BY THE KENTUCKY INFRASTRUCTURE AUTHORITY TO SUCH GOVERNMENTAL AGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (the "Authority") has heretofore approved the undertaking of the projects described in further detail in Exhibit A (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority anticipates making loans and grants to governmental agencies pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 224A of the Kentucky Revised Statutes (the "Act") for the Project and the governmental agencies may be expected to pay and/or incur costs with respect to the Project ("Prior Capital Expenditures") on or after the date of this resolution and prior to the issuance of the obligations (the "Obligations") which will finance the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Directors hereby approves the use of the Obligations to finance the costs of the Project in the maximum principal amount set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> plus costs of issuance related thereto and amounts required to fund a debt service reserve, if any, and declares its intent that any Prior Capital Expenditures made by the governmental agencies pursuant to loans made by the Authority will be made in anticipation of the issuance of such Obligations to reimburse said Prior Capital Expenditures. This declaration is made pursuant to Treas. Reg. §1.150-2.

Section 2. The Executive Director and Treasurer of the Authority are hereby authorized and directed to reimburse, not later than eighteen months after the later of (i) the date of the expenditure or (ii) the date the item was placed in service, but in any event not later than three years after the original expenditure, only those Prior Capital Expenditures made with respect to assets having a reasonably expected economic life of at least one year, and in addition, eligible preliminary expenditures paid and incurred prior to commencement of the Project.

Section 3. The Authority finds and determines that, consistent with the Authority's budgetary and financial circumstances, it does not have funds currently available and does not expect to have funds available in the future that may be allocated on a long-term basis, other than the proceeds of the Obligations, to finance the Prior Capital Expenditures.

Section 4. The Authority hereby directs the Executive Director, Secretary, and Treasurer to take the following action at the time the Prior Capital Expenditures are reimbursed from proceeds of the Obligations: (i) evidence the reimbursement on the books and records maintained with respect to the Obligations, and (ii) identify either the actual prior expenditure to be reimbursed or, in the case of reimbursement of a fund or account, the fund or account from which the expenditure was paid.

Section 5. The books, records and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution shall be made reasonably available by the Authority for its inspection by the general public at the Authority's administrative office every business day during normal business hours commencing no later than 30 days after the passage of this resolution. Said books, record and proceedings of the Authority with respect to this resolution will continue to be reasonably available to the general public until the date of issuance of the Obligations.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption. Passed and adopted this 5th day of December, 2024.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION

The Nicholas County Water District is currently navigating a critical recovery phase following a period of mismanagement and insufficient oversight. Despite effectively managing its four significant debt obligations, the district's small size and the pressing need for system improvements are hindered by these financial burdens. Additionally, the district is collaborating with Bourbon County on a pivotal regional industrial park project, further emphasizing the urgency for financial restructuring.

To address these challenges, the Nicholas County Water District is seeking funding to consolidate and refinance its current, immediate debt obligations. This strategic move aims to combine their total debt of \$1,444,823.43 into a single, low-interest loan, thereby alleviating financial strain and enabling progress on essential improvements and continuing recovery. The debts targeted for consolidation include:

Western Fleming County Water District debt: \$15,231.34 Kentucky Department of Revenue back taxes: \$10,719.69

Federal back taxes: \$197,872.40 USDA-RD loan: \$1,221,000

These debts, while currently manageable, are stalling further advancements and delaying the Water District's recovery despite its ability to address the issues that caused its current situation. By restructuring these obligations into a single loan with a lower interest rate, the district can significantly reduce their financial impact and expedite recovery efforts.

The back taxes owed to both the state of Kentucky and the federal government include all penalties and interest incurred. The district is actively negotiating with the IRS to reduce this burden. The root cause of these tax issues, primarily the failure to file Form 941, has been addressed through strategic staff hires, enhanced training, and implementation of commissioner oversight.

The USDA-RD loan is instrumental in boosting revenue collection through the installation of over 1,600 radio read meters, ensuring accurate and timely meter readings. This is essential in not only increasing monthly revenue through more accurate meter reads, but it also increase the consistency and timeliness of those same revenues.

The debt to the Western Fleming County Water District resulted from a catastrophic water loss due to a large leak, from which the district is still recovering. This debt was unavoidable and the infrastructure issue at the center of it has since been rectified.

Refinancing will yield multiple benefits for the Nicholas County Water District: Cost savings, tax compliance, revenue enhancement, decrease in negative income, and operational efficiency.

PWD will replace water line under Forkland Road that has been damaged and is leaking using a horizontal directional drill to place the new line.

The City of Stanford Waterworks is seeking to add to their finished water supply, while also improving the transmission of water throughout their distribution system. The City of Stanford Waterworks has an existing interconnect to the City of Danville municipal system, which is only utilized during emergency events. However, due to limitations in line size and supply side pressures, the proposed project includes approximately 80,000 Linear Feet of 12" Water Main, and two 1.0 MGD pump stations to move additional water into and throughout the City of Stanford's distribution system. This project reduces stress on the existing water supply sources and water treatment plant, and improves resiliency for the customer base. The project also improves flow along U.S. 150 to the Rowland Industrial Tank to increase the level of service to the Rowland Industrial Park and support future growth along the U.S. 150 corridor.
